## CD Notch/Blank Tape Royalty - Under The Microscope

LOS ANGELES - Following a flurry of DAT copy-code demonstrations that produced more controversy than they dispelled, both sides in the DAT issue - the Home Recording Rights Coalition (pro-DAT) and the Recording Industry Association of America (pro-copy code) - find themselves in a holding pattern as the National Bureau of Standards prepares impartial tests on the system designed by CBS Labs.

According to an informed Washington source, Congressional activity over DAT has diminished due to Marantz's postponement of their domestic introduction of DAT. In Europe, meanwhile, the Sony Corporation has introduced DAT in both France and Germany.

The NBS tests should identify any adverse effect of the CBS "notch." This notch, which is read by DAT machines fitted with a copy-code chip, is part of the anti-pirating system developed by CBS Labs. Sensing the presence of such a notch in material, a modified DAT machine would automatically cease recording.

The notch is created by removing certain frequencies of recorded material from a band in the middle of

the audible spectrum. Controversy over its effect has prompted Congress to seek an impartial, scientific test of the impact it has on the listening experience.

There has been speculation that a royalty on blank tape could be a viable alternate to the copy-code in dealing with various forms of infringement. Similar legislation is being considered in England.

"There's always talk about a surcharge on blank tape," said the same Washington source, "but there has never been a big enough constituency to see it through. It would seem to be easier to pass copy-code legislation than a royalty on blank tape. Either way, there isn't that much happening right now since Marantz backed off."

DAT is the popular acronym for Rotary Digital Audio Tape, or R-DAT, a revolutionary tape format that utilizes a rotary drum head (similar to those used in the video cassette format) and which, by virtue of its digital capabilities and immediate availability for home recording, poses a very real threat to the recording industry.

## Now Stands At \$2 Billion

# Sony Ups CBS Records Offer

LOS ANGELES - CBS confirmed late last week that an offer to purchase the company's record division had been tendered by Sony. Sources placed last week's offer at \$1.8 billion, and sources this week reported that the offer has been raised to \$2 billion.

An official CBS statement was released just before press time that stated simply "The CBS Board of Directors today received from the Sony Corporation a further expression of interest in a possible purchase of the CBS Records Group. CBS will consider and respond to this further expression of interest in due course."

An offer earlier in the year by an investor group headed by CBS Records Group president Walter Yetnikoff of \$1.25 billion was subsequently turned down by the CBS Board of Directors. Yetnikoff is reportedly involved in the current Sony bid.

The CBS Record Group has consistently been the most profitable of all American record operations and last year reported profits of \$162 million, the highest ever for any American record company.

## BMG Stabilizes After Goldman Shakeup

LOS ANGELES - The Bertlesman Music Group, in continuing their drive for worldwide expansion, plans no further changes after the departure last week of Elliot Goldman as BMG president and CEO. Michael Dornemann, co-chairman of BMG, has taken over Goldman's operational responsibilities.

Joe Isenstein, BMG's vice president of employee relations, told *Cash Box* that the company plans to continue expansion in the worldwide market with Dornemann as operations head, and expressed the company's satisfaction with Goldman's performance. "The management team has been in place, and Elliot has done a very fine piece of work from the start in terms of rebuilding. He's gone through some very difficult transitions, and in that process he's done a fine job in terms of rebuilding and bringing people in. Dornemann has no plans to give that position up. He's assuming Elliot's responsibilities."

BMG's expansion plans include increased artist roster signings, higher

concentration on marketing and advertising, strengthening of the classical repertoire, further development of the music publishing division, and the creation of new affiliates in countries where no BMG operations currently exist.

In commenting on his departure from BMG, Goldman said his next career move has yet to be determined. "I think I'll take a little time to think about it. I've spent 20 of the last 30 years in operational positions in the music industry. I think I may want to capitalize on those operational experiences."

The RCA label has been through many internal changes over the past two years, with Goldman at the helm throughout. "It was RCA to GE and GE to Bertlesmann, and trying to help all those transitions and at the same time trying to restructure and put the management into the operating divisions as well," said Goldman. "It's been very hectic and I'm very proud of what we've accomplished. I feel good about where the company is."

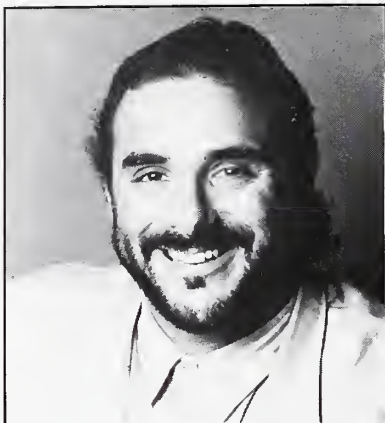

## A&M Announces Two Executive Appointments

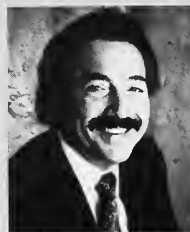

## Peter Tosh Gunned Down In Jamaica

NEW YORK – Peter Tosh, the reggae star and founding member of the Wailers, was shot and killed September 11 at his home in St. Andrew, a suburb of Kingston, Jamaica.

In what authorities are describing as a robbery attempt, three men drove up to Tosh's home on motorcycles and shot all seven people present when they resisted the attempt at robbery. One other man was killed, and the five others were wounded.

The Wailers were formed in 1963 by Bob Marley, Peter Tosh, and Bunny Wailer (Neville Livingstone) and were instrumental in establishing the sound of contemporary reggae. With the band increasingly becoming a vehicle for Marley, Tosh and Wailer departed the group in 1973.

Tosh continued performing and recording, his music deeply-committed to social concerns and to Tosh's personal crusades, such as the



legalization of marijuana and the glorification of Rastafarianism. He recorded a duet with Mick Jagger, "(You Got to Walk and) Don't Look Back," and, in 1985, was nominated for a Grammy Award for "Captured Live."

Tosh, who was born Winston Hubert McIntosh in Westmoreland, Jamaica, was 42.

## Grateful Dead Sues Bootleg Cassette Groups

LOS ANGELES - The Grateful Dead has entered a preliminary injunction in United States Federal District Court in Los Angeles to stop several firms from manufacturing and selling unauthorized copies of the Dead's "Wake Of The Flood" LP. Companies named in the suit include Gusto Records, Starday Records, Moe Lytle and the International Marketing Group.

The court found that the I.M.G., along with Cindy Lou's Musical Mail Order, had been distributing the bogus cassettes throughout the U.S. and Canada. The tapes were copied by Nashville-based Gusto Records and the other defendants. Along with these findings, the court ordered Gusto and its affiliated entities to turn over all master recordings, un-

authorized cassettes, and all Dead-related items to the band's attorneys pending further proceedings.

While the Grateful Dead has long allowed its fans the privilege of taping their live shows for personal use, any use of trademarked or copyrighted items for sale must be approved by the band prior to sale. Joseph Yanny, member of the band's trademark and copyright firm, stated "Commercial misappropriation of the Grateful Dead's music and trademarks will not be tolerated or condoned. It is inherently unfair to allow others who have not sown to reap the benefits of the artistic works of people like the Grateful Dead."

The case, with regard to permanent injunction and damages, is likely to go to trial in 1988.

## Passport Forms New Label To Be Distributed By PolyGram

NEW YORK – Passport Records has formed a new label, Paradox Records, which will be distributed by PolyGram in the U.S. and A&M in Canada. A&R, creative services, marketing and promotion for Paradox will be carried out by the Passport staff in South Plainfield, New Jersey and Glendale, California.

Passport was formed in 1985 by Marty Scott. Passport Jazz has since become a popular jazz fusion label and the Audion Recording Co., formed with the creative assistance of Larry "Synergy" Fast, has become a

leader in the field of electronic new age music. Paradox was created as a rock label.

Eastern Bloc – a trio consisting of guitarist Ivan Kral, vocalist Mark Sidgwick and drummer Frankie Larocka – is the first signing to the label; their self-titled debut album will be released on October 5. The second signing is pop artist Tom Caufield, whose "Long Distance Calling" album is due October 19. Passport president Marty Scott expects to release six to ten albums on Paradox in the first year of operation.

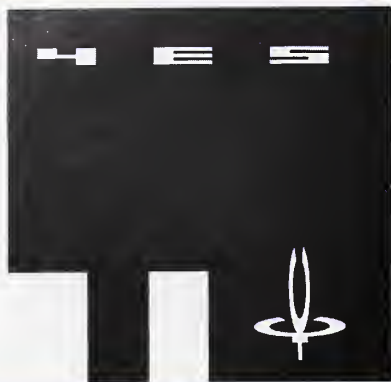

## Barry White

LOS ANGELES - "You can't kick Barry White's ass any harder that it's been kicked," explains the man who pioneered disco, rap, the 12-inch single, and almost started a major independent label before his funding fell through. "You can't make me bitter. I didn't come to Hollywood to reinvent the wheel; the wheel's already been invented. But you can try and become a very valuable spoke in the wheel - if you've got positive power going for you."

Coming off a four-year hiatus with a dynamic debut on A&M, White's *The Right Night*, signals a positive return for "the Maestro," a man who has earned substantial acclaim as a songwriter, producer, and arranger. By his own count, Barry White's 14 year recording career has produced 103 gold albums, 38 platinum albums, 20 gold singles, and 10 platinum singles, with total worldwide sales approaching 100 million units.

Barry White's hits have always been distinctive, sensual statements on a singular, recurring theme - love. Thanks to the deep, biding resonance on his signature vocals, "I've Got So Much To Give," "Never, Never Gonna Give You Up," "Can't Get Enough Of Your Love," and "You're the First, the Last, My Everything," have become some of the most memorable, popular dance releases from the seventies.

"Even though a creator loves the work that he's doing," White says, "the consumer has the last word. Do they like it? Do they like it enough to buy it? Do they like it enough to just want to hear it? There are lots of levels of like, and to hear about people liking *The Right Night* is very nice."

Assuming Barry White still has the magic touch, what is the secret behind this consummate ladies' man?

"Everybody makes love," Barry

explains, "I don't care what language you say it in, people know what going to bed means, what marriage means, all of it. So I have a common denominator that everybody relates to. I just put myself in the story, and I deal with it the way Barry White would do it, which is different than normal men."

His artistic, emotional focus aside, Barry White admits that he has gone around the track more than once since his last album.

"I tried to go independent," Barry says, "I tried to accumulate joint venture capital and got very, very close, but the Texas oil business wiped our people out. So, it was back to production - right where I started from. It's still about love, and that's the message I will constantly bring this world, as long as I feel there's a need for it."

"You've gotta realize that this is not Barry White's first time around. This is my second go around. You look at the Rolling Stones' Mick Jagger. Mick Jagger has been at the forefront for many years, even though there have been times when we didn't have records from Mick. But when he comes back, he comes back banging. It's always been my philosophy - since I was 16 -- that it doesn't really matter when an artist comes back - if he's great - it's what he comes back with."

## TALENT ON STAGE

## Frank Sinatra

CARNEGIE HALL, N.Y.C. - Frank Sinatra, on the cusp of his 72nd birthday, is still one great singer. But there's only one way to really know this - you've got to go out and hear him. Not an easy thing to do (you've got to stand on line for hours, you've got to shell out 50 bucks a ticket, stuff like that). Forget the odd TV appearance where the voice (formerly The Voice) cracks and groans. Forget the last album or two. You've got to go hear him.

So, anyway, I went to hear Frank Sinatra on opening night of his eight-night engagement at Carnegie Hall and, no surprise to these ears, he sounded great most of the time. He didn't sound great all of the time - in fact, he came out sort of wheezy and

uncertain, doing "My Heart Stood Still" rather than some punch-ya-in-the-gut Sinatra opener, sneaking peeks at a prompter set centerstage.

Once he settled in, though, about midway through "Where or When" (the second number), he hit those notes, and tore at heartstrings and, oh, did his Frank Sinatra thing - that voice sounding like experience, like life.

But, like at any Frank Sinatra concert, there were a bunch of songs I'd rather not have heard. He was in a Richard Rodgers mood, and I loved the Rodgers & Hart songs, and the Rodgers & Hammerstein songs. "I Have Dreamed" was gorgeous and dreamy, the "Soliloquy" from *Carousel* was a tour de force of dramatic singing, "Bewitched" was socked out with both fists flying.

Loved the "saloon" medley - "It Never Entered My Mind" (Rodgers

# The Insiders

LOS ANGELES - The Insiders are that rare brand of rock and roll bar band with no pretense - just amped-up guitars, fluid, powerful rhythm section, and tight Everly Brothers harmonies. And add to that provocative mix some thoughtful lyrics, often a bane of the species.

Usually these elements coalesce into a band worthy of a boozy evening at the local pub, a little dancing, maybe a "Louie, Louie" or "Wild Thing" to close the set. What we have here is a little different, however. This band benefits from the contributions of two superb songwriters, Gary Yerkins and John Siegle, whose lyrical acumen and musical inspiration allow their material to soar above the failed hopes and wasted dreams of the unfulfilled bar bands that walked these roads before.

The Insiders hail from Chicago, where they built up a strong local following before inking with Epic last year. Their first album, entitled "Ghost On The Beach," was just released featuring the single of the same name, which has received tremendous initial response from AOR stations nationwide.

Guitarist and producer Jay O'Rourke told *Cash Box* that the division of power within the band is the key to their success. "Everybody satisfies different areas of expertise. We all have individual aspirations, which come together and form what we are. We're willing to give each other enough room to make mistakes in our own areas. I'm not a songwriter, Gary and John are songwriters. They don't produce records. I don't cross the line with the songwriters and they don't cross the line with me as producer. We keep it very business-like."

While this business-like approach might tend to stifle the creative forces of some outfits, here it works

wonders. O'Rourke's production is clean and crisp, adding punch and a sense of spontaneity to the grooves that belie the group's rookie status.

The most engaging aspect of "Ghost On The Beach" is the dual integrity of the songwriting approach. The music is gut-level tough, but the lyrics reach deeper to another plane. As O'Rourke explains, "The more you pay attention, the more you can find in it. To me, the music has several different levels. You can listen to it on a physical level and get off on it sonically, or you can go deeper. In a way, I really like the immediacy of 'you're my baby, and let's dance,' so we wanted to keep the music accessible on that level. But if you want to go deeper, you can. There's more there. I, personally, am not the type to sit down and ponder lyrics indefinitely, but Gary and John happen to be pretty literate (laughs)."

Certain cuts, like the minor-chord ambiance of "Love Like Candy," ride the cusp between mainstream AOR and a more alternative sound. "We didn't consciously sit down and decide a certain sound or market that we wanted to go after," says O'Rourke. "We just threw it at the wall, and that's what stuck!"

ain) and "The Gal That Got Away." Washed with loneliness and bitterness and hurt. Loved "What's New" and "Lonely Town," songs I don't think I've ever heard Sinatra sing in concert. Loved the feeling that one gets in the pit of one's stomach when a great interpretive singer is singing great songs - songs with great lyrics and great melodies and an ambience that speaks only of this country and this century. Great American Songs.

But Sinatra likes to sing more contemporary songs, too, and I guess he has the right to pick out some songs that are younger than his son. Problem is, they don't write them like they used to. At least, for a singer like this they don't.

So I sat through "What Now My Love" and "Maybe This Time" (is that what that's called?), both given bizarre, angry performances - the singer gnashing his teeth and spitting

out the lyrics (barking the lyric, "Everybody loves a winner/but nobody loves me," like he wanted to beat somebody up about it).

For a Sinatra performance, this was a little too much *dreck* for me. Sinatra usually does 18 songs (19 counting the medley as two), ending (as he did here, naturally) with "New York, New York." So this tallied up to about 40 percent schlock. Too much schlock.

But then Sinatra did something surprising. He came back after "New York, New York" - unheard of in my experience - and did two encores, "The Summer Wind" (not a bad song that) and "I've Got the World on a String." Two encores - and they swung with that cool swagger of the '50s Sinatra, nice 'n' easy. Good ending, and the ol' guy even had a tear in his eye.

ON JAZZ

**D**UKE - Duke Ellington is, no matter how you slice it, one of the towering figures of 20th Century music. The greatest jazz composer of them all, by a very long shot, Ellington was also one of the most prolific artists of his time. One can compare him with Pablo Picasso in terms of the variety of his work, the originality of his work, and the sheer volume of his work. From the time he first started writing, as a teenager, until his death in 1974, Duke Ellington turned out a staggering amount of music.

Much of this music has been heard, but a good deal of it - what Ellington referred to as his "stockpile" - hasn't. Ellington composed a lot, and he composed specifically for the players in his band (whose loyalty to their maestro is awe-inspiring). So when a piece was done - a piece, say, written with Johnny Hodges' alto specifically in mind - Ellington wanted to hear the piece. His band was on salary, so he spent a lot of time rehearsing them. He also spent a lot of time recording them - booking studio time here and there for no other reason than to get his material down. Was he thinking about the future - about the possible value of this material in later years? Quite possibly he was.

In any case, Mercer Ellington, Duke's son and the keeper of the flame, has tons of this stuff around (he's given lots of it to Danish radio) and now it's starting to come out. LMR Records (that's LeFrak, Fuhrman, Moelis) has just issued five Ellington compact discs of previously-unissued material under the banner "The Private Collection." Most of it, not surprisingly, is terrific - terrific! The discs are "Volume One. Studio Sessions, Chicago, 1956," "Volume Two. Dance Concerts, California, 1958," "Volume Three. Studio Sessions, New York, 1962," "Volume Four. Studio Sessions, New York, 1963," and "Volume Five. The Suites, New York, 1968 & 1970." The titles might be stuffy, but the music is wonderful. Excellent writing (imagine, all of this great writing, most of it never before heard) and magnificent playing by, amongst others, Hodges, Cootie Williams, Paul Gonsalves and Ray Nance. The sound quality is exemplary, the running times are generous (over 70 minutes on Volumes Two and Five) and the liner notes - by official Ellington annotator Stanley Dance - are incisive and informed.

Duke Ellington is listed as producer of all of this music, the executive producers are Mercer Ellington, Mel Fuhrman and Stanley Dance, and Harry Hirsch produced the music for CD release. LMR

Records is at 40 W. 57th St., New York, NY 10019 (212-586-3600). There is, they tell me, much more of this to come (with vinyl and cassette releases planned for the future). For Ellington lovers, for jazz lovers, for anybody interested in American music, this is an extraordinarily rich lode.

**KEYNOTE CDS, CONT.** - PolyGram has just issued the second five sets in "The Essential Keynote Collection," the CD version of most of "The Complete Keynote Collection" boxed-set of LPs. They are "The Complete Coleman Hawkins" (a four-disc set collecting all the Keynote sessions featuring the great Hawkins and absolutely, positively an essential addition to any jazz CD collection), "The Complete Benny Carter," "Red Norvo Improvisations," "The Keynotes with Nat King Cole," and "The Small Herd," the last two featuring different small-group sessions, the latter, of course, focused on Woody Herman bandmembers. It's funny how much of this brilliant stuff was out-of-print a couple of years ago and now, in two fell swoops, is available on vinyl and CD. And I remember somebody asking me recently - very recently - "you think they'll ever put any good Lester Young on CD?" Oh how digital we've all become.

While we're talking about our friends at PolyGram, the next two months will see 20 new titles added to the mid-price Walkman Jazz/Compact Jazz series. October 19 will see ten of them released (Benny Goodman, Louis Armstrong, Mel Torme, others), with another ten (Dizzy Gillespie, Charlie Parker, Ben Webster, others) due November 16. They're all compilations (a "Best of Bossa Nova" sounds particularly good to me) and they'll all chime in at about an hour each.

# Hein & the Restless, Enigma Subsidiary Restructured

LOS ANGELES - Enigma president Wes Hein has restructured the staff at Restless Records, an independently distributed subsidiary of his independent label.

Restless' former label head, Scott Vanderbilt has moved to Enigma's business affairs department, while Julie Kryslur, former director of publicity has been named general manager. Ilene Barg moves to the alternative marketing department at Enigma after being replaced by Chris Watts. Brian Cohen has been promoted to national sales manager. Julienne Farman joins Restless as manager of national publicity (she was former booker at Boston's The Rat) and Sherri Trahan has been ap-

pointed manager of retail promotion.

Outlining the dramatic changes Wein said, "Enigma gets a lot of exposure, with bands like Poison and the Smithereens, and Restless was an under-utilized asset. We think it can be a great label in its own right, as well as being a great source of talent for Enigma. When we didn't see the depth we wanted in Restless' roster, [and in lieu of] changing a bit here and there, we went for a major overhaul. This sends not just signal to us, but to college radio, distributors, press -- everyone. We've hired an essentially new staff, we've re-financed the label, and set it up in a more aggressive manner than ever before."

pus/retail promotion focusing on the Thunderbirds and Omar & The Howlers. Concerts are also scheduled for November 18, and next February 20 and April 8.

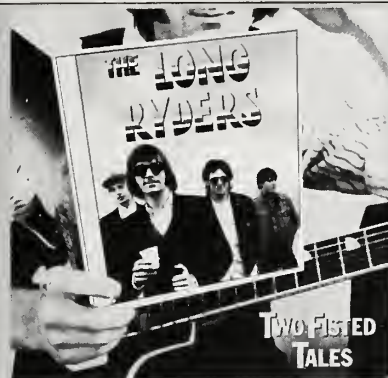

## Billy Joe Royal... "Country Came Around To Me"

Billy Joe Royal visited my office, with his manager John Ragsdale, to sit and have a conversation about his current career and what's happening in his world of music. As you may know, Billy Joe has had a very successful record on the market lately.. a duet with Donna Fargo called "Members Only."

Billy Joe commented that he was very pleased with the popularity of the record. "Steve Popovich called me and played the song. I liked it, right away. I was in the middle of a recording session at the time. Steve then asked me how I would like to do the song in duet with Donna. I thought it sounded interesting, so they came over, and we sang the song right there in the office. It was really a spur-of-the-moment thing. We actually cut the song in two or three takes."

Billy Joe Royal has his "ducks in a row." He went on to speak about new priorities. "We have a new album debuting in September. It is titled 'Royal Treatment,' and my next single (just released this past week) is 'I'll Pin A Note On Your Pillow.' Billy Joe has high hopes for these two new products. I haven't heard the album yet, but if the single is any indication, Billy Joe should not have to worry about the success of either.

Billy Joe doesn't want to be categorized with his music. "I don't like labels, such as 'contemporary' and 'traditional.' I'm a singer. I want to be considered a *good* singer. I'm very happy that we have the country outlet, but I truly love all kinds of

music. I don't consider contemporary or traditional. I only consider singing what I like to sing. Good songs are good songs no matter what 'label' they carry.

I don't really listen for anything special when I'm looking for new songs. If it sounds good and feels good, then I go after it! I don't really listen to the lyrics that closely the first time. I'm listening for an over-all feel. When I get that feel, I go back and listen to the lyrics more closely. I consider song tempo, and how a new song relates to what I recorded last. I like to mix it up as much as possible. But, again, I don't listen for *particular* type things."

When asked about his career ambitions from this point in time, he smiled but answered in all seriousness, "Hopefully, I can keep doing what I'm doing, and my best work is yet to come. In the 70's, I moved to California. At that time I got a lot of personal appearance work, but there didn't seem to be a recording slot for my style. Country was, as the 'labelists' say, 'traditional', back then. However, it broke through, and the country market became my outlet. I haven't really changed my style, but country came around to me."

Country music *has* come around to Billy Joe Royal. His recent past has surely proven that. Thank goodness! Billy Joe Royal is country, and the fans have responded to his country ways. "If the good Lord's willin', and the creek don't rise," Billy Joe will be back to visit again, soon.

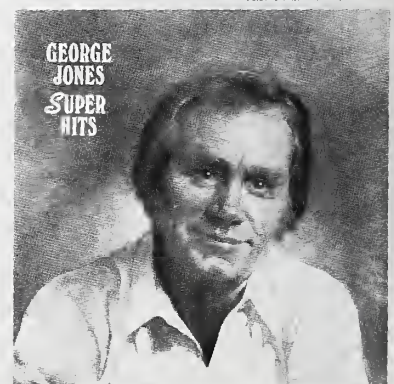

**GLEN CAMPBELL** (MCA, MCA-53172) *Still Within The Sound Of My Voice* (4:08) (White Oak-ASCAP) (J. Webb) (Producers: J. Bowen, G. Campbell)

This song is almost reverently different. Keyboard intro, joined by Campbell's vocal, and building into full production sound. Glen Campbell has surely matured in his positive vocal presentations. His vocal is strong and controlled. Glen sings this song to the radio listener, personally. It's a "come back, lost lover" song (by Jimmy Webb), which builds and flows impressively. We're looking for Glen to start



climbing the charts again with this one!

## FEATURE PICKS

**HIGHWAY 101** (Warner Bros. 7-28223-A) *Somewhere Tonight* (3:15) (Tree-BMI; Granite, Coolwell-ASCAP) (H. Howard, R. Crowell) (Producer: P. Worley)

The best country group sound around brings us another solid country song, written by two of the best...Harlan Howard and Rodney Crowell. Paulette Carlson sings a "mean" lead vocal, here, and the harmonies are "right-on." Sing-along type chorus should make this a very popular release. Sounds like another winner for Highway 101.

**PAKE McENTIRE** (RCA 5256-7-R-A) *Good God, I Had It Good* (3:15) (Blackwood, Land Of Music, Englishtown-BMI) (M. Wright, R. Nielsen) (Producer: M. Wright)

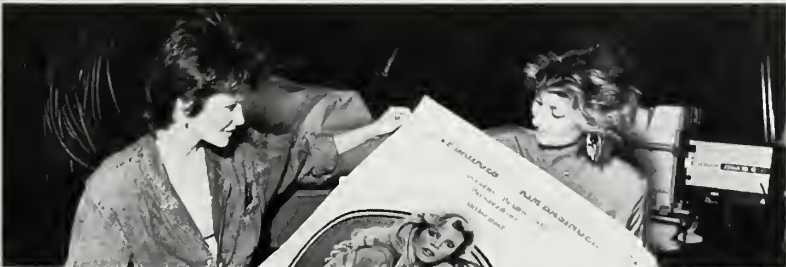
Acoustic guitar and fiddle lead us into a mid-tempo song with a catchy melody and some hurtin', prayer-type lyrics. Hurting songs with a happy tune seem to be a success formula, presently. Pake gives us a good vocal performance, with pleasing harmonies in the chorus. There are some strong pickin' fills and rides in the arrangement.

**RUNNER** (Epic, 34-07304) *You're Mine Tonight* (3:42) (Unichappel, Van Hoy-BMI) (R. Van Hoy) (Producer: E. Bayers, Jr.)

Runner has picked a fine, proven song to release at this time. This is a good vocal group featuring good harmonies. We felt the vocals might be "buried" a little deeply amid all the instrumentation. However, they are evident enough to reveal the talent. Ebb and flow of the song takes the listener along for a smooth trip.

J. C. "Tex" Walker... Still Good As New At 77!

"Our next honored artist is a third generation Texan and one of America's pioneer singing cowboys. The timber industry has occupied his interest for the past 43 years, but music was his first career, beginning at the age of 13..."

J. C. "Tex" Walker has heard that introduction from announcers and masters of ceremonies many, many times. And, I'm here to tell you that Tex Walker may be in the timber and cattle business in Huntsville, Texas, but he is certainly still in the music business, too!

I had the honor and the pleasure of visiting with Tex and his lovely wife, Dorothy, recently, at the invitation of Tex's current record producer Bobby Dyson. You don't know how happy I am that the invitation was extended. You see, Tex Walker is 77 years young and has been recording an album in Nashville each year since 1983, with one exception.

"I'm trying to keep the old cowboy songs alive. I don't want to see such a beautiful part of American history fade away and be forgotten," said Tex. "Of course, we use the albums back in Huntsville for advertising, too."

Tex was known as "The Singin' Cowboy" when he had his own radio show for CBS. "I had my own show on the network. The studio was in Washington, D. C.. That was back when I could sit in my own little broadcast room and look across the hall at another new talent on CBS at that time. You see, Arthur Godfrey was just beginning his career, too."

Beginning in 1923, Tex was the featured singer for seven consecutive years at Madison Square Garden for the World Series Rodeo. "There was a fellow named 'Foghorn' Clancy, who was the rodeo announcer. That



was long before the P.A. system days, so he used a megaphone to announce the rodeo events to the crowd. When it came my turn to sing, he would simply bring the megaphone over, hold it up to my mouth, and I would play guitar and sing.

I also doubled for Bing Crosby in the movie "Rhythm On The Range," which was filmed at the Garden. Crosby made a lot of cowboy song albums. In fact, he made one for that picture with the same title."

Tex Walker is a part of country music past and present. He recorded in New York on the old Brunswick label in the 30's. In fact, that record, which contains two self-penned songs, "If I Could Hear My Mother Pray Again," and "The New London School Disaster" is included in the Country Music Hall of Fame collection. Tex has also guested on the Grand Ole Opry on many occasions.

Tex says he will continue to make one album each year until he is 90. Then, he's going to call it quits. I, for one, hate to see that day come! Tex still sings like a young man. The cowboy albums are great! Get one, and see if you don't agree. You can order a Tex Walker Album from the man himself. Just write to Cowboy Country, P.O. Box 88, Huntsville, Tx. 77342-0088. Generally speaking, the recording industry, recently back on its feet but still adjusting to the newfound commitment to the compact disk, views the unrestricted introduction of DAT technology with concern. DAT rivals CDs in quality, and puts digital recording in the hands of the average consumer long before it's available with CDs. While not considered "indestructible" like CDs, the smaller digital audio tapes are much more durable than conventional audio cassettes.

More technical arguments do exist, like the debate over whether a DAT machine can actually pirate "perfect clones" off a CD.

Engineers concede that a CD to DAT recording signal must first be converted to analog in order to get around a built-in frequency mismatch. This deterrent is meant to discourage CD copying by causing a gradual quality down curve through successive generations. Skeptics consider this a meaningless, electronic side step which hardly interferes in the recording process.

The NBS research, considered critical at this stage of the implementation of digital audio tape, was begun in response to three different requests from House and Senate sub-committees.

"The chairman of my sub-committee and his counterpart in the Senate have asked the National Bureau of Standards to do a neutral test of this equipment," confirmed Congressman Howard Berman (D-CA) from his Washington office. Berman, who has been active in various music industry issues such as DAT and source licensing also expressed his view on protecting intellectual property.

"My own preference has been that there should be a royalty on blank tapes," Berman continued. "The only question is, whether that will produce adequate compensation for the amount of unauthorized taping

that goes on. It is true that a royalty system will, in effect, impose some costs on people who are not engaging in the practice, but these are not going to be prohibitive costs. Somewhere we have to find some method to rectify an injustice here, which is what this is all about."

Funding for the NBS tests was arranged by the RIAA and the HRRC, both of which have paid \$75,000 to cover the \$150,000 project.

"They desposited their funds with the Patent and Trademark Office," explained Michael Baum from the NBS, "they are the lead agency which handled all the funding."

When asked why the testing of the copy-code system was costing approximately \$50,000 more than it cost to develop the technology, Baum stressed that the NBS figure was only an estimate.

Baum explained that Congress has asked NBS researchers to determine such things as whether or not DAT works as advertised, if the "notch" in recorded material actually harms the quality of such works, and finally if the copy-code system is one which can easily be circumvented by copyright infringers.

"We do science and engineering research, with no vested interest," explained Mat Heyman, also from NBS' public information office. "We're a non-regulatory, federal laboratory often called upon when there is a technical controversy. In this case we've got a large electronics group and a smaller group of acoustic specialists already doing research at NBS. These teams cover a variety of fields, such as electrical testing and measurements, and acoustic techniques in manufacturing and engineering. For the purposes of a listening test, we are considering using outside experts to aid us."

As of early September, CBS has provided the NBS with some equipment and certain technical specifications with regard to the copy-code system, Heyman said. NBS' next step is to develop a complete testing plan.

Informal surveys show that many music industry professionals do hear a quality difference between material that has the notch and that which does not. However, such surveys are not conclusive and must be considered carefully. RIAA president Jason Berman has said that inferior copy-code equipment has been demonstrated by those lobbying against the CBS copy-code system, and that only CBS' system is built to the specs that will be marketed to consumers.

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## Third Amnesty Benefit Live Due

LOS ANGELES - Virgin Records is planning a September release for the third in the successful "Secret Policeman's Ball" series, featuring superstar acts recorded live in London. Compact disc release date is September 17, while vinyl product will debut September 28. All proceeds from sales of the album go to benefit Amnesty International.

This year's concerts were held over a four day period in March at London's Palladium, and the record features performances by Kate Bush, with Dave Gilmour and Nick Mason on "Running Up That Hill;" Lou Reed with Peter Gabriel, Jackson

Browne, and Youssou D'Nour & Nour's "Voices Of Freedom;" Bob Geldof with "This Is The World Calling;" Jackson Browne on "For Everyman;" Joan Armatrading with "I Love It When You Call Me Names;" an instrumental version of John Lennon's "Imagine" by Chet Atkins and Mark Knopfler; and Pete Dinklage, joined by Lou Reed, Youssou D'Nour and others performing his poignant "Biko."

As with the first two "Secret Policeman" efforts, a film was made of the concerts. It is currently being readied for theatrical and home video release in this country.

## Chicago Naras Sponsors Jingle Panel

Los Angeles - The Chicago chapter of the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences is co-sponsoring a panel titled "Music in Television and Radio Advertising," on October 20 at Loop College in Chicago. Loop is co-sponsoring the event in conjunction with NARAS and Columbia College.

Composer Bobby Schiff and producer Dan Lavorini will chair the event and have set up a seven member panel which will deal with many aspects of the advertising jingle scene.

"There will be comprehensive insights," Schiff explained in a prepared statement, "on how to approach casting coordinators; an airing of common recording problems and production concerns; self marketing; auditions tapes and jingle pilots; and theatrical union considerations."

## UK BUZZ

**B**lack is not the name of a group, but a corporate identity for one person, Colin Verncombe. The sadly ironic and sweetly-voiced "Wonderful Life" (A&M) is the second chart hit for Verncombe. It follows the success of "Sweetest Smile," which went Top 10.

The 25-year-old introduces his split personality into his songs, which are brilliantly witty and poignantly sad. He admits his best songs are all drawn from personal experience, and most of them are sad ones. "Who wants to write songs when you're happy? I wrote 'Sweetest Smile' going to the shops for a loaf of bread, but it was about the break-up of my marriage.

"I wrote it in 1985, which was the worst year of my life. It was like a bizarre soap opera. I lost my first record deal, my publishing deal. I had two car crashes, my mother was ill, and my marriage broke up. I am sure it was something to do with Halley's comet."

Colin still lives in Sefton Park, Liverpool, where he grew up. His mother, who once did her best to make him get a proper job, now ushers all of the neighbors into the living room and forces them to watch his videos. He was given a guitar as a boy, shortly after he started playing his cricket bat along to Elvis Presley movies.

"At first I thought I would never be able to play it. It was much too complicated. Then my father said, 'Either play the thing or we'll sell it.' My father is a very straightforward man. He often used to smack me for something my brother had done, and I would wail, 'That's not fair dad,' and he would retort, 'Whoever told you life was fair boy?'"

Life is still not fair for Colin, but it is considerably better. He constantly muses about the masochistic streak in women and his emotional vacuum on the one hand, and his now buoyant career on the other. He takes singing lessons to improve his voice, he sings Mozart and Bizet.

"Miles Davis once said you have to make yourself technically perfect and then play naturally, and that's what I try to do."

He also hopes to do a promotional visit to America in October.

"The one thing I wanted when I was looking for a new record deal was a company with a global attitude. A&M is perfect, because Herb Alpert is so involved himself, he's really in touch. America is really important to me because the market there is much more stable, they have better taste. The British market is fickle. The Americans would have never stood for the dreadful 'Startrekking' single to get to number one..."

America should get ready for Terence Trent D'Arby, the biggest-mouthed, and the biggest, new act in the UK this year. Terry could have been invented by Saatchi and Satchi, he's a pale-skinned, beautiful black boy from Florida who used to be a boxer and went AWOL from Elvis Presley's regiment in the US Army. Now an anglophile, he sings carefully crafted pop tunes with a soulful voice, and just to prove he's got soul, he can rasp away at a Sam Cooke cover version.

He has also proved himself one of the most outrageous new pop stars by his famous quote: "I have sex more times than I wash my hair." He says, "I am young, therefore I am interested in music, art and sex, nuclear disarmament and South Africa. But I can't pretend I'm more interested in South Africa than I am in sex."

He has threatened that after his quick rise to fame with his debut album, "The Hardline According to Terence Trent D'Arby" (CBS) he will quit the business altogether. But then again, in the past few months he has done some considerable bad-mouthing of his homeland, explaining how he does not want to be like other successful black American artists.

"Any black act in America has to emasculate himself. Prince has had to pretend to be bisexual, and Michael Jackson has had to pretend to be asexual. In America it's in the contract that if you sell over a million it certifies you to a free plastic surgeon visitation. That's why I don't care about America. Why should I care about insulting someone in Iowa that I don't even know?"

Expect to see a lot more of this boy's face...

Meanwhile, back in the retail business, the shops are feeling festive already. The Michael Jackson album, "Bad," has already shipped platinum, and has been boosted by the UK TV premiere of the "Bad" video. Dealers seem euphoric for the first time this year. They claim the Michael Jackson album is getting people into the shops and getting them interested in other product.

Edgardo Larrazabal of Bertelsmann/Ariola (formerly RCA) reports a four month long campaign featuring exceptional product by Joan Manuel Serrat, Raul Porchetto,

and the first outings on BMG by Miguel Mateos with Zas, and the local rock act, Virus. This campaign will also include a compilation album of international hits, a repeat strategy that has worked well for BMG in the past.

EMI commercial director Roberto Play has jetted to Spain, England, Mexico and Brazil to conduct an intense series of meetings in those countries. The label indicates they have had significant success in Argentina with singer Pablo Ruiz, a teen age artist who has generated sales of over 50,000 units in just a few months time. EMI plans an international launch for this artist in conjunction with a major promotional tour. Hailing from up north, EMI's Daniela Romo, the popular Mexican chanteuse, will be seen in Argentina when her Mexican soap opera is shown here. Daniela visited Bueno Aires recently and is scheduled to return at the beginning of 1988.

## IMA '88 Show Dates Announced

## Jukebox Promo Committee Meets; Sets 'National Jukebox Month'

CHICAGO—October has been declared "National Jukebox Month" by the newly organized Jukebox Promotion Committee (JPC). The commemoration will begin October, 1988 and continue to be celebrated, on an annual basis, thereafter. This was one of the major decisions reached by the Committee at its first official meeting which was held in Chicago on Sept. 14.

The JPC also announced that a meeting with the Recording Industry Assn. of America (RIAA) is on the agenda.

Among the major goals of the Jukebox Promotion Committee are: to create a greater awareness of the jukebox and its entertainment value to the general public (as exemplified by the establishment of a National Jukebox Month); to develop jukebox selling tools and to communicate in-

formation to the jukebox operators so that they can compete more effectively in a changing marketplace; and to develop a closer relationship with the recording industry and related groups that would be allied to the jukebox industry.

The Jukebox Promotion Committee was formed by AMOA (Cash Box, 9/19/87) following the trade association's participation in a jukebox roundtable meeting in Minneapolis and a subsequent meeting in August between AMOA and representatives of RIAA. The Committee's chairman is Clyde Knupp, who is currently treasurer of AMOA. Committee members include Randy Chilton of Chilton Vending; James Hayes of Gem Music & Vending; Steve Lieberman of Lieberman Music Co.; and Joe Pankus of Seeburg Corp.

It has become a highly competitive and extremely lucrative marketplace. Gone are many of the memories of ill-fated systems and the abundance of poorly executed game cartridge software that helped to hasten the doom. Today, home video has generated a great deal of support and enthusiasm not just on the retail level, but also for the many consumers who are once again considering this home entertainment medium to be highly desirable and very affordable.

In past issues, *Cash Box* has reported on many of the developments taking place within this product category and will continue to do so since much of the influence is coming directly from the coin-operated amusement game universe. And, although it might seem confusing at times, Atari Games is not the Atari Corporation we're about to cover in this feature.

While Atari Games has kept its presence alive and well in the realm of coin-op extravaganzas, Atari Corporation has attempted to impact the personal computer field with a full line of impressive systems and has also resurrected its video game systems to challenge the market leader—Nintendo, and the other contender to the throne—Sega/Tonka.

In a scramble to gather up recognizable titles for its game systems, Atari has begun making some impressive announcements that should poise it for a full attack in the next few

months. Led by the reclaimed 2600, the true centerpiece, currently, for the company is the advanced 7800. This might well change, however, when Atari introduces its much awaited XE game system in time for the holiday season.

Penny, Circus World, Price Savers, Venture Stores, Service Merchandise and Best Products. 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# Over 1000 Exhibitors Sign Up For Winter CES Show

CHICAGO - More than 1,000 exhibit applications have already been received for the 1988 International Winter Consumer Electronics Show, to be held Thursday, January 7 through Sunday, January 10, 1988 in Las Vegas.

These applications reflect the broad spectrum of the consumer electronics industry, whose sales to U.S. dealers next year are expected to approach \$32 billion. Among the product categories featured in Las Vegas will be audio and video hardware, pre-recorded video, blank media, home satellite systems, computers and other home information equipment, PC software, telephones and telephone equipment, electronic watches and calculators, and wide array of accessories. Approximately 1,400 companies will fill the exhibit facilities at the Las Vegas Convention Center and the Las Vegas Hilton, Riviera and Sahara Hotels.

Attendance at this 16th Winter Show (and 37th CES overall) is likely

to equal or surpass the 105,000-plus figure recorded last January. Included in that total will be an estimated 70,000 buyers, several thousand buyers from abroad, and over 1,800 journalists whose intensive coverage has made the CES a major media event.

And so it is that Atari has released a number of new "super game" cartridges led by the likes of 'One-On-One Basketball' licensed from Electronic Arts. This highly successful sport simulation features the moves of Dr. J (Julius Erving) against Boston Celtic superstar Larry Bird.

'Karateka' from Broderbund Software is another title that has enjoyed considerable success for personal computer owners with its exceptional graphics and its kung-fu style play action and strong story line. Also from Broderbund comes the original 'Choplifter' which has found a growing audience in the arcades and also the computer field.

In addition, Atari is also readying 'Crack'ed', a new action/strategy game licensed from Robert Neve, and Cosmi's 'Super Huey' which is a helicopter flight simulator. Another effort getting a broader audience is the sophisticated 'Gato' from Spectrum Holybyte. McIntosh com-

puter owners have enjoyed this compelling World War II submarine simulation and now so, too, can owners of Atari's XE game system.

Almost two dozen titles are presently available for the 7800 system and the list is starting to grow for the upcoming XE as Atari Corporation is taking a very different approach compared to Sega/Tonka and Nintendo. The former is choosing a direction that is utilizing arcade titles from Sega as well as some strong licensed characters from the entertainment field to catapult its presence. Nintendo, by comparison, is pulling together many of the major coin-op companies for their rendition of recent arcade hits for home consumption. Together all three systems are covering the bases of what it can potentially draw upon and more, undoubtedly, is sure to follow as we move into the fall and winter selling/buying season.
