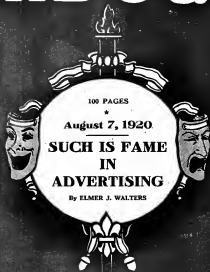

CONCESSIONS TO THE T. M. A. ARE VOTED DOWN BY ACTORS' EQUITY

Proposition Offered Is Rejected in Its Entirety

Standard Form F. M. A.-K. A. Contract Demanded

Action Taken at Special Meeting in Hotel Astor

New York, July 20.—Last night, at a special meeting of the Actors Equity Association, held at the Hotel Astor, the members voted in their entirety to reject a proposition advanced by the Touring Managers' Association, by which the latter proposed to allow concessions from the Standard Form of F. M. A.-K. A. contracts used by the Equity and the Touring Managers' Association. The vote was practically unanimous.

By the motion the Council was instructed to notify the Touring Managers' Association that the Equity demanded the same form of contract from the T. M. A. as that they were using under the F. M. A. This notice was served on the managers in an official communication from Frank Gilmore, the Executive Secretary of the A. M. A. It is understood that John Chalmers, secretary-treasurer of the T. M. A. today.

The meeting of the hotel was called to order by Tom Wain, who acted as presiding officer. After reading the call for the meeting Mr. Wain read a resolution from John Chalmers, secretary-treasurer of the T. M. A. The resolution, in his message the Equity president, said he requested not being able to be present at the meeting, but he was writing on July 21 for America. He also said that the English and French actors and actresses were in heavy season with Equity, and anxious to cooperate with them.

The mortgage-owned and leased school was the only structure left standing, and those were damaged. The entire audience was badly frightened. The show suffered an estimated loss of between \$15,000 and \$20,000.

CRAFTSMEN'S STRIKE ENDS WITH VICTORY FOR WORKERS

Men Returned to Work in Laboratories on Monday

Recognition of Union and Higher Pay Agreed Upon

Craftsmen and N. A. M. P. I. To Confer Upon Terms

New York, Aug. 2.—The strike of the laboratory workers has ended, with victory for the workers, the National Association of the Motion Picture Industry, thru Tom Hines, Chairman of the Laboratory Section of the association, advising the workers to return to work, and after immediate negotiations. The workers returned to work this morning with the assurance that representatives of the manufacturers will meet with officials of the film workers this afternoon at 1:30 for a conference to agree upon a wage scale and other matters.

The strikers have been out about two weeks, the strike being the result of a long controversy between workers and manufacturers. The initial demands of the workers were that they be paid 10 percent more than the rate which was presented to the manufacturers, which the craftsmen claim received an increase. An agreement was reached July 19 by the workers to the effect that they would work again if their demands for better hours and money were not granted. No agreement was said their demands, and on Tuesday, July 20, the laboratory workers safely put their jobs, giving up about thirty days and small salaries in and about New York, bringing them to the degree that it was with the greatest difficulty that some releases were given out.

It has been agreed by the manufacturers that they would be in an environment against individual members of the film workers' union as a result of strike action, but the association asserts that it will not recognize workers who have left the organization when plans have been made accordingly.

In a statement to the *Billboard* today, Thomas Hines, secretary of the craftsmen, said: "The association agrees to recognize a new labor organization to be formed at once."

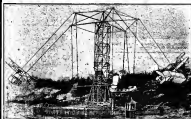
