

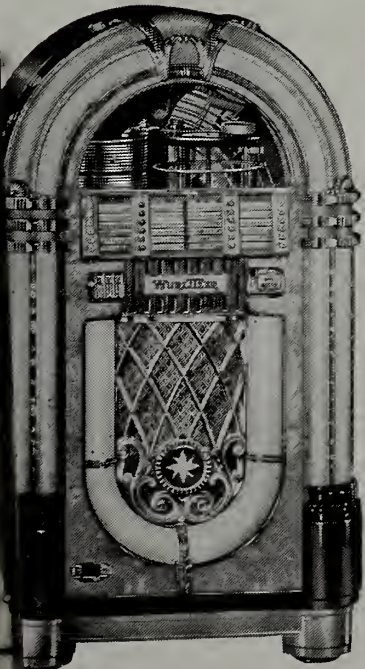

BUCKLEY BILL MAY PASS

Entire Juke Box Industry Urged To Immediately Fight Rep. Chas. A. Buckley's Bill (H. R. 3190) Now In The House Patents Committee. Union Affiliates Asked To Help. All Employees Of Mfrs., Distribs, Jobbers, Operators And Allied Industries Must Lodge Protests Immediately. All Pending Bills Scheduled For Quick Passage.

WASHINGTON, D. C. — In view of the fact that the Congress of the United States is now anxious to terminate its present session and that all bills which have been pending are being scheduled for as rapid passage as possible, the Charles A. Buckley Bill (H.R.3190) to amend the Copyright Act of 1907, which is still in the Patents Committee of the House of Representatives, may soon be pushed out of the House and into the Senate—where it can, in very short order, become Federal law.

And, as is well known thruout the juke box trade, should the Buckley Bill become Federal law then every owner of a juke box in the nation is liable for payment of a yearly license for the use of the copyrighted music which his juke box may be playing. In short, as in the wording of this Bill, each juke box would then be giving "a public performance for profit" and would be no different from a theatre, nite club, or any other spot where an admission is being charged and a copyright license fee is paid to ASCAP, the (American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers) or to BMI (Broadcast Music, Inc.).

It is further well known that in an editorial of three pages in the July 24, 1945 issue of *The Cash Box*, this publication not only analyzed the entire contents of the Buckley Bill but even reprinted the bill itself in its entirety. *The Cash Box* warned the juke box industry at that time (and has continued to warn them ever since, week after week) that as long as this bill remained in the Patents Committee of the House of Representatives in Washington that there was always the danger that some one of the representatives might come to the front for it and push it thru its three necessary readings. (It seems that statements have already been made in Washington by certain representatives to push this Buckley Bill thru the House.)

There is no earthly doubt that this bill (which originally also included the movies in its demand, and which demand was immediately removed from the bill by the quick action of the film people) is now completely and solely directed at the juke box industry. This bill will make each and every juke box owner in the nation pay anywhere from \$100 to \$200 or more per year per machine license for the privilege of playing the music copyrighted by ASCAP and BMI.

To get some idea of the extent of this bill and its financial meaning to ASCAP and to BMI—let us suppose that this bill was being pushed thru now and that the approximately 400,000 juke boxes in these United States would have to pay at least \$100 per year license to ASCAP for each

individual machine, and maybe that much more to BMI. This would mean a payment of about \$40,000,000.00 per year to these organizations from the juke box industry. Is it any wonder then that they are going to continue the battle to get the Buckley Bill thru the House Patents Committee and into the Senate where they can then try to make it a Federal law and force each and every owner of a juke box to pay whatever fee (whether it is \$100 per yearly license or even \$1,000 per year) they may desire?

The Cash Box has been the one and only force in this industry which has been warning the trade about this bill. Should it ever become law this entire juke box industry would halt right where it is at present and perhaps fall down to just a small industry with very little future ahead of it. As one man stated, "That would be that as far as canned juke box music is concerned". And this is one gentleman who means to do away with "canned juke box music".

It is now up to every single member of this juke box industry to get into immediate action and attempt, by every possible means, to halt this bill in its tracks. Not only the operators, jobbers, distributors and manufacturers of juke boxes—but also the entire field allied to this industry. And, in addition, every union affiliate of this industry directly as well as all the union affiliates of the allied industries.

It is necessary to bring labor into this battle at this time for politicians like to count votes before they take a definite stand on any bill. And labor's vote is

the one power which can hold back legislation of this type.

The union affiliates of every single division of this industry protesting this Buckley Bill because it would hurt their labor members to the extent where they would lose wages and revenue would force a decision in the matter of the Buckley bill. There is no doubt that the unions of the cabinet makers, motor manufacturers, etc., etc., in addition to the union affiliates directly connected with this industry and their widespread affiliations into other fields would be of great value to squash this Buckley Bill.

As these reports come in from Washington that many pending bills will be hurried thru as fast as possible, it is up to the members of the juke box trade to as hurriedly offset any obstacle which may be thrown in their paths. This Buckley Bill must be stopped before it can become law. Once it becomes law then this industry will face a fight for negative legislation which is one of the toughest jobs that any group of men could choose for themselves.

At the present time there is no lobby and no committee composed of members of this industry residing in Washington to watch this bill. Certainly there is no one there from this industry working to halt this bill. There must be put together, by the leaders of this field, the proper committee of men who will spend their time in Washington, in the House Patents Committee if necessary—at each meeting of this committee — to watch carefully that the Buckley Bill is squashed before it can raise its ugly head to knock-out the members of this trade.

Furthermore, every single member of this trade must now get into instant action to protest this bill. Not only from his own office to his Congressman, but letters and wires from his employees, from their families, from his locations, from the firms and the employees of the firms from whom he buys, from his union and association affiliations and from all friendly union affiliations as well as from every sort of supplier and every dealer he can push into this picture who would be affected by the passage of this bill in loss of monies and labor.

Unless this juke box industry immediately gets back of this effort the word from Washington is now to the effect that the Buckley Bill (H.R.3190) has all possibilities of passage. It is therefore absolutely necessary for the individual members as well as the associations and unions in this juke box trade to get right into action and not halt until the Charles A. Buckley bill is killed once and for all time.

PHILLY PHONO ASSN. ELECTS NEW OFFICERS

Goes On Record For Nat'l Tax Council By Unanimous Vote

PHILADELPHIA, PA. — In the most important meeting of the year the Phonograph Operators Association of Eastern Pennsylvania and New Jersey, held at the Schaff Building in this city, elected new officers to serve for 1946.

President of the association remains, Raymond C. Bernhardt; Vice-President: Benjamin Fireman; Secretary: Elsie W. Zercher and Treasurer: Harry Stern.

The following were elected to serve on the Board of Directors: Philip Frank, Frank Fromowitz, Herman Scott, Louis N. Sussman, Louis Klein, William L. King and William Appel.

The entire organization was tremendously pleased with the officers and the Board of Directors. Expressions from phono ops who attended the meeting were unanimous to the effect that, "the association will continue to do a grand job in 1946."

Most important vote held during this meeting was on the proposal made by *The Cash Box* for some years now that the industry create a "National Tax Council" for the complete protection of the trade so that when new and higher taxes are attempted the men will have some central source where they can obtain complete information, data, precedents, former cases, expert tax advice, etc.

This organization unanimously voted into their records that they would immediately enter into a "National Tax Council" and have set aside sufficient monies for such entrance.

At the present time the organization is fighting a proposed revenue bill here to raise the present license fee to \$25.00 per year per phono. They need experts who have been engaged in such tax revenue raising efforts before. But since there is no "National Tax Council" in existence in the industry today they have continued to fight on alone.

The organization calls to other associations thruout the country to get back of *The Cash Box* proposal that a "National Tax Council" be created. They ask that all associations contact them and start such an organization into being. They believe that the entire country wants and desperately needs a "National Tax Council".

President Bernhardt of this association stated, "We should like to be kept informed of any and all moves anywhere in the nation to get a 'National Tax Council' under way.

RAY WILLIAMS IN HOUSTON

HOUSTON, TEX. — Jess B. Skiles, manager of the Commercial Music Co., this city, reports that Ray B. Williams who heads the firm visited here after a trip to Chicago and brought news of the forthcoming "National Wurlitzer Days" which excited all the music machine trade in this city.

Skiles reports, "Mr. Williams was met by many music merchants here who were waiting to hear him tell them about the new Wurlitzer phonographs and remote control equipment for 1946. These music merchants were tremendously impressed and all eagerly look forward to the forthcoming 'National Wurlitzer Days'."

Terrence Corrison Passes Away

CLIFFSIDE PK., N. J. — Terrence Corrison, father of Eddie Corrison of Palisade Specialty Company, this city, passed away this past Monday (December 17) at 9:30 P.M. of complications following a serious operation at the Holy Name Hospital in Teaneck, N. J. He was 66 years old.

Mr. Corrison had been a resident of this city for over 30 years and was extremely active in all civic affairs. He was one of the most noted and best loved men in this community. He had, for many years, been the leader in all efforts to benefit this city and was known for his welfare work thruout the community.

All civic leaders and a great many noted citizens here felt the loss very keenly. All acclaimed the work which Mr. Corrison had done to help beautify this community and to win it greater acclaim.

In his youth, Mr. Corrison was a very noted athlete. He was one of the walking champions of the New York Athletic Club. He continued active in athletic events until the time of his demise.

Many coin machine friends are mourning with Edward Corrison the loss of his father.

COINMEN FLOOD MAILS WITH 1946 CALENDARS

NEW YORK — From everywhere in the nation coin machine buyers are being flooded with colorful calendars being issued by leading distributors and jobbers in the trade.

Last year was supposed to have set a record with the number of calendars which arrived to coin machine buyers from jobbers and distributors, but from information already at hand it seems that 1946 will find some of the buyers with as many as 20 and 30 calendars from as many different firms in the trade.

R & S Sales Aireon Distribbs In Virginias

MARIETTA, O. — Ted Snearly and R. D. Rose of R & S Sales Company, this city, report that they have been appointed distributors for Aireon Manufacturing Corp. phonos and remote control equipment for the states of Virginia and West Virginia.

The firm are planning new offices in Richmond, Va. and also in West Virginia very soon in addition to their present offices here in this city.

Both men are extremely enthusiastic over the Aireon music line and believe that this will be the leading line for '46.

Ted Snearly stated, "After being connected with the automatic music business as long as I have I believe that I can state with complete honesty and also with complete knowledge of what the operators want. I have seen the Aireon phonographs and also the Aireon remote control equipment and I feel sure that when the operators also see this line of automatic music merchandise they will agree with Mr. Rose and myself that it is what they need."

XMAS TIME FACTORY MUSIC GIVES OPS GOOD RENTALS

NEW YORK — Phono ops report that many factories thruout this territory are leasing juke boxes for the entertainment of their employees during Xmas parties. Rentals range anywhere from \$20 to \$35 per day for each instrument.

Some of the coinmen here are pulling in low take machines to turn these over to factories in this area who have been phoning to get juke boxes. One leading op reports, "We are asking \$35 per day to rent these factories a phonograph for the entertainment of their employees during their Xmas parties. We believe that this is a fair charge for we have to not only service the machine but it must play continuously and, many times, it receives tremendous abuse at these parties."

EAST AND MIDWEST STORMS TIE UP EQUIPMENT

NEW YORK — Leading jobbers and distributors here report that much equipment has been tied up en route to them by the blizzards which have been raging thruout the East and Midwest.

All equipment being shipped over New York Central Railroad lines is being re-routed out of the Buffalo, N. Y. area due to the great blizzard which this city underwent and which left over four foot of snow piled up in its wake.

New York City itself was struck by a storm of blizzard proportions this past Wednesday which practically halted all shipments of coin machines from this city to other parts of the nation.

Chicago coinmen, too, who have been in phone communication with the trade here, report that storms in the Midwest have slowed up shipping and tied up many machines which were en route to them.

AOLAC HOLDS BIGGEST MEETING OF YEAR

Samuel "Curley" Robinson Unanimously Voted Contract For Five Year Additional Term As General Manager. Forsee 6,500 Games Operating In Los Angeles County Before 1946 Is Over.

LOS ANGELES, CAL. — The Associated Operators of Los Angeles, Inc., this city, held the largest meeting of this year this past week with over 175 of their members attending.

It was more than just a regular meeting of this noted organization. There was a gala feeling in the air with the holidays approaching, with the fact that peace was here at last and that new machines had started to appear in this city from manu-

facturers' production lines.

Great interest was evidenced thruout the meeting in the new, forthcoming equipment and many questions were asked as to when members would be able to purchase these. There were distributors on hand to answer these questions as well as they could.

Some interest was also shown in the prices of the new machines. The distribs who attended the meeting gave as much information as they could in this direction. Tho there was some sentiment shown in regard to the fact that prices were higher than pre-war, it was generally accepted with the labor and materials costs so much increased that this was to be expected. The ops who attended agreed that as long as new equipment was arriving the price didn't much matter.

The highlight of the meeting was the tremendous enthusiasm shown in the unanimous vote given to the managing director of AOLAC, Samuel (Curley) Robinson, who was asked to retain his present office for an additional five year term. A contract is being signed and given to "Curley" for these forthcoming five years.

"Curley" spoke before the entire assemblage and brought forth the many problems which the organization had faced during the war years. He explained how locations of association members, who had joined the armed forces, were maintained and preserved for them during the period they were in the Army or Navy. He also pointed out that the organization had actually grown more closely knitted together during these past war years. He vehemently attacked "malicious rumor mongers" whom, he claimed, were attempting to create strife and dissension in the organization and who also were directing much of their rumors against him, personally.

Curley then introduced Col. Marshall Micon, Los Angeles representative of "The Cash Box", who made a speech to the group regarding the general work of this publication as well as its policies in regard to the entire Pacific Coast trade.

Among the distributors who were called upon for short talks regarding the factories they represented and what they expected would help the trade were: Al. Griebahn of California Amusement Company; Leonard Micon of Pacific Coast Distributors; Paul Laymon of the Paul Laymon Company; Jack Simon of Sicking, Inc. and E. Ray of D. Gottlieb & Company, Chicago.

One of the most effective statements made by Curley Robinson during his speech to the men present was that at this time there were approximately 4,600 games operating in Los Angeles County. He also explained that this figure had dropped down to about 1,700 during the war period. "But", he stated, "we expect that before 1946 is over there will be 6,500 machines in operation in Los Angeles County alone."

NEW DISTRIBS SEE AIREON PHONOS

KANSAS CITY, KANS. — Aireon Manufacturing Corporation, Radio and Phonograph Division, played host to several new distributors this week and plan to continue with several private showings here, prior to the nation-wide distributor showings to be held throughout the country after the first of the year.

The men were enthusiastic over their first glimpse of Aireon's new automatic phonograph and remote control equipment. All agreed with their host, R. R. "Rudy" Greenbaum, Vice-President of Aireon, that "As far as the automatic phonograph is concerned, Aireon has certainly made a reality out of 'the shape of things to come'."

G. E. PRESENTS HOT DOG VENDER

SCHENECTADY, N. Y. — After a year of experimentation, General Electric Manufacturing Co., this city, believe that they have at last perfected an electronic, automatic "hot dog" vender.

For one dime the public can now step up to the machine, which is much similar to any juke box in the attractiveness of its cabinet, and get a hot dog broiled right in the roll. As yet the firm haven't perfected any method for also vending mustard along with the electronically broiled hot dog.

The "dog" is cooked from the inside out and is reported to be extremely tasty. The machine is expected to go into immediate production at the factory here. Quite a demand is anticipated.

Rumors have been rife thruout the trade for sometime now that G.E. was producing such a machine. This is the first official publicity released regarding the fact that this firm are entering into the automatic merchandising field.

The belief is that a great many small restaurants and lunch counters thruout the country will buy this unit, not only because of its novelty, but also because of the fact that it will save them much time and money.

There are many operators in the trade who believe that they can very profitably operate such machines in their penny arcades and at park concessions as well as at many other spots in their communities.

HAROLD KLEIN VISITS AIREON PLANT

MILWAUKEE, WIS. — Harold Klein of Klein Distributing Company, this city, has just returned from a visit to the Aireon Manufacturing Corp., Kansas City, Kans., and reported that he was very much impressed with what he saw there.

According to Klein, "After seeing the new Aireon line of phonos, and also the accessories and other equipment the

firm will have for the trade sometime right after the New Year, I can only report that we are enthusiastically eager to get going with sales once again and give the music operators in this territory something which they have been looking forward to for many years.

"We are preparing to hold a very outstanding showing for the Aireon phonographs here as soon as they arrive. We believe that the music trade in this area will admit that they have never yet seen some of the brand new innovations in design and mechanism which they are going to see on these phonos."

Doc Eaton also reported, "We have received many pictures of AMI phonos being used all over the world by our armed services. This one was most interesting in view of the fact that it is being serviced by a general mechanic who has little or no knowledge of automatic phonographs."

Juke Box Gets China's First Lady Hep To Jitterbugging

PEIPING, CHINA — Mme. Chiang Kai-shek, China's first lady, saw her first demonstration of American jitterbugging at the swank Red Cross Legation Club in this city when she visited here on a Saturday night.

With the juke box located in the club playing "In The Mood" someone informed Mme. Chiang that this was good jitterbug music. She promptly replied that she had never yet seen it danced.

Sgt. Thomas Kearns of New York and Prudence Hemenway of Buffalo volunteered for the command performance.

With the introduction of jitterbugging to China's many young people, juke boxes are expected to grow more popular thru-out this huge country.

Majestic Records To Have Plastic Disk

NEW YORK — James J. Walker, former Mayor of New York and president of Majestic Records announced this past week that phonograph records made of a plastic material known as Duraflex are now being produced by the firm.

Walker stated that the records produce "studio presence", fidelity of tone and reduction of surface noise and scratch "unobtainable with ordinary records."

Guy Lombardo Wins Radio Editors' "Best Band" Title

NEW YORK — Guy Lombardo's sweet music has captured the title of "The Country's Best Dance Band" in the Motion Picture Daily's annual poll of 600 radio editors and columnists thruout the country.

Many juke box coinmen carefully watch this poll for it usually reflects a steep rise in the records of the band chosen for this number one position.

There is no doubt that Guy Lombardo recordings will get a very good play at this time, as the results of this poll are made nationally known to the public.

RFC OFFERS SURPLUS HAND TRUCKS FOR SALE

NEW YORK — More than 35,000 surplus hand trucks of the two wheel type, used for handling cases and barrels, have been placed on sale nationally to wholesalers and retailers on a fixed price basis by the Reconstruction Finance Corporation, New York Regional Director Frank L. Seymour of the Surplus Property Division-Consumer Goods, announced this past week.

Approximately 30,000 of the trucks are new and have ten-inch metal wheels. Some are equipped with rubber tired wheels.

For this region the sale will be conducted at the regional offices of the RFC, 61st floor, Empire State Building.

CANDY AT NEW HIGH

WASHINGTON — Operators of candy machines will be happy to hear that the Department of Commerce reported that 1944 candy production was at an all time high of 2½ billion pounds, an average of 20.5 pounds person.

This year, with the sugar shortage even more acute, production is high enough for an average of 18.6 pounds per person.

The department conceded that last year "the market for candy was not entirely satisfied". It said that the nation could have absorbed an additional 700 million pounds, if they had been available. (More than 25 percent of last year's production was bought by the Government for the armed forces.)

England's Decca Records Has Financial Ad in N. Y. Times

NEW YORK — Sir Cyril F. Entwistle, chairman of the Decca Record Co., Ltd. of London, England, reports on the 16th annual general meeting of the company in a large ad in the financial pages of the New York Times this past week.

He advises of the firm's work in accurate navigational systems as well as other war materials developments. At the same time he reports the firm's world-wide interests and also tells of the stock of Decca Records, Inc. of the United States.

Most interesting part of this report is the fact that this company believe they now have a revolutionary "gramophone" and that new type records will be made which are a great advancement over pre-war type records to go along with this unit.

He also reports that export has started to Sweden and that the company believe they are on the way for their biggest business boom.

No Relief On Lumber Until Spring 1946 Survey Shows

NEW YORK — The Lumber Survey Committee with J. L. Miller, chief, lumber unit, Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce as secretary, report that with production still declining in the face of unprecedented demand, lumber continues in short supply and there is very little prospect for relief before next spring.

Civilian demand, pent-up by years of war, has replaced the military demand, the report added. The Army and Navy are using their own stock-piles to meet their reduced requirements.

Stocks now are at the lowest recorded level. Lumber is moving to consumers at the rate of 2,000,000,000 feet per month, about the same rate as during the Fall of '39.

With the demand in the cointrade for cabinets of every kind growing daily, it is generally believed that this very short supply will hold up full production of all coin machine products using lumber in any quantity. The trade cannot expect to see volume production until the lumber supply loosens sufficiently to insure greater delivery.

WESTERN CITY MAG REPORTS ON COUNTY'S POWER TO LICENSE PINBALLS

SEATTLE, WASH. — "Western City" magazine gives a most complete report on a "county's power to grant pinball licenses within city limits" which should prove of good interest to all the trade. There may be other rulings to this effect in various other states. The above applies to the State of Washington. It reads as follows:

"COUNTY'S POWER TO GRANT PINBALL LICENSES WITHIN CITY LIMITS. We are asked whether a county has power to impose and collect a license fee for the privilege of operating pinball machines within a city.

"Section 11 of Article XI of the State Constitution provides that "any county, city, town or township may make and enforce within its limits such local police, sanitary and other regulations as are not in conflict with general law.

"Section 4056 Rem. Rev. Stat., granting powers to Board of County Commissioners, provides in part that they shall have power 'to license and fix rates of ferriage; to grant grocery and other licenses authorized by law to be granted by them.' These are the only provisions of law which we have been able to find which might be relied on by counties as authorizing them to license pinball operations within the county either inside or outside of cities.

"The constitutional provision referred to relates to police power matters. The licensing of pinball machines may be done as a police power measure if the license is in an amount sufficient only to cover the cost of regulation; i.e., if the licensing is not done as a means of raising revenue. However, a police power regulation or a licensing for police power regulation, or for that matter any other regulation prescribing a course of public conduct, could only be enforced by means of penalties imposed for violation of the regulations. We find no law authorizing County Commissioners to impose penalties for violation of its police or other regulations and fixing the amount or nature of the penalty which can be imposed.

"We find no law expressly authorizing Boards of County Commissioners to grant pinball operators licenses or to grant any licenses which can be said to include pinball operators. The deficiencies in the law with respect to penalties would also apply to such licenses.

"There is specific statutory authority for cities to grant licenses and to impose penalties for violation of the license ordinance.

"While it is true that cities are included within the territorial limits of counties, and for certain purposes are regarded as a part of the county, from the course of state legislative action and lack of action it seems plainly evident that the legislature intended the power granting cities to license and regulate businesses and to enact police regulations to be exclusive in cities, except in so far as the state itself may have preempted that field and excluded cities therefrom. In this connection insofar as county officers act in enforcing state penal statutes they are doing so as agents of the state and not as agents or officers of the county.

"So far as we are aware there is no Supreme Court decision on the question but it is our opinion that the Board of County Commissioners has no power to require a license and the payment of a fee for the privilege of engaging in the business of operating pinball machines within city limits."

NEWARK EVENING NEWS FEATURES STORY ON MAKING GAMBLING LEGAL

Study of Chicago Crime Prevention Expert Suggests Electing "Gambling Commissioners"

NEWARK, N. J. — The Newark Evening News, one of the largest papers in the country heavily featured a story on the perils of making gambling legal. Part of this story was devoted to Jersey City wherein political tie-ins are said to have made gambling possible. The story is based on the study by Virgil W. Peterson, operating director of the Chicago Crime Commission.

Thruout this study Peterson is very much against placing the licensing of gambling in the hands of any local or state political machine. Otherwise, he reports, the entire licensing program is sure to fail.

He states in part, "Licensing proposals are based primarily on the contention that because of the human desire to gamble it cannot be suppressed and, therefore, should be licensed and legalized with the people sharing in the profits instead of allowing the hoodlum element to reap all the gains.

"If these proposals are based on sincerity then it is clear that only one type of proposal is worthy of any consideration at all. If gambling is to be legalized it should be completely controlled and operated by the state with all the profits accruing to the people.

"A state agency should then be set up to operate and control the gambling business. It should be completely removed from politics. A commissioner of gambling should be elected directly by the people at a separate election."

Mr. Peterson then suggests, "Candidates for office (that of 'gambling commissioner') should carry no political party appellation. Rigid restrictions should be placed in the statute to make it impossible for anyone who holds, or had held, any political position, including that of a ward committeeman, alderman or precinct captain, from having any connection with the administration of the state agency that is set up to operate the gambling business for the state.

"It should be illegal for any political party to indorse or actively work for the election of the gambling commissioner. The salary of the commissioner should be sufficiently great to attract the most ably qualified men in the state.

"He should then be empowered to select his own administrative staff. The complete responsibility for the operation and control of the legalized gambling business thruout the state should be fixed with the commissioner.

"The law should have sufficient 'teeth in it' to assure that there could be no shifting of responsibility. All of the profits would go to the benefit of the people of the state."

Peterson states that perhaps this scheme would fail but he feels, "there is no justification whatever for the business of gambling to be legalized and permitted to operate for private profit, nor is there any justification for the non-productive lucrative business of gambling being operated for the benefit of any political organization".

Peterson also stated that indorsement of legalization proposals is not confined to gamblers and politicians. He says, "A considerable number of outstanding citizens without political ambition or affiliation and who are sincerely interested in civic betterment, believe that the licensing of gambling is the solution to the troublesome situation."

Peterson also writes, "There are many who enjoy gambling and can do so under proper circumstances without affecting the crime problem in any manner and with little, if any, detrimental effects on social welfare. Only moralists or reformers have any interest in such private conduct."

MATHENY BECOMES AIREON DISTRIB

WICHITA, KANS. — H. A. Matheny of Matheny Vending Co., this city, has been appointed distributor for the Aireon Manufacturing Corp. for the state of Kansas.

Matheny stated that the firm were going all out for Aireon and that they intended to show the music ops in this state the way to greater profits with this line.

Matheny also reported that the firm would have a most complete display and a special showing of the Aireon music line when the machines became available.

At the present time the firm are devoting themselves to contacting the various music operators in this state.

NO TAX RELIEF IN SIGHT

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Tho many coinmen are of the belief that some tax relief will come about right after the New Year, especially in the excise tax division, and in the \$100 counter games tax division, the arcade taxes, etc., very little hope is being held out for such relief according to reports from Chairman Doughton of the House Ways & Means Committee.

Such nuisance taxes as those on furs, jewelry, telephone calls, admissions, etc. will be first on the list for revision, reports state. There will be some fights to change present excise levies with special lobbies again arguing for special favors. But lowering taxes will be only a secondary consideration in the new tax bill which will come up sometime in April.

The primary aim will be to shift the present tax structure to a more workable peace time arrangement. While this may mean many tax changes, it doesn't mean tax cuts. Corporations may not get any relief until sometime in 1947.

Tax experts of Congress and the Treasury have been collecting and analyzing tax data for many weeks now and they have ideas as to how and why and where taxation should be exerted.
