Playboy's "New Phase"; Takayoshi Resigns

Tom Takayoshi, President of Playboy Records, resigned Friday (10-21), amid industry speculation as to the label's future plans. Takayoshi told R&R, referring to the company's parent organization, Playboy Enterprises: "They wanted to cut the organization down. I just didn't want to be part of it. There were vast philosophical differences between us."

According to Dick Rosenzweig, Executive Vice President of Playboy Enterprises, the label will not be discontinued. He told R&R that although Playboy's recent distribution deal with CBS Records had worked out satisfactorily, "it is now our feeling that it's time to move into another phase with our record operation. The new phase will be in the best interest of our artists, our label, and the corporation." He stated that talks with

CBS were being held to determine the direction of the new phase, but that in any case staff cutbacks were considered necessary.

Resigning along with Takayoshi were National Promotion Director John Wellman, with R&B Promotion Director Jay Butler staying on to complete ongoing promotion assignments and subsequently departing. Playboy's Nashville division, under the leadership of Eddie Kilroy, remains, as does a small staff at the label's Los Angeles headquarters. A spokesman for Beserkley Records, a key component in Playboy's AOR orientation, stated that the small Bay Area-based company's distribution pact with Playboy had terminated in September, but that Beserkley was grateful for Playboy's efforts in establishing it on a national basis.

Bly Appointed Promotion VP At MCA

Stan Bly has been appointed Vice President of Promotion at MCA Records, it was announced by company President Mike Maitland. Bly was most recently Vice President of Promotion at Polydor Records, and had been affiliated with the Polygram Group for eight years save for a term as Vice President of Promotion at Arista Records earlier in 1977.

Bly told R&R: "I have a tremendous amount of professional respect and very close personal relationships with Irwin Steinberg and Lou Simon. But I've been away from Los Angeles for almost nine years and I'm very excited about coming home and working with Mike Mait-



land, Denny Rosencrantz, and Richard Bibby at MCA."

Bly will assume his new duties shortly, with further appointments expected to be announced at a later date.

Beer To Head Promotion At 20th Century

Lenny Beer has been appointed Vice President/National Promotion Director of 20th Century Records. Beer was Vice President of Marketing for Record World, and was widely credited with pioneering a number of innovations in the magazine's chart methodology. In making the announcement, 20th Century Senior Vice President Harvey Cooper stated, "Lenny Beer, in my opinion, will bring several new dimensions to the record business. His overall intelligent view of radio, research, and contemporary promotion is a rare insight from a great observer. His outstanding character was one of the first notable characteristics which ... attracted us to him. We felt that Lenny stuck to his guns in many a hard debate and accomplished seemingly insurmountable tasks."

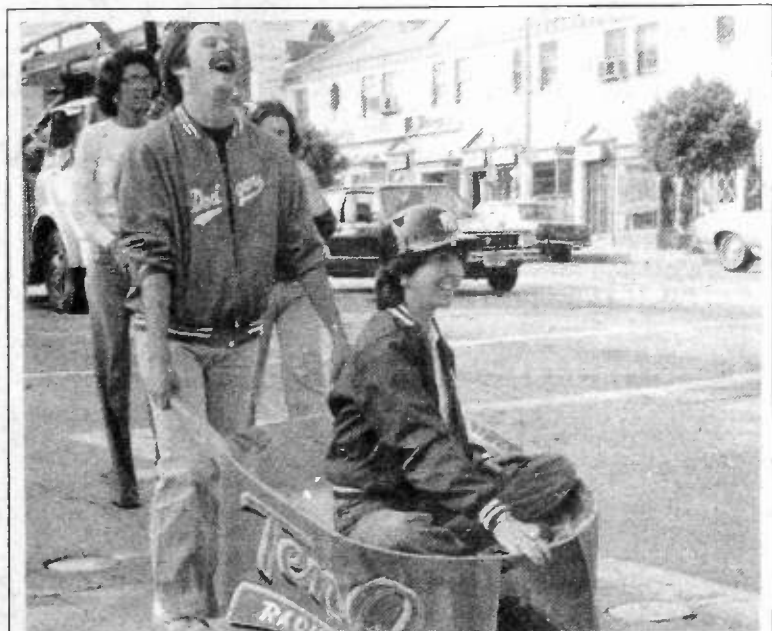
Beer told R&R: "The reason I'm leaving is that I feel this is a great opportunity for me, more than anything else. The people at Record World have always treated me very well. I've been there five years and I really feel that it's time to move on. 20th Century is a company on the upswing, and I feel that the new management team is going to be highly aggressive. I'd like to thank the people at Record World and the people in the industry for helping me to learn, and now



I'm ready to put some of the things I learned into practice."

Joining Beer at 20th Century is former Record World Research Director Toni Profera, who will become National Singles Promotion Director. Beer commented, "Toni has been with me from the start. She's the strongest female in the entire industry; and soon everybody will know it. She's been dealing with radio stations at Record World out of New York." Profera was with the magazine for seven years.

Assuming the position of National Field Promotion Director is Kevin Keogh. He was most recently in promotion at ABC Records, and worked at Chelsea previously. Earlier, he worked in the radio field. Barry Goldberg will assume the post of National Album Promotion Director.

Court Enjoins Mushroom On Heart "Magazine" LP

A panel of three U.S. District Court of Appeals judges in San Francisco voted 2-1 to enjoin Mushroom Records from releasing their Heart album, "Magazine," pending an appeal from the group and their new label, Portrait Records. Taking into consideration the 28-day period permitted for making the appeal, and forecasts of further delays, Mushroom, according to label President Shelly Siegel, is planning to request stations currently playing the controversial album to hold off on airplay until the situation is closer to resolution. The "Magazine" album has been the subject of legal actions and controversy since last year. At one point, Mushroom received a short-lived clearance to release the album, which was shipped to radio stations, reviewers, and a limited number of Southern California retail outlets. Litigation then ensued

once more, with the album once again going into limbo and copies reportedly selling for \$10 and over in collectors' circles.

Lynyrd Skynyrd Survivors To Disband

Following the plane crash that took the lives of three group members, Lynyrd Skynyrd has decided to disband, according to MCA sources. Four other members of the group were injured when a chartered twin-engine plane crashed near Gillsburg, Mississippi Thursday night (10-20).

Lead singer and principal songwriter Ronnie Van Zant, 28; guitarist Steve Gaines, 28; vocalist Cassie Gaines, 29, were killed in the crash, along with the pilot, co-pilot, and assistant road manager Dean Kilpatrick. Leon Wilkeson, Artimus Pyle, Gary Rossington, and Allen Collins

of the group were among the 20 injured, with Wilkeson listed in critical condition.

The plane, which had earlier developed engine trouble, ran out of gas en route to Baton Rouge from Greenville, South Carolina. According to one report, the group had reservations about the plane's safety and were planning to vote on whether to use it again after landing in Baton Rouge.

Lynyrd Skynyrd had just released their sixth album on MCA Records, ironically titled "Street Survivors" (which, in a further unhappy irony, contained a coupon for T-shirts and other accessories called the "Lynyrd Skynyrd Survival Kit"). The LP had just received gold certification, as had previous albums like "Nuthin' Fancy" and the live "One More From The Road." Lynyrd Skynyrd had become one of the most popular Southern Rock groups in the world, following closely on the Allman Brothers Band, another Southern group plagued by tragedy (two members killed in motorcycle accidents). The Florida based band was best known for numbers like "Sweet Home Alabama" and their theme song, the extended "Free Bird," an AOR programming staple. Services for Steve and Cassie Gaines were held over the weekend, and for Ronnie Van Zant on Tuesday (10-25).

EDITORIAL:

Call-Out Research

For years the industry has faced the challenge of determining the likes and dislikes of the elusive passive radio audience.

The newest technique developed to tackle the problem is "call-out research."

Unfortunately, very few of the programmers putting together "call-out research" questionnaires, and in some cases excerpts of songs for playing to prospective passives, have ever been professionally educated as to the actual scientific techniques of this evolving form of research. As a result, they may end up with drastic misinterpretations of biased research.

An even greater problem arises when trade and tip publications combine various sources and print this unqualified data, and other programmers begin to follow it without questioning its validity.

Answers are not always easily found. Don't depend on someone else's research to program your market.

Most important, learn all you can about the kind of research you intend to conduct—take a college course, read a few books. There are no short cuts to winning.

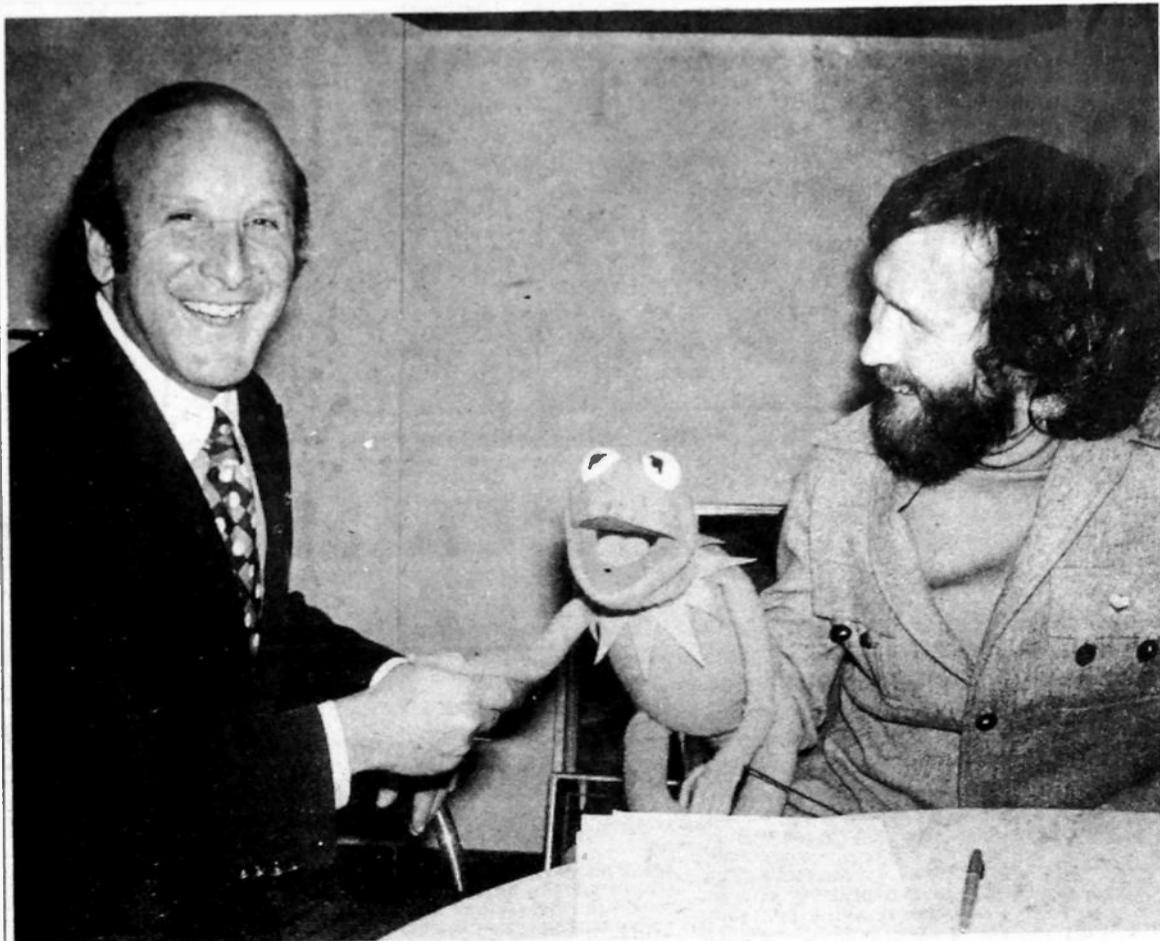

VW Shifts Ad Emphasis Towards Radio

Volkswagen of America, still lagging in third place in the car import standings despite improved sales performance, is rethinking its advertising approach. Citing "out of hand" TV costs and a move towards more selective magazine ad buys, the company is planning to utilize spot radio in its fall schedule for the first time in about eight years. The company is of the opinion that its new models--Rabbit, Dasher, Scirocco--are well enough established in the public mind that radio can effectively call them to listeners' attention without TV's visual stimulus. The company's planned fourth quarter media buy ratio of 70% TV, 25% magazines, and 5% radio, outdoor, and newspaper, is subject to review for 1978 and may be slanted to radio's benefit. Volkswagen has also adopted a new theme line for the next two years: "Volkswagen does it again."

Columbia Sets "Close Encounters" Blitz

Columbia Pictures is gearing up for a massive media campaign in support of its upcoming UFO-themed film "Close Encounters Of The Third Kind." Advertising, in radio, TV, and print media, will stress that close encounters of the first kind constitute the sighting of a UFO, the second kind involve securing evidence, and the third kind represents actual contact. The campaign starts around mid-November, with a novel TV strategy called "roadblocking"--scheduling 90-second commercials on all three networks simultaneously. Columbia also plans major merchandising strategies, including a soundtrack record of some sort, in an attempt to ignite a "Star Wars"-style phenomenon.

Dr. Pepper Peps Up Radio, TV Ad Campaign

Dr. Pepper, launching a drive to overtake 7Up as the nation's third most popular soft drink, will debut a new campaign in November. The TV portion will introduce the concept of "Peppers," young dynamic people who drink Dr. Pepper and are proud of it. Commercials will feature Country-styled music and will be shown on a number of music-oriented specials (Paul Simon's Dec. 8 NBC special, ABC's "New Year's Rockin' Eve," and upcoming Barry Manilow and Paul Anka specials). On radio, artists including 10cc, the Atlanta Rhythm Section, Donna Summer, Charlie Rich, and the Side of the Road Gang will be featured on Dr. Pepper spots.

Taft Into Tampa, Buys WYNF

Taft Broadcasting, on something of a buying binge of late, has agreed to purchase WYNF/Tampa-St. Petersburg from Rahall Communications for \$2 million. The transaction is subject to the completion of Rahall's proposed merger into Gulf United Co., as well as execution of a formal contract and FCC approval.

Ali A Lethal Anti-Bug Voice

Muhammad Ali has been signed by Sterling Drug's d-Con Co. as the official spokesman for its line of d-Con insecticides. Ali will represent the company on radio spots, as well as TV, outdoor, and print ads; the spots should be a technical knockout.

WCI Has Record Nine Months, Third Quarter

Revenues from the record and film divisions spurred Warner Communications Inc. to new record profit figures for the third quarter and for the nine months ending Sept. 30. Third quarter overall profits were up 7% to \$16.6 million, while nine-months earnings increased 8% to \$50.9 million. Record earnings (including music publishing) were up 13% to \$17.2 million for the third quarter, compared to film profits (including movies and TV) leaping 53% to \$17.9 million from \$11.7 million last year. Records, however, still registered a higher overall profit figure for the nine-month period, with \$53.8 million (up 19%) compared to \$49 million (up 35% over last year) for filmed entertainment.

7Up Shifts Ad Emphasis To People

Seven-Up Co., whose TV ads have focused on elaborate abstract visual spectacles in the past, are concentrating on actual people in a January campaign. However, the "UNdo it" theme will continue in a new jingle utilizing Rock, Country, and R&B styles.

Sex Film Industry Attacks Times Ad Ban

The sex film industry, as represented by the Adult Film Association of America and a group of producers, exhibitors, and distributors, have taken action against the L.A. Times, which banned sex film ads August 23, on two fronts. A \$45 million lawsuit was filed, accusing the paper of engaging in an "intentional, malicious, and willful" attack against the hard-core industry. At the same time, a complaint was filed with the Federal Trade Commission asking that the Times be cited for illegal restraint of the trade.

The FTC petition stated that the Times had banned films that were not legally obscene "nor otherwise unlawful, but rather are communication and expression protected by the free speech and free press provisions of the First Amendment." It termed the Times' policy "arbitrary, irrational, and discriminatory," citing ads in the paper for other films it maintains are "dealing graphically and explicitly with such subjects as violence, war and racism." The petition cites "severe economic loss" as a result of the Times ban, which other L.A. area papers have followed.

FM Translators Can Go Solo

The FCC has amended its rules to permit the unattended operation of FM translator stations, bringing the regulations in line with guidelines for TV translators. Translators are low-power devices which receive signals and convert them to different frequencies, retransmitting them to remote and/or low-population areas.

Tobacco Subs Fizzle In UK

Cigarettes using a tobacco substitute called NSM (New Smoking Material) has encountered dismal response in the British market, with the leading manufacturer (Imperial Tobacco) laying off its staff. 12 brands using the cellulose-based secret cigarette substance were launched in the spring of 1977, with over \$5 million spent on advertising. Manufacturers were hoping for a 5% share of the market, but won only 2%. Apparently the British are attached to their tobacco, and feel much like the Nashville Teens did in their 1964 hit: "I despise it 'cause it's filthy/But I love it...Tobacco Road."

"Your Place" Ready To Go

McCall Publishing Company is set to debut a new magazine called Your Place on February 28, 1978. The publication is aimed at what they call "the New Twenties," active singles and couples in the 20-30 age bracket, and Your Place professes to be "the total medium" for the age group, providing information, ideas, humor, and entertainment. A new attempt to capture the post-teen youth market should be interesting to watch.

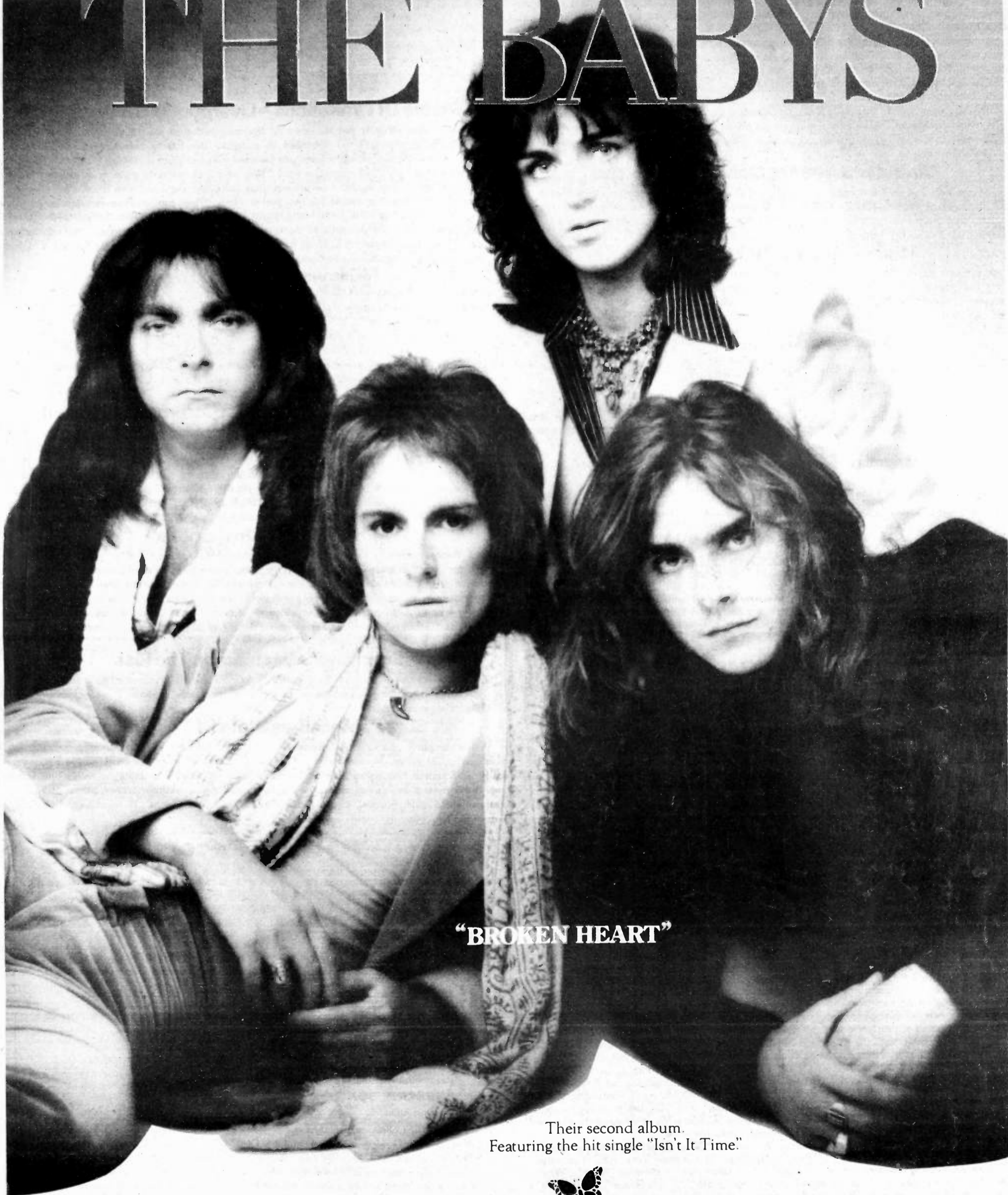

What's New?

Own Your Own Phone

The Supreme Court has declined to review a two-year-old FCC order permitting consumers to buy their own telephones without paying a special fee to the phone company. Previously only large businesses have found it financially feasible to buy their own equipment; Bell's fees for "protective devices" outweighed any potential benefits for small business or individuals. The advantages of the new scheme of things will probably include significantly lowered prices for purchased phone equipment. For radio stations, the new situation allows customized phone systems to be installed to fit the individual station's needs and desires. Stations might also consider awarding custom phone installations as premiums for listeners.

Disadvantages include the potential of repair fees (the phone company provided that service free for its rented equipment), and a conceivable rise in phone rates by the Bell system to make up for lost revenues in the equipment rental sphere. Still, most consumers evaluating the new situation should get a buzz out of it.

Mattel Is Swell For Columbia Pictures

Reports from the financial community indicate that Columbia Pictures is toying with the idea of acquiring Mattel, Inc. Columbia has reportedly been buying up stock in the top toy concern, and a spokesman confirmed that Mattel was one of three or four companies that Columbia was looking into buying.

Mighty Mouths Off To Good Start

A company called One-Up, Inc., is hoping they've stumbled across the next Pet Rock with their line of mini-puppets, particularly the new "Mighty Mouth." It's a tiny, wide-mouthed apparatus held between the thumb and forefinger, and comes with clothes accessories, makeup, and a detailed instruction manual, flippantly written with information on competitive Mighty Mouth sports like fly-trapping and how to use the puppet as an alter ego. Could be worth looking into for a novelty giveaway/promotional item. They retail for \$3.00 and details are available from One-Up, Inc. 124 East Alton Ave., Santa Ana, CA 92707, (714) 540-3944.

Minority Report Blasts Networks, Majority Violence Report

A minority report authored by six members of the House Communications Subcommittee attacked the conclusions of the Subcommittee's recent report on TV violence, stating that it spreads the blame for violence on television away from the networks to a meaningless extent. "We believe the report is biased in favor of the networks," the report stated. It said the majority report took an unwarrantedly favorable view of TV industry self-regulation, ignored affirmative regulatory action alternatives, and failed to look into possible relationships between the network-dominated structure of the broadcast industry and the level of TV violence. The minority report also scored the family hour viewing concept, citing millions of children watching TV after 9 pm, and stating that in the Central and Rocky Mountain time zones, where network TV schedules are set back an hour, the family hour ended at 8 pm and was totally ineffective. The report accused the majority of attempting an evasion of the TV violence issue, and termed it a calculated distortion. Network reaction has yet to come in.

Foxx On The Run—Redd Foxx has been beleaguered lately, with Farrah Fawcett-Majors and her parents both demanding apologies for a recent satirical skit (the parents have filed a \$7 million lawsuit). Now Dolly Parton has reportedly demanded an apology for certain anatomical references Foxx made towards her on his October 20 show. Foxx is standing firm in the Fawcett furor, refusing to make any sort of apology, but apparently he wants out of his ABC series, which has six episodes yet to be filmed under current agreements. Depending partially on whether or not a recent upward ratings trend continues, Foxx may get his wish.

A number of top Country stars are scheduled for TV action, headed by Jerry Lee Lewis, set for a special tentatively titled "Whole Lotta Shakin' Goin' On...Still!," a tribute to Lewis' 22-year career commencing filming in January...Roy Clark is the special guest star on the Johnny Cash Christmas Special on CBS, which also features June Carter Cash, Carl Perkins, Roy Orbison, and Jerry Lee Lewis once more...And Loretta Lynn, Mel Tillis, Ronnie Milsap, Gene Autry, Freddie Fender, and, once again, Roy Clark, are set for appearances on NBC's January special "Fifty Years Of Country Music, Part I."

Series A Ratings Home Run; ABC All The Way

Paced by the first three World Series telecasts, ABC easily won the ratings battle for the week ending October 16, netting a 23.9 rating to NBC's 17.6 and CBS's 17.4. The latter two networks, however, each had two Top 10 entries, although preemptions of some of ABC's top shows by the Series may have been a contributing factor.

The second game of the Series was the week's top-rater, with a 30.4 score. Game number one was second at 30.2, with the third game at 30.1, good for third place. Fourth was ABC's "Three's Company," bumped out of its usual Tuesday night spot for the Series but still holding up just fine on Thursday. Following were 5) CBS's "All In The Family," with a special one-hour presentation 6) "Dick Clark's Good Ol' Days" on NBC, a major triumph for the Rock-oriented special 7) ABC's Sunday Night Movie "White Line Fever" 8) "60 Minutes", continuing a solid showing for CBS's news show 9) ABC's "What's Happening" and 10) the opening two-hour segment of NBC's "Big Event," "79 Park Avenue." CBS's "Country Music Awards" finished an impressive 11th, considering the heavy baseball competition for the week.

In the Arbitron standings for the week ending October 14, NBC managed to break the ongoing ABC monopoly in Los Angeles (with one show in the Top 10). In New York, ABC dominated, with "Three's Company" leading the pack, followed by a three-way tie between "Soap," "What's Happening," and the first game of the World Series. Continuing, 5) was Game Two, 6) NBC's "Monday Night Movie" tied with "Welcome Back Kotter," 8) NBC's "Laugh-In" tying with the third game of the Series, and, far behind in a three-way tie for 10th, "Love Boat," "Six Million Dollar Man," and in an impressive ratings comeback, "Redd Foxx."

Los Angeles gave the World Series opener the top spot, followed by the second and third games at 2) and 3). Monday Night Football took fourth place. Then, 5) was "Three's Company," 6) the last game of the playoffs on NBC 7) "Love Boat," "Six Million Dollar Man," and "Soap" tied, and 10) "White Line Fever."

Rowan Assistant To President At ABC

Alan Rowan has been named Assistant to the President at ABC Records, according to label President Steve Diener. He will become involved in all areas of the company "on a special projects basis." He was most recently Director of Planning within the record division, and has been at ABC since 1970, starting as a financial analyst.



Statue Of Limitations—Liverpool Nixes Beatles

Despite having virtually put the town on the map as far as most Americans under 40 are concerned, the Beatles are still regarded as a mixed blessing in hometown Liverpool. Last week the city's General Purposes Committee rejected plans to erect a statue in honor of the four Beatles by a 10-8 vote. One councillor said, "They aren't worthy of a place in our history. They made a lot of money and we have never seen them since they departed from the scene." Another, even more testy councillor added his two pence worth: "They turned down requests to appear in the city for official functions. I am dead against having the statue. They ended up taking drugs and bringing tremendous discredit to the city. They could not sing for toffee," he concluded, offering a final insult to injury. A local music appreciation society's plans to substitute a statue of Gerry & the Pacemakers have not yet gotten off the ground.

All News That's Good News

Radio News Hotline bills itself as the "first and only publication to serve radio news and sports," and the sample issues sent to R&R contained a thorough cross-section of radio news and sports coverage, along with editorials, openings, and an interesting Gallup Poll summary of the public's opinion of radio's most important components. Memphis Paper Has Russian Commercial Appeal

The Memphis Commercial Appeal, in cooperation with the State Department, distributed 500 copies of its special 12-page edition commemorating the memory of Elvis Presley to "musicians and known Rock fans" behind the Iron Curtain, free of charge. "We always have been acutely aware of Elvis Presley's worldwide popularity and the distinctive American influence his career has had, even in countries such as Russia, where it's difficult for private citizens to keep up with his career and music," said the paper's editor, Michael Grehl. "Presley's success is a positive statement about life in America, and that's a good reason to make its details widely available."

CBS Video On Campus

CBS Records, already focusing on the college market with special artist interview disks (as reported previously in R&R), is now moving into video tape presentations of its artists for collegiate consumers. Working with VTN (Video Tape Network), CBS is marketing and leasing one-hour video tapes to on-campus student organizations on a weekly basis. Each tape is made up of four 15-minute segments, the first featuring Mother's Finest, Cheap Trick, Heart, and Southside Johnny & the Asbury Jukes. Campuses receive unlimited playback rights. Sounds like a service that organizations outside of colleges might be interested in as well.

Executive Searching On The Rise

Business for executive search firms has risen 28% over last year's figures, according to an Association of Executive Recruiting Consultants survey. A further 18% increase is expected for 1978 as the search surge continues.

Survey Measures State Of The Unions

A new computer study from A.T. Kearney, Inc. of Chicago measures relative organizing success of unions in 20 states. Florida and North Carolina measured up as the most hostile anti-union states, with unions scoring success in Tennessee and Kentucky. As union activities and labor costs are important factors for business weighing relocation, the Kearney survey, aimed at helping business avoid union turmoil, could prove beneficial in that regard. The company eventually plans to provide county-by-county union data.

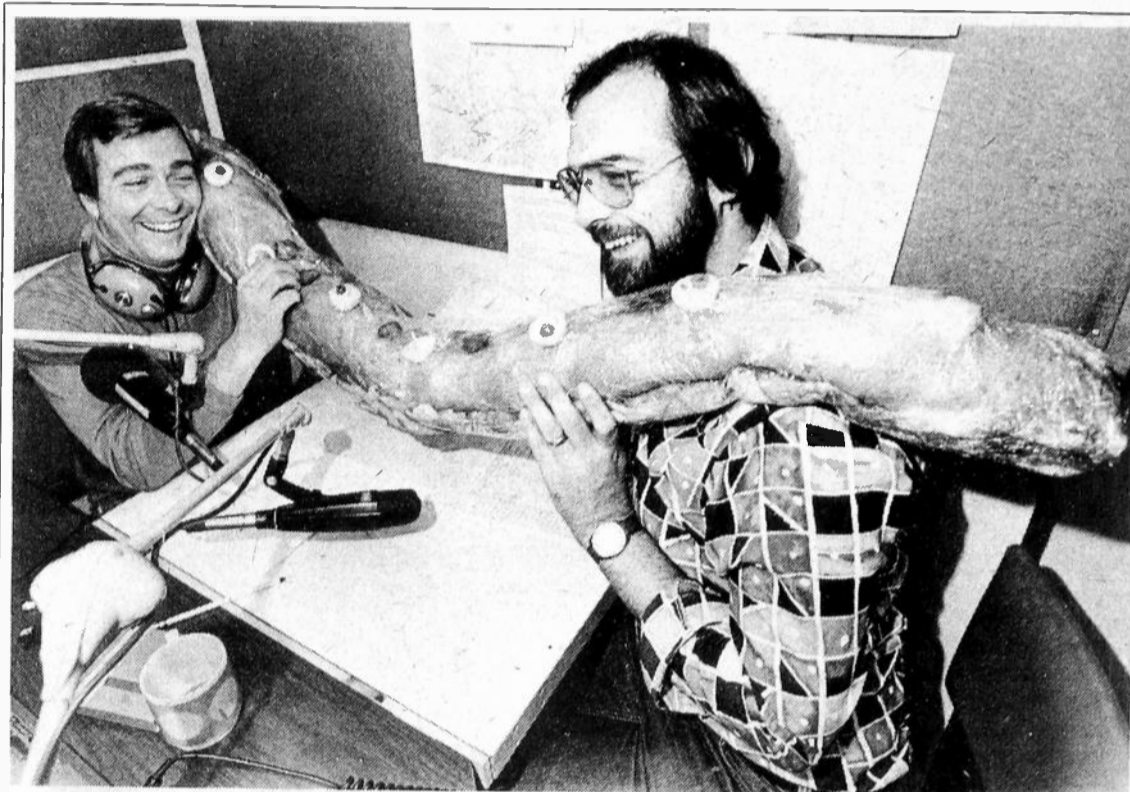

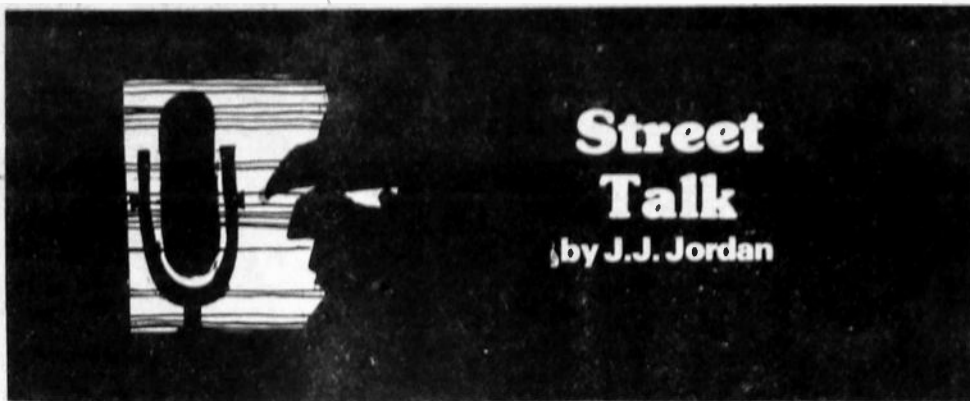

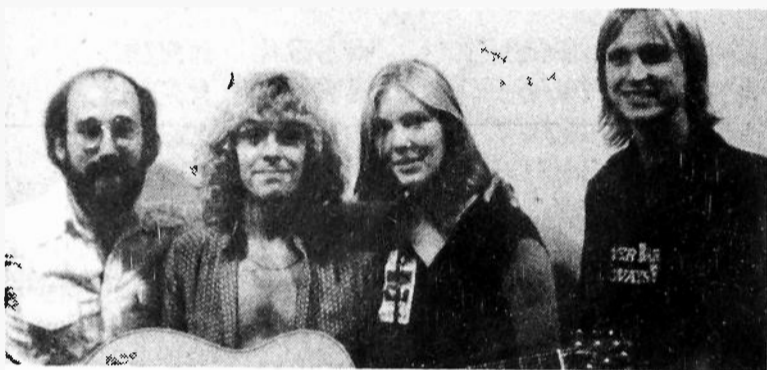

ments. However, his typification of AOR with "acid" rock and his reference to the "teen mentality" of "today's young programmers" because of AOR influence are an affront to the integrity of today's AOR programmers. His statements are about as accurate as WEEI suggesting that the Electric Prunes and the Flying Burrito Brothers are still in hot rotation at the competition. Is Bob Pittman a success because of his teen mentality?

People "forget that AOR is a narrow-range non-mass appeal format" because it isn't anymore. All over this country there are innovative programmers working to convert AOR from the narrow-range format "acid" was, to an important, if not leading, segment of the mass-media. Within the past two years in our own market, the two AOR's have taken a 15 percent combined share—strongly upstaging the established Top 40's, out of thirty-three stations, both of them racking up impressive top five numbers, 18-49, not just 18-24 as Mike implies. Does he believe that if someone enjoys albums, they are not an adult? Even in a more conservative market such as Richmond, Virginia, the AOR DAYTIME AM radio station continues to hold a significant 18-34 men against strong FM Top 40 competition. Who suffers? Not the AOR, but the AM Top 40, just as those in the Norfolk market. Look at Chicago—a market where Mike had significant impact of his own not long ago; the fact that as many AOR's can survive there attests to the increase in the strength of AOR radio.

I suggest that if there is confusion in AM Top 40 radio, it is because AM Top 40 programmers, young and old, are asking "What next?" and the success of AOR as a growing mass-appeal format is just one of the areas they look to for ideas. I can say this as one who was raised on Top 40, and programmed Top 40 and MOR before moving to AOR. I've been there—and I have friends who are there right now, and I know the pressure they face as they look to the future. 35-49's no longer ask for Tommy Dorsey; they want more Elvis. And established AOR listeners are getting older, increasing the upper demographic strength of album oriented stations every day. What we face is the end of the Top 40 DOMINATION concept—but not the end of Top 40. When Mike refers to the need for Rock (Top 40) stations to start communication with their audiences, he may be right, but he fails to see that is just what a major portion of the success of today's AOR is. And that kind of programming is creating a teen mentality in upcoming media professionals?

If so, Mike has just bitten either his mentality or communication theory in the tail. Whether referring to Pop/Adult or AOR, I would like to think that his point about communication is valid because it covers most of what I stand for as a programmer.

The fact is that Top 40, Pop/Adult, Country and AOR programmers today are the same people, working for similar goals, just in slightly different branches of a more diversified media. We can still learn from each other, and we must work with each other to maximize communication with our separate and combined audiences. If today's new programmers are affected by the AOR we know now, then Top 40 should be better for it; just as AOR has learned much from Top 40 innovators like Mike Joseph.

It not only sounds good, but some games are sold out to local sponsors months in advance.

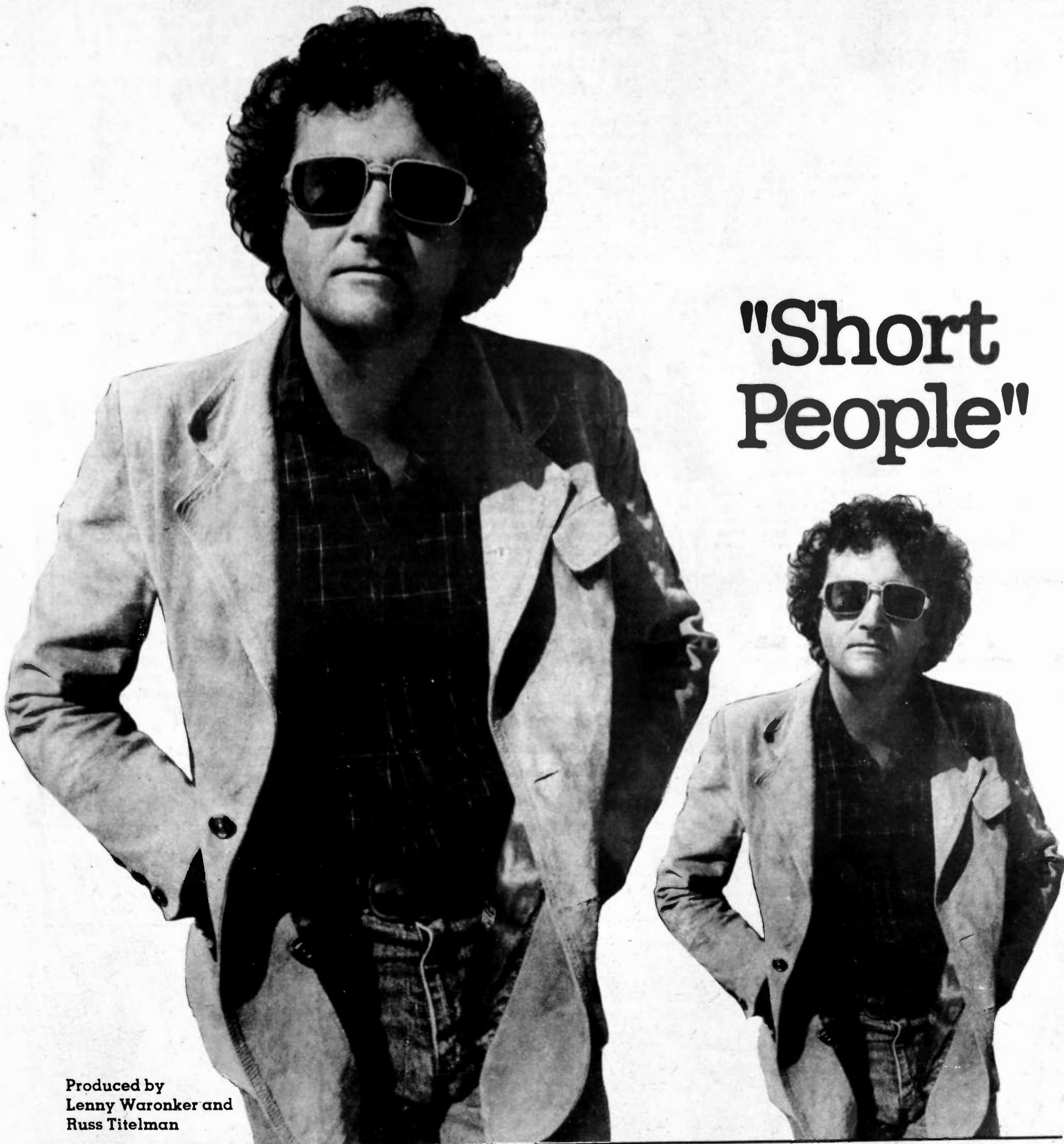
Thanks again for an enlightening article on a great radio person: Charlie Lake. We could use dozens more like him in this business.

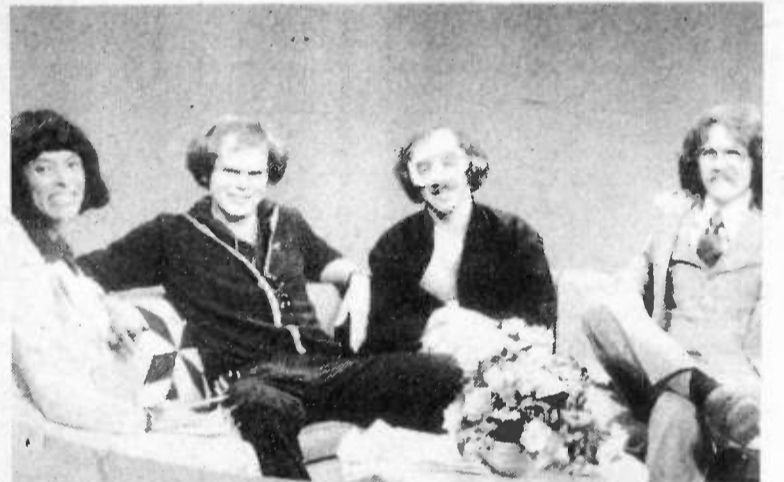

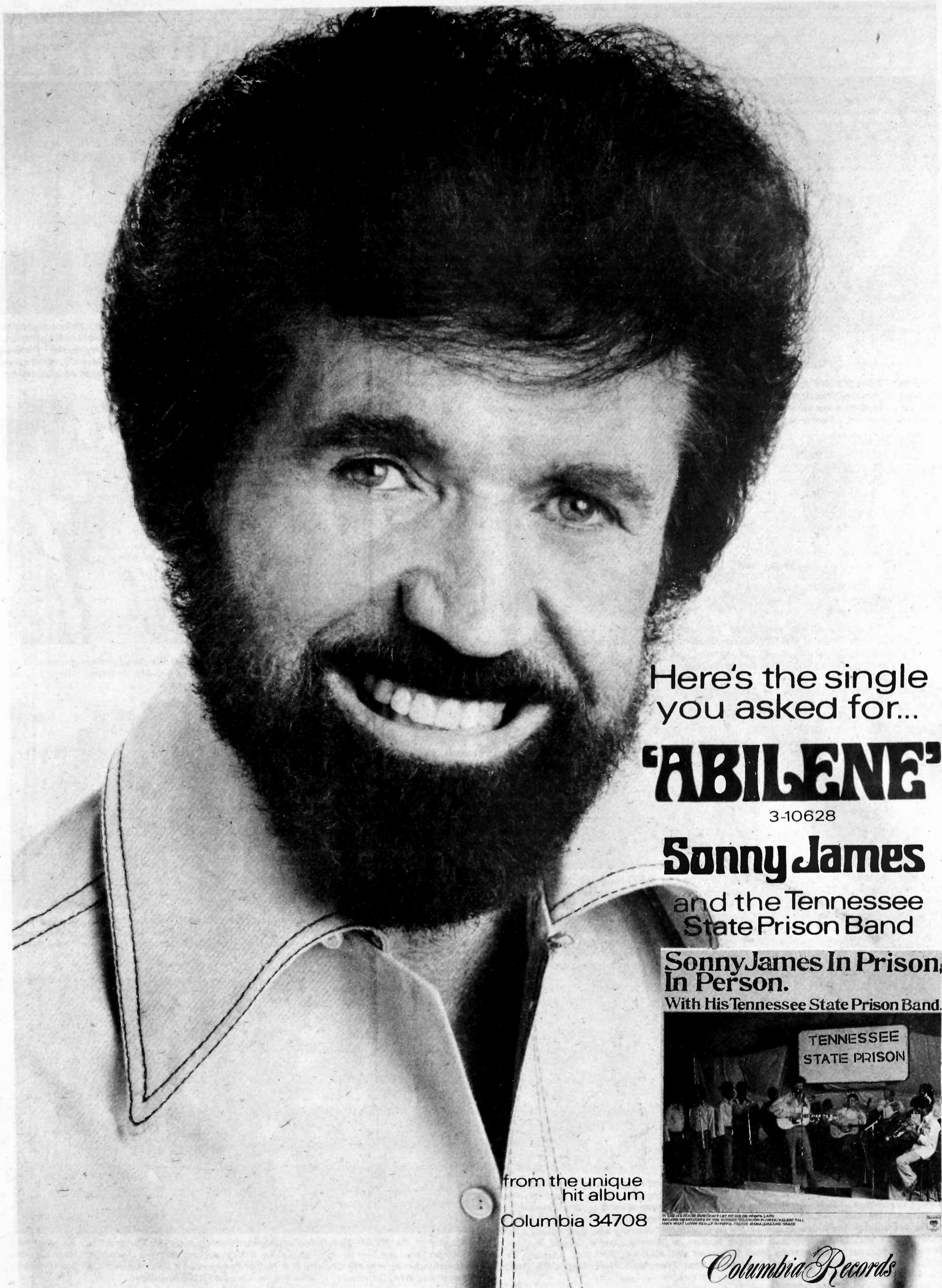
