



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INDUSTRY NEWS

Music Choice, the largest provider of commercial-free digital music via cable and satellite, filed a Petition for Rulemaking with the Copyright Office on September 16, requesting an amendment to current rate-set-



ting laws that would allow a greater opportunity for participation by all affected parties. The petition argued that the Library of Congress's process of setting rates is so complicated and expensive that it severely limits many of the smaller entities from participating, even though they are affected by the decision. "The current situation allows a few copyright owners and licenses to manipulate the process, unfairly imposing barriers and raising costs to rival firms," stated David Del

Beccaro, President and CEO of Music Choice. "Only when rates are set in a fair and transparent manner, with the opportunity for full participation by all affected parties, will consumers and competitors alike be reassured of their fairness and suitability." • Little Big Man

Booking, a New York-based boutique booking agency, has become the industry's first to go Carbon Neutral, an environmental movement led by Future Forests that seeks to counteract global warming by planting enough trees to soak up the same amount of carbon dioxide produced by the company's daily activities. Little Big Man joins such environmentally conscious acts as Coldplay, Pink Floyd, Pulp and Beth Orton by planting 150 trees in the Tensas River Forest in Louisiana. "Going

Carbon Neutral is very important to us and we want to encourage all the artists that we work with to follow suit with their CDs and tours," stated Marty Diamond, president of Little Big Man. The production and distribution of a CD creates 105 tons of carbon dioxide and costs less than \$0.02 per CD to offset. 
LABEL NEWS

Hollywood Records has downsized their staff; about 20 of its 100 employees were laid off on September 17. Please reach out to J.J. Quest, Christy Anderson, Megan Slater and Melissa Langer, as they look for their next opportunity. • TKO Records has announced the signing of Los Angeles' Stitches. The band will release an album in CD format for the first time in its history. Its last record was 1995's vinyl-only *8x12*.

MUSIC NEWS

In a bit of an upset, the 2002 Panasonic Mercury Music Prize was awarded to rising U.K. R&B star Ms. Dynamite on Sept. 17. The prize, which seeks to recognize the best British album of the year based on musical qual-

ity, rather than sales or mainstream visibility, has since been mirrored in the U.S. by the creation of the Shortlist Prize,



which is also awarded to an artist based on creative merit. Favorites for the Mercury Prize this year included Doves, the Coral and the Streets, while performances at the award ceremony came from Doves, Ms. Dynamite, and fellow nominees Roots Manuva and Gemma Hayes. Past winners include PJ Harvey, Badly Drawn Boy, Pulp, Gomez and Portishead. A U.S. release date for Ms. Dynamite's winning album, *A Little Deeper*, has not yet been set. • Meanwhile, the final list of contenders for the 2002 Shortlist Prize in the U.S. has been announced. The nominees, who are not restricted by nationality like the Mercury Prize, are Aphex Twin, the Avalanches, Björk, Cee-Lo, DJ Shadow, Doves, the Flaming Lips, the Hives, N.E.R.D. and Zero 7. The Shortlist Prize recipient will be announced at a ceremony at the Los Angeles Knitting Factory on Oct. 29. • The 16th annual Bridge School benefit concerts have been announced and, as usual, feature an eclectic line up of artists. The school, founded by Neil Young and his wife for children with physical and speech impairments, hosts a benefit every fall. This year's lineup includes performances by Tenacious D, Foo Fighters,

Ryan Adams, James Taylor, Jack Johnson, Vanessa Carlton, the Other Ones, Young and a special solo set from Radiohead front-man Thom Yorke. The all-acoustic shows are scheduled for Oct. 26 and 27 at the Shoreline Amphitheatre at Mountain View in Hillsborough, California. • THICK Records is putting together a unique compilation, titled *OIL: Chicago Punk Refined*. The disc, recorded over the course of 16 days in an oil-blending factory in Chicago, features a number of influential independent and underground punk bands currently thriving in the Chicago scene. Produced under the direction of engineer Lance Reynolds, the compilation seeks to make a comparison between the hard-working mentalities of the blue-collar workers in the Chicago oil industry and the local musicians. Slated for an early 2003 release, *OIL* combines the likes of Alkaline Trio, Detachment Kit, Local H, The Reputation, The Ghost and more. Along with the compilation, THICK is planning on releasing a DVD that documents both the recordings and the daily

work of making motor oil that goes on in the factory. • November 26 will see the reissue of the long sought after first release from Scottish duo Boards Of Canada. The nine-track album, titled *Twoism*, was origi-

nally released seven years ago in a pressing of only 100 vinyl copies. Warp Records is re-releasing the debut on both CD and vinyl, but they are using minimal

promotion. "We'd rather that people find our music by themselves, so that it's something that feels like it belongs to them," explained the group in a statement. • Audioslave, the recently re-cemented collaboration between former Soundgarden vocalist Chris Cornell and the singer-less trio formally known as Rage Against Machine, has announced plans to release its debut album sooner than expected. The self-titled disc is due out on Nov. 19 and will be preceded by a radio single, "Cochise," in October. • The Cranberries have been busy traveling around Europe to promote their new 10-year retrospective release, *Stars: The Best Of The Cranberries 1992-2002*. The 20-track disc, which hit stores on Sept. 24, features all of the Irish band's singles, as well as two new songs, "Stars" and "New New York."

Drummer Fergal Lawler recently posted to the band's official site, www.cranberries.ie, to deliver some good news amid all the activity: "We are taking a month off soon, as my wife is due another baby in two weeks, so I'm thinking about that more than anything. It's going to be

great. I'm sure my plate will be full for the next few months but I'll try to write when I have time!" • John Coltrane, one of the most influential names in jazz history, would have celebrated his 76th birthday on Sept. 23 if he hadn't died tragically early from liver cancer in 1967. However, there's still cause for celebration if you're a fan, as the date has

been marked by Impulse Records with the release of a four-CD box set, titled *Legacy*. In addition to a full disc of live material, the collection also includes previously unreleased recordings and a 60-page companion booklet. • Tour news: Beck will be trekking across North America in support of his new album, *Sea Change*, and, as rumored, he has recruited the Flaming Lips as both his

debut, *Scarlet's Walk*, with an American tour that begins its first leg in Tampa on Nov. 7 and wraps on Dec. 21 in San Francisco. Unlike her previous solo tour, Amos will have backing bass and percussion accompanying her this time, along with Howie Day as the opening act on all dates. The new album is slated for an Oct. 29 release; Swedish rock band Division Of Laura Lee is leaving its homeland and setting out on a U.S. jaunt, following the release of its acclaimed Epitaph debut, *Black City*. The band will be joined by Haven, beginning Oct. 1 in Atlanta, with fellow Swedes the (Inter-national) Noise

Conspiracy taking over from the British rockers beginning Oct. 22 in Los Angeles; Sigur Ros will be rolling through North America, starting and finishing its upcoming run of dates in Canada. The shows start on Oct. 30 in Toronto and wind up on Nov. 27 in Vancouver, with a full run of U.S. dates in between. It's all preceded by the Oct. 29 release of the innovative Icelandic band's

third album, untitled, but represented by the parenthetical symbol ();

Lambchop will be heading out on its fifth tour this year in support of its most recent release, *Is A Woman*. The Nashville-


based group, just returning from Europe, is hitting the road on Halloween in Chicago and will end off a long year of touring in Athens Georgia on Nov. 14.


**BECK**

Sea Change (DGC-Interscope)
Beck Hansen has proved himself to be a multi-talented musical chameleon time and again during the course of a career that has seen him become everything from slacker icon to indie-hop magnate to disco king. Still, nothing could have quite prepared us for this.

Working once again with Radiohead producer Nigel Godrich, Beck has delivered a disc of somber, quiet and — in contrast to his tongue-in-cheek last effort, *Midnite Vultures* — truly soulful songs. The collection is the natural successor to the singer's *Mutations*; most notably its haunting "Nobody's Fault But My Own," a track whose despondency is mirrored here in such sorrowful compositions as "Lonesome Tears," "Lost Cause" and "Already Dead." Flourishes of electronica and orchestration enhance the music throughout, without ever obscuring the fact that this record is really a spotlight on a man and his guitar. A very sad man, it would seem, but as countless great performers before him have proved, there is a beauty inherent in sadness. Beck is quite clearly intimately familiar with it.

**CAVE IN**

Tides Of Tomorrow
(Hydra Head)

After starting out as an alt-metal luminary in 1995, Cave In began a burgeoning metamorphosis into more melodic and expressive territories that's most apparent on its new EP, *Tides Of Tomorrow*. The disc features five new original tracks, closing out

with a dynamic rendition of underground icon Giant Chair's "Everest." Along the way, it takes sweeping turns between waves of searing guitars, ethereal atmospherics and driving, melodic vocals that have only lurked in the shadows of the band's previous releases. "Dark Driving" starts with a haunting guitar riff and brooding drumbeats, allowing the tension to slowly simmer before it all boils over with singer Stephen Brodsky's soaring vocals atop a landslide of crashing cymbals. This release will be the Massachusetts group's last for the Boston-based indie Hydra Head Records, as Cave In will make its major label debut on RCA in February 2003. Meanwhile, whether you meet Cave In's new sound with disdain or great rejoicing, *Tides Of Tomorrow* is a power-packed disc that needs to be listened to. — Louis Miller

**LUNA**

Close Cover Before Striking
(Jetset)

Just six months after the release of its acclaimed Jetset debut, *Romantica*, Luna is both teasing and appeasing its fans with a new seven-song mini album that highlights some of the band's latest material. Like a nicotine-patch induced dream, *Close*

Cover Before Striking leaves the listener in a state bordering on both reality and the surreal. Through the use of vivid and melodic guitars, topped with the soothing vocals of singer-guitarists Dean Wareham and Sean Eden, these new songs are the cure for the withdrawal symptoms we've suffered in the months following the release of *Romantica*. "Astronaut," the album's opener, swirls with the fuzzy electricity of a head rush, while the tracks that follow open up with sheer intimacy and relaxed perfection. Luna exhales a breathtaking cover of the Rolling Stones' "Waiting On A Friend" while claiming the ability to "hypnotize a pancake and levitate the Pope" on "Teenage Lightning." While the vocal tracks are all equally addicting, the instrumental ballad

"Drunken Whistler" is centered perfectly in the middle of the album, leaving the listener clamoring for more.

**TERRANOVA**

Hitchhiking Nonstop With No Particular Destination (!K7)

Get ready for a surprise. Terranova's *Hitchhiking Nonstop With No Particular Destination* is one of the most stunning, original and just plain kick-ass albums you'll play this year. The product of Berlin based producers Fetisch,

Meister and Shapemod, this album is a filthy affair that brings the raw power of rock 'n' roll back to dance music. Comparable in many ways to Prodigy's seminal *Music For The Jilted Generation* and Junkie XL's *Saturday Teenage Kick*, this record is full of bangin' breakbeats, cyber-ragga and trashy guitars. The stoopid beats of "Concepts" gets the party started and leads into the electro-politico "Equal Rights." Former Stereo MC's vocalist Cath Coffey drops her angelic hum over "Breathe" and a cover of Shuggie Otis' "Out Of My Head," while Mike Ladd's rhymes sound remarkable on "Sublime" and "Heroes." The album closes out with the Bauhaus rhythms of "Running Away" and the thrash Pantera meets Fatboy Slim hybrid, "Good Bye The Ferrari."

Hitchhiking Nonstop... is a fantastic album that will undoubtedly get a lot of free rides on your playlists. — Justin Kleinfeld

The Teaches Of Peaches (Kitty-Yo-XL)

After becoming a trailblazer in the electroclash pseudo-genre, the pink latex-clad, potty-mouthed Peaches is getting a reissue for her Lil' Kim-meets-Suicide debut extravaganza, *The Teaches Of Peaches*. The six-song bonus disc is the real treat; it includes a bleepy cover of "Keine Melodien" (by Kitty-Yo confreres Jeans Team), where Peaches cops a luscious Teutonic lilt, plus the sexy Princess-Superstar-on-ecstasy rap "Casanova," where Ms. Peach promises to "tease ya, squeeze ya, please ya, then Thelma and Louise ya." Remixes abound, including an amped-up, head-bangin' remake of "Felix Partz" with Kitty-Yo buddy Gonzales and a Tobi Neumann remix that turns "Set It Off" into squelchy Detroit electro-house. Kid606 forgoes his usual glitch-laden mindfucks to turn "Fuck The Pain Away" into an Eazy-E samplin', Fatboy-Slim-esque arena-rock rave-up. Also, Peaches gender-fucks Berlin's "Sex (I'm A)," by tackling both the male *and* the female verses. There's even an edited CD headed to radio and retail, so finally "Fuck The Pain Away" can be fun for the whole family.

BLACK DICE

Beaches And Canyons (DFA)

Known for mind-melting post-Merzbow noise blurts, tortured hardcore screamage and glass-flinging stage antics, the Brooklyn-via-Rhode Island School of Design noise mongers in Black Dice have turned their sound inside-out — drowning in atmosphere, psychedelia and restraint.

Beaches And Canyons is a sprawling, visual-inducing release that mutates often-soothing, often-jarring electro-acoustic noise into 15-minute dirges. The minimalist "Seabird" is comforting digital skronk and subtle mumbles — *are those fucking wind-chimes?* — that meld into tribal tom-tom psychedelics. The peaceful ocean waves that appear to have turned the Dice from teeth-gnashing sonic terrorists to Faust's lullaby factory make their presence known in "Things'll Never Be The Same," where the digital wash bears an uncanny resemblance to rocking water and, in the 15-minute Tangerine Dream-meets-John Bonham "Endless Happiness," where exotic nose-flutes warble over digital heartbeats, rollicking drums pound and a six-minute coda consists solely of a crashing surf.

Trading the glass for water, Black Dice replaces its noise with poise and floats with grace and confidence.



Ordinary Time

(Transdreamer-Megaforce) Megaforce Records is best known for releasing some of thrash-metal's greatest albums (Anthrax and Metallica are just two of the bands that released material on Megaforce over the years), but the label is going in a decidedly different direction


with the release of Bill Ricchini's debut album. *Ordinary Time* sounds like a disc that could be released on a Belle And Sebastian vanity label. Ricchini has a knack for complex and laidback pop; his smart arrangements go well with his quiet, Nick Drake-like sensibility and his music never has to scream to be heard. Instead, Ricchini's hushed melodies whisper with more intensity than a loud guitar. What makes this album even more of an achievement for this budding singer-songwriter is that Ricchini recorded and produced the album himself on his Dell PC. Some songs have up to 30 tracks and sound like a seasoned producer manned the sessions that shaped them. The dreamy "Deliver Me" is sure to make it on to many mix tapes made by guys trying to impress girls, while the string section alone of "Like Falling Asleep" is enough to get it played on college radio. Bill Ricchini is definitely one to watch. — Brad Filicky

Antiques (Solar Flare Records)

Remnants of a broken heart, bruised egos and the tortures of a young soul — Pilot Radio's *Antiques* speaks to those lonely moments when a burning candle and a pile of old photographs are one's only comfort. A Texas quartet consisting of members Ricky Young

(vocals/guitar), Austen Hooks (drums), Drew Walters (bass) and Keith Shepard (lead guitar), Pilot Radio has a flair for producing simple, gentle songs brimming with catchy hooks and intimate lyrics. With a sound that's similar to artists like Better Than Ezra and John Mayer, "Obvious Things" gets things off to a good start. "World Without You" is a lovely little tune aided by the addition of keyboards, while the vulnerable "Maybe We Won't Die" is rich with lyrical reflections on love lost and slipping hope ("Maybe we won't die/ Maybe we'll all survive/ I'll give it a try, I might not die/I can't say how") and "Easy Target" is a tender ballad that's laced with tear-inducing vocals. *Antiques* is an album to spin on lonely nights when you need a friend and you're ready to find one.

RYKODISC TURNS 20

On the eve of its 20th anniversary, Rykodisc remains one of America's largest and most successful independent record companies.

It's fitting that platinum is the modern gift for a married couple celebrating their 20th wedding anniversary. Rykodisc will celebrate its 20th birthday in 2003 and although the only recording in the label's history to claim a platinum award was a reissue of David Bowie's *Changes*, the Massachusetts-based indie has delivered a lion's share of important albums over the past two decades. Heavily focused on artistic integrity, Rykodisc developed a highly respected reputation for itself by producing quality reissues of artist's work, including the majority of the Frank Zappa catalog, as well as classic recordings from Elvis Costello and Jimi Hendrix, among others. More recently, Yoko Ono, the Meat Puppets and Big Star are among the many artists who have received a Ryko makeover.

In addition to reissues, Ryko's impressive roster of talent, both past and present, is enough to make any true music fan dizzy with delight. Sugar, Morphine, Chuck E. Weiss, Kristin Hersh, Jeb Loy Nichols, Matthew, Medeski Martin And Wood and Josh Rouse, to name a few, have all recorded albums for the label. One look through Rykodisc's catalog, which includes the Hannibal, Gramavision, Tradition, Slow River and Ryko-Latino imprints, reveals a plethora of brilliant albums; Morphine's *Cure For Pain*, Sugar's *Copper Blue*, Zappa's *Joe's Garage*, the recorded work of comedian Bill Hicks and Nick Drake's *Pink Moon*. This is just a small sampling of the many defining titles Ryko has to offer.

Founded in 1983 by Don Rose, Arthur Mann, Rob Simonds and Doug Lexa, the original business plan for Rykodisc (the company name comes from the Japanese word *ryko*, which means "sound from a flash of light") was scribbled down on a cocktail napkin at a sidewalk café in Cannes, France. At the time, compact discs were produced solely in Japan and Germany and the foursome wanted to bring the new technology home to the United States. They had their work cut out for them. However, Rykodisc had an ace in its deck that virtually none of the major labels in America had in the early 1980s: Digital Rights.

When Ryko was established, the company was the first CD-only record label in the country. The majors still hadn't caught on that, in just a few short years, the compact disc was going to evolve into the viable format of the industry. Remember, in 1983, CDs were a high-end audiophile technology — consumers had to go to specialty stores to find the few albums that were available on a disc, and most were expensive imports. Before the compact disc took off in the States, a few artists, including Zappa and Bowie, recognized the potential of the new format and retained the digital rights to their recorded work. Smart move. Because of the major label's shortsightedness, the wiser artists in the bunch were able to retain the digital rights to their recordings, thus enabling them to license the material, in digital form, to whomever they chose. In 1983, a digital rights clause was virtually non-existent in the stan-

dard artist contracts — as far as the labels were concerned, digital rights were useless. They hadn't considered future digital audio technologies. Enter Ryko and the compact disc.

"I have a theory that the digital rights clause in artist's contacts exists now largely because of Ryko, but that's speculation," says Rykodisc President **George Howard**. "If an artist signs a contact now, they sign away the rights for all existing and future technologies. In the early 1980s, nobody thought digital rights had any value. Some of the savvier artists had these rights and were able to license them off. And, these artists licensed their albums to Ryko. It allowed the company to grow very fast because it dove-tailed with the adoption of CDs by consumers."

While some artists, like Costello and Bowie, licensed their albums to Ryko for a just a limited period of time, the results were huge nonetheless. If you wanted Bowie's *Changes* on CD — which a million people did — you had to get it from Rykodisc at the time (the Bowie catalog has since resurfaced on Virgin Records). If consumers wanted something from the Zappa catalog on CD, they had

to get it from Rykodisc. In fact, the label announced its worldwide acquisition of the Frank Zappa catalog in 1994 and still retains the rights to the majority of his releases — a goldmine of recorded work. Eventually, the label began releasing CD-quality LPs and cassettes, but at its genesis, Rykodisc foresaw the future and embraced a technology that eventually changed practically everything about the record industry.

On the eve of Rykodisc's 20th anniversary, it's strangely appropriate that the record industry is again facing a massive technological facelift. And, once again, the major labels are missing the boat. MP3s and file-sharing services are clearly gateways to the future, but who will be the first to embrace the technology in a way that makes everyone — the consumers, the record labels, the artists — equally happy? Short of the Amazing Kreskin or that guy who talks to dead people on daytime television, no one knows for sure. However, one thing is for certain: Rykodisc will be right there, fervently waiting with open arms and one step ahead of the competition.

AN INTERVIEW WITH RYKODISC PRESIDENT **GEORGE HOWARD**



Rykodisc President George Howard started Slow River Records while he was still in graduate school. In addition to being a musician himself, Howard has produced albums for a number of artists, including Matthew, Kelly Joe Phelps and Chuck E. Weiss. "It's important to me that Ryko is seen as a label that's full of musicians," he says. "We have a studio here in the office and I wouldn't have it any other way." Howard has been on the Ryko staff for 10 years and he took over as President of the label in 1999. As he guides one of the country's largest and most successful independent record companies into its 20th year in the music business, CMJ spoke to Howard about Rykodisc, its artists and how new technology will further alter the path of the industry at large.

Many record labels have come and gone over the past two decades; what is the secret to Rykodisc's staying power?

It's a number of secrets. The key has been trying to focus on career development. We're interested in working with people who are in it for the long haul. Because of that, we have always resisted trends. Intentionally, we've never been a niche label. We've always tried to offer the best of each genre. So, if we reissue something like the Frank Zappa catalog, then we try to do it better than anyone else. And, if we're going to do an acoustic-folk record, we're going to sign someone like Kelly Joe Phelps, who is — and I'm biased, of course — the finest in that field. We try to pick carefully on the A&R side so that a qualitative thread runs all the way through all of the label's releases. That has steeled us against the changes in the industry and changes in taste. It allows us to build up our catalog so when something explodes — like what happened recently with bluegrass, for instance — we already possess quality releases within the genre. We own the Tradition catalog, which has tons of bluegrass records in it, including the original version of "I'll Fly Away" by the Kossoy Sisters, which was featured prominently in *O*

Brother, Where Art Thou?. While it wasn't a big seller for us before that movie was released, it was a record that we were really proud of. Same deal with Nick Drake. *Pink Moon* was something that was in the Rykodisc/ Hannibal catalog for years-and-years and he was certainly a cult artist that we did fine with. But, after his song "Pink Moon" was in that Volkswagen commercial, it catapulted his music into the stratosphere. So, it's nice when things like that come along. There's some sort of karma-like retribution about picking artists that have real qualitative worth. You find that, in the long haul, they're the ones that end up sustaining the company over a lot of years, rather than the things that happen to be "hot" for a moment.

Were you as surprised as me the first time that you heard Nick Drake's "Pink Moon" in that Volkswagen commercial?

It was strange because I came out of the punk rock world; I played in hardcore bands and produced records. I had a label before Ryko and I was always agnostic at best, skeptical at worst, of music and advertising. All I can tell you with regards to the Nick Drake thing is that roughly 400,000 people have bought the *Pink Moon* record, largely because of that commer-

cial. I can't think of one bad thing about that. It started selling 150,000 a year since that commercial aired. So, while I have deep ideological reservations about the use of music as a commodity, in this particular case, no one has pointed out a downside to it. That music is so beautiful and important to so many people. Before that commercial aired, *Pink Moon* was underexposed and underheard for whatever reason. Now, that music has changed some people's lives for the better.

Personally, *Pink Moon* is one of the most important albums in my life.

You're deep into music and you found that album before the commercial. But you're the minority. Before that commercial aired, the album was only selling a couple thousand copies per year. But now, people know that commercial and that song — even little kids. If I was exposed to *Pink Moon* when I was 14 years old, I could only imagine the possibility of how good that would have been for my life and me. So, was I surprised to hear it in a commercial? Yes. I wrestled with the idea of it. It's not always a good thing when music is used to sell stuff. But remember, at the core, I am in this business to affect culture in a positive way.

If I feel like I can do that by putting out great records, then that's what's important to me — not sales. That's what gives me the most satisfaction. So, if advertising is way to affect culture in a positive way, then that's great. It's subversive. I always like the opportunity to put out music that's good in a wide-range medium like that because it's subversive. So much stuff out there is really bad. I'm making qualitative judgments that I probably shouldn't. Call me an asshole [laughs].

How will the label celebrate its 20th anniversary? Will there be any releases tied into the label's birthday?

I want to celebrate by continuing to put out great records. I am not into the self-congratulatory

the major's legs. We're not a baby indie. We're not a little tiny record label. But, we're also not a major label. A lot of the playing field is decided on the major's terms; everything from radio to retail co-op programs — those are fixed hard costs that, being an indie, you don't have any advantage over. In fact, indies are at a huge disadvantage because they don't have the deep pockets that a major does. So, we look at artists that don't necessarily need a lot of those things. You're never going to find a Rykodisc artist who is signed solely with the criteria of having a big radio hit. We can have artists who have radio hits, but they're going to have a lot of other things going for them that allows us to level the playing field a little bit, whether it's

things that labels tend to do. It's not my bag. We may do some compilations or things like that. It is the artists who define the label and not vice-versa. In my opinion, anything that we would do around the 20th anniversary would only be appropriate if it was something that highlighted the artists, whether they are catalog or active artists. It's not about the label. The label is here because of the artists, not the other way around.

Speaking of artists, Rykodisc's roster is one of the most varied in the business — the label's catalog boasts releases from Sugar and Morphine to Kelly Willis and Mickey Hart. Is there a certain criteria an artist must meet to be a part of the Ryko family?

All labels will probably say this, but an artist looking to get signed to Ryko should be insanely great. We have to be very careful about what we do and what artists we sign — that's how we stay in business. We figure out ways that we can sneak between

great press — which has always been a hallmark of Ryko — or touring. We are interested in redefining what it is that record labels do. But again, if the music is great, then everything else works out. If the music isn't great, we won't sign it.

Reissues are a big part of the label as well. Rykodisc has worked with and reissued classic albums by many artists, including Frank Zappa, David Bowie, Elvis Costello and more recently, the Meat Puppets, My Life With The Thrill Kill Kult and Mission Of Burma. The primary goal of reissues is to rejuvenate sales of catalog releases. What sets a Rykodisc reissue apart from the rest?

When the founders of Rykodisc started the label, they had one of those wonderful light bulb moments where they were able to see that if they packaged music for people like themselves, there was an audience out there for it. By "it," I mean bonus material, liner notes, deluxe packaging and remastering.

Remember, labels weren't doing those things 20 years ago. Reissues weren't happening then. The founders of the label recognized that stuff like that was valuable and that it would appeal to music fans. Rykodisc started that and then everyone else copied it — everyone from Rhino to Columbia Legacy got in on the act. Effectively, when the majors got in on the act, reissues were no longer an exploitable niche for Ryko. So again, this is why we sneak between the legs of the majors. We still do all of those things, but we're not the only ones doing reissues nowadays. So, we're focused on A&R. We've got to find those undiscovered treasures and bring them to prominence while we continue to do the remastering and bonus materials. We really try to speak to our core audience. They demand quality reissues and they've come to expect a certain level of A&R. That's the brand at this point. People feel that Ryko has a certain level of quality. So, maybe they aren't familiar with the Meat Puppets, but because it came out on Ryko, they'll try it because it's on the label. We try to give as much value as possible for the list price. Again, reissues are not unique to us anymore, but that's what happens to innovative companies; they get copied.

Rykodisc is one of the largest and most successful independent labels in the country. Because the label is so fiercely independent, what are your thoughts on the future of the Internet and record companies? Will the two ever become bedfellows in a way that makes everyone happy?

We have no choice. The Internet is the greatest thing in the world for independent companies. It changes the function of record labels. The record labels have to be a service business, more now than ever. Making records is much more cost efficient than it has ever been. That changes the leverage; record labels aren't the "bank" anymore. Artists are like, "So what are you going to do for me? I made this record and it

came out great. It would have cost \$200,000 to make 10 years ago and I made it for \$20,000 today and I'm not giving it to you forever." So now, the record labels have to ask what their role is in the process. If labels no longer have the leverage of being the "bank," then what do they do? That, more than the Internet, is going to change how record labels do business. If labels don't have to bankroll the costs of producing an album, and they don't have to handle distribution, what do they do? They are a marketer. That's all.

Is CD burning and file sharing damaging the music industry?

No. I'd have to see some specifics, but I think that the consumption of music is way up, but the purchases are way down. It's our responsibility as record labels to figure out how to stay in business with that reality. Online subscription services won't work for anyone but the major labels. From the proposals I have seen for the way that they are going to cut up the pie, it will be financially impossible for anyone that sells less than half a million records to have a career. File sharing isn't as relevant to Ryko as it is to other labels. A lot of our artist's material is traded back-and-forth online, but ultimately we're happily not releasing teen pop that's regularly stolen.

Pick three albums that you feel best represent Rykodisc.

I'm the President of the label! I can't pick favorites! That's like saying you like one of your kids better than the others.

Fair enough. Where do you see Rykodisc in another 20 years?

We will evolve and continue to find ways to make emotional connections for the artists that we have the privilege to work with. If we continue to do that, continue to have the brand, remain on the leading edge of technology, be very careful with our A&R choices and always work hard for our artists, we'll always have a role in the record industry.

INTERVIEW WITH **TREVOR JONES**



While going to school at Boston's Berklee College Of Music, Rykodisc Promotion Coordinator Trevor Jones began working at the label as an intern. "Interning should be the number one priority for someone that's trying to get into doing something like this," he asserts.

"Working at a college radio station is the place to be if you want to break into this industry." Jones has always been surrounded by music. He started playing drums when he was in fourth grade and, even at that early age, he was certain that he would always be involved with music. "The biggest thing about being a musician is that it fuels my passion for the records I work," Jones says. "I understand how much artists put into their work and I feel like I have a connection with that."

What makes a great college radio station?

Communication is key. Great stations get the community involved. Stations must be tight with the community. They need to keep in touch with community events, the listeners and what the listener wants. A great college station keeps an open line of communication with record labels. It's important that they let us know why a record is or isn't great, why one works or why one doesn't work. They should communicate with us about their community as well and what's going on so that we can work with them.

Is there enough communication going on between the college radio community and

the record labels?

Yes. It's my job to make sure that there is an open line of communication between Rykodisc and radio stations. One thing that we take huge pride in is the relationship that Rykodisc has with college radio.

How vital is college radio to Rykodisc?

College radio is a huge priority to Rykodisc. If a band or an artist is on tour, I make sure to check what college stations are in the markets that the tour hits. That way, the band can get into the studio and everyone benefits from that. It's great for people at the station to meet the artist whose records they are playing and it's equally great for the band to get there and show their respect for the station playing their records.

What's the best project that you've ever worked?

The great thing about working here is that it is such an eclectic mix, ranging from Chuck E. Weiss to Matthew. I've had a blast working everything.

What artists are you the most excited about working during the remainder of this year?


The Slip, a band that features amazing musicians with roots in rock, jazz and world rhythms. The band is touring like crazy through the end of November. Then there's Pork Tornado, which is led by Jon Fishman of Phish. The band has elements of funk, rock and bluegrass and is doing a huge tour this fall. We're also reissuing some of the Restless Records catalog, including early Flaming Lips. We're servicing a limited edition catalog sampler to radio by the Flaming Lips, titled *The Shambolic Birth And Early Life Of The Flaming Lips*. It was put together by Wayne Coyne and features highlights, bonus tracks, outtakes and demos from 1983 to 1991. Also coming up are two compilations of Frank Zappa tracks, called *Zappa Picks*. Larry LaLonde of Primus compiled one and Jon Fishman put the other one together.

The Michigan band really stepped it up a notch, going for a more commercial sound — one it's always had in it — on *Welcome*. Want to know the telltale sign of this? The track "Mine" lingered in our brains for about three hours after we stopped listening to the sampler. Nice work, kids! Raise a glass for another band that got its start at metal radio and is about to move

on to the critical next step. • Brian McTernan, responsible for the fantabulous production values on the new Snapcase and Thrice albums, has been tapped to produce the new Beloved record. • Southern Lord Records has signed the Ravenous, which features the all-star line up of Danny Lilker (Brutal Truth, S.O.D., Nuclear

Assault), Killjoy (Necrophagia, Wurdulak), Chris Reifert, Clint Bower and Danny Coralles (Autopsy, Abcess). The band will enter a Canadian studio in November to record *Blood Delirium*. That slab of sludgified crust will be out next year. • Rejoice! Rejoice! Strapping Young Lad, the brainchild of super-producer Devin Townsend (who looks like a livelier version of The Crypt Keeper and is renowned for his zaniness), is currently holed up in Armoury Studios in Vancouver, British Columbia, recording its first album since 1997's *untouchable City*. Some early song titles are

"Consequence," "Last Minute" and "Bring On The Young." Death/Dark Angel drummer Gene Hoglan will sit behind the kit on this release. The departed duo completed their studio duties and were quickly replaced. DFD has completed 16 tracks for its next album, due out next year through Spitfire. 

FIVE QUESTIONS WITH WSFX'S KEN "THE MAD SQUIRREL" McCANN

WSFX Loud Rock Director Ken McCann is not your typical college radio specialty director. He's in his 40s, but he is a busy man who is wholeheartedly dedicated to metal. He hosts "The Squirrel's Nest" on the Wyoming Valley, Pennsylvania station. Random listeners can tune in and expect to hear classics like Motörhead and Black Sabbath, along with the newer metal sounds of KoRn and Slipknot, or unsigned acts like Far From Even. And we learned, do not piss him off or you might end up with acorns in your vehicle!

Why do they call you the Mad Squirrel? Are you nuts?

I worked at a trucking company. My boss pissed me off one day. I had my three step-kids fill garbage bags with acorns. I filled the boss's tractor up with acorns, his desk, his clothes, his private car. There were acorns everywhere! He tried to get me fired. The company wouldn't fire me but they sent me for a psychiatric evaluation. As for being "nuts," they said no. If I were wealthy, I would definitely be called "eccentric." Anyway, the head of the company started calling me "The Mad Squirrel" and it stuck.

How long have you been at WSFX?

Four years, on-and-off. After my first year, I took a job working in commercial radio doing the overnight gig. I couldn't do school and radio at the same time. I chose radio. Here I am at college, taking broadcasting classes so I can eventually get a job in radio. I landed a job on-air at Northeast PA's biggest rock station, "The Bear." I dropped out of school, for a while. Now, I'm back doing my fourth tour of metal. I thought the decision was a no brainer, until I was forced to change jobs, due to poor pay and even poorer benefits. I had to take a job outside of radio to survive. It didn't really matter, because "The Bear" ended up in hibernation forever. To tell the truth, I have been at WSFX so long, I really don't know how long.

Like me, you seem to put a lot of time into writing and radio. Where do you find the energy?

Drugs and my ego! Only kidding. Mostly drugs. I get my energy from meeting and interviewing bands that I have listened to for years, like Black Sabbath, Alice Cooper and Motörhead, as well as new bands. When someone tells me that I can't do something, I get fired up, and do what they say I couldn't do, just to prove them wrong. No one believed I would, or could get a Sabbath Interview. I not only got to interview Bill Ward, I met the entire band in Philadelphia. I do just enough academics to get by. I would rather be writing a review, at a concert, or doing an interview with a rock legend than doing math or Shakespeare.

Will the Mad Squirrel still be storing nuts and rocking out to metal in 10 years?

Hell yes! I am 40 years young now. When I shave, I look like I am 12. I see myself in 10 years with long hair and headbanging into 2012! Best-case scenario? I plan on working in the industry through Mad Squirrel Promotions and Management. Worst-case scenario? I will still be in college, on-air at WSFX!



DISTURBED

Believe (Reprise)

Attention Loud Rock Radio! Recall early 2000, when Disturbed's *The Sickness* landed on your desk. Loud Rock radio immediately laid ownership to the Chicago quartet, propelling it to No. 2 on the CMJ Loud Rock Chart. That unwavering support helped break this band at the earliest stage

in its career, so pat yourselves on the back. Yes, Disturbed graduated from our format to commercial rock status and *Believe* is a rock record in its truest sense. That said, we know you might be hesitant to play *Believe* on your "metal" show, but we strongly suggest popping this sucker in. Frontman David Draiman and his crew are still metal at heart (the band made a rather "disturbing" video for the single "Prayer" that was rejected by MTV and Draiman refuses to alter it. That's rebellious and very metal behavior!). *Believe* omits the "ooh-ah-ah-ah" chimpanzee impersonations found on *The Sickness*. Instead, Disturbed focuses on stellar, solid songwriting bolstered by thick grooves and Dan Donegan's razor sharp riffs. Draiman's perfectly enunciated, intellectualized lyrics and catchier-than-an-STD-from-a-hooker melodies are at the heart of *Believe*. Expect to see this band slug it out on the road for the next two years. In that time, we're sure "Prayer," "Liberate," "Awaken" and "Mistress" will become monster smashes, nabbing airtime on every channel on the FM dial.

In Absentia (Lava)

Porcupine Tree's *In Absentia* is the first post-Atlantic release from Lava Records. The label is no longer under the Atlantic umbrella and Porcupine Tree is a quirky, totally left of center release with a two-fold purpose. It is an album that could establish the label's A&R prowess and rocket its cred

level into the stratosphere. Porcupine Tree is not a new band; it started out as the brainchild of singer Steve Wilson back in 1987. Wilson specialized in experimental, psychedelic music. This eccentric musician once created a fictional band, developed a faux discography, recorded some music, set it to tape and called it Porcupine Tree. The rest, they say, is history. Porcupine Tree has developed a cult following. *In Absentia* is progressive rock that has been brewing in the streets of the U.K. for several years now. It might be your first taste of the band and, while it's more like Pink Floyd than Morbid Angel, *In Absentia* is one of those albums that begs to be listened to from the first note to the closing outro. Thinking man's music: "Blackest Eyes," "The Sound Of Muzak" and "Collapse The Light Into Earth."

downthesun (Roadrunner)

Sure, nü metal is as credible as an Enron exec nowadays, but there are still a few bands in the bunch that get it right. Roadrunner's *downthesun* is one of them. The Midwestern band's self-titled debut



was exec-produced by Slipknot's M. Shawn "Clown" Crahan, produced by veteran knob-tweaker GGGarth (Rage Against The Machine, Chevelle) and features 12 punchy little fuckers that are reminiscent of bands like Slipknot, Mudvayne and Chimaira. Musically, *downthesun* isn't reinventing the power chord, but what it does best is perform with a level of conviction most bands of this ilk never reach. On "Medicated," the band blends KoRn-style guitar riffage with tight Fear Factory-like rhythms as vocalist Aaron (who, like Cher, basks in the mystique of having just one name) switches between smoothly sung melodies and puked-up barks quicker than Jonathan Davis can cry about his daddy. The cheerfully titled "We All Die," "Enslaved," the effectively moody "Lucas Toole," "Scapegoat" (watch the "fucks") and "Pure American Filth" prove that there's still some signs of life in nü metal after all. — Kevin Boyce





ARTIST SPOTLIGHT

BREAKING BENJAMIN

Breaking Benjamin is a confident band. Two of the Pennsylvania quartet's members, guitarist Aaron Fink

and bassist Mark James Klepaski, quit Lifer, a band signed to Universal Records, in late 2000 to form Breaking Benjamin with Ben Burnley (vocals, guitar) and Jeremy Hummel (drums). Once the band was assembled, it started recording demos and playing gigs around the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton, PA area. One of those demos, a song called "Polyamorous," landed in the hands of DJ Freddie from WBSX in Wilkes-Barre. The song went on to become the station's No. 1 most requested track. Freddie was so impressed by the band's on-air success that he funded the recording of Breaking Benjamin's first five-song EP, which sold 2,000 copies locally. Naturally, a buzz began brewing and the labels came calling. After playing a showcase, the band decided to sign with Hollywood Records. Breaking Benjamin's debut album, *Saturate*, is a radio ready, hook-laden riff-fest that effortlessly holds its own against modern rock heavy hitters such as Godsmack, Puddle Of Mudd and Creed. One thing that separates the band from its modern rock contemporaries, however, is that Breaking Benjamin tries to instill a positive energy in its music, rather than the angst that prevails over most of the rock airwaves today. Don't be surprised if that positive energy drives the band on to huge success. CMJ recently talked to singer/guitarist/primary songwriter Ben Burnley gain some insight into the band.

How did Breaking Benjamin come together?

I went to high school with our guitar player, Aaron Fink. I've known our drummer, Jeremy Hummel, for a long time because he's from my hometown. So, we already knew each other, but we were all in different bands. We just decided to join forces and write really good tunes and here we are.

What's the songwriting process like for the band?

For this record, I pretty much wrote all the songs. Usually, I come in with the songs pretty much done and the guys put their flavor on it, thicken it up and make it more fully realized. They put the bells and whistles on it. The stuff we're writing now is a total group effort and everybody's writing now. But I wrote almost all of *Saturate*.

There's a hidden track on the album that would make a really good radio single. Can you tell us a little about that song?

Why did you choose to make it a hidden track?

That song's called "Forever." I wrote it while watching *24*, that television show with Kiefer Sutherland. It's real easy — just three chords. It's a bit of a departure from the rest of the album. That's why we decided to make it a hidden track and not label it. We wanted it to be a nice treat at the end. It turned out great.

Did the band tour a lot before it got signed?

We didn't really tour at all before we got signed. In the area that we're from, the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton area, it is easy to do really well if you have a decent band that people want to see. We just made our living like that and packed all the clubs on a consistent basis. That's how the labels heard about us. Radio helped, too. We were on the radio before we got signed.

Do you have any crazy live experiences that you'd like to share?

There's plenty of crazy stuff that happens when you play live. It's pretty much the standard stuff though. People get beat up; chicks flash you — that sort of thing. One time while I was playing somebody tried to steal my shoe. They tried to take it right off my foot. I thought that was kind of odd. What did they want me to do? Walk around with one shoe? What do you want *my* shoe for? Find somebody famous and take their shoe instead of mine and leave me alone!

A lot of the songs on the album have a melodic edge, but the riffs are pretty heavy. It's a sound that can appeal to a broad base of people. Do you find a lot of metalheads at your shows?

We find all types. We get people who like TOOL. We get people who like KoRn. We get kids who like the Foo Fighters. It's a good mix. So it's all types; black, white — whatever. We have a pretty broad listening audience. So, yeah, we do see some metalheads.

Which songs are the most enjoyable to play live and which songs get the best crowd response?

I personally love playing "Wish I May," which is the first song on the album. I also like to play "Shallow Bay." That's fun. As far as crowd response goes, it depends on where we are. "Polyamorous" gets a pretty big response, of course, because it's on the radio. When we play around the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton area, people love this song we have called "Sugarcoat." They just go crazy when we play it. When we play somewhere else, the crowd doesn't really know those songs. They only know the single.

How many songs from this album do you plan on releasing as singles?

I don't know. We're just going to take it as it comes and see what's up. The record is good and it's hard to pick the next single because I like them all. I heard "Medicate" on the radio today and it sounded really good.

What's in the immediate future for the band?

In late September, we start a small tour playing some radio shows. We're doing a Miller Light tour that starts on October 4. We'll be playing with Epidemic. That tour is only three weeks, so it's pretty short. We're looking to get on tour with a big, big act.

COPE WITH IT

I've been thinking a lot recently about the current state of our beloved music business. These latest years will not exactly be considered by historians as the Golden Years of the music industry. Fact is, the constant battles for control over content, pressure from stockholders, the simultaneous emergence and inability to profit from online opportunities and the constant necessity of appeasing record company egos have all lead us to where we are today, folks: in the Ol' Dumper with little but the unknown ahead. Can independent retail survive? Can big-box accounts continue to justify music as loss leaders to their stockholders? Are labels as viable as they once were? Lots to think about and lots to decide—quickly.

I've been thinking about all this a lot lately, mainly because I came up through the street. The only thing important to me then was the music and the bands (ok, and the chicks). And though I couldn't play a note, all I cared about was being around it. In 1971, I lied my way into a job at Licorice Pizza and within three months I was managing the store—not because I was qualified but because I was the only employee left. Sometimes it's better to be lucky than good. At any rate, my career in the music industry "skyrocketed" to (for me) unknown heights when I started doing returns at the old Mile High One Stop. I later moved on to buying new releases for MS (Milt Salston) Distributing—at that time we were hotter than any

major in the business with smash records from Kiss, Donna Summer, Supertramp, Peter Frampton, Heart, ELO, Kenny Rogers, Blondie, the Alan Parsons Project, Styx—get it? What a fucking blast and what a fucking education, one I could never have found in books or school—just on the street.

My career path has given me a tremendous opportunity to work with music professionals the quality of Shelly Seigal, Miles Copeland, Jay Boberg, Jayne Simon, Candy Berry, Don Van Cleave, Howie Gabriel, Geoff Mayfield, Dave Yeskel, Jordan Katz, Joy Feuer, David Lang, Gary Arnold, Steve Rosenblatt, BB, Jason Whittington, (especially) Yvette Ziraldo and so many, many more. These people are not only my business acquaintances, they are also my friends. On a side note: Working for IRS Records was the most special of special. After all, how many label people can actually say they enjoy the music they are working? I loved every band, and am honored to have worked with World Party, R.E.M., the English Beat, Stan Ridgway/Wall Of Voodoo, Danny Elfman/Oingo Boingo, the Lords Of The New Church, Bangles the Dead Kennedys—need I say more?

So many things have made this business so special to me as a fan. Another fifty pages couldn't explain the incredible experiences,

After a seven-year stint managing one of Detroit's Repeat The Beat locations, Glen Uranis opened Switched On CDs in 1998 after RTB's demise. At a career crossroads like this, you think you can do the entrepreneurial thing better than the place you just left (I know I tried it in 1978 with an oldies/punk rock store I opened after the drive-thru record chain I managed in Dallas went bankrupt—but that's another story). Glen has done better. While opening his new store, Glen came up with the idea of forming an association to extract a share of the local advertising budgets from labels and distribution companies. RTB had been successful in getting a small share of the release-positioning money labels were spending in Detroit (most of it went to Harmony House and the national chains), but very little trickled down to individual stores. After initial conversations with Bill at Rock-A-Billys and RTB alum Dave Houpert at Desirable Discs, Glen helped launch the DMRC (Detroit Music Retailer

Collective) with the idea that they would be much more effective marketing titles as a group.

Switched On CDs specializes in indie rock and '60s Blue Note-type jazz. Using the mantra "keep the customers happy, make them feel comfortable and they'll keep coming back," Switched On has been able to build a loyal and growing customer base. Hosting in-stores has brought many new people in as

well. They specialize in local bands but have also presented national groups like Mojave 3. The only store within a five-mile radius is a Best Buy and the two

stores couldn't be more dissimilar. Besides the intimate atmosphere, the assurance of having a staff of knowledgeable music-lovers makes the biggest difference. They have many programs available, including listening posts and P&P (check out detroitmusicretailers.com for a menu of items).

As if a label with Tom Waits and Merle Haggard could handle any more death ballads and melancholy love songs, Anti-Records has announced a licensing agreement with UK's Mute for celebrated Australian broodmeister Nick Cave and his Bad Seeds. The Nick Cave And The Bad Seeds Anti- debut is set for early 2003, and will be marked by thousands of spindly Eurotrash dudes painting their fingernails black.

You Damn Hoodlums!

It just seems natural that the punks would congregate at a place called Hoodlums Music, and they certainly flocked to the Tempe, AZ store for a series of three recent in-store

performances by some fast 'n' loud three-chord wonders. An August 29 performance by melodic SoCal mainstays Guttermouth garnered both the front page of the *State Press* (the Arizona State University rag) and around 450 people.

At a September 10 in-store, Mesa, Arizona punks Authority Zero obliterated their home state of Arizona (often referred to as "the copper state," for its mineral wealth. Fun fact: the amount of copper on the dome of the Capitol building is enough to make *4.8 million pennies!*). There was moshing galore and a crowd of 700 to 800 kids according to Hoodlums's Kid Counting Apparatus.



Arizonians convene at Hoodlums for Authority Zero. In a bold move, the band opted not to play either AZ's official state song "Arizona March" or the alternate "I Love You, Arizona," which is more popular and easier to sing. They played only original material.

September 10 was the street date for AZ's *A Passage In Time* and Hoodlums sold 312 copies of the damn thing—enough for SoundScan to call the store the following Monday to ask for verification!

Two days later, Irish pop-punkers, Ash, stopped by for a little acoustic performance ... in the TV room next to the store! Ash quietly rocked around 125 kids and sold 40 copies of their latest album, *Free All Angels*.

people and events I have witnessed. I have never taken what we do lightly. To me it's been Christmas everyday: whether it's a new album that would come in and blow me away, a day when an artist like Buddy Guy would perform, or a night at a show with Bowie or NIN or whomever. As I look at today's business, those times seem so much longer ago than they really are. To paraphrase our friend Robert Johnson, we're at the cross-roads, folks. There are choices

that need to be made now about the future of music online, about how to break new artists with longer than one-album careers, pricing, the competitive playing field and exclusives—so many things. Peoples' livelihoods and jobs are at stake. Let us never forget why we got into this in the first place. Let's do the right thing—that's all that really matters. Peace, Cope.

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
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
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
