DAVID GEFFEN, WB MUSIC, AND TWO OTHERS NAMED IN

Eagles Multi-Million \$ Lawsuit

R&R has learned that the **Eagles** have filed a multi-count antitrust suit against their former manager **David Geffen**, **Warner Bros. Music**, their present publishers, and two other music companies. The nine-count suit, brought by four members of the present group, **Glenn Frey**, **Randy Meisner**, **Don Henley** and **Don Felder**, along with former member **Bernie Leadon**, charges Geffen, Warner Bros. Music, **Companion Music** and **Benchmark Music** with violations of the Eagles' rights under the Sherman Antitrust Act, breach of fiduciary duty; and (against Warner Bros. Music alone) breach of duty of good faith and fair dealing. The suit will likely cause major repercussions in the industry and the damages sought are thought likely to run into millions of dollars.

Summarizing some of the main points of the suit, the first count essentially alleges that David Geffen and the three music publishing companies were in violation of the antitrust laws. The complaint alleges that Geffen, as the Eagles' manager, influenced the group, described as "naive, unsophisticated, and inexperienced in the business, and financial aspects of the recording industry," to sign with **Asylum Records**, in which Geffen had a financial interest, and as songwriters with **Companion Music**, in which Geffen also had a financial interest.

Furthermore, it is alleged, Geffen made the signing of the Eagles' Asylum recording contract contingent upon the individual members signing the publishing contracts with Companion. The claim also alleges that the arrangement to tie the Eagles to Asylum, Companion, and Geffen's management was "a contract and combination to foreclose and limit competition in the music publishing industry," thereby falling under the provisions of the antitrust act.

The next key claim, the third, suits for "Declaratory relief for breach of fiduciary duty." In this count the Eagles contend that all sums of money obtained by Geffen as the Eagles' manager, as well as all the money Geffen received upon sale of his interest in Asylum Records and Companion and Benchmark Music are constructively those of the Eagles. The fourth claim, similarly, contends that all sums of money attached to the group's songs published by Warner Bros. Music must be paid over to them and that the

existing publishing contract is void. Finally, the eighth claim in the suit alleges that Warner Bros. Music breached its "good faith

and fair dealing duty" by assigning all "grand rights," which in-

Nationwide Takes Over 13Q

Nationwide Communications, Inc. has assumed control of **13Q/Pittsburgh** from former owners the **HefTel** chain. As an initial change, General Manager **Steve Berger** has appointed **Bob Savage** to the Program Director position at the station. Savage comes to 13Q from **WBBF/Rochester** where he was PD. Berger himself a recent arrival at 13Q (from **WPEZ/Pitts-**

burgh), told R&R: "Bob Savage is the best and he did a wonderful job in Rochester. I'm looking forward to having him start here at 13Q May 18."

Berger also announced that the station will be represented by **RKO Sales**, thereby also gaining the programming advisory services of **Paul Drew**.

Arista Appoints Scott Jackson

Scott Jackson has been appointed Vice President/National Promotion of **Arista Records**. In making the announcement, Arista President **Clive Davis** told R&R: "Scott Jackson has the required expertise and experience to provide first-class leadership of Arista's promotion efforts in the forthcoming years of the company's dramatic growth. He is widely respected as a man of insight, integrity, and imagination, and I'm delighted he is with us."

Jackson, who comes to Arista from **ABC**, where he was Assistant to the Chairman, commented, "I am exceptionally pleased to be associated with Arista Records, and am especially looking forward to working with some of the product

I've heard in the past few days. I feel sure this is the year that Arista is going to become the 'artist' label that Clive Davis and the Arista people always believed it would be."

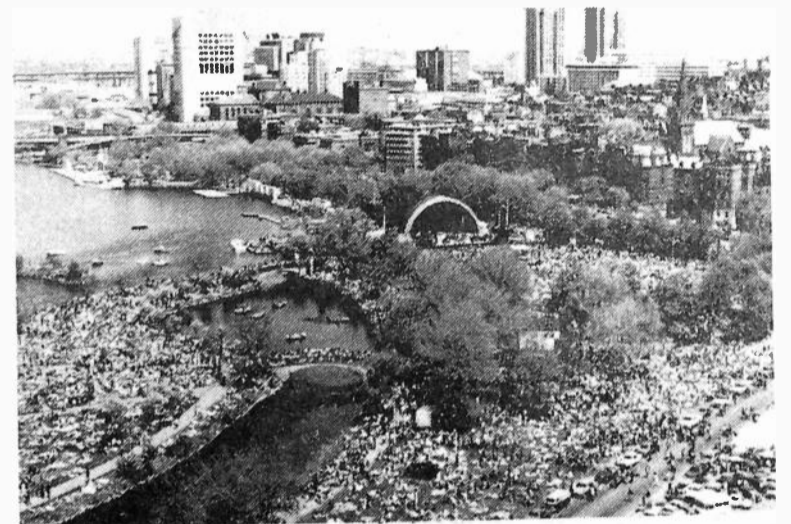

Regan's 'Parachute' Label Lands At Casablanca

Neil Bogart, President of **Casablanca Record and FilmWorks**, and **Russ Regan** have announced the formation of a new label, **Parachute Records**, to be distributed by Casablanca. Regan, most recently President of 20th Century Records, commented, "I'm looking forward, with absolute delight, to working with Neil Bogart, whom I've long admired as a key industry figure. I'm also very happy to regain my relationship with the independent distributors of America. It's great to be back in my lucky building, where I spent seven of the happiest years of my life with Uni Records and 20th Century. It feels like I'm going home."

Bogart, in announcing the new label, called Regan "one of the most competent all-around record people in the industry. He was responsible for the discovery, promotion, marketing and development of many superstars."

Regan's label will be headquartered at Casablanca and will use many of the Casablanca distributors, according to Bogart, though these plans have not yet been finalized. The association with Casablanca is for domestic distribution only, with all other territories to be negotiated by Regan at a later date.

FCC Rules On Political Buys

The **FCC** ruled that the lowest-unit-charge provision of Section 315 may not be used by politicians to gain broadcast time with the same access privileges as advertisers. The ruling reversed a 1976

decision which stated that not only must stations sell time to politicians at their lowest unit price, but candidates must receive the same treatment as advertisers in receiving time.

Arbitron Offers AID Service To Radio Stations

Arbitron has made its AID (Arbitron Information on Demand) service available in the radio field. The computerized service, in use for television since 1975, provides clients with more detailed information not available in Local Market Reports. Among AID's capabilities and services, according to Arbitron, are reach and frequency analysis, audience duplication, and station loyalty reports from actual diary data, as well as computerized post-analysis, time period flexibility, and ethnic analysis. AID is available through direct access information retrieval (enabling clients to receive desired information in hours) or through Arbitron itself.

Butler Signs Production Deal With UA; Shults Named Director of Country

Larry Butler signed a longterm independent production agreement with UA Records. Butler, who recently resigned his UA staff position as Vice President, Country Product in order to produce on a full-time basis, will produce a minimum of five UA artists a year under the new pact, including Kenny Rogers, Billie Jo Spears, Dottie West, Melba Montgomery and Steve Lawrence.

In making the announcement, UA President Artie Mogull commented, "We are elated to welcome Larry Butler to UA in his

WRKO/Boston Concert Draws 175,000 People



WRKO/Boston presented an all-day free concert festival on the Boston Esplanade alongside the Charles River April 30, attracting 175,000 people. The concert featured Heart, Orleans, the James Montgomery Band and others, along with prize giveaways and competitions sponsored by the station and a beverage company.

The concert was apparently successful on the whole, taking into account the immense crowd, but in the aftermath of the pre-

sentation Massachusetts authorities elected to ban future Rock shows on the Esplanade.

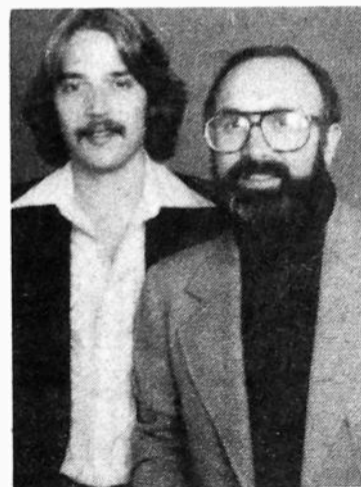
Cited as reasons for the decision were a post-concert litter problem of major proportions and the arrests (40) and reports of violence arising from the festival. WRKO's agreement to pay the clean-up costs did not affect the state's action, and local officials spoke out against "outrageous" behavior on the part of the audience.

Business News

NAB Opposes Communications Act Revision

The potential massive revision of the 1934 Communications Act has been opposed by the **National Association of Broadcasters**. The NAB told Congress that the current rules and regulations in the Act, although somewhat outdated, still enable broadcasters to serve the public well. The House Communications Subcommittee has filed opinion papers for a proposed revision of the Act, which may be drastically different than the Communications Act which has ruled broadcasting for the past half century.

FCC Appeals To Congress On Equal Time

The **Federal Communications Commission** has told Congress that they should exempt Presidential and Vice Presidential candidates from the current equal time regulations of the Communications Act. They did not ask for a relaxation of the law for other federal campaigns, but did say that free time should not be given to minor state and local candidates. Equal time rights would be limited to candidates that received 2% of the vote in a previous election, or that appear on the ballot through a petition signed by 1% of the voters. Congress is not expected to immediately jump on the bandwagon to push through the FCC's proposed changes.

Complaints To FCC Up Slightly

Formal complaints against broadcasters filed with the **FCC** reached 8,376 in March, up 966 over February. Comments and inquiries to the Commission totaled 2,122, an increase of 37 over the previous month.

NPR and APR Merge

At the recent National Public Radio Conference in New Orleans, **National Public Radio** and the **Association of Public Radio Stations** merged into one organization, retaining the National Public Radio name. Board member **Pat Callihan** has been named temporary head of the group, a permanent chief will be named within the next three months. Members of both organizations also agreed to elect a single 25 member Board of Directors for the new group.

AFTRA National Convention Set

San Francisco is the site for the **American Federation of TV and Radio Artists'** 1977 convention. Meetings will take place June 20-23 at the Golden Gate Holiday Inn. Members from the Los Angeles, Chicago, Nashville and San Francisco locals will be in attendance.

A Big Decade For The Record Industry

The **RIAA** and **Warner Communications Inc.** have released data showing that industry-wide sales of record albums, tapes and singles combined have increased consistently in the past 10 years, with the dollar growth of the business up 10.5% for the decade. Album sales constituted the biggest growth factor, with 1976 sales up 12.5% over 1975, now up to \$1.6 billion. Tape sales were the next biggest increase, followed by singles which increased in '76, after a drop in 1975. Despite rising list prices, total units did increase as well in 1976. Record clubs and mail orders were also up 5% over 1975.

Texas Instruments First 'Automatic' CB

CB users in the West will be the first to try out **Texas Instruments'** sophisticated digital CB radio. The 20 channel model activates other compatible CB's through a five digit code number punched into a calculator-type apparatus on the CB microphone. The new system will be marketed nationwide by 1978, after introductions in the West and Southwest, the two strongest CB use areas. The country's largest maker of CB's, **E.F. Johnson Co.**, has also announced that they will have a similar digital CB by the end of this year.



Battle Begins Between Grocers And Fast Food Chains

Americans' lifestyles are changing rapidly, and the grocery stores of America are starting their fight to keep as many people as possible eating at home. Fast food services are taking a big bite out of grocery sales, and the **Food Marketing Institute** is trying to come up with some ideas to stem the tide of take-out food. Many grocers are already starting to offer their own carry-out food operations. Other plans for the battle include heavy promotion and advertising touting the savings and other advantages of cooking at home, and making available more soft goods and health and beauty items at grocery stores. Some advertisers are more than happy to help these stores bring in business, **Royal Crown Cola** will tie in with the grocers to offer "Save All Summer" holiday promotions. Radio, TV and newspaper ads will tell customers that they can get \$1 refunds with proofs of purchase when they buy their soft drinks from markets.

Ozone Creates New Headaches For Airlines

Within the past several months, a new illness has hit passengers and crew members on board planes, caused by the ozone layer in the atmosphere. Some of the symptoms include coughing, shortness of breath, headaches, fatigue, eye irritation and bloody noses. There are two reasons for the recent rise in cases of the "disease." First, the ozone layer of the atmosphere has been dropping into range of aircraft, and secondly, many planes are flying at higher altitudes to conserve fuel. Passenger complaints are making the airlines a bit nervous, several have noted that the complaints started getting stronger in January, and have continued to rise through the year. Airlines have been frantically making tests and trying to evaluate what methods are best for alleviating the symptoms, and some have instructed their pilots to fly at lower altitudes.

Major Push For New Disney Attraction

Billed as "The most incredible attraction in 22 years," California's **Disneyland** has launched a multimedia campaign for their new "Space Mountain" ride. The 177 foot tall attraction hurls "potential astronauts" into space in six passenger rocket ships. A fast food restaurant and entertainment center are also included in the huge structure. Stations in three Southern California counties are included in 30 second spot radiobuys.

Newspaper Looks To Youth To Increase Circulation

San Diego's afternoon daily **Evening Tribune** has kicked off a 10 week campaign to increase readership by youth. The push runs through September on radio, TV, outdoor and newspaper. Radio spots describe upcoming features in the paper. Theme for the campaign is "People You Can Turn To."

Wrigley "Orbits" Into The East

After a successful introduction in the Western region of the country, **Wrigley's** new "Orbit" gum will bow in the East this month. Radio, TV and newspaper ads will herald the introduction of the sugar-free gum. New markets include the entire Northeast and all points south to Virginia.

TV News

NBC Has Top Show, ABC Still Leading Network, Nixon/Frost Scores

Although **NBC's** presentation of "Snowbeast," their Thursday Night Movie, scored in the top show position for the week ending May 1, the Nielsen's show **ABC** still in a solid lead with a 17.5 rating, followed by **NBC's** 16.1, and **CBS'** 15.8. "Charlie's Angeles" was second placing show, the rest of the top 10 were: "Maude," "Laverne & Shirley," "Eight Is Enough," **NBC's** "Mac Davis Special," "What's Happening," "Most Wanted," "Phyllis," and "Andros Targets." **Paul Anka's** first special "Music My Way" came in 22nd.

Arbitron's TV meter service for the week of April 23-29 shows the top 10 shows in New York: 1) "What's Happening," 2) "Welcome Back Kotter," 3) "Laverne & Shirley," 4) "Charlie's Angels," 5) a three way tie with "Eight Is Enough," "Happy Days," and "Paul Lynde," 8) "Hardy Boys" and "Maude" and 10) "Starsky & Hutch." In Los Angeles: 1) "Happy Days" and "Laverne & Shirley" tie, 3) "What's Happening," 4) "Welcome Back Kotter," 5) "Ann Margaret Special" and "Barney Miller," 7) a five way tie with "Eight Is Enough," "Mac Davis Special," "Most Wanted," "Paul Anka Special" and "Paul Lynde."

The first rating returns on the **Nixon/Frost** interviews shows the tremendous potential of a fourth network, after the first interview may have netted close to 45 million viewers. Arbitron meter service placed Washington D.C. as the most attracted to Nixon, with a 35 rating and 56 share. In the Nielsen overnight's, taken only in Chicago, Los Angeles and New York, New York came in first with 33.5 rating, 47 share. L.A. had a 32.9 rating, 50 share, and Chicago a 20.7 rating, 35 share. The series of interviews is being run exclusively on non-network stations, and produced over half a million dollars in advertising billing. If the projected total audience does reach over the 35 million mark, the interview will be a record breaker, gaining the biggest audience in the history of news attractions on TV, network or not.

Cash Cashes In At CBS

CBS-TV has signed up **Johnny Cash** in an exclusive agreement. Cash will kick off the three year pact with two variety specials next season.

Constant Contests At The Q

KCBQ/San Diego Program Director Gerry Peterson brings us up to date on the flood of promotions run recently on the station. Latest contest addition to their airwaves is "W-3," or, "Win While you Work." Workers let KCBQ know when and where they work, and the station calls their names on the air, allowing them five minutes to call in and win up to \$1000. KCBQ's "Cash Call" is still continuing, offering double cash call and a \$10,000 call to keep listeners on their toes. During one weekend, after President Carter cancelled the \$50 rebates, the "Q" took it upon themselves to stage the rebate plan anyway, giving away \$50 bills to listeners who heard the call-in clue voiced by a Carter sound-a-like. KCBQ's "Money Machine" is cruising the city streets, and Peterson noted one thrilling incident involving that promotion. The Money Machine found a local lady who was listening to KCBQ in her car, and pulled her over to award cash. However, she was so excited she didn't pull off the freeway exit, instead stopping in the middle of Interstate 8 during rush hour traffic. KCBQ awarded her \$1000 cash and she immediately fainted on the spot. An ambulance and highway patrol cars came to the scene, and one motorist who was busy watching the events kicked off a 5 car pileup, tying up traffic for several hours. After upsetting the local traffic, KCBQ then proceeded to do the same to the city's phone company with yet another \$1000 bill giveaway. The big bill went to the 1000th caller one evening, with each 50th caller also scoring \$50. During the 2 1/2 hour rush of calls, phone service was knocked out in east San Diego county. Last, but certainly not least, the weekend of May 1st featured their "Who Done It" contest. To determine which of the station jocks had "committed the crime," where the crime was, hourly clues were aired by Inspector "Q-So," with help from Lt. "Q-Jack," and "Q-Retta." The first listener to know that air personality Danny Wright did it in the music library with a turntable won \$500 plus a part in a real "who done it," TV series, "The Rockford Files."

Each contestant that participated in the contest won a Tavares album and a Clue game.

WCOL Helps Zoo, Students

WCOL/Columbus is helping support their local travelling Zoo, offering \$10 coupon booklets good for Zoo rides and admission. All the WCOL personalities helped distribute the booklets and WCOL-Zoo shirts at a local shopping center during that stopping point for the movable zoo.

Franklin University and WCOL are participating in a special joint program encouraging community involvement in the Columbus area. Entries in a special written dialogue on transportation problems are being solicited by WCOL through the first half of May. Writers are asked to enter by writing about what they would do about transportation if they were Mayor of the city for a day. A panel will select the winners from all the essays entered, first place winner will receive 12 credit hours at Franklin and the opportunity to spend the day in the Mayor's office, second place wins 8 credit hours and third place, four credit hours. Nearly \$1000 in scholarships are offered in the program as well.

What's Wrong With This Contest?

WERC-FM/Birmingham did a tie-in contest in conjunction with Andrew Gold's latest album "What's Wrong With This Picture?" Listeners were asked to guess what was wrong with the cover picture on the LP. Posters were displayed in several record stores in the area to help entrants with their guesses. The person with the most correct answers won a Polaroid SX-70 camera and an Elektra/Asylum gold album collection.

A "Very" Secret Sound Contest

What is probably the most obscure "secret sound" around was the basis for KDON/Salinas' most recent promotion. Clues to what the secret sound was were given on the air, giving listeners a chance to guess what it was to win \$100 a month for a year. The sound was of a belt being pulled out of it's loops!

"Stereo In May"

KFXM/San Bernardino is helping their listeners get ready for summer sounds with their "Stereo In May" giveaway. Complete car stereo and home systems are given away daily in two different ways. Listeners are asked on the street what their favorite radio station is, if they answer KFXM they score one of the systems. Or, if they call in at a designated time and say that KFXM is their favorite station, they win their choice of home or car stereos.

KFXM revisited the 60's by previewing the Beatles "Live At The Hollywood Bowl" album. The LP was played commercial free three times during last week, and listeners could win copies of the live album in a call-in-and-win contest. The station also played up the fact that they were co-sponsor of the Bowl concert where the album was recorded in 1965.

Happy 17th, WLS!

WLS/Chicago celebrated their 17th anniversary of 'rocking and rolling' on Monday, May 2nd. Afternoon drive man Bob Sirott presented music of the 60's and 70's from WLS history, kicking off his show with the first Rock record WLS ever played, "Alley Oop."

KPNW Salutes Secretaries

KPNW/Eugene air personalities asked employers in the city to write to the station about their "great" secretaries throughout the month of April for KPNW's "super secretary" contest, in observance of National Secretary Week. Morning man Bill Barrett read each of the dozens of letters received recommending their secretary for an honorary title. Each day, all five "super secretaries" received a lunch for two at one of Eugene's finest restaurants and a bouquet of flowers from the station.

"Here Comes Summer"

CJCH/Halifax is airing a 21 hour program, titled "Here Comes Summer," dedicated to the theme of putting winter behind city residents and welcoming summer. The program is broadcast in seven segments, and features summer's greatest hits by artists like Chicago, the Bee Gees, the Beatles, and many more, plus interviews of celebrities and people on the street's feelings on the coming of summer fun.

WIGY's "Cash Clock," "Super Group Battle"

In their first three months of rocking, WIGY-FM/Bath-Portland, Maine has already given away nearly \$10,000 in cash and prizes in several contests. Currently running is the "30 Second Cash Clock" promotion. Random callers are given a subject and 30 seconds to talk about it. If they can make it to the end of a 30 second timer without saying ahh, uhh, or pausing, they win \$1 a second. Subjects range from nightlife and rubbish to gyrostabilizers and passion flowers. clude the right to fashion dramatizations (including movies) from the group's songs, to **Leber-Krebs, Inc.** The complaint alleges that not only was the group's compensation for transferral of the grand rights minimal, but that no creative controls were set over the "content of the play or film in which their musical compositions would be used."

In addition, should the Eagles themselves decide to make a film from their own songs (one such project, based on the **Desperado**

album, has been discussed), they would, it is claimed, be obliged to buy back the grand rights to their own songs from **Leber-Krebs** as a result of the **Warner Bros.** Music agreement.

The complaint also alleges that **Warner Bros.** Music contracted with **Elektra/Asylum Records** for a royalty rate higher than the rate the Eagles were being paid by **Asylum**, with "Warner Brothers Music in essence obtaining an additional half cent per album for itself at the expense of the Eagles."

The suit was filed in the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California, with a jury trial demanded.

The State Of The AOR

As AOR radio enters its second decade, its growth, spread, depth, and influence have probably far exceeded the expectations of the form's founding Progressive radio pioneers. Because AOR radio is a "style" rather than a "format" per se, it seems as if we can look forward to many more years of evolution and growth within the style's boundaries.

What started out as a contemporary music/culture alternative on the fledgling FM band under the banner "Progressive radio" has evolved into a wide spectrum of radio formats which can be found on both AM and FM. They include, of course, the all-purpose AOR's, which can probably be considered the direct descendant of the original Progressive radio. These are the stations that address themselves to a multiplicity of tastes within the Rock consumer world and play a variety of sounds from such diverse artists as Joni Mitchell to Led Zeppelin. At this point, the all-purpose AOR stations make up the largest number of AOR outlets.

Other AOR approaches include the soft (or as some put it, "Mellow") AOR stations. They are growing in number of outlets at a tremendous rate and feature a sound variety drawn from the "softer" or "mellow" selections available in Album Oriented Rock. The direct antithesis of the soft AOR approach can be found in the hard AOR stations, which as their descriptive name implies, play mostly Album Oriented Rock selections that, in addition to falling into the category "Rock," also comfortably fit the sub-category "Rock and Roll."

On the fringes of the AOR radio world are the Black AOR approach and the new Jazz AOR sound, both of which may prove to be major entities on a national scale before long.

For many years, it was merely the difference in mechanics that separated the AOR formats in terms of philosophy and interpretation. These mechanics consisted of the elements "when to add a record," "what research to consider," "the actual role of the air personality in terms of selecting music and/or freedom of speech," and other options rooted in the old controversy of "what is Progressive." As we approach the 1980's the issue of "progressiveness" is rapidly fading, and the basic differences between AOR formats come down to the actual directions in sound that each station will take in an increasingly fragmented marketplace. However, the same differences in mechanics still exist in just about every segment of the AOR spectrum. In other words, there are tight and loose all-purpose AOR's soft AOR's, etc. That is but a thumbnail sketch of AOR radio today. One's knowledge of the style increases with one's knowledge of each station. There is absolutely no quick description that can accurately cover them all.

Nevertheless, AOR is building, not only in number of stations billing themselves that way, but in the effect they are having upon stations of other formats.

More and more, music radio stations are utilizing the album as a primary unit of measurement in the categorizing and tracking of music activity, the old on-the-air hype is being replaced with a style and delivery based upon a foundation of humanity, and broadcasters are realizing that Rock music and adults come from the same generation in history.

It is often said that radio should reflect the society that it serves. The more accurate the reflection (all things being equal), the more successful the station. Society, of course, is fragmented and becoming increasingly more so, hence the need for different "styles" of radio. "Formats" are merely the mechanical approaches taken to execute the various styles. "Formats" come and go in a fad-like manner in this business. Styles stick around and represent eras. Because changes in society are continuous and fluid, rather than stratified into obvious plateaus with easy to recognize cut-off points, broadcasters are constantly faced with the dilemma of learning format concepts which by the time they are mastered are obsolete. Keeping up with the changes in society for radio people is like chasing a runaway kite across an obstacle course on a windy day. You've got to keep running.

AOR radio is a style that offers plenty of room for running.

Abrams Ups Michaels/Expands Superstars

Lee Abrams, of the Burkhardt/Abrams & Associates radio consulting firm, has announced that KISW (FM100)/Seattle Program Director Lee Michaels will be joining the company in Atlanta to serve as Assistant to Lee Abrams in developing Superstars. In the newly created position, Michaels will be dealing extensively with research, format development, and special projects. Michaels has been with KISW for the past 6 years, the last two of which were in conjunction with Lee Abrams' consultation services.

Abrams also told R&R that he has added CILQ/Toronto and KCJB/Minot, North Dakota to the growing roster of AOR stations subscribing to the "Superstars" approach.

"What Was A Whale, Mommy?"

What started as a local radio station Public Affairs promotion has spread to a state-wide movement and is beginning to draw national attention. KZEL/Eugene, one of the West Coast's leading bastions of "Free-form/Progressive" AOR broadcasting began by programming special Public Affairs features dealing with the senseless slaughtering of whales on the part of humans. The idea, which was the brainchild of KZEL Station Manager Michael Denligner and Program Director Stan Garrett, was designed to "provide the community with a ratings promotion that would be beneficial to the public, as well as the station."

In addition to the special programming, the station sold "KZEL-What Was A Whale, Mommy?" T-shirts for \$4.00 each and promoted a public auction at which donated merchandise would be turned into cash. All monies from the dual event, which totaled about \$20,000, are being donated to the Greenpeace Foundation, a local activist organization formed to bring attention to the whale problem and discourage those who are creating it.

The promotion prompted the Lane County Commissioner to come out in support of the cause. He in turned asked that Country Joe McDonald participate in the auction as a performer and be named Commador of the Lane County Navy to enforce a recently passed

ordinance that forbids whaling off the county's 38 mile coastline.

The station also received official support from the Oregon U.S. Congressional Delegation and the cause, as a result of the station's activities, received a supportive official statement from the White House.

Congratulations to KZEL for a job well done!

PD Bill Bruun will now be handling music...Stuart Sank has started the firm Projects/Creative Promotions. The New York City based company will specialize in album promotion and artist development. The first two clients are London and RCA Records. Stuart can be reached at (212) 580-7259...Mike Bechtel exits the Program Directorship of KXFM/Santa Maria. Carey Bruce is the new PD, upped from within.

KDKB Recieves Headliner Achievement Award

For the second time in three years, KDKB/Phoenix has been named a recipient of the National Headliners Club "Headliners Achievement Award for Radio Stations." The award was received for the station's expose of the Mesa Police Department. The "Outstanding Documentary by a Radio Station" award winner was produced by KDKB News Director MARK NYKANEN.

In addition, the feature won the second place award in the Arizona Press Club annual Radio General News Competition.

Big Apple Jazz

Once upon a time WRVR/New York, when owned by the Riverside Church, was a Jazz station in the historical sense. Now, the station, owned by Sonderling Broadcasting, is a Jazz station in the contemporary AOR radio mode. Under programming guidance of Program Director DENNIS WATERS and Music Director DONNA HALPER, the station is bringing a new slant to the programming of Jazz that, if commercially successful, could be the prototype of a whole new division of the growing AOR programming spectrum.

Waters and Halper bring a healthy amount of programming diversity to WRVR's new on-the-air posture. Waters was Program Director of 13Q/Pittsburgh and in-house Consultant of WRC/Washington, D.C. prior to joining WRVR, both Top 40 radio outlets. Halper did A&R for Mercury Records and at one time was Music Director of AOR stronghold, WMMS/Cleveland.

Halper told R&R, "We are a Jazz station, yet that may have some negative connotations to some programmers, especially those who still believe that Jazz is a tune-out to the Rock listener. Yet, our research has consistently shown that our audience has a sizeable percentage of young 18-24 year old White male listeners who, when asked what other stations they listen to, name WNEW-FM or WPLJ, the two AOR stations in the market." Halper went on to explain, "Similarly, our Black listeners are people who have rejected WBLS or the other Black-oriented R&B and/or disco stations in town. In short, WRVR has become an alternative for many people. We are, in essence, a Jazz station for people who are not necessarily experts or even devotees of Jazz. We are also a station that believes it is important to serve the people who are Jazz aficionados, and it is thus that we play the best of both contemporary and traditional Jazz. In any given hour, a listener will not only hear the top selling Jazz albums by such name artists as GEORGE BENSON, WEATHER REPORT, or HERBIE HANCOCK; he or she will also hear selections from early MILES DAVIS, JOHN COLTRANE, DAVE BRUBECK, or perhaps more esoteric masters as ART TATUM.

In regard to WRVR's para-musical programming, Halper described the station's jocks as being "...human beings who neither try to sound 'hip' nor 'laid-back.' We try basically to convey our love for the music and our sincere desire to expose the best from all kinds of Jazz. Perhaps we might be called a 'Progressive Jazz Station,' and I certainly believe we are AOR in our thinking and methodology."

In addition to the aforementioned profile, WRVR features guest artist interviews, concert ticket giveaways, and live radio concerts, a la AOR radio.

Jazz is a form of music that continues to maintain a hold on the periphery of the body of diverse music that has come to be known as Album Oriented Rock. Many music industry participants and observers claim that the form is on the popularity rise. If this, indeed is the case, WRVR may represent a needed form of the AOR style that might very well in the future, develop into a segment as significant to the radio industry, the record industry, and, of course the public, that, say, the Soft-AOR segment has proven to be.

Call Me At Home

WGRQ (Q-FM-97)/Buffalo Program Director JOHN MCGHAN informed R&R of his station's very unusual television ad campaign. In his own words, "Q-FM-97 has a relatively low promotional budget. It's next to impossible to compete with the giant cash giveaways that our three major competitors are involved with. Therefore, to create a BUZZ on the street, I recorded a quiet TV spot asking viewers to turn off their TV's and turn on Q-FM-97 RIGHT NOW and if they had any suggestions as to how Q-FM could be better they should call me at home. I then listed my home number on TV. The response was absolutely overwhelming. I've been able to determine several irritants on the station I never perceived and immediately corrected them. This week Q-FM is airing three specials called for by the listeners. We're shaping this into 'Q-FM's Listener Input' motif. I can only describe this 'listener input' ideas as overwhelming."

Interesting how radio seems to be moving out of an era in which it seemed to isolate itself from direct contact with the listeners "on the air" in terms of requests, feedback, etc. KRLA proved that it can be most effective in Los Angeles, and now competitor K-100 seems to be employing the same method on the air and it sounds really competitive. It'll be interesting to see how the direct "tell us and we'll react" approach will work in AOR radio. After all, the best research is that which goes right to the source, and the best community involvement IS just that...community involvement. All eyes on Buffalo!

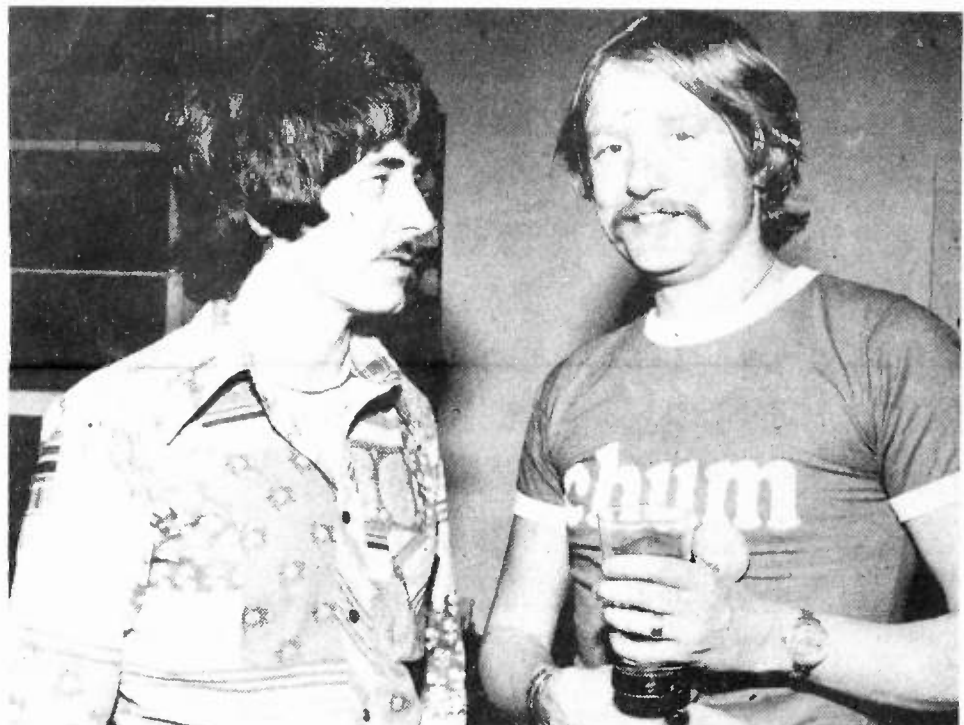

A Look At Miami's AOR Ratings Battle

As the Spring '77 Arbitron survey comes to a conclusion, Southeastern Florida shapes up as "anxious," to say the least, in terms of AOR radio competition.

WSHE/Miami PD Gary Granger recently affirmed a "good healthy battle in AOR" in the Miami market. Bill Stedman, PD of WINZ (ZETA 4)/Miami agrees, as they approach the conclusion of this very significant rating period for both stations.

WSHE is the established AOR station, on the air for nearly six years. ZETA 4, new to the scene approximately 1 1/2 years ago, has made very strong gains in the ratings, showing an overall 3.8 to SHE's 1.6 in the October/November '76 Arbitron.

Popular belief has stamped Miami as a market dominated by transients, a large ethnic population, and the elderly, but this has not stopped the progression of AOR radio in Southeastern Florida. Bill Stedman explained, "The semi-transient population doesn't concern us; juxtaposed to that is one of the basic concepts of Rock and Roll—the word is tonight." For a basically three county area with a three million TSA, both programmers claim to employ fairly tight music programming policies with extensive research playing a significant role in their programming decisions.

In addition to their weekly store calls and instore sales research, ZETA 4 makes approximately 200-300 random calls per week to their target 18-34 year old audience, testing their radio listening habits and song preferences.

WSHE involves listeners as test audiences for new product, sending selected participants copies of new LPs for their critical evaluation. WSHE research is aimed at the more passive listener, not necessarily a record buyer or concert goer.

The October/November '76 Arbitron reflects high 18-34 male numbers for ZETA 4, which might suggest a harder Rock sound, but Bill Stedman explains, "High male numbers don't reflect a hard approach primarily to males. ZETA 4 is a communicative radio station, we're very human and talk like people. We feature lots of classic Rock and highlight a warm sound, a familiar sound rather than specific artists. We talk to people, not at them." He further explained that while taking their music research into consideration, ZETA 4 relies heavily on their ears and gut feelings as they reach for the music that will reflect the sound and image of the station. Stedman attributes their recent rating achievements to a "market situation that was ripe for new energies, competition that seemed to have lost sight of their format and their audience, and of course, the hot sound of ZETA 4."

On the other hand, Gary Granger at WSHE is banking on their consistency to pull back the listeners they lost in the last book. Programming an AOR format since August '71, "We have never really let the people down, they know they can depend on SHE to fulfill certain needs. Any new station adds a different touch, something novel. After the audience tries something new, they'll come back to what they can depend on." According to Granger, WSHE did not overreact to their losses in the last book. "We serve the same purpose, same audience. Our main advantage is that we have established a proven successful sound, and we are staying with that sound." Granger told R&R that WSHE compiles as many barometers as possible in their programming research, relying heavily on listener input—and that their goal is "understanding the audience and reading their changes, gathering as much input as possible and then trying to reflect that to our target audience."

Bill Stedman concluded, "SHE has never sounded better, they're gonna make some smoke this time; they have not rolled over and played dead, but then neither have we."

Should be an interesting book.

Council now readily agrees that it has returned the city more revenue, many times over, than the property was worth when the city "sold" it to CMA for \$1. The income of the museum pays 85% to 90% of its overall operating costs with its income from what is expected to be 500,000 tourists in 1977.

Attendance at this seminar seems to grow at the same rate as the growth of Gospel radio programming, this year's registration up 30% over 1976. RICHARD LAMB, ARB's Regional Director from Atlanta spoke to the topic of ratings in Gospel radio; RICHARD MACK, Southeast Manager of RAB-Atlanta addressed

sales and advertising; LES ACREE, PD at WKDA/Nashville presented a look at music mix; BOB HENSLER, WSST/Largo, Florida made a promotional presentation, and ERIC aucoin, Director of Radio for the Christian Broadcasting Network chaired a panel on "Measuring Your Potential Audience."
