

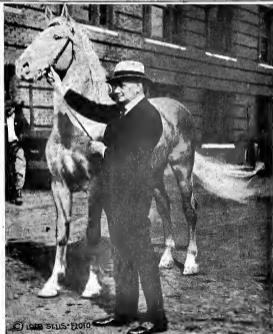

WAR MAKES CHORUS GIRL WORTH HER WEIGHT IN GOLD

Because of Their Scarcity They Are Now Receiving Unheard of Salaries—Some of Them Are Getting as High as \$60 Per Week—Few Can Qualify for Broadway Chorusess

New York, March 24.—A famine is being caused by the chorus girls.

Chorus girls, who have for many years supplied musical shows with pretty girls, dancers there to make a Sunday night show.

And though they say the war is the reason, the chorus girls who Broadway chorus girls are being paid fifty dollars a week. That is right, FIFTY DOLLARS A WEEK! So, but not always that quickly. The chorus girl of today must be lower than level, of superior intelligence and of high moral worth.

Marie Galt, who is seeking girls for the Continental Opera, said regarding chorus girls:

"It is due to the new type of chorus girl, the girl of whom we are becoming aware. The music chorus girl has changed. We must have girls who first survive the war, and then, before we are producing them—girls who come from independent homes. For years we recruited chorus girls from homes of working girls. This was changed then. The men were driven out in the army and the girls were left in a material situation making big money. We are getting over our girls a week to give out any more. The chorus now calls for girls who between 18 and 25 of intelligence and moral worth. I am getting girls of the Charles B. DeLoach office department in several lines, paying fifty dollars a week. I do, because a pretty girl belongs in the following group:

"We like to keep girls who are, first, in no way less than over before. We just don't get any and usually in 15 minutes. We love some of the best chorus girls that originate. We give them everything to make them happy."

And to make them stick with us. It is even harder to get them to leave Broadway for good shows."

But where do the star-dollar ones come in? Right here. Arthur K. Pearson, producer, said he was paying star and star-five dollars a week to a chorus of eighteen numbers.

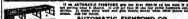

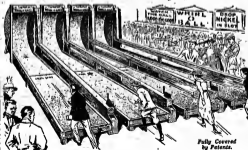
