## Montana Station Loses License

An FCC judge Tuesday (5-29) denied the renewal of KDRG-AM/Deer Lodge, MT because owner David Fransen had 1) transferred control of the station without prior FCC approval, 2) violated numerous technical rules, 3) falsified station logs, and 4) misrepresented the logs to the FCC.

The case came to the Commission's attention when GM John McPartlin brought a lawsuit against Fransen charging that he interfered with KDRG's operations, put its license in jeopardy, and breached a lease-purchase agreement. McPartlin had entered into an agreement with Fransen Aug. 14, 1976 to purchase the station after operating it under a lease for three years.

Judge Daniel Head found the agreement violated Section 310(d) of the Communications Act of 1934, which prohibits transfer of a station license without prior FCC approval. R&R has learned that at one point during their squabbles, Fransen cut off the station's electricity.

The administrative law judge said that although the technical violations and log falsifications alone might have warranted a fine rather than denial of license, the other violations combined to show a "pattern of disregard for FCC regulations."

Judge Head ruled that employees, particularly the licensee's wife, had falsified signatures and fabricated entries in the station's operating logs. In addition, he said Fransen had lied about the operating logs in written statements.

Violations were initially uncovered by the Commission's Seattle Field Operations Bureau, which noticed KDRG occasionally operating at daytime power during nighttime hours.

## Harte-Hanks Acquires Radio & Records

Harte-Hanks Communications, Inc. has agreed in principle to acquire Radio & Records, Inc. R&R President Bob Wilson made the following statement on Tuesday (5-29):

"The acquisition of Radio & Records by Harte-Hanks Communications Corporation signifies our solid commitment to this industry. R&R has made giant leaps in a very short space of time. In five years, we've become the industry's leading trade publication, with fully staffed offices in Los Angeles and Washington, D.C."

Bob Marbut, President and Chief Executive Officer of Harte-Hanks Communications, commented: "Bob Wilson and his associates

WFMT, a Classical-formatted Chicago FM station, will become the first radio "superstation." United Video, Inc. will offer the station's programming 24 hours a day to cable systems nationwide, pending FCC approval. The signal will be transmitted by microwave, along with WGN-TV/Chicago's signal (which United Video has been carrying as a superstation), to an RCA satellite station in Lake Geneva, WI, and then to RCA's Satcom I satellite. Cable systems

subscribing to WGN-TV will also be able to pick up WFMT and distribute it to subscribers. The implications of a radio superstation transmitting nationwide were viewed as vast, with informed speculation indicating that a number of cable operations would soon be seeking potential radio superstations of their own.

### Classical Class

WFMT President/General Manager Raymond Nordstrand told R&R, "We are certainly flattered

to be the station they chose. They were looking for a station with a very high quality signal and a unique programming service that was not available in all communities. We fit the bill; they chose us as the station that made the most sense."

The station's Director of Research and Marketing, John Major, added, "It's the kind of programming we had that attracted them. We don't plan any programming changes." The station does, however, plan a few advertising changes. Major pointed out that under present FCC regulations, once a radio signal is broadcast, a cable system can recirculate it without compensating (or even notifying) the radio station, as long as the station's programming is presented unaltered. United Video Public Relations spokesman Jim Trecek characterized the situation, "We're just another listener intercepting their signal." However, United Video and WFMT have been working together planning the superstation linkup, and the station is excited about the huge potential audience increase in store for them, and plan to seek advertising accounts outside Chicago.

Nordstrand and Major anticipated no problem in receiving FCC permission, pointing out that approval for TV superstations has already been granted. Major added, "The FCC may welcome this sort of thing," since classical programming will now be made available in many markets where it does not exist.

### Improvement For All Radio?

United Video's Trecek cited WFMT's "excellent credibility and staying power" as the reason for its selection, pointing out that the availability of classical programming on radio may entice potential cable subscribers who might not be fully convinced by TV availability only. He also brought up the attraction of a Classical format in markets without such radio stations currently, and added, "We felt it would stabilize the retention rate for cable systems," explaining that the WFMT service would help convince trial customers to keep up their cable subscriptions.

Trecek spoke of the implications of radio stations being carried nationwide, commenting that the "wrong attitude" for local stations to take was that superstations would squeeze them out of the

## KGB Wins Right To Chicken Costume

The KGB Chicken lost his suit Tuesday (5-29), as KGB/San Diego won a preliminary injunction barring the man behind the Chicken (Ted Giannoulas) from appearing anywhere in the KGB Chicken outfit. A Superior Court judge ruled that the costume and concept belong to KGB, but that Giannoulas may appear in any nationally broadcast sports event (unless it involves a San Diego team) in a chicken suit, as long as it's not the KGB model.

Giannoulas and KGB reached a parting of the ways earlier this month, with Giannoulas being fired and KGB later filing suit for \$250,000 against its former mascot (R&R 5-18). Both parties seek to establish their rights to the costume. Following Tuesday's decision, it was unclear whether KGB would continue pursuing its lawsuit. PD Rick Leibert told R&R, "We could go farther and press it all the way to a trial but this is sort of testing the waters." Leibert expressed no surprise at the judge's verdict, and claimed that Paul Sansone, the new Chicken (who originally met with considerable negative reaction from loyal Giannoulas partisans), was now getting good receptions. "We're getting him back to the sort of one-to-one appearances that built up the grass roots support for the KGN Chicken," Leibert commented.

### A Purple Chicken?

Giannoulas has not decided on a course of action yet. He told R&R, "I was disheartened by the decision that I cannot work as the Chicken in San Diego. All the success I have as the Chicken I attribute solely to the people of San Diego."

## Berardini Named PD At WBCN

Tony Berardini has been promoted to Program Director at WBCN/Boston, replacing the departing Charlie Kendall (R&R 5-25). Beginning his radio career at AOR-formatted KTIM/San Rafael, where he spent three years as an air personality and Music Director, Berardini joined WBCN in 1978 and began serving as the Boston AOR station's MD shortly thereafter.

Berardini says he's looking forward to assuming programming duties for the first time, although as a self-described "music person" he admits the decision wasn't easy. He described the situation to R&R as "a new challenge and a new area in radio for me to explore and have fun with. That's the bottom line: if it isn't fun, I'm not going to do it. I took the job be-

cause I felt radio could and should be fun, not drudgery. I'll do all I can to facilitate that spirit around here."

Within two weeks, Berardini plans to have named a new Music Director — probably someone from outside the station. In addition, he said that he hoped to build upon the foundation Kendall had created,

and that there would be no changes in the full-time airstaff with the exception of his leaving his full-time post in favor of weekends. "We're going to continue to play best of a whole lot of music, expose local talent and continue to prove that you can do all that and still win in the ARB's," said Berardini.

## Attorney's WGMA Ads At Issue In Florida

Do broadcasters have the same First Amendment rights as newspapers? Currently, this is the dividing issue between Florida attorney Robert Leen and the Florida State Bar Association. The conflict stems from Leen's advertising his professional legal services via 60-second spots on Country-formatted radio station WGMA/Hollywood, FL's morning drive newscasts.

The FSBA claims Leen's broadcast announcements are outside the boundaries of lawyers' advertising guidelines recently revised in a 1977 U.S. Supreme Court decision, and has brought charges before the bar against Leen, threatening him with reprimand and possible disbarment. Leen contends that the spots are in good taste and do not violate the Court's principles. Leen also cites similar cases in other states (notably California and Oregon) where lawyers have won the right to air broadcast advertisements.

However, on May 9 the Florida Bar subpoenaed WGMA VP/GM and station owner Jim Glassman, demanding he provide them with a taped copy of the spot in question. Glassman, upon the advice of his attorney, unwillingly complied.

Glassman commented that he didn't understand why the Bar needed to subpoena material that was not confidential and readily available (since the spot was airing every morning, all the Bar had to do was tape it themselves).

The Bar's action prompted Glassman to air an editorial two days later (5-11) supporting Leen's right to advertise his services and accusing the Bar of discriminating against broadcast advertising. Leen is the second Florida attorney to test the Bar's stand on broadcast advertising. A Tampa attorney's case is currently pending action by the FSBA.

Due to WGMA's requiring four weeks cancellation notice, Leen's spots will continue to air until June 12 with final action on the matter to be decided in a hearing before the Bar on June 16.

## Chuck Berry Charged With Tax Evasion

"Johnny B. Goode" is in trouble with the law. Fifties rock 'n' roller Chuck Berry, whose songs have served as staples for rock musicians for the past 25 years, pleaded not guilty Tuesday (5-22) to three counts of Federal income tax evasion.

The Internal Revenue Service claims that Berry, 52, not only underpaid his income taxes for 1973 by \$109,137, but that his gross income was "substantially" beyond his reported \$585,478. In addition, the IRS indictment charges that Berry erroneously reported his 1973 income from Chuck Berry Music Inc. to be \$39,866, but that in reality the amount was much greater.

If convicted, Berry faces a fine of up to \$20,000 and imprisonment up to 11 years. Trial date has been set for July 9 in St. Louis.

## Lennon Breaks "Silence Of Love"

John Lennon, absent from the recording scene and the public eye in general since 1975, took out full page ads in major metropolitan newspapers Sunday (5-27) for "A Love Letter From John & Yoko," explaining what the couple has been up to. Judging from the text, their activities have been largely confined to raising their son Sean and refining their personal happiness, with a great deal of attention paid to the power of wishing and magic. Lennon and Ono that the world for "respecting our quiet space, which we need;" but as for a return to recording, the only part of the message touching on that subject is their assertion that they're "writing in the sky instead of on paper — that's our song."

## \$33 MILLION SUIT

### Al Bell Trial Extended

Former Stax Records Chairman Al Bell's \$33 million malicious prosecution suit against the Union Planters Bank of Memphis will be extended until Sept. 24. The case, to be tried by jury, has been continued owing to an exceptionally heavy caseload facing the Memphis U.S. District Court, according to Bell's attorney, Mike Pleasance.

Bell's suit stems from a 1975 federal indictment charging himself and bank executive Joseph Har-

well with conspiring to acquire \$18 million in fraudulent loans. Bell was acquitted. Later, Harwell confessed to having deceived Bell into signing certain documents and to having forged Bell's signature to several others.

Bell alleges that the bank's officers and consultants knowingly gave false information to federal officials, which led to his being charged. This was done, Bell contends, so that the bank could recoup their losses through their bonding firm.

### Gas Crisis: What Is Radio's Role?

In our May 18 issue, R&R surveyed a number of Los Angeles radio stations to learn what they were doing to serve the public during the city's gasoline crisis. During the preparation of that story, we noted wide differences in various radio stations' attitudes about what "serving the public" should mean in a crisis of this sort. The stations we wrote about, which sponsored gas station airwatches, rumor-checking services, and aid and comfort to motorists stuck in gas lines, among other promotions, obviously felt they were serving the public. FM100 Operations Manager Lee Bayley, in the letter printed below, has a different opinion; he feels that such promotions are essentially frivolous and may even contribute to a "panic" atmosphere. FM100's approach was to present a series of editorials dealing with the background whys and wherefores of the gas crisis (mostly advocating decontrol of oil prices domestically and generally defending American oil companies, judging from the transcripts).

What is radio's role in serving the public during a gas crisis or similar problem? R&R would like to know what our readers think. Read Bayley's letter, read our previous gas crisis coverage, and let us know . . . .

Dear R&R:

Just read with interest R&R's article on how L.A. radio responded to the gas crunch, and felt whoever authored it overlooked a few things.

My concept on how radio can really be helpful to the listener, at a time like this, is different from those your magazine wrote about. Frankly, I feel the kinds of things many of the L.A. stations are doing contribute to a "panic buying" problem. Unfortunately, many of the stations you wrote about displayed just how shallow our industry can be in this kind of situation. Is it really helpful for a station to announce "There are only 20 cars in line at the Chevron in Hollywood (which might be 20 miles away), so get over there quick!" . . . or does that make the listener panic? Because, believe it or not, the majority of L.A.'s population does not live and/or work in Hollywood. Is this kind of response by L.A. radio helping in any way? I submit to you it is not! Is it contributing to the panic? Yes.

It is unfortunate, also, that in R&R's article, the broadcasting industry's responsibility to "serve" the listener was totally missing. It is not the industry's responsibility to make sure the listener has doughnuts while waiting in line, anymore than it is our responsibility to create panic. It is our responsibility to wade through all the BS, research the problem and inform the public, with facts that can be documented. Is any radio station doing that? Yes.

Through a series of editorials, our GM, Pat Shaughnessy, is doing each day at 8am and 5pm, we are letting the listener know what the problem is (and it isn't how many cars are in a gas line somewhere), who created it, the Federal Government's role, OPEC's role, the oil companies' role, the dealer's role, and what the average citizen can do about it.

We hear a lot about oil companies making a ton of money. It's simply not true. In fact, did you know that oil company profits rank far below the broadcasting industry's and many, many others for return on investment? Did you know that out of an 80-cent gallon of gas (the national average price for regular), American oil companies get 3 cents, while OPEC and State and Federal taxes account for 57 cents. Did you know that there are proven forms of energy for an automobile (other than gasoline) that the Department of Energy knows about, but has refused to act upon? . . . Did you know there are only 20 cars at the gas line in Hollywood?

### Supreme Court Justice Criticizes Colleagues On Free Speech

"Preserving a climate of free interchange among journalists is essential to sound editorial decision making," said Justice Thurgood Marshall in remarks Monday (5-28) critical of the rulings his fellow Supreme Court justices have made eroding "freedom of speech."

Referring to the *Herbert vs. Lando* decision, Marshall stated that journalists "must be afforded the utmost protection to ensure the public is exposed to the widest possible range of information and insights." The Supreme Court's 6-3 decision last month allows public figures suing for libel to inquire into the state of mind of journalists.

### XETRA Eyes Sanctions Against CERF

Charging that four San Diego radio stations (members of an organization called **Committee for Equality in Radio Frequencies - CERF**) are engaged in "an illegal conspiracy to restrain trade," an attorney for XETRA-AM-FM/Tijuana last week (5-15) urged the FCC to dismiss CERF's petition and "consider" sanctions against the stations.

XETRA's attorney, Bill Potts of Haley, Bader & Potts, cites evidence acquired through the Freedom of Information Act that Dan McKinnon, Chairman of CERF and KSON President, was "serious violation" of Commission rules. McKinnon, according to a letter dated March 14, met with Chairman Charles Ferris to present his views without telling Ferris that CERF was preparing a petition against XETRA, Potts charges.

The bone of contention is Section 325(b) of the Communications Act of 1934, requiring an FCC permit to transmit programming across a border for rebroadcast into the U.S. KSON, KGB, KPRI and KIFM (CERF members) are seeking a "cease and desist" order against XETRA on the grounds the rule excludes physical deliveries, as well as radio and wire transmissions.

Citing legal precedents, Potts said the rule does not apply to physical deliveries. Furthermore, he said, the regulation of interstate and foreign commerce falls under Congressional power, not the FCC.

XETRA-FM currently receives audio tapes by truck from its San Diego-based licensee, Noble Multimedia Communications Inc. The licensee has obtained a Section 325 (b) permit to transmit news, sports and financial information to XETRA-AM by means of a telephone line.

### FM Quad Gets Extension

To Quad or not to Quad? That question is being asked by the FCC in a notice of further inquiry. A widening circle of groups is expressing concern over what the proposal will mean to their futures.

Several respondents, including Muzak and seven franchisers, two agricultural news services, two radio services for the blind, and the Physicians' Radio Network oppose FM quad on the basis it would destroy their use of Subsidiary Communications Authorizations (SCA), which operates on an FM subcarrier channel.

While National Public Radio and NAB favor quad, they are also concerned with its potential impact on SCA operations. Meanwhile, the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) says it is concerned that selection of one of the quad systems will preclude creation of new frequencies. One of NTIA's major objectives is diversity of programming, which it hopes to achieve by opening up more frequencies to minority broadcasters.

#### Scope: Quad, SCA's And Stereo

The aim of the inquiry includes what would be the impact of reducing FM channel spacing from 200 kHz to 150 or 100 kHz. Ed McClain, an engineer from Morningside, MD; CBS, Inc.; and the Electronics Industries Association argued that reducing the FM band width would be detrimental to quad, SCA's, and stereo.

Although few individual broadcasters commented, they now have more time. Citing British postal labor problems, the National Development Corporation (NRDC) asked for and was granted an extension by the FCC until June 11 and July 11 for comments and reply comments on FM quadrophonic (NRDC's headquarters are in London).

### Called A "Monstrosity"

Meanwhile, comments from the blind and the Muzak franchises (from Tennessee, Kentucky, Missouri, Alabama, North Carolina, Florida, and Wisconsin) stress the importance of SCA's to their viability.

"Please do not destroy us . . . If quadrophonic sound is so important, let the commercial stations combine to provide this monstrosity," pleaded James Swed, Executive Director of the Minnesota Radio Information Center for the Blind.

Said Warren Coughlin, Pres. of FloridaSound Engineering Co. (a Muzak franchise in Jacksonville): "A favorable quad decision will only help a few Japanese manufacturers who are already flooding this country with their equipment."

### KJAZ vs. COM Continues

"Not rational," was the label attorneys for the Citizens for Open Media (COM) attached last week to an effort by KJAZ/Alameda to have an objection to a second appraisal of KJAZ dismissed.

The objection came from KJAZ's attorney, Lester Spillane, who called COM's objection "scurrilous and unsupported trash" (R&R 5-11).

COM recommended the FCC dismiss KJAZ's second appraisal because it was in excess of the 54 percent of the fair market value established by the WAE0-TV/Rhineland, WI decision, the FCC's first interpretation of its distress sale policy (R&R 4-27).

Under the FCC's policy, all stations applying for a distress sale must furnish two appraisals. The FCC's Broadcast Bureau joined COM in recommending dismissal of the second appraisal (R&R 5-4).

### COM Member Seeks Out

Meanwhile, Joan Passalacque, a member of COM, asked the FCC to dismiss the original petition to deny and all other documents filed by COM against KJAZ. The Citizens Communications Center (COM's attorney), however, said Ms. Passalacque's motion should be denied.

"While Ms. Passalacque can clearly withdraw from membership in COM (as she has already done), she cannot, by so doing, alter COM's participation in a legal proceeding after that withdrawal," said Jeffrey Olson of the Washington-based Citizens Communications Center.

### Deregulation Specifics Spelled Out

A newly released Radio Code study of 777 subscribers shows stations consistently air less than the FCC's limit of 18 minutes of commercials per hour, according to Jerry Lansner, NAB VP Code GM.

Licenses complying with FCC Form 395 in the future will have discretion as how to list job categories and titles despite FCC's rejection of NAB petition seeking greater broadcaster flexibility.

In response to FCC Chairman Ferris's invitation to amplify NAB President Wasilewski's call for an end to processing the backlog of applications, NAB's suggestions include a symposium to discuss problems and a Commission "checklist of common errors."

## Washington Sales Talk

### WDAS Sale Looking Better

R&R has learned that the FCC's Broadcast Bureau has withdrawn its objections (a major hurdle) to the sale of WDAS/Philadelphia from Max Leon to Unity Broadcasting. Earlier, R&R reported that a pending citizens' group challenge (the last remaining obstacle prior to the commissioners' reviewing the case and rendering a decision) should not hinder the transfer.

The Bureau had a change of mind after Unity and WDAS mutually agreed to withdraw a provision in the contract that would have made Leon and GM Bob Kline consultants to the new owners. Additionally, the bureau has withdrawn its concern over two appraisals of the station's worth which will ultimately be a factor in the sale price the Commission okays.

### "Don't Be Cute" Says FCC

In their latest filing, attorneys for WDAS used strongly worded language, such as "nitpicking," to describe the bureau's opposition to the sale (R&R 5-18). Last Friday, however, David Silberman, a Hearing Division attorney, took exception to the manner in which the filing was worded and warned that the "zeal of advocacy should be kept within bounds" or risk jeopardizing the attorney's "practice before the Commission."

### Radio Plugs "Manhattan"

Woody Allen has asked that radio be the exclusive broadcast medium to advertise his new movie, "Manhattan," according to Jim Ingrahan, Radio Advertising Bureau (RAB) VP, Western Region. The movie was supported by two \$30,000 radio campaigns - Los Angeles and New York.

### RAB Conferences Set

Meanwhile, RAB is gearing up for the first of 42 Idearama Plus conferences to be held all over the United States in June and July. The one-day meetings will give radio sales people "a brand-new inventory of ideas, promotions, contents and copy." Commercials, slides and visual exhibits will outline 1) promotion ideas to beat competition and inflation, 2) "idea content" commercials selected for their adaptability, idea power and salability, and 3) long-range campaign ideas to make "a prospect cancel his radio schedule, and go into Radio 100%."

# Cardona Named To New EEO Office

The Commission's choice for the long-awaited appointment of the chief to the FCC's Industry EEO and Minority Enterprise Division was announced last week (5-16), revealing the FCC's intention to give this newly created department an active and visible role.

Edmund Cardona, the new chief, brings solid background as a community relations expert to the job. Cardona, 34, was Public Service Coordinator for WCBS/New York, and later Manager of Community Relations for WNBC/New York before joining the FCC last year as an investigative attorney in the Broadcast Bureau's Compliance branch.

Cardona's newly appointed deputy, Barbara Moran, is a 12-year veteran of the FCC, having working her way up from the FCC's Mail and File section to the Consumer Assistance Office, where she helped initiate the FCC's Minority Ownership Task Force and coordinate the minority buyers list. (The list contains names of minorities interested in purchasing broadcast properties.)

## New Division To Beef Up EEO Outreach Efforts

The division will serve as a focal point for outreach efforts to inform the public, minorities and radio stations about FCC policies and programs that affect them. New publications and public participation workshops are on the agenda to tell interested persons about distress sales, tax certificates, minority loans, and other minority-oriented programs.

"If you can't get the word out, the programs won't be effective," said Bob Mann, the FCC's new Director of Public Affairs. "You've got to have the skills and ability to pass along to the media the essence and importance of minority hiring."

Under Mann, all three offices — Consumer Assistance (headed by Belle O'Brien), Industry EEO and Minority Enterprise Division, and Public Information — have been centralized to serve all the FCC's public relations and outreach functions. The chief of the Public Information Office has not yet been chosen.

## R&R Spotlight On Bob Mann

Mann, who will set the course for the new department, spoke to R&R recently about his past and some of the hopes and beliefs he brings to the job.

Radio broadcasters who claim they can't find qualified minorities to work in their

stations have a standing challenge from Bob Mann.

"I can't buy that," says Mann between telephone calls in the office he's occupied since mid-February. "This is one question this office needs to be concerned with."

Mann is especially bothered by the exemption small radio stations have from filling out the FCC's employment form 395, which gives a breakdown of employees by specific race and ethnic groups, sex, and job cate-

area of affirmative action in Texas during the early 70's — "before EEO took hold, before the (role of) the ombudsman, before Barbara Jordan." At that time, recruiting minorities was new in Texas, he said.

Equipped with an M.A. in journalism from the University of Colorado, Mann returned to his home state. His goal was nothing less than "to turn journalism around" in the area of minority news coverage.

"Policymaking decisions must show which

scholar by nature," Mann has also achieved some prominence in the academic field. He became Chairman of the Journalism Department at Southern Methodist University during what some call its "golden era," often calling upon prominent journalists such as Bill Moyers and Eric Sevareid to speak to his classes.

More recently, Mann worked on the President's Council on Wage and Price Stability, translating the often complex language of experts into words the layman can understand. Mann says that will be one of his major functions at the FCC.

## Critical Of The Press

Mann is critical of what he sees as the hypocrisy of the press. For example, in covering affirmative action violations such as the Sears & Roebuck case, the press too often neglects to look at itself, Mann said.

"The communications industry for the most part — they have never really invested the dollars that some other industries have. Yet they are quick to write stories about others. You've got to have your own house in order first," he said.

Mann explains he came to work for the government because it was "a culmination of involvement in communications. I've worked 21 years — since I was 14 — in communications. I'm putting into practice everything I have to offer. That includes speaking, writing, managing. He concludes: "And I have a moral commitment to minorities."

### FCC Establishes EEO As High Priority

## Disco Programming Up 73 Percent In Past Two Years

A recent study of America's top 25 radio markets by McGovern-Guild showed an increase of 73 percent in Disco radio programming within the past two years. Not surprisingly, no other format approaches this explosive growth pattern, although News formats are up 12 percent. Oldies formats are among those hardest hit by Disco's rise, down 50 percent over the past two years.

## TV News

### Network Profits Down, O&O Earnings Up

The three television networks reported 1978 profits were off 8% from 1977 levels, although revenues were up 14.8%. Totals were \$3.7 billion in revenues and \$373.5 million in pretax profits.

The 15 owned-and-operated stations, however, enjoyed a 25% profit jump to \$560 million. Their revenues were up 15% to \$3.5 billion. Figures come courtesy of your local neighborhood FCC.

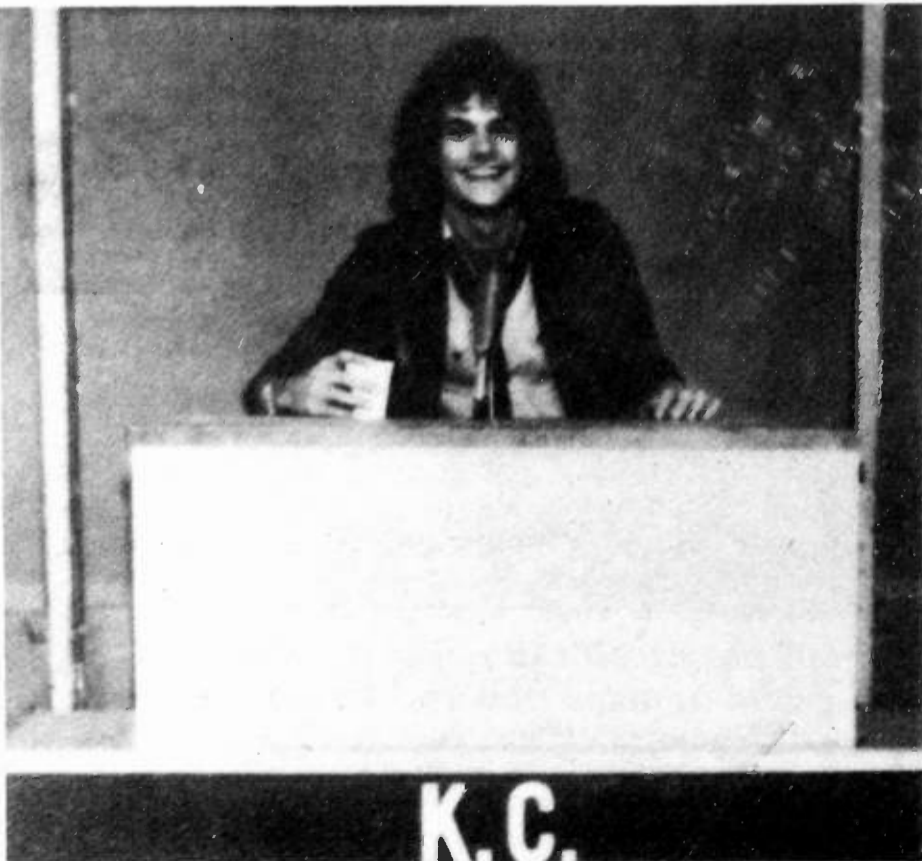

### ABC Again A Winner

ABC won another one — a Nielsen primetime weekly ratings race, that is, this one for the week ending May 20. The victory was the leading network's 19th in a row. ABC won with a 17.1 average rating, a relatively low score reflecting rerun season viewing levels. CBS was a fairly close second with 16.0 and NBC was last with 13.6. ABC took eight of the top ten places, including an impressive third-place finish for its TV movie "Love's Savage Fury," which beat CBS's "Blind Ambition" Pt. I (the John Dean telefilm) in its time slot. The top ten: 1) "Three's Company" 2) "Laverne & Shirley" 3) "Love's Savage Fury" 4) "60 Minutes" (CBS) 5) "Taxi" 6) "Barney Miller" (a special tribute to the late Jack Soo) 7) "MASH" (CBS) 8) "Mork & Mindy" 9) "Happy Days" and 10) "Angie." "Blind Ambition" finished 14th. Lelf Garrett's first special was 43rd, while Glen Campbell's latest finished 50th (against "Love's Savage Fury").

### Olympia Puts \$3 Million Behind Imported Beer Pusch

Olympia Brewing Co. will be spending \$3 million in six Western markets beginning in July when the nation's seventh largest brewery (1978 sales of \$372 million) unveils its new imported German beer "Grenzquell." The beverage is manufactured by Bavaria-St. Pauli Brewery in Hamburg with Olympia setting up a special import division to handle the "540-year-old beer."

The campaign, scheduled to run for a year, will include two 60-second radio spots as well as TV, newspaper and outdoor ads and will be based around the theme, "The beer German people drink on special occasions."

## Columbia Pictures' Nine-Month, 3rd Quarter Revenues Up, Net Down

Despite higher revenues in both periods, nine-month and third quarter profits for Columbia Pictures Industries both failed to reach last year's record levels for these periods. CPI's net profits for the nine months ending March 31 dropped 43 percent to \$29.9 million from \$52.8 million at the same time last year. Revenues for the nine months, however, rose 13 percent to \$465.7 million from \$410.4 million in 1978.

While third quarter net profits for CPI fell 26 percent to \$11.8 million from \$16.1 million a year ago, third quarter revenues increased 14 percent to \$184.5 million up from \$162.5 million in 1978.

### Arista's Story Similar

The nine-month story for CPI's disc subsidiary, Arista Records, is similar. Revenues for the nine-month period rose 10 percent to \$61.7 million from \$56.1 million in 1978, but net profits for the nine-month dipped 7 percent to \$3 million from \$3.2 during the like period last year.

Arista's third quarter revenues likewise declined 12 percent to \$18.3 million from \$20.7 million in 1978,

while the record company's net profits for the third quarter plummeted 83 percent to \$163,000 from \$985,000 in the same period last year. Arista Executive Vice President and General Manager Elliot Goldman attributed the decline in revenues to several factors, including creative delays in the release of a number of albums from established artists, last year's third quarter being the period of heaviest sales on Barry Manilow's multi-platinum "Even Now" album, and Arista's current chart album action coming at the tail end of the third quarter.



## Kirkup Upped To VP At A&M

Martin Kirkup has been promoted to the newly-created position of Vice President of Artist Development at A&M Records. Kirkup, a five-year veteran of the label, most recently served as A&M's Director of Artist Development. Prior to this position, he held posts as East Coast Publicity Director and Director of Creative Services for the label.

## Brown Upped To VP/ Sales For Phonogram

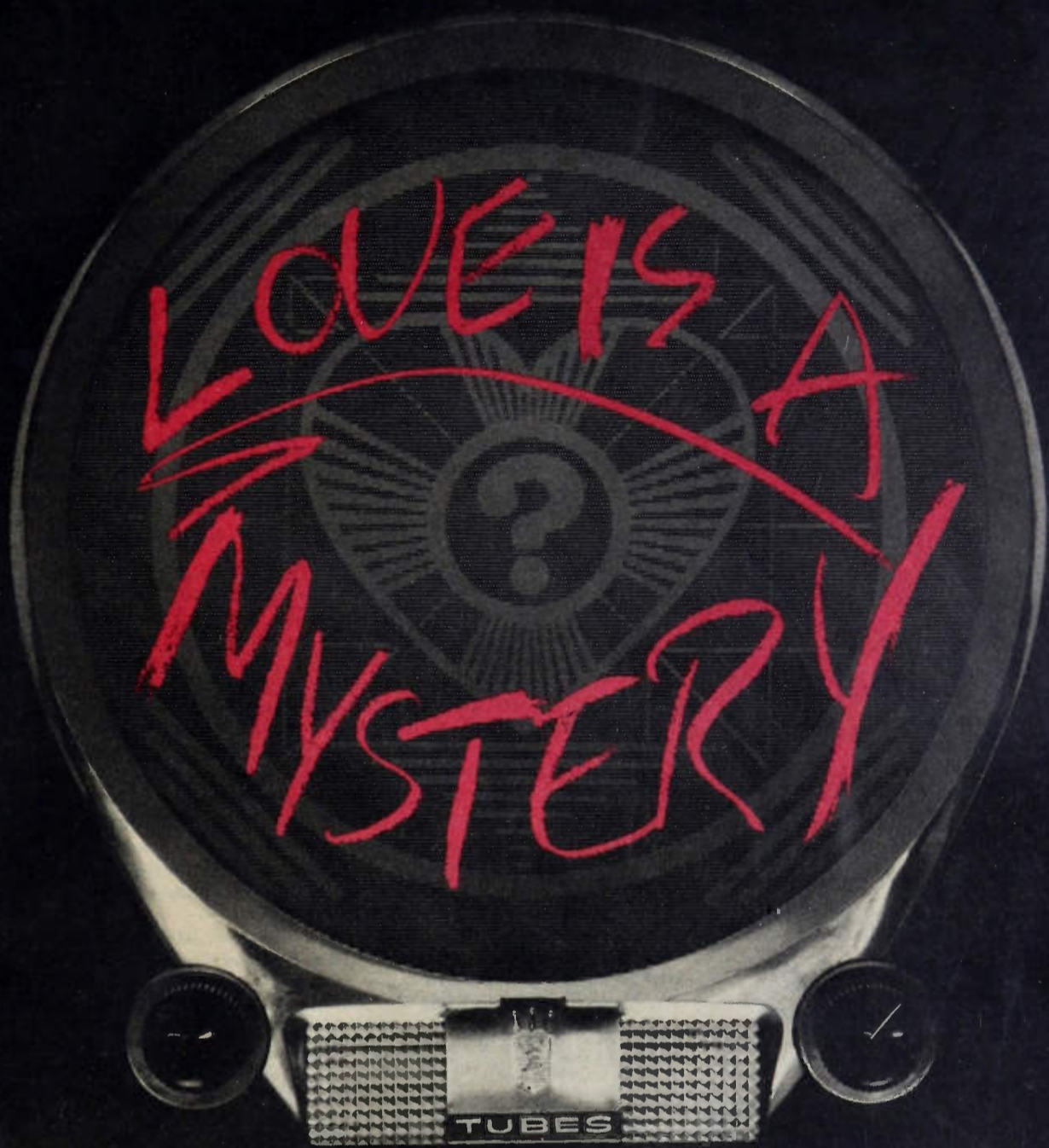

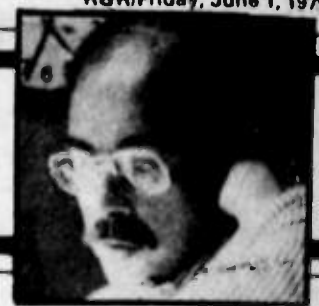

#### Making Gasoline From Water With Louis Enright's Green Pill

Louis Enright's announcement to reporters was a grabber. "Gentlemen," the 70-year-old Long Islander said, "I have just invented a substitute for gasoline that can be manufactured for a penny a gallon!"

William Haskell (publisher of the Chicago Herald) was skeptical, but the old man with the huge white moustache and warm brown eyes staged a convincing demonstration, allowing reporters to inspect the empty gas tank on a car, then taking a gallon pail of water (which the reporters were allowed to taste) and carefully pouring it into the tank. Then he dropped in the Green Pill, got behind the wheel and hit the starter. The engine started after just a few turns.

The reporters piled into the car and Enright drove them around town, publisher Haskell later saying, "I examined the entire engine and tank. I even tasted the water before the mysterious green pill was dropped into the tank. Then I opened the petcock and examined the liquid, which now tasted like bitter almonds. I also tasted the liquid at the carburetor which was the same. I was amazed when the auto started. We drove it around the city without any trouble!"

Scientists know gasoline cannot be made from water and a tablet of chemicals. Enright's reply to that? "That's what they always say when an important discovery is being made."

The head of Ford Motor Company stated, "I don't know what to think of Enright yet, but if the tests prove satisfactory I will buy the process."

Mr. Enright's first announcement about all this was on April 16, and one week afterward the Maxim Munitions Corporation confirmed it was willing to pay him a million dollars for the formula, although consulting engineer Hudson Maxim said early in May that "the company only had an option and that no tests were yet completed."

#### The One Major Drawback Of The Green Pill

The newly-formed National Motor Power Company's head, B.F. Yoakum, quickly became embroiled in a major hassle with Enright when the inventor refused to immediately supply the secret formula. Yoakum went to court and got an order forcing Enright to open the safety deposit box containing the formula and a sample pill.

The box was empty. Enright had pulled a clever con game.

Before I tell you how he did it it's time to say this story happened in 1916, and that I have lifted it nearly verbatim from an article by Raymond Schuessler with profuse thanks and full credit to the Robert Thomas "Old Farmer's 1976 Almanac" (not to be confused with its many imitators). The OFA is an excellent newsroom source book, I believe.

Okay, how did Enright's green pill work? Probably just like the pill a guy named John Andrews tried to sell to the U.S. Navy not long before. The Navy got Thomas Edison's chief engineer, Dr. M.R. Hudson, to witness Andrews' demonstration, in which the man was locked in a small room with his secret ingredients, a pail of water and an engine. He got the engine started. Hutchinson said "I was amazed. When I went home that night I tried to figure out how he possibly could have done it. I had smelled the exhaust to make sure it wasn't gasoline, and then it dawned on me: he must have used acetylene. By using acetone to take up the acetylene and then dissolving the acetone in water, I had a satisfactory combustion mixture. I returned to the test engine and it ran perfectly on my mixture."

"The water, you see, was only the carrier to get the explosive (acetylene) to the cylinders. But you should see what happens to the cylinders!" said Hutchinson.

So the one major drawback to the Green Pill was that it did not work and was a red herring to draw attention from the "water," which was impregnated with tasteless acetylene/acetone . . . a mixture which would run an engine for a while but soon would destroy it.

When the scam artist comes to your town with a gas-from-water story, this information may be of some help to you.

#### Monday June 4 — "Old Maids' Day"

#### Wednesday June 6 — Roots Of Rock

Bill Haley's "Rock Around The Clock" began two months at the top of the chart 24 years ago today (1955). At the time, highschoolers tended to think of '55 more as the year Chevy made the big change to tailfins.

This was D-Day in 1944, when about 175,000 troops landed along 50 miles of coastline in the Normandy Invasion, trying to kick Hitler out of Europe. 4000 ships and 11,000 airplanes!

Bjorn Borg is 23, Larry "the Mole" Taylor (ex-Canned Heat) is 37.

The first drive-in movie opened at Camden, NJ in 1933: Chrysler Corp. is 54 years old today (formed 1925).

#### Thursday June 7 — Because His Pants Are Too Tight?

Why should Thomas Jones Woodward be smiling today? Because he has maybe a couple hundred trillion dollars already and isn't even 40 yet: singer Tom Jones turns 39 today. I may have slightly overestimated his income, but you know Las Vegas pays pretty good.

# Media Marketing

## ROCK AROUND THE CLOCK

### Researching Daypart Preferences

**M**ore than just a golden oldie and the theme of "Happy Days," "Rock Around The Clock" may be an accurate description of some listeners' music preferences — they like rock morning, noon, and night. But many, if not most, listeners might have more varied musical tastes and thus prefer one type of music in the morning, for example, and another type at night.

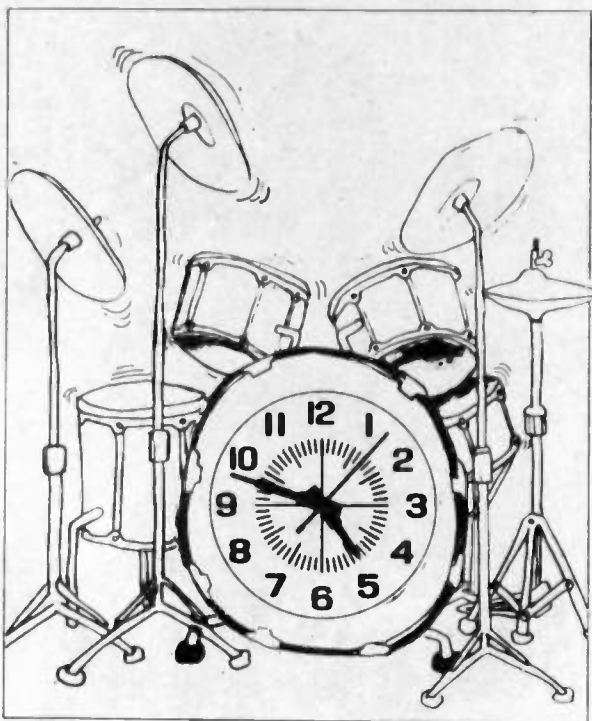
**D**ifferences in music preferences by daypart may have substantial impact on the results of call-out music research. For example, if you are conducting most of your call-out interviews in the evening, asking respondents to rate a series of records, you may be getting systematically biased results if a significant portion of the respondents have different nighttime and daytime tastes in music. In other words, the results may be applicable to determining your playlist for evening time slots, but not for morning or afternoon. Similar arguments might be made for weekends versus weekdays, and even for "drive time" listeners versus listeners at home.

**H**ow can the possibility of differing preferences by daypart be dealt with effectively in a call-out research system? It is clearly not feasible to interview listeners during the different dayparts, because most listeners are not at home during the day to be interviewed. And, unless the percentage of cars with telephones has risen dramatically, you could never hope to interview a drive-time listener during drive time!

**I**n marketing terminology, this variation of listener preferences by daypart is an example of differences in the *consumption situation*. Music, and radio programming in general, is a form of public service which is, in effect, being *consumed* (i.e., listened to, enjoyed) by listeners. However, listeners can find themselves in a variety of *situations* in which they are listening to radio. For example, in a typical day, the listener may listen to radio:

- While deciding whether or not to get out of bed
- While eating breakfast, getting ready for work or school
- While driving to work or school
- Over the lunch hour
- At work
- While driving home from work or school
- While eating dinner
- In the evening

While it may not be possible to program to a large variety of listening situations, it is feasible to try to ascertain the differing music preferences of listeners in some of the more common situ-



ations. The most convenient breakdown is probably by daypart (say, morning, afternoon, evening) and perhaps drive-time.

**T**o factor the situational preferences into your call-out system is a fairly straightforward task, but one that will lead to the necessity of larger sample sizes, depending upon how many different situations you wish to represent.

**H**ere is how it might work. At the screening stage of the interview, where you are determining if the respondents are of the right age and sex and if they ever listen to stations of your format, you can take it one step further to ascertain the dayparts during which their listening occurs. For instance, the following question might be used:

**On a typical weekday, during which of the following times do you listen to radio?**

- Morning before work or school
- Morning drive
- During the day
- Afternoon drive
- Evening

For each daypart checked, a second question would be asked in order to determine which stations are listened to most frequently during that daypart. For some listeners, the stations and formats may not change over the various dayparts, but for others, they may vary greatly. For instance, they may like Top 40 in the morning, all news while driving to work, and AOR while driving home during the evening.

**H**aving determined listeners' format preferences by daypart, you would then most often wish to interview people who prefer your station or format for the particular daypart when that preference is expressed (if it is consistent across a number of dayparts, then you need to select one — the ultimate goal would be to have a specific number of respondents — say 30 — for each daypart, just as most stations now seek certain numbers of listeners of various age and sex categories).

**T**he key to the situational approach comes next. Rather than simply asking respondents their music preferences on playing records down the line and asking for ratings, you ask them to assume a specific frame of reference for their responses. For example, you would say, "You mentioned that you like to listen to country music in the morning. I'm going to ask you to rate a series of songs as to how much you like or dislike each one of them. As you're giving me these ratings, I would like you to imagine that you are hearing these songs on the radio in the morning, when you would normally listen to this kind of music."

**B**y making the daypart factor explicit to respondents, you create a mental "set" in their heads which should help them to respond more accurately to your music research questions. Note that this approach could be even more useful for determining listeners' feelings about other programming elements, such as news, talk, air personalities, weather and traffic information, etc. Preferences for these elements may vary even more dramatically by daypart than do most preferences. What it might boil down to then, is not changes in *type* of music preferred, but rather changes in the *amount* of music preferred by daypart, as well as changes in preferences for what accompanies the music. The changes in music preferences may be relatively subtle, within format, with mellower tunes perhaps having an edge in the morning and more upbeat cuts being favored during drive-time (helps get those aggressive juices flowing!).

**I**n conclusion, music and programming research may be biased toward the evening daypart unless respondents are explicitly given a "set" to respond with a different daypart in mind. Using a situational approach could give you more detailed information on what your listeners want during the course of the day. Give this system a try and see how it compares to the results of your standard system. You may see some interesting and useful differences!

*"Massive firings and job shifts in the wake of Arbitron results don't make sense . . ."*

## Arbitron Ratings: A Probing Look At Accuracy Of Industry's "Bible"

Billions of advertising dollars. Thousands of careers. These are the stakes involved in a radio industry dependent on the Arbitron radio market reports. Yet how accurate are the Arbitron numbers? Many broadcasters and ad agencies may not be familiar with how much "give" there really is in the estimates. Since many important advertising, programming and career decisions are made based on the numbers, we thought you'd like to know, just prior to the release of the April/May Arbitron reports, how reliable are the numbers

you see in the book. We've included a formula and table you can use to figure how much plus or minus range there can be in a given estimate in your market. (We should note here that estimates from any major survey firm are subject to similar variations.) Later in the article, we'll discuss the significance of this flux.

### The Key Formula

Let's start the analysis by listing the variables involved (why not follow along with an example from the last Arbitron in your market...)

1. Station
2. Demographic Cell
3. Daypart
4. Total 12+ in-tab for the market (metro, ADI or TSA)
5. Demo Cell In-Tab
6. Station Rating For Demo/Daypart

An example I used in a recent seminar in Detroit will illustrate what information you need

- Stations: A; B
- Demo: Adults 25-49
- Daypart: Monday-Friday, 6-10am (80 quarter hours)
- Metro 12+ In-Tab: 1631
- Adults 25-49 In-Tab: 630
- Station Ratings In The Jan./Feb. Report In The Specified Demo/Daypart: A 4.3; B 1.9

Now that we've determined the input, let's plug those numbers into the formula to figure "standard error" of a given rating

**Standard Error Calculation Formula**  
(To determine how much "plus or minus range" there is in an average rating)

$$2x\sqrt{\frac{p \times q}{n \times SE}}$$

1. Determine "p". Arbitron rating (as shown in book for the specific station, demo and daypart).

Station A 4.3 p=4.3  
(Adults 24-49 Average Rating, M-F, 6-10am)

2. Determine "q" q=95.7  
q = 100% - p  
100 - 4.3 = 95.7

3. Determine "n" n=630  
n = in-tab sample size for the specific demographic

Page three of the Arbitron report shows the metro "percent unweighted in-tab" that each demo contributes. Since we are examining adults 25-49, just add the percent figure for the various unweighted (actual diary in-tab) demo cells - in this case men 25-34, men 35-44, men 45-49, plus the percents for women in the three cells. In this case, (J/F 79 Det ARB) we came up

with 38.6% of the total 12+ in-tab of 1631, yielding 630 metro diaries that came back from adults 25-49. Try this in your market selecting a target demo and then adding up the page three unweighted figures. This determines what percent of the total in-tab came from the demo you are examining.

4. Determine number of quarter-hours in the specific daypart. In this case, Monday-Friday, 6-10am = 80 quarter hours.

5. Determine the "Statistical Efficiency" S.E. = 2.7. From a table computed by Arbitron, and reprinted here with their permission, select the relevant demo and the correct quarter-hour total (from Step 4). You'll note that for adults 25-49, in a daypart containing 80 quarter hours, the S.E. is 2.7.

6. Let's now plug the above ingredients into the formula:

$$\frac{(p \times q)}{630 \times 2.7} = \frac{411.51}{1701} = .24$$

$$\sqrt{.24} = .489$$

$$2 \times .489 = .98 \text{ (round off to 1.0)}$$

Thus, we see that station "A"'s 25-49 average adult rating in morning drive is subject to standard error of approximately 1.0, or one average rating point. We can say then that the 4.3 as shown in the book is actually 4.3 plus or minus 1.0, or 3.3 to 5.3. If we took station "B", with its 1.9 rating in the same demo and daypart, running the figures through the formula show that the 1.9 is plus or minus .7, thus probably a 1.2 to 2.6.

### Industry Impact . . . Enormous

The implications of the above calculations are vast. Station managers and program directors would be pleased perhaps with a 5.3 (and the share generated by such an average rating), while a 3.3 rating might get everyone's ulcers working overtime. Yet, both of these average ratings are within the same statistical realm represented by the 4.3 in the book.

Given this flux, agency buyers, who make buying decisions based on one number being just slightly better than another, are kidding themselves and their clients. Likewise, station managers or program directors who panic at a lower number or rejoice at a higher rating are not necessarily making wise decisions. The gain or loss may be a statistical illusion. The massive firings and job shifts that take place in the wake of Arbitron results don't make sense unless the GM or PD has a three-book or four-book trend to increase statistical reliability for better management decisions.

Bottom line on this is that you now know how to determine the "wobble" inherent in the estimates generated by Arbitron. This procedure outlined here is much more exact than Nomograph. Before the April/May '79 Arbitron report is released to your market, do some practice calculations from a previous book. Then, when your market report is received, you can analyze the ups and downs carefully, using the information here. ## Q & A

A question came to us concerning how different Arbitron survey methods can affect a station's rank in the numbers. "Why is it that in an Arbitron telephone coincidental survey our station was in the top three in the market, but when the regular market report was released we were way down in the rankings?"

The difference in the estimates for the station was likely due to the types of surveys being different. The telephone coincidental measures listening in-home, at the time of the interview. No out-of-home listening is asked for, nor is there any attempt to determine listening habits for an entire week. The regular diary survey measures listening both at home and away, and it asks people to record their listening preferences for an entire week, not just for the limited time span usually covered by a coincidental survey.

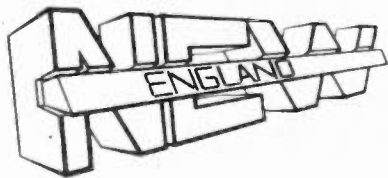

Seems one morning they got to kidding around on the air about a reserve player for the Cleveland Indians, Horace Speed. The rest is history. Horace is now one of the best known of all the Indians, having been the subject of several articles in the local papers, editorial cartoons and even a mention in the ABC Paul Harvey News this week. WZZP began talking about Horace as if he were the only thing that could save the Indians this season, and the entire town has picked up on it (Horace has only played in about 10 games all season). Now there is even a "write-in" campaign to get Horace Speed's name on the All-Star roster. The impact of this radio-created "bit" is phenomenal.

A very pleasant surprise was the announcement that Jim Dunlap, Operations Manager of Y103/Jacksonville, will become the new GM of WBCN/Boston. It's a well deserved step-up for a fine radio professional. Taking over at Y103 will be the current PD, Scott Sherwood, although a new Operations Manager for the station has not been named.

And finally . . . from our "Press Release Hall of Fame" comes the following item, and we quote direct from the Epic Records release: "Epic recording group The Jacksons have had their latest chart-topping album 'Destiny' certified Platinum by the R.I.A.A., signifying sales in excess of 1 million units. The album has *spurred* the Gold-certified hit single 'Shake Your Body.'" Well, that's one way to get hit singles out of those albums, but certainly not the traditional pattern!

## John Leader

### What Training Ground?

In recent weeks the discussion of Top 40 in general and the "personality's role" in specific have brought in a lot of comments and clarifications. The assumption that most major market PD's have made is that the secondaries have always been and should continue to be the "training grounds" for future talent, both on the air (jocks) and off (programmers and management). But perhaps things have changed at the secondary level since those who migrated up to the majors left those so-called "training grounds."

### Money Talks, Not Jocks

An example of just what kind of training is not going on at the smaller market level comes from Jim Orr, who writes from KOZE/Lewiston, ID.

"I feel that you failed to mention that programming of medium and small stations is not necessarily carried out by the person who has the Program Director title. In many cases the management of the station does the programming and obviously they have a better view of the market dollar. Although the air personalities and incoming sales revenues are equally important at some stations, the air personality is not the top priority in medium and smaller markets.

"I grew up in the Portland area and was very much influenced by radio with the likes of Victor Ives, Barney Keep (both formerly of Golden West's KEX), Mike O'Brien, and the legendary KISN radio. I told myself that, once in radio, I too would be different. I wasn't about to let myself come out of a record and do a quick pun and jump into the next spot. My reasoning: everyone does it. Since I've been in radio (5 years) the word I get from most general managers - not the PD - is 'just keep it moving.' Some training ground, huh?

### The Tidal Wave Effect

"But, the way I see it, there seems to be a tidal wave effect from bigger markets to the medium and smaller ones. KHJ knocked out personality with the promise that this was what the public wanted. Now, Chuck Martin has brought it back, yet the smaller stations are still feeling the wave created earlier. That, undoubtedly, is due to station management within the smaller markets that want to sound 'big time.' The day will come when programmers will say, 'I don't give a damn what they're doing, we're doing this because it works here.' Maybe then, medium and smaller markets will again become the training grounds for air personalities, not air talent."

### To Clone Or Not To Clone

Sure, a lot of stations in the smaller markets emulate the big market successes, but the question of "cloning" stations comes down to motives. Why copy the "sound" of a major market station? Because it's successful? The real question is: why is it successful?

Allan Johnson, who has worked for several stations in the Western region as an air personality, commented to me, "I realize smaller stations have traditionally copied the big boys, but that's only worth doing if there's something worth copying, and even then copy an attitude or philosophy and not just style and liners."

Sage remarks! Too often stations are cloned without any thought as to why the station is successful. Anyone could copy the "sound" of a station without ever knowing the format philosophy that lies behind the sound. The programming decisions made in the major markets are not sacred, nor are they always correct. The programming decisions at any station should not be based on what everyone else is doing around the country, but rather on what will be successful within your own market.

Whoever programs a smaller market station, be it the PD or the GM, what works in one market may not apply equally to all others (that point has been proven time and time again). The thing a lot of first-time PD's in the smaller market situation forget is that a successful radio station in any market size is one that makes money. A programmer's job becomes that much more difficult in that he must balance art with business and program a station that will attract large numbers and therefore make large dollars. If the general manager meddles in programming at the smaller market level, perhaps his or her view of the total market situation is better than that of the PD.

At the secondary level the goal of the PD and GM should be the same, and that goal should be identical to the goal the "big boys" have in the majors: to run a successful radio station. And the important part of that goal definition is to give the listeners what they want. If the listeners in Seattle and Lewiston want the same thing, fine. But, if they want different things in Lewiston than the stations in Seattle have always offered, then Lewiston radio should give their listeners those different things. To find out what your listeners want, just ask them. If you know the listeners' needs, problems and interests, programming your station to those listeners becomes that much easier.

### Forget The Big Boys

The cloning problem does not only lie with the major markets; it can also be placed squarely at the feet of the programmers and managers of the secondary and smaller market stations. The very successful smaller stations around the country don't sound a lot like Los Angeles, Chicago or New York stations, and they make no apologies about it. They just make lots of money for their owners and continue to serve their communities

with what their listeners have shown them that they like. And if the PD's and GM's and jocks at those smaller stations are pointing their careers to eventually be at a major market station, then the winning principles they have learned will apply just as pragmatically there as they did in Lewiston.

### Bits

**FUEL PHONE FILLS BILL:** The entire country has been made aware of the dramatic gasoline shortages California is going through, and KGB/San Diego recognized the problem in its area with a special effort. Music Director Michelle Pettis told R&R, "Shortly after it became apparent that gas availability and long lines were becoming major problems in San Diego, our Program Director, Ed Hamlin, initiated the 'KGB Fuel Line,' a service designed to inform motorists about stations that were open and pumping gas. Positive public reaction was so great that Ed was invited to address a special city council meeting called to encourage the media to help alleviate some of the problems caused by the current shortage." The "KGB Fuel Line" has continued (even though the gas crisis has eased a bit), and now includes the service of the Automobile Club of Southern California, the California Highway Patrol, the San Diego Police Department and the Visitors Information Center. People dialing "information" in San Diego asking about fuel availability are now referred to the "KGB Fuel Line." The station also had special signs distributed to gas station operators (as shown) to reinforce their public service effort.



**FEELIN' GOOD:** KGW/Portland and its TV station KGW-8 recently put on the largest and most comprehensive health screening clinic ever staged on the West Coast. 30,000 area residents proved they were vitally interested by attending and participating in the event. Over 75 health care organizations and 1500 volunteers helped guide the participants through the several individual health check points. All the KGW radio personalities took part in the event, including morning man Craig Walker and Jim Donovan. The KGW Health Fair was a two-day event with a great media and public impact. If your station is interested in such a venture, contact Jacquie Crist, Promotion Director at KGW.

**QUICK BITS:** KRUX/Phoenix sponsored a run "to save the cheetahs." 3000 kids aged 8-16, along with all the KRUX jocks, ran to raise money for a new cheetah pen for the Phoenix Zoo. . . . CJBK/London held its Sixth Annual Spring Bikini Contest recently, asking listeners to drop by the station at 7am clad in bikinis. After some celebrity judging, the grand prize winner received an all-expenses-paid trip for two to Club Guava, Jamaica. Incidentally, the contest was held earlier this spring, before the weather was, shall we say, warm. . . . WKEE/Huntington held a Muscular Dystrophy "Can't Stop Dancin'" weekend, helping the charity raise over \$12,500.

### Motion

Chuck Diamond is the new Program Director at WROK/Rockford, replacing C.C. Matthews, who has joined E. Alvin Davis at WKLO/Louisville. No format switch is anticipated at WROK as Chuck, who has been the station's night jock for the last year and a half, takes over. . . . KENI/Anchorage has promoted Randy Robbins from MD to PD. Ron O'Neil has also been promoted to Music Director, but will retain his 7-12midnight airshift. . . . EFBL/Syracuse has kicked off its new format under the guidance of consultant Mike Joseph. The station is "Top 40" in the most literal sense, playing only 40 songs with no oldies or album cuts! The lineup of carefully chosen jocks includes: Dave Laird from WHAM/Rochester, 6-10am; Robb Stewart, formerly of JB105/Providence, 10-2pm; Bob Reynolds from WOLF/Syracuse, 2-6pm; Todd Parker, 6-10pm and Don Rossi, 10-1am, both of whom remained from the former WFBL staff; Jack Lee does 1-6am, and swing is handled by Mike Frazer from WOLF. . . . market. "I think it will improve all radio," he said. "People will start listening to more radio in general, I think. It will help the quality of radio at all levels, including local. If local radio has to compete with imported signals, they're going to have to improve their quality, and I think you'll see greatly improved quality in all radio programming in the next five years."

He predicted that it will be "relatively easy" for United Video to lock up 50 "good-sized markets" for WFMT when the service becomes generally available in September. He recognized the possibility of complications from music licensing organizations and other interests, but expressed the hope that the industry "will regulate itself" adequately. He said that United Video had no present plans to add another radio station to its superstation roster, but stated, "I think we'll see a big influx of other companies doing it. They all have extra audio channels." Trecek predicted that future superstation programming would not be restricted to Classical formats, but would feature Disco, Country and other popular music styles.

Commenting on the chicken suit decision, he said, "I have to make changes in color in order to use it. I could come back as a purple or amber chicken if I wanted. I can't work as the Chicken in San Diego. The phone has not stopped ringing. People now realize that I can be the chicken outside the city. I've been approached by some of the largest corporations in the country: major beverage firms, sports franchises, a radio conglomerate which owns a dozen stations in major markets. It's quite flattering."

But Giannoulas feels an attachment to San Diego. "My first thought is to stay in San Diego," he said. "I've been spoiled by San Diego, by the people's affection for what I do, by the climate here, the lifestyle. Maybe I'm too sentimental, but I love this town very much. That's the decision I have to make right now."

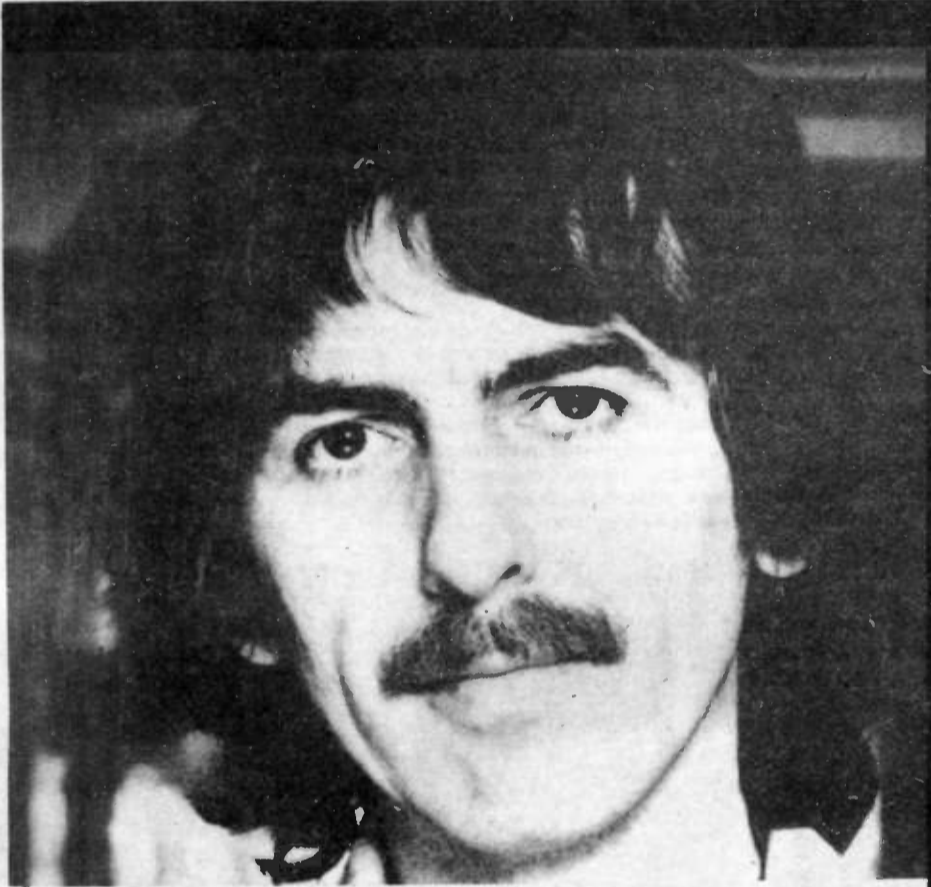

## Young Black Programmers Look To Future

On May 20, the Young Black Programmers Coalition met in the Holiday Inn in New Orleans. Many topics were discussed, and a Vice President slot had to be filled for exiting Vice President Barry Mayo of WGCI/Chicago. The new VP appointed was Reginald Henry of WXEJ-FM/New Orleans. Also, the voting of new members took place: WYLD-AM-FM, as well as their Program Directors and the Operations Manager — Willie Jay Johnson (AM), Calvin Booker (OM), and Al Scott, PD for the FM.

The principal topic of discussion was the involvement of the organization with the Black Music Association. President J.D. Black discussed the endorsement of the YBPC's involvement with the BMA's drive to recognize June as "Black Music Month." The programmers' group plans to have an active promotional campaign to promote black artists of our historical past on Coalition stations (which range from Washington, DC to some parts of Texas). As far as we know, this is the first radio group at this time that's making that kind of commitment to be reflected in the programming of the particular radio stations.

President Black also spoke on some future functions the YBPC and the BMA will be doing together (to be announced as soon as it's finalized to exactly what degree the involvement will be).

The meeting had two guest speakers, Jack Gibson and E. Rodney Jones, both radio veterans in other areas of the industry now. Both told of the need of an organization like the YBPC to continue to fight for and support the growth and development of Black radio.

Jones in particular made mention of the sophisticated approaches to programming as well as the equipment in use in radio today. He also mentioned the disco explosion taking pieces of the black listening audiences without the commitment to those communities, and stressed the importance of "a basic black" approach in programming.

Jack Gibson, owner of a black-owned industry tabloid, discussed the importance of supporting black artists as well as blacks in the industry.

At that time, J.D. Black proposed a vote to the floor for the coalition to support other black-owned tabloids in the industry.

There was some discussion as to whether some other industry trades were going to hold official functions because of the widespread industry support of the BMA's Founders' Conference in Philadelphia June 8-11. The group voted to support more black radio/music functions. The general feeling, since most other music formats support several major trade conventions, was why shouldn't blacks in the industry support black trade conventions?

President Black also spoke of letters being sent to all major record companies' home offices as well as regional offices, inviting them to attend an important meeting of the YBPC board to witness the merger with another programming coalition from the Southeast (the Progressive Communicators). In conclusion, the YBPC is asking all record companies with anthology series to contact organizational head J.D. Black at WKXI/Jackson to find out which stations will be participating in the month-long celebration of Black Music Month in June.

It looks as though the future of Black radio seems to be constantly developing, and I was encouraged by the spirit of the Coalition's meeting. Watch for future columns for more on the subject of the future of Black radio.

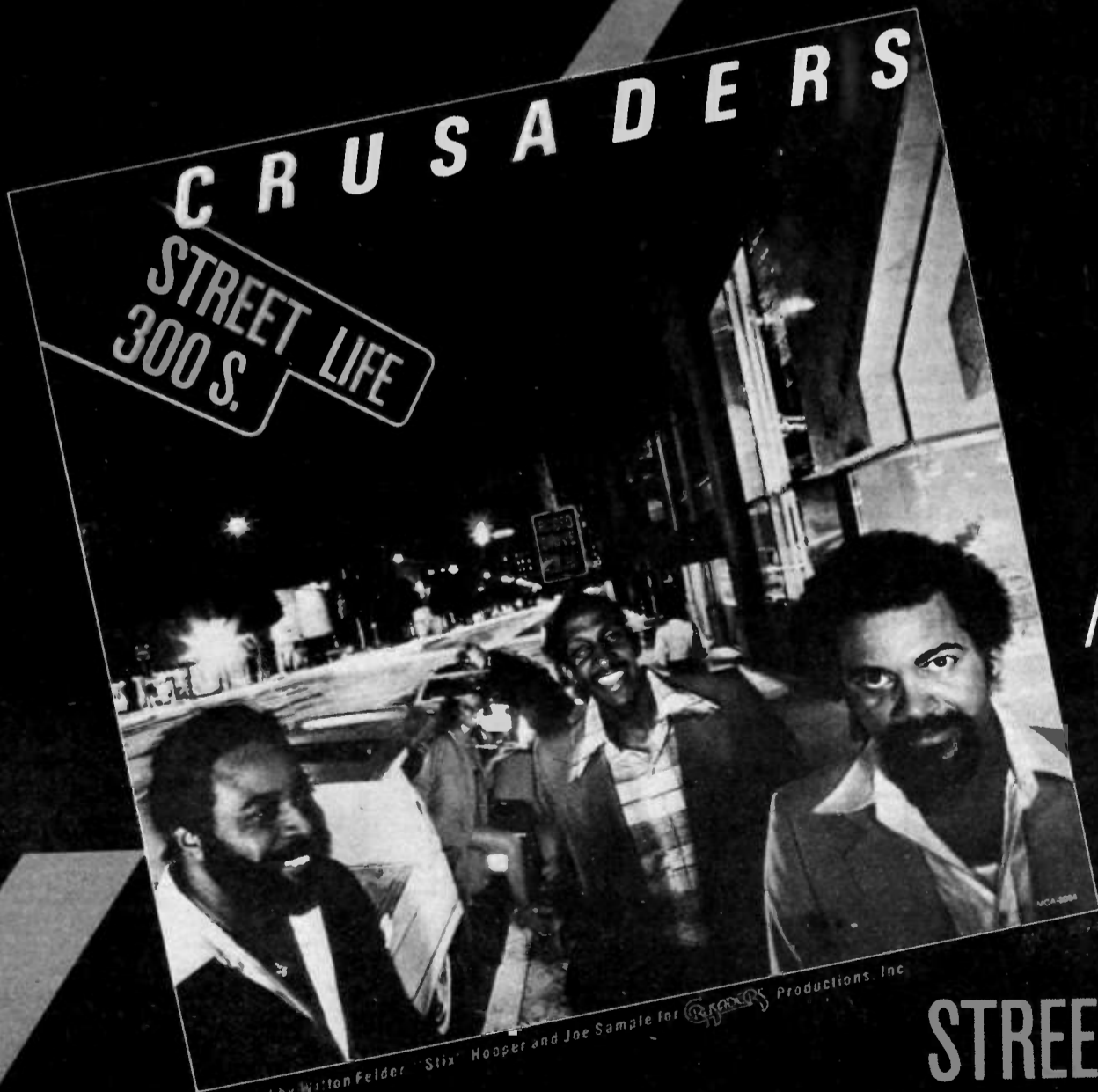

### Making Free Concerts (Almost) Free For The Station

Every week R&R's AOR section mentions an impressive number of radio station-sponsored free or low-dough concerts for their listeners. These shows are usually subsidized by the acts' record labels, and the stations themselves also harbor many of the financial responsibilities for the often-costly shows. KWST/Los Angeles is in the middle of its second annual eight-week series of free outdoor rock concerts, which have been nearly free for the station to produce.

The man behind the scenes of the KWST free concert series is Bill Gerber, West Coast Director of Nemperor, an entertainment conglomerate that includes Nemperor Records. As a former concert promoter himself, Bill has found a method of cutting concert costs that involves the patronage of an unlikely source: county government.

In a nutshell, what Gerber has done is ask the county government's Music and Performing Arts Commission to co-sponsor the spring series of rock concerts. Once the agency has approved the arrangement, this frees county funds for many of the costs of the shows, and makes it easier to arrange for the cooperation of the Musician's Union as well. The MPAC has provided Gerber and KWST with a free county-owned hall (in this case a 2000-seat outdoor amphitheater), paid for security, maintenance and clean-up crews. The Musician's Union uses its nationwide union trust fund to pay the performers union scale for the shows, and other union costs are defrayed because of the county connection and the profitless nature of the shows.

Additionally, KWST has arranged with Tower Records to pass out tickets for the shows, and Tower, in return for the promotional value of the on-air mentions, has agreed to pay for part of the sound system. The record companies are left with a portion of the sound system costs and contract rider stipulations like catering. All of which leaves KWST with a nearly-free concert series; the extent of the station's actual financial responsibility is in the printing costs for the promotional posters and tickets for the series. Of course the station uses valuable airtime to promote the shows as well, but the promotional benefits to the station obviously outweigh the loss of commercial time taken up by the announcements.

Gerber pointed out that coordinating such a series of concerts does involve one investment on the station's part; that of a great amount of time on the part of the person in charge of the shows. He suggested that stations that have Promotion Directors allow these people to take the concerts' burden off the PD's shoulders.

KWST PD Steve Downes also mentioned the importance of a cooperative person in the county government organization with whom the station can work. Downes cited the cooperative spirit of the head of the L.A. Music and Performing Arts Commission as being essential to his station's concert series.

Free concerts that are very nearly free for the stations as well as their listeners? It still sounds too good to be true, but as Bill Gerber stated, "I think the raw materials are there for any county government to be able to do what we have done here in L.A." KWST's concert series, which this year has already featured such acts as Robert Gordon, Doucette and Marc Tanner is proof that this system can work wonderfully well; the station has already set plans for a second series of free jazz and rock concerts for the fall.

### "The Source" Is With Them

This week, fourteen AOR's cross-country began carrying the first transmissions from the new NBC FM radio network, newly christened "The Source." Initially, the new network is offering its affiliated stations six daily two-minute newscasts, all anchored by its Manager of Radio News, Jim Cameron.

On the eve of his first newscast, Cameron spoke of the news department's goals: "We'll be dealing in hard and soft news that is relevant to our target demographic of 18-34 year-old adults. It might be stories about waiting in California's gas lines or strolling the New York site of the next Woodstock festival. I have all the incredible resources of NBC's news team to draw from, and all of its correspondents, though we won't be using their reports verbatim.

"Most importantly I want to try and use raw sound whenever possible. I want to try and get back to when radio was king, when there was that immediacy of the sound of the event taking place. I hope to get back to that radio theater of the ear."

Chief among Cameron's hopes for the network is that it interact with its affiliates. "I expect to use our affiliated stations' news departments' sources to help cover events happening in their communities. We don't, by any means, want to be the sort of network that only thinks that material originated from our New York studios is worth running."

While "The Source" begins as a news network, it will, according to Cameron, branch out shortly into producing mini-documentaries and features, and will provide exclusive radio concerts for its affiliates. Though its initial base is with AOR stations, Cameron's hope is that the features will be of interest to other contemporary music formats, including Soft AOR's and Disco stations.

### End Of An Era: WEBN Pacts With Abrams

Climaxing a full year of negotiations, WEBN/Cincinnati, serving area AOR fans since 1968, has pacted with Lee Abrams as a Superstars affiliate.

Station PD Denton Marr explained the reasoning behind the decision: "Lee usually comes into a semi-crisis situation at a station, or changes its format to AOR, neither condition existing here. He's coming into an existing station that is very solid. Basically what we're trying to do is preempt competition, both present and potential, and to gear up for the eighties. Certain AOR stations have allowed themselves to get trapped by their own histories into a sort of time warp. I don't want that to happen to WEBN."

Marr said he initially approached the idea of a B-A Superstars affiliation with some trepidations. "I had some misconceptions about it," he stated. "I wanted to be certain the station wouldn't be programmed out of Atlanta. But Lee understands the history of the station and wants its future to be consistent with its past."

In the future, WEBN will share in the Superstars systems of lifestyle and music research, which has of late resulted in the stations dumping their softer material for an all-rock musical stance. Marr stated, "This is consistent with our own perceptions of the changing nature of the Cincinnati marketplace. Three months ago we weeded out a substantial amount of softer material from our library, and now we're going to be rocking a little harder still." Marr expressed satisfaction with the station's new sound, and optimism for the new Superstars alliance.

A WORD OF GOODBYES, AND A WORD OF CONGRATULATIONS: As Charlie Kendall bids adieu to a radio station he helped put back on the map, and a radio format of which he has been a chief component, we all wish him great luck in his new managerial challenge. We know his efforts at WIKS/Indianapolis will be instrumental in taking Disco radio to its next plateau as a legitimate and lasting radio format. And to the newly-appointed WBCN/Boston PD Tony Berardini, we add our vote of confidence to that of station management, who have given one of AOR's most knowledgeable and congenial MD's such a fine shot at growing within the industry. Luck to both of them!

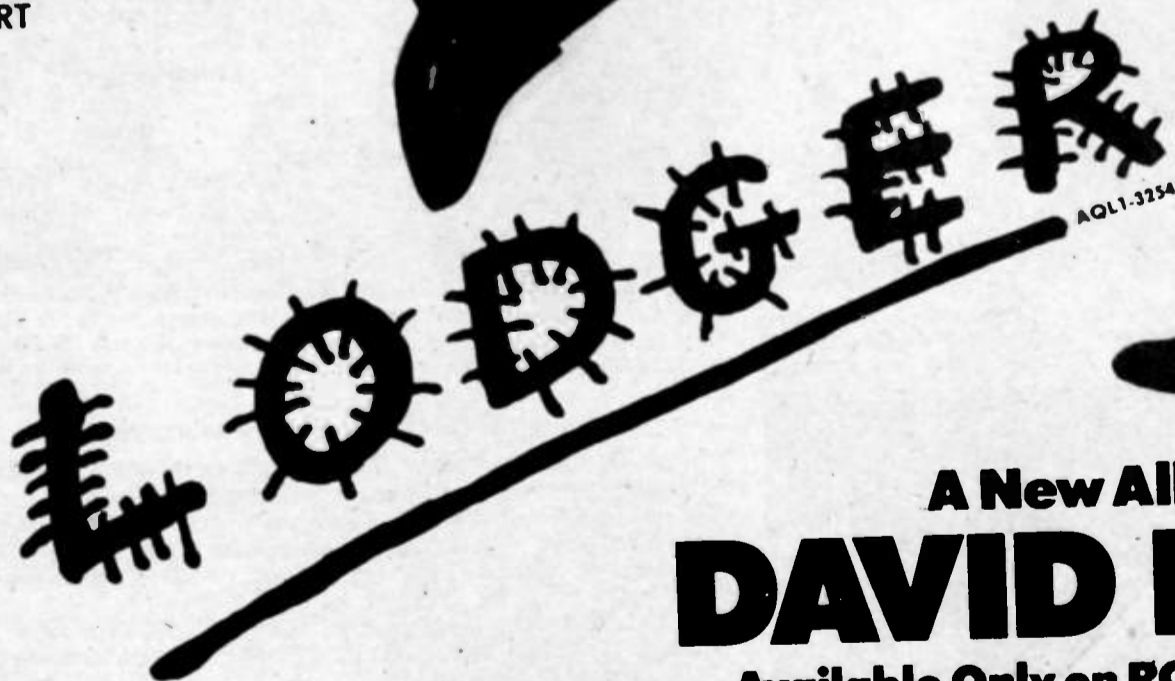

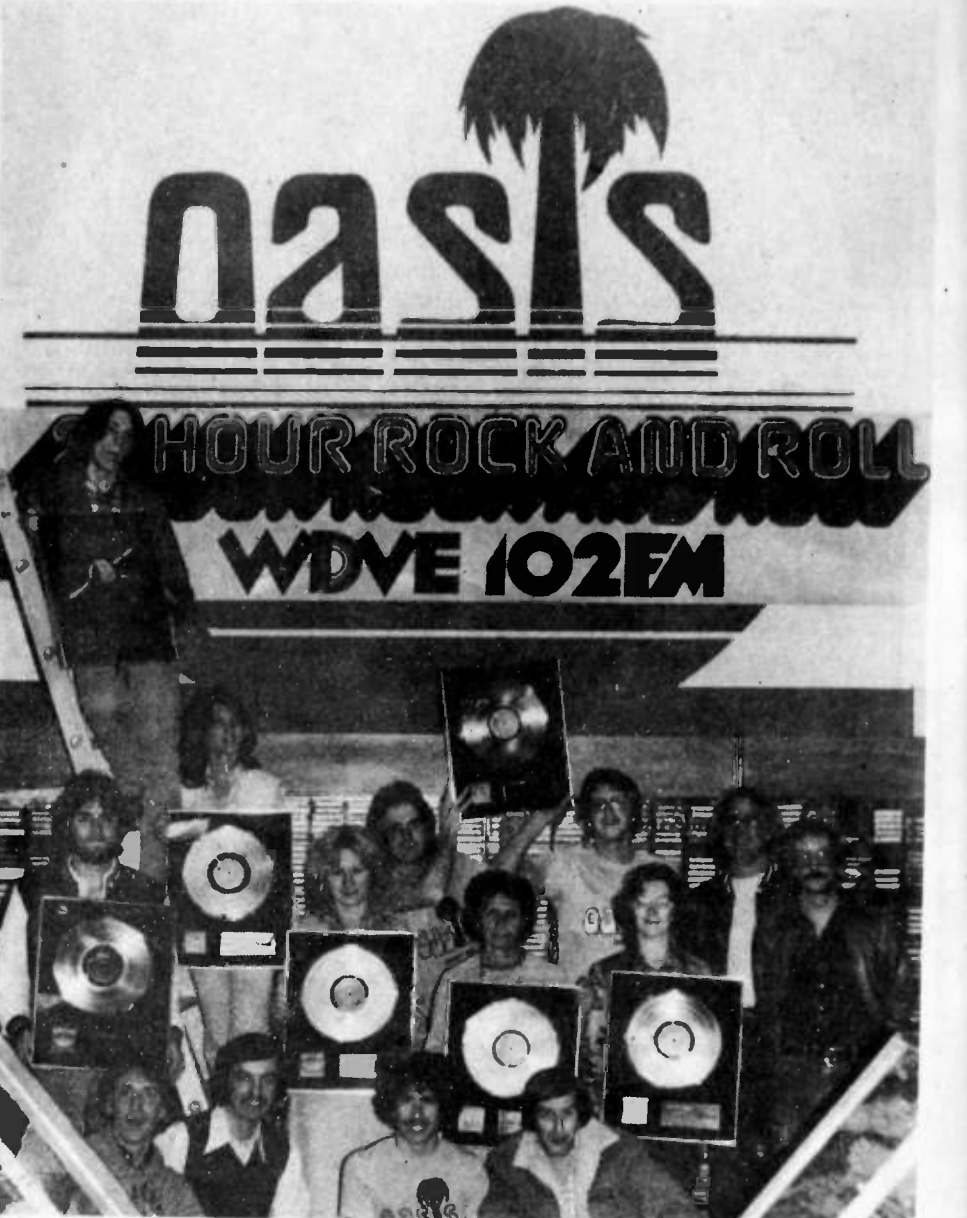

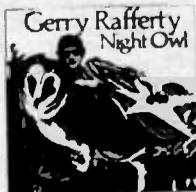

# New and Active!

"Feel It"! **LE ROUX'S** second album, "Keep The Fire Burnin'", should establish the Louisiana-based group on a national level. Last year's very successful debut album showcased LE ROUX'S talents for great songwriting, precision musicianship and the ability to make totally consistent and truly enjoyable records. That LP generated the single "New Orleans Ladies", a smash in the South. "Feel It" from the new album lays down a groove much like a PABLO CRUISE or DOOBIE BROTHERS record, and has the same potential to be a hit throughout the entire country, as is demonstrated by unprecedented acceptance for the new LE ROUX LP by Western AOR programmers. Capitol's rushing out 7-inch and 12-inch versions of "Feel It" as a single, and both versions sound even hotter than the album cut. Again, LE ROUX has made a very consistent album; check out the title track, "Window Eyes" and their show-stopper, "Back To The Levee".

**MAX WEBSTER'S** "A Million Vacations" represents an international breakthrough for the up-and-coming Canadian rock band. In Britain, where MAX WEBSTER is now on tour with RUSH, the rocker "Paradise Skies" is shooting up the charts; in Canada, where the album has already sailed past gold and seems assured of platinum status, "Let Go The Line" is just beginning to break as a hit single. Now, U.S. AOR programmers are turning on to the great production and intriguing lyrics of MAX WEBSTER'S new album.

**FACE DANCER** is a young and powerful sounding rock band whose debut album, "This World", is exploding out of their native

Washington-Baltimore area. The album opens with "Red Shoes", a great rock and roll song that should sound perfect to programmers looking for fresh, energetic music. "Red Shoes" could be another "Roller" for Capitol!

A complete surprise is in store for anyone familiar with **LEE CLAYTON**, the singer-songwriter who's been compared to DYLAN and J.J. CALE. CLAYTON'S new album, "Naked Child", couples his unique voice and moody, haunting lyrics to sinuous, compelling tracks filled with guitar lines that would sound at home on a DIRE STRAITS album. Be sure to check out "I Ride Alone", "10,000 Years/Sexual Moon" and "A Little Cocaine".

Record stores in Dallas and San Antonio are reporting surprisingly strong sales from initial AOR airplay of the **TEAZE** album, "One Night Stands". In the tradition of the best Midwest bands, **TEAZE** is a young but already top-notch performing unit whose concert appearances in San Antonio (always a great market for rock and roll) have created a loyal and growing following. The album's highlights include "Stay Here" (the likely single), "Heartless World" and the all-out "Young & Reckless".

**DOMENIC TROIANO**, former guitarist with the **JAMES GANG** and **THE GUESS WHO**, has formed a new band that mixes rock, funk and instrumental jazz styles. CKLW has already added "We All Need Love" from TROIANO'S new album, "Fret Fever", and it looks like a multi-format hit is being launched in Detroit. Check this one out!

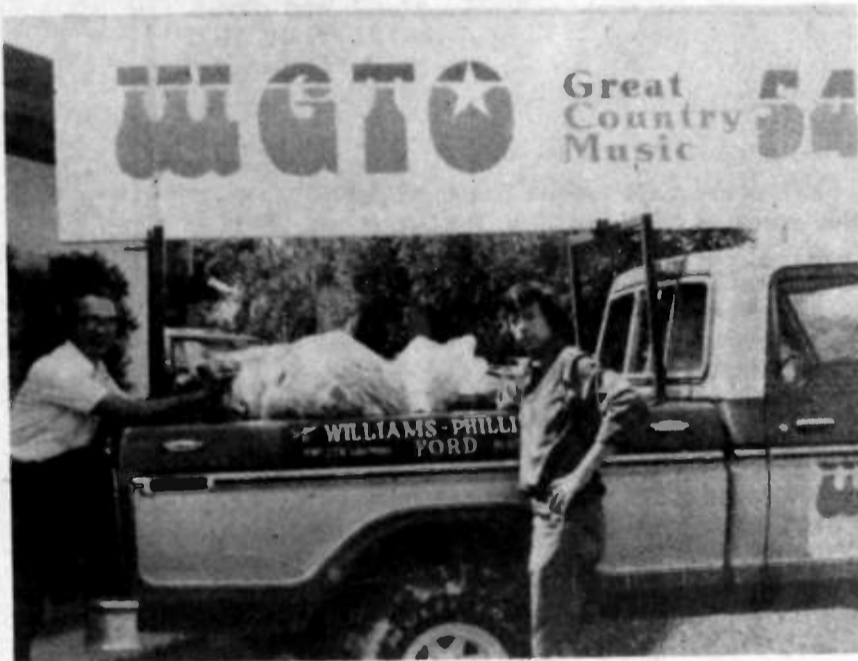

#### A Deafening Roar From Pittsburgh

In what might seem to be a contradiction in terms, KDKA, long-time powerhouse in Pittsburgh, presented a radio program for the deaf.

Because May has been designated "Better Hearing and Speech Month" in the area, station personality Roy Fox invited representatives from the Pittsburgh Hearing and Speech Center for the Deaf to participate. The idea behind this promotion is to dispel many misconceptions about the problems of hearing loss.

Special telephone facilities will enable Fox to take calls from "impaired listeners" so they can participate in this program. The Pittsburgh Chapter of Deaf Awareness coordinated the effort and provided interpreters who listened as the talk show progressed, and relayed the issues discussed by sign language to deaf participants in a variety of locations. In a medium operated solely for the hearing public, this may be the first time a radio talk show has endeavored to reach a deaf audience and make possible spontaneous dialogue between the hearing and deaf communities.

#### The Bank Of Talent

Mike O'Shea, National Program Director of the Golden West Broadcasters chain, has come up with an idea that may not be new, but is certainly a positive one for young talent across the country.

O'Shea plans to implement a program that will (he hopes) supply a communications link between Golden West and individuals desirous of moving up into the key market areas presently benefitting from his counsel.

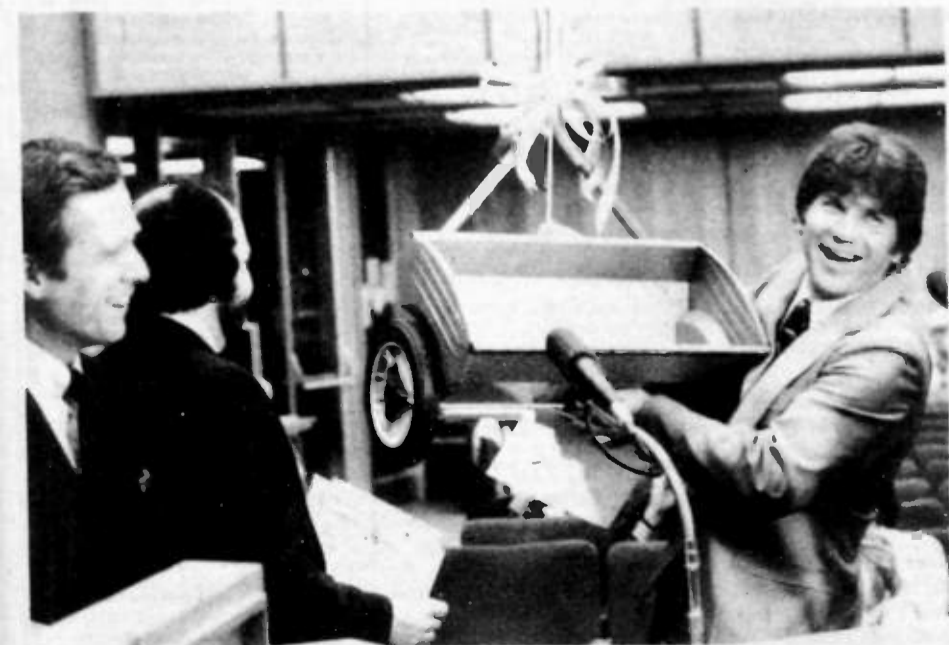
The way all this will work is explained by O'Shea: "What I envision is myself being the human clearinghouse for talented individuals ready to make the move up the ladder with a respected broadcasting group. During my travels across the country, I have become aware that there are many young people looking for and, in some cases, ready for a shot at a bigger market."

O'Shea went on to say that the enormity of his position precludes many personal contacts with those interested in responding to a brighter future.

He also points out emphatically, "The bank of talent that I talk about is in no way an automatic possibility to become a part of the Golden West chain, but simply to establish an open line with talent that deserves to be heard from."

At 1:05pm, Friday May 25, Skylab, NASA's multibillion-dollar space station was passing over Oakland, California. But the news and description of events were being heard across the globe. #### A Deafening Roar From Pittsburgh

In what might seem to be a contradiction in terms, KDKA, long-time powerhouse in Pittsburgh, presented a radio program for the deaf.

Because May has been designated "Better Hearing and Speech Month" in the area, station personality Roy Fox invited representatives from the Pittsburgh Hearing and Speech Center for the Deaf to participate. The idea behind this promotion is to dispel many misconceptions about the problems of hearing loss.

Special telephone facilities will enable Fox to take calls from "impaired listeners" so they can participate in this program. The Pittsburgh Chapter of Deaf Awareness coordinated the effort and provided interpreters who listened as the talk show progressed, and relayed the issues discussed by sign language to deaf participants in a variety of locations. In a medium operated solely for the hearing public, this may be the first time a radio talk show has endeavored to reach a deaf audience and make possible spontaneous dialogue between the hearing and deaf communities.

#### The Bank Of Talent

Mike O'Shea, National Program Director of the Golden West Broadcasters chain, has come up with an idea that may not be new, but is certainly a positive one for young talent across the country.

O'Shea plans to implement a program that will (he hopes) supply a communications link between Golden West and individuals desirous of moving up into the key market areas presently benefitting from his counsel.

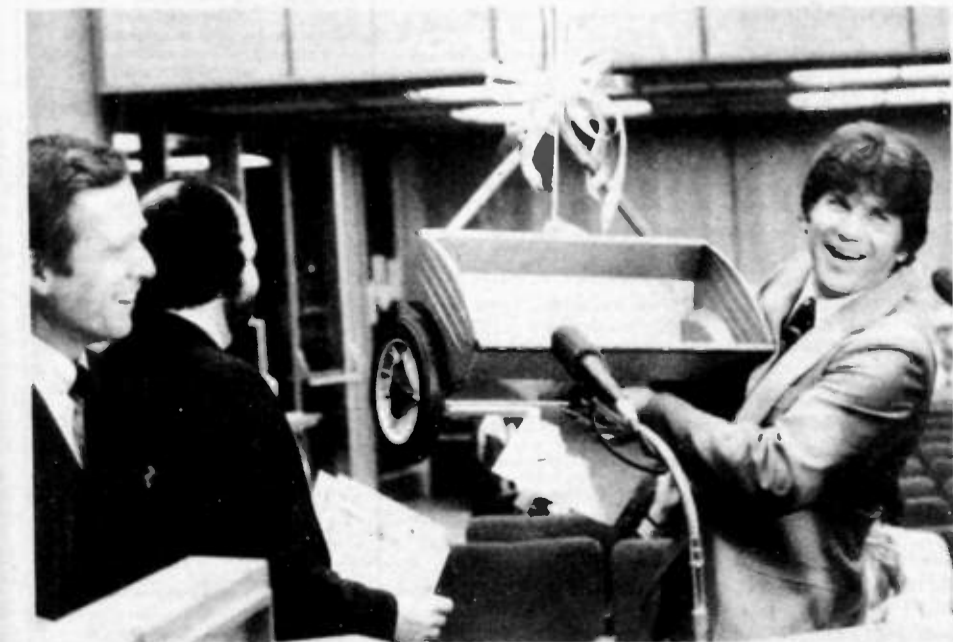
The way all this will work is explained by O'Shea: "What I envision is myself being the human clearinghouse for talented individuals ready to make the move up the ladder with a respected broadcasting group. During my travels across the country, I have become aware that there are many young people looking for and, in some cases, ready for a shot at a bigger market."

O'Shea went on to say that the enormity of his position precludes many personal contacts with those interested in responding to a brighter future.

He also points out emphatically, "The bank of talent that I talk about is in no way an automatic possibility to become a part of the Golden West chain, but simply to establish an open line with talent that deserves to be heard from."
