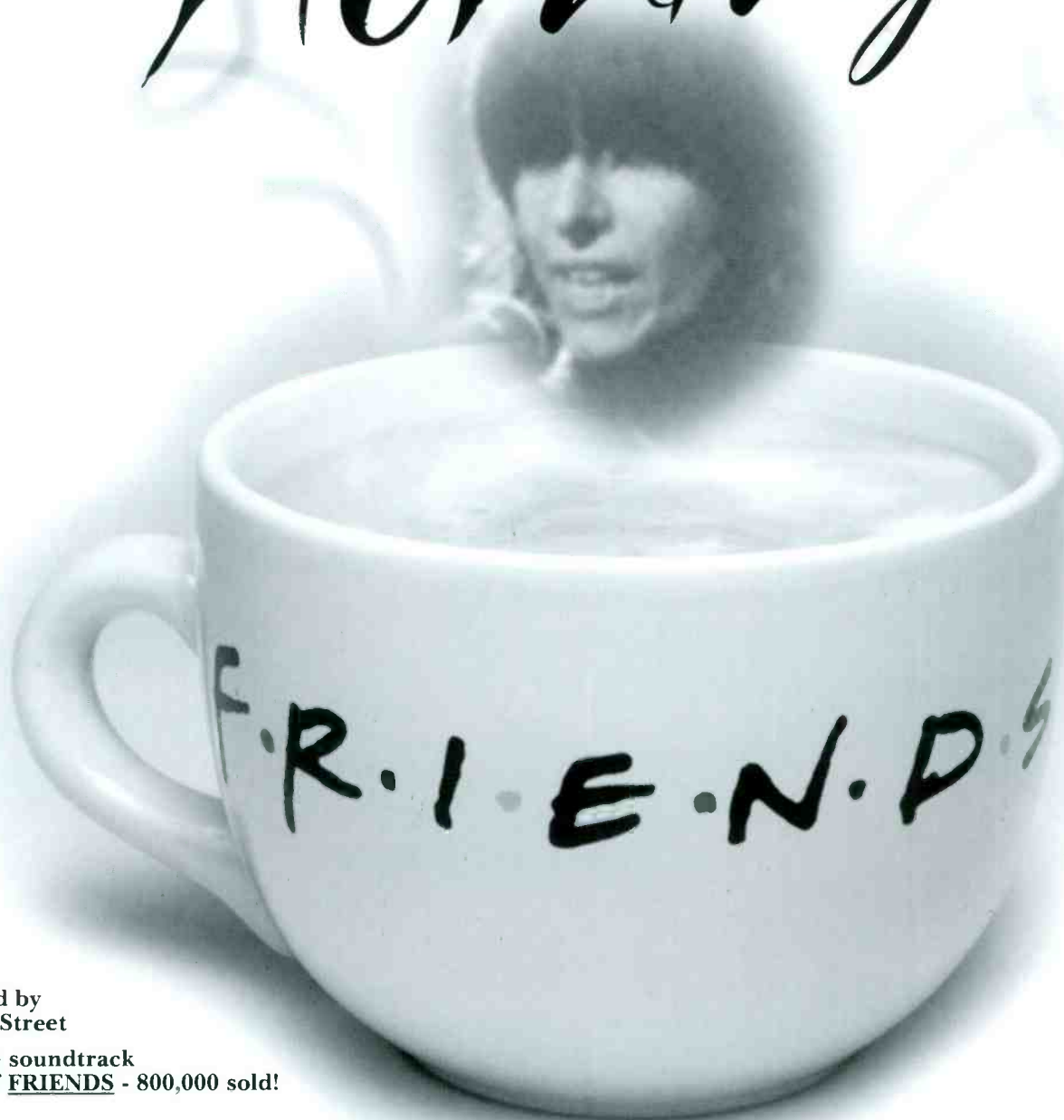

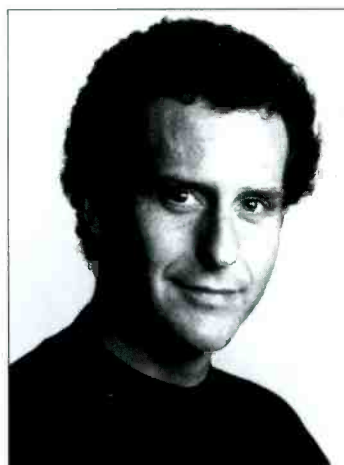

Daniel Glass Named President of Universal Records

Succeeds Doug Morris At New MCA Label

As expected, Daniel Glass was named President of Universal Records. He succeeds Doug Morris, who left to become Chairman/CEO of the parent company, MCA Music Entertainment Group.

Glass moved up from his Exec. VP/GM post to assume the helm of the company, a wholly owned subsidiary of MCA INC. Previously, Glass was President/CEO of EMI Records USA, which included SBK Records and Chrysalis Records. While there, he was instrumental in the breakthrough successes of Wilson Phillips, Jesus Jones, Arrested Development, Jon Secada, Technoronic and Huey Lewis & The News.

During his 15-year career, he also oversaw successful releases by Billy

Idol, Sinead O'Connor, Pat Benatar and Queensryche.

"Daniel is an outstanding leader and executive who understands both talent and the business," states Doug Morris. "We are pleased to recognize his abilities with this well-deserved promotion."

"It's a once-in-a-lifetime chance to work with visionary record men like Doug Morris and Mel Lewinter," Glass says. "Any record company is only as good as its artists and staff, and at Universal, we have the best of both worlds."

Glass is also the co-founder and President of LIFEbeat, the music industry organization fighting AIDS.

Corporate Buy-Outs: The Calm Before The Storm

ARS Buys Out Rochester, Infinity Girds Up, Music Groups Eye EMI

With one notable exception, the fourth week of corporate radio life after de-regulation was relatively uneventful. Besides American Radio System's purchase of Lincoln Group's four Rochester stations, industry eyes are centered on Infinity's reported massive war chest and the imminent spin-off of EMI Music, and who its prospective suitors might be.

In Rochester, ARS coughed up \$30.5 million for heritage Top 40 WPXY-FM, WVOR-FM, WHAM-AM and WHTK-AM. Combined with the three outlets it already owns (WCMF-AM/FM and WRMM-FM) and the two it has under joint sales agreements (Alternative WNVE and "The River"), the new entity is now responsible for over 60% of the market's revenue.

Meanwhile, a lot of radio pundits are focused on Infinity Broadcasting. Once the nation's largest group until it was passed by Jacor's recent buying spree, CFO Farid Suleman was quoted in a recent *Wall Street Journal* piece as estimating that the radio group has an acquisition budget of upwards of \$2 billion.

Last week, Infinity paid \$300 million for the TDI outdoor advertising firm. The move enables the company to control billboards, bus sides and other presence in almost all of the major markets where Infinity has stations.

Meanwhile, Thorn EMI announced that it was moving up the date it will spin off its music division from the rest of the conglomerate. That only fuels the interest other parties would have in acquiring the music division. Although EMI heads have publicly denied that EMI Music is on the block, that is being taken as seriously in some circles as the Los Angeles Kings' public announcements that it was going to sign and keep Wayne Gretzky.

Industry sources, who for obvious reasons prefer to remain anonymous, agree that EMI Music will not come cheap. Its catalog boasts classic product by The Beatles and the Beach Boys as well as current hitmakers such as Garth Brooks, Janet Jackson, Smashing Pumpkins and D'Angelo. Furthermore, if a new buyer comes in and wants to clean house, it would have to commit considerable resources to cover severance pay. Nevertheless, the following three parties seem to be the leading contenders.

• DreamWorks SKG. No record company in this industry can rival the executive level experience of DreamWorks' David Geffen, Mo Ostin, Lenny Waronker and Michael Ostin. However, DreamWorks lacks the one thing that is generally considered to be the lifeblood of record business op-

erations: catalog. Sales of The Beatles, Beach Boys and Garth Brooks catalogs could do a lot to ease the investment costs of this start-up label.

• MCA. Acquiring half of Interscope put the Doug Morris machine within shouting distance of the record group leaders in market share. Acquiring EMI's Pop and Rock catalog, a nice complement to MCA's exceptional Black music catalog, would move MCA considerably closer to market share king WEA.

• Viacom. The corporate parent of MTV and Paramount, head Sumner Redstone has publicly announced his intention to get into the record business. EMI Music represents the best and most available entity on the market.

If there's a dark horse candidate for EMI Music, some would point to Disney. While the prospects of Disney using its unparalleled marketing clout on The Beatles, Garth and Beach Boys seem especially enticing, the fact that Disney sunk so much in the ABC deal makes another major acquisition seem unlikely.

Again, EMI officials have publicly stated that they intend to keep the music division as a separate entity. Unfortunately, their sentiments are not considered to be set in stone in a business climate where market share is king.

"I'm thrilled to be part of the new MCA Records team," Konowitch states. "With Jay's leadership and vision, MCA is ideally positioned to maximize a strong roster of both established and developing artists with a new style and approach to marketing music for the '90s and beyond."

Simon comes to MCA from Geffen/DGC Records, where she ran the label's sales department. There, she played a key role in developing new artists and maximizing the success of the more established artists. Prior to Geffen, she was Sr. VP/GM for Zoo Entertainment, VP Sales for Enigma Records and National Sales Director for A&M Records. As Sr. VP Marketing & Sales, Simon will be responsible for the combined efforts of MCA's marketing team and overseeing the relationships between MCA Records and its retail accounts.

"The decision to leave Geffen for MCA was a difficult one," she says. "My years there were among the most rewarding of my career, and I feel fortunate that Eddie Rosenblatt gave me the opportunity to be part of such a superb group of professionals. I'm

very excited about the unique possibilities that my new position at MCA offers, and I look forward to working side by side with Jay, Abbey and the entire MCA Records staff."

Shellie Hart Named KEDJ PD

Chris "Curly" Patyk Named MD

New Century Media brought in a new programming team for the Phoenix Alternative KEDJ-FM, as well as KHOT-FM/KGME-AM. Shellie Hart was appointed PD and Chris "Curly" Patyk was named MD.

The company recruited Hart from Crossover KUBE Seattle, where her 10-year tenure saw her rising to the APD/MD posts. KEDJ management asserts that The Edge will stay Alternative. "For me, this is a big 'wow' move," Hart states. "This is exactly the opportunity I've been holding out for. I believe Phoenix is a magical market with a very fierce Alternative scene.

"It's been one helluva killer ride," she says of her KUBE days. "I certain-

ly plan the same for The Edge. It's going to be so intoxicating."

Patyk boasts Alternative experience, having programmed KKND Tucson before the call from New Century Media came. He has also worked as a producer at KRQ and KMXX Tucson. "I'm just so excited about being here, I can't wait to get started," he says. "This is an excellent opportunity for me."

"The one-two punch provided by Shellie and Chris is going to be just the explosion The Edge needs," KEDJ/KHOT/KGME VP/GM Reid Reker states. "We've been following both of their successes for quite some time and I am doubly excited about watching their individual talents blossom at this station."

Capitol And EMI Records Merge Urban Depts.

Capitol Records President Gary Gersh and EMI Records President Davitt Sigerson announced the unification of their Urban music departments. The new staff will be headquartered in New York as part of EMI Records. The lineup of the newly merged division has not been specified.

"This reflects the realities of the music industry in the '90s," Gersh and Sigerson say in a joint statement. "The ultimate result of this re-engineering will be that artists benefit by receiving focused A&R, marketing and promotion attention from a specialized hands-on staff."

"This move is in keeping with the EMI-Capitol Music Group North America mandate to develop rosters within the major label and to ensure that the artists' needs are served."

Where Are Our Damn Presents?

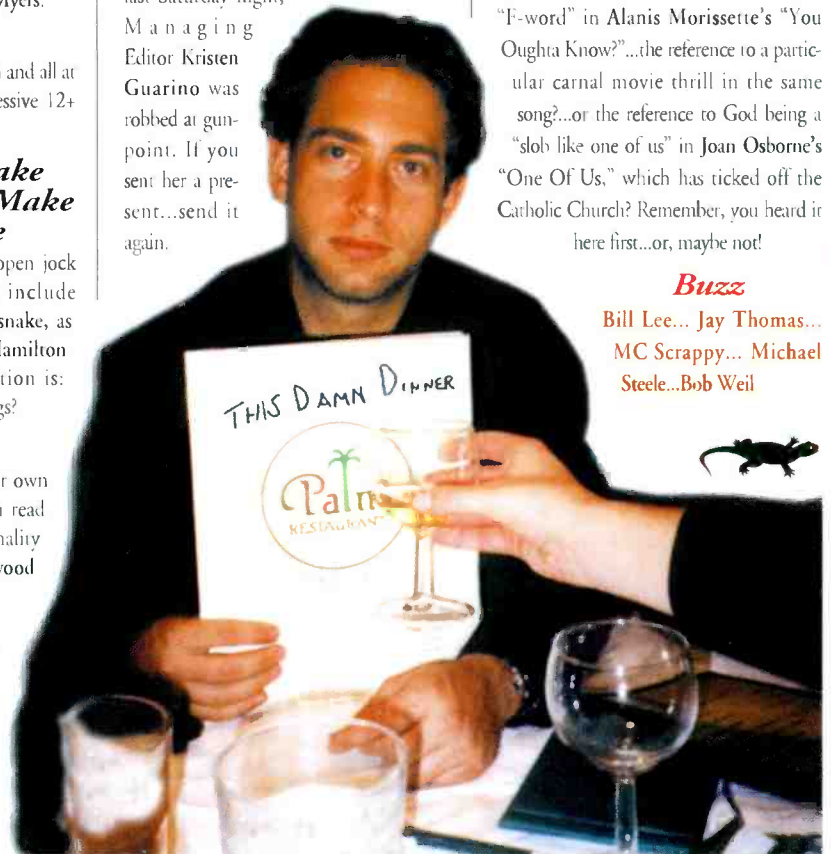

GRAMMYTICAL

I like to dress up and have a good time.

Is that line from a song? Or is it just a state of mind during Grammy week in Los Angeles?

With all due respect to New York, there's no business like show business in Los Angeles.

Besides, we're feeling pretty good about ourselves right now. Magic is back, the Lakers are making a run and it's Showtime again at the Forum. The Dodgers are talking the talk as they prepare to win their division. Disney bought the Angels, so they're bound to improve. We don't have a professional football franchise, so we're able to see the best games on television. We haven't had a really good mud slide in over a year, no fires to speak of and not a measurable earthquake (that's anything over a 4.0 for those of us who live here) since 1994. Housing prices are moving up and O.J. hasn't called a local radio station in over a week.

It's paradise.

And it's Grammy week.

I love L.A.

And I especially love L.A. during Grammy week. It's the one time of year in this entertainment town that the record and radio businesses gets to pretend we're more important than the motion picture industry. In the long run, we fail, of course, but for one brief moment in time we can ask the question: "Did you do it for love...did you do it for money...did you do it for spite...or did you have to, honey?" (That's an oblique reference to The Eagles, for those of you who are a little slow.) And just in case you're wondering, I always do it for spite.

Those of you who live in New York don't quite understand us out here on the West Coast. See, we don't dress up a lot. You people will squeeze into a tuxedo or evening dress at the drop of an invitation. Not so us. It's got to be special.

And the Grammys are special.

It's not just the Grammy presentation. It's the total experience. Like going to a state fair, it's fun to see the main tent, but the sideshows supply the real action.

And a state fair doesn't hold a candle to Los Angeles during Grammy week. You think you've seen the world's fattest man, the tattooed lady, the piercing Queen, the transvestites, the sword

swallowers, the fire-eaters, the freaks, the jugglers and clowns that all did tricks for you? Honey, come on down to Hollywood. You ain't seen nothing yet!

The action begins long before Grammy week. Things begin to get tense when the invitations are sent out. God forbid if you aren't invited to one of the parties. It's a social faux pas worse than brown shoes with a tux. It starts when one of your colleagues asks if you've gotten an invitation to a certain party. If you haven't, the politicking begins in earnest. You start by calling everyone you know at the company, wondering why you haven't received your invitation. They, of course, lie and say they're sure you're on the list. The invitation must be the mail.

You, of course, don't believe them for a second. So you begin asking others with more juice

to help you out. They, of course, lie and tell you they'll get right on it. You're left out in the cold.

But, if you're smart, you can scam your way in. Just find out others who are invited to the parties you want to attend. Leave the awards early and stop by the party. Use their name. The people checking the lists are not heavy enough to garner an invite themselves, hence, they have no idea what the real person looks like. You're never asked for an I.D. And no one is really hurt. When the "real" people get there, they can prove who they are by showing an I.D. They'll get in (after a hassle) and you'll already be drinking champagne at the bar.

Next to arrive are your actual Grammy tickets. You quickly break open the envelope and

check your seating. The tickets probably suck. But it's hard to bitch. They're supplied by a record company. (Does anybody other than record companies actually pay for these things?) If you were at a major market last year, and this year you're in a smaller city, look for your tickets to be further from the stage. If you're in radio and you get your tickets early, you've got a chance at moving closer. It depends on the records you add. Hold out for the prime locations.

The first party is the biggest record company party of the year. It's Clive's party at the Beverly Hills Hotel. You haven't truly arrived until you're invited to Clive's party. And trying to get an invitation is almost impossible. You've got a better shot at front-row Grammy tickets than getting on Clive's list.

Clive's party happens the night before the Grammys. Appropriate. Most believe it's more important. And it's Black Tie. Now the Grammys are Black Tie as well, but Black Tie in L.A. means anything from a tux to spangled denim jackets with cowboy boots and spurs. Not so with Clive's invitation. Better have the tux or be ready to get embarrassed.

Then we finally get to the Grammys. The most important part of the Grammys is your arrival. You must, of course, have a limo. Anything less is of the lowest order...or either ultra-cool. You have to be pretty confident of yourself to pull up in your own car. Since almost nobody in our business has that confidence, the only people who drive their own cars are those who can't afford a limo. Take out a loan. In this town, the bank will understand.

After you get inside the Shrine Auditorium, you must locate your seat. This is very important because you must determine who has better seats than you. That's the only real reason for going to the awards. You must be able to silently gloat about having better seats than your rivals or smilingly seethe over seating you deem inappropriate. You'll do both. There are enough people over you and under you to have you completely confused.

Veteran Grammy-goers leave their seats right after the opening ceremony. The lobby provides the perfect setting for the ultimate schmooze-fest. There you can brush against the titans of our industry and they can pretend they think you're important...if only until someone more important enters their peripheral.

And don't forget to leave the ceremonies early. You have to clear out before the people you're impersonating later. It's the only way you'll get into the parties. ■

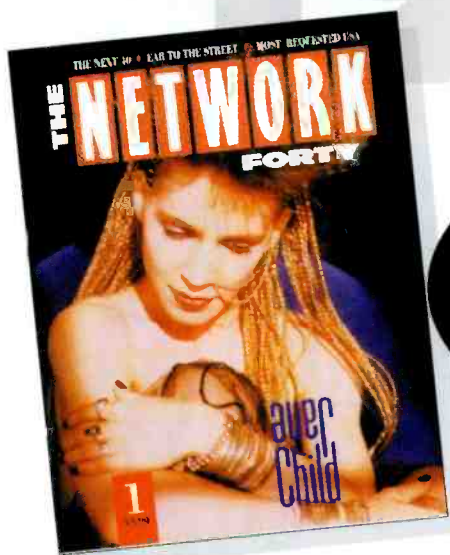

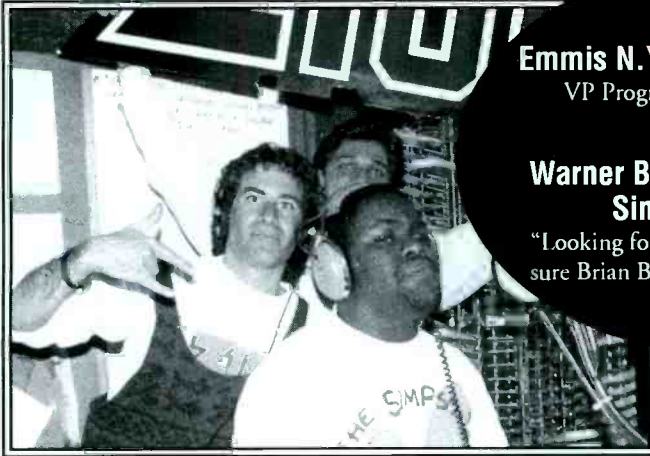

"With so many Top 40s falling off the map in the past five years, we're proud that OK95 has been able to maintain a healthy listenership in the Tri-Cities year after year. This market has changed considerably with many new entrants, but OK95 has benefited by being the station that listeners are comfortable with and keep coming back to. Although we still target a somewhat wide audience, even a market like this has become more niched than before. We really don't have a strong lean, but instead try to get a feel for what kind of music is working at the particular time. A year ago Hootie & The Blowfish was hot, and we helped break them. Today, it might be La Bouche or Joan Osborne. We try to avoid defining the station too stringently, as that tends to hurt stations when the music "flavor of the month" changes.

"In addition to being Program Director, I handle the morning show with Jolynn Winter. 'Walker & Winter' have been going at it for five years and is the most recogniz-

able morning show in the market. Middays is Jeff Jacobs, a 20-year-old who sounds 40; I expect him to be in a major market someday. Afternoons are handled by Bob Bishop, a great talent and promotional genius. Music Director Michael Dean is one of the best night jocks around. Overnights is open, so if anyone is interested and is willing to work for next to nothing, give me a call.

"OK95 tries to give listeners a little something extra with fun features throughout the day. We run an '80s-flavored Retro Lunch, a 5:00 Power Slam, and 'Goodnight Line' evenings. We recently ran a 'Disco Weekend' that went over incredibly well, especially with women. (Who said Disco died?)

"OK95 is tied into the Tri-Cities community like nobody else. From little things like helping a local elementary school raise money for stolen drama equipment, to being the prime sponsor for Walk America, there is no substitute for taking an active role in your listeners' lives. The radio industry is going through some huge changes right now, but the bricks and mortar will remain the same: Provide good customer service, a strong local presence and the best entertainment you can find. That seems to work at OK95."

• Lesley Rankine, lead vocals. • Sharon Dougherty, guitar/keyboards. • Chris Taplin, bass/guitar/programming. • Gavin Fawcett, drums.

• Lesley Rankine began singing as a child in a choir conducted by her grandfather.

• Originally from Livingstone in Glasgow, she moved to London in the early '80s.

• She was the lead singer/screamer of the Punk band Silverfish for five years.

• When the band broke up on unfriendly terms, she left London and moved to Seattle to work with engineer/producer Mark Walk, formerly of Ministry.



• Walk built the Minnesota studio where Nirvana recorded *In Utero* and has engineered albums by Babes In Toyland and Soul Asylum.

• Rankine and Walk met in 1991, when they worked together on Pigface, an experimental collective of musicians that included Genesis' P. Orridge, Red Hot Chili Peppers' Flea and Jello Biafra.

• They formed Ruby (the name shared by their grandmothers) and have just released their debut album, *Salt Peter*, which is either one of the main ingredients in gunpowder or a renowned male anti-sex drug.

• The latest release is "Paraffin."

BABYLON ZOO (EMI RECORDS)

• Babylon Zoo frontman Jasbinder "Jas" Mann was born in Wolverhampton, Britain.

• At age three, he moved with his parents and three sisters to India, a place called Shimia in the Himalyas, by the Ganges river.

• A few years later, his family moved back



to The Midlands industrial suburbia, where they were raised with no music or records.

• Jas hated school and was obsessed with science fiction movies, their soundtracks and books.

• His musical career began in the '80s, as the stage-diving/lead singer of indie band The Sandkings.

• When The Sandkings went their separate ways, he sold all of his possessions and constructed an artificial environment called, New Atlantis, with an indoor rainforest and a music studio.

• Jas is the "director and performer" of Babylon Zoo and he plays all the instruments himself.

• The first single from the album, *The Boy With The X-Ray Eyes*, is "Spaceman."

J'SON (HOLLYWOOD)

• J'son Tyre Thomas is the youngest of eight children, four brothers and three sisters, who grew up in South Central Los Angeles.

• He joined the L.A. Deliverance Community Choir at age 11 and began entering local talent shows.

• He was discovered by Don Johnson, a local promoter, at a Jesse Owens Community Park talent show near his home.

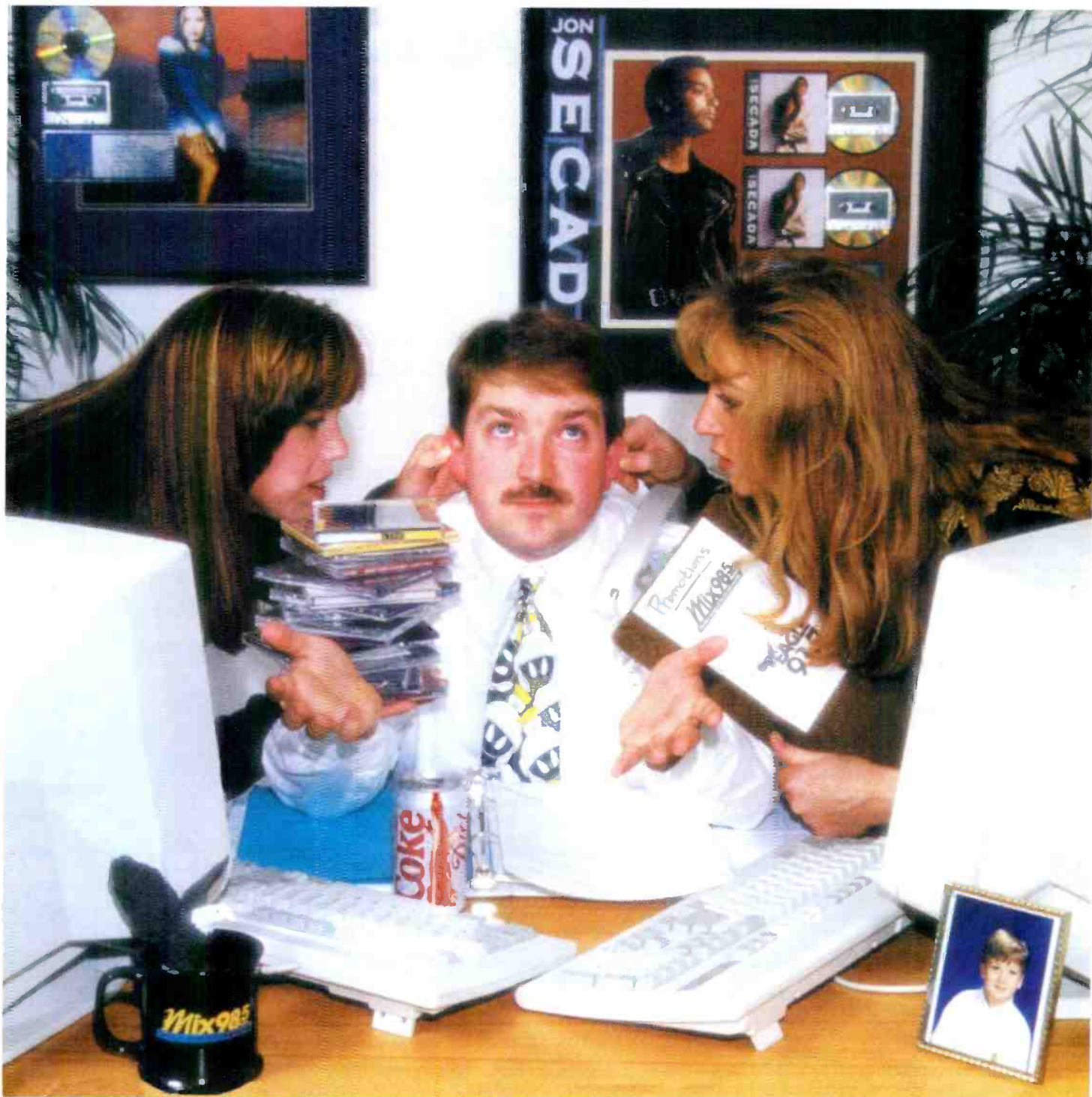
