

Ottawa 2nd rate for Big Country

Walt Grealis, president and founder of Canada's Big Country Awards, announced today (Feb 9) that the planned Big Country meeting and Big Country Awards banquet scheduled for Ottawa in September, may not take place in that city.

Grealis stated: "Recent reports from Ottawa indicating that the Central Canada Exhibition refused to book Canadian talent because it is second rate has caused Big Country Awards and RPM Magazine to concern itself with deciding on a more suitable location for this annual event.

"There has been a rash of this anti-Canadianism by Fair people across Canada and it's time for the industry to take a stand. We don't want to encourage this kind of anti-nationalism. It isn't the same as the Canadian National Exhibition in Toronto where top Canadian artists were asked to perform and refused. This situation in Ottawa is a general and wide-sweeping condemnation of Canadian talent.

"It is surprising that this has happened within a flag-wave of Capital Hill and a stonethrow from Quebec, particularly for the latter where that province's entertainment industry is regarded as an important link to the culture of the French-speaking community. The national seat, of all places, should be the stronghold of Canadian entertainment.

"The Canadian artist and performer is discriminated against with unfair international immigration restrictions, unnecessary taxation on record production, extra recording costs because of high tariffs on imported equipment and now a blatant anti-Canadian talent smear that will take a long time to live down.

"We were greeted very warmly last year in Edmonton with both the city and province of Alberta giving an overwhelming boost to the Canadian artists who appeared. It wouldn't be fair, nor economically sound to hold an entertainment convention where Canadian artists aren't wanted and where they are considered second-rate. So, naturally, we are considering another part of Canada for Big Country.

"We are anticipating about 500 delegates to this Big Country conference and that would leave a goodly sum of money and prestige behind for the host city..

"It is unfortunate that a great deal of planning has already gone into the Ottawa date. We have even been talking about a national telecast of the Awards Banquet highlights.

"This year's Juno Awards, which RPM created, will be a good indication that Canada's talent is not second-rate. Artists from English Canada and Quebec will appear on the 90 minute telecast, expected to be seen by an estimated 3 million Canadians from coast to coast and, with Canadian David Steinberg as host, there is a possibility that the Juno Awards will be sold to a U.S. television network. This could be the first time that Canadian talent will make an international television breakthrough.

"The proposed Quebec Producers' Awards show is another indication that Canada has a great deal to offer from both its cultures and this show will be a great tribute to Quebec and to the French-language artists to be honoured.

"Now, we hear from the nation's capital that our artists aren't good enough."

Jim Sward named Exec VP of Rogers radio chain

Keith Dancy, president of Rogers Radio Broadcasting Limited, has announced the appointment, effective in March, of Jim Sward as executive vice president for the Rogers radio chain. Sward will operate out of Rogers' head offices in Toronto.

Sward moves to Rogers from a position with Maisonneuve Broadcasting, where he has been executive vice president and general manager for seven years. Maisonneuve is a part of the Stirling chain, consisting of Montreal stations CKGM and CHOM-FM.

In making the announcement Dancy

stated, "We're delighted that Jim is going to join us because we think he's one of the really bright people in Canadian broadcasting. He'll be working directly with the entire group of stations and contributing to our long range planning and our short range activities. He's really well known in the Canadian radio scene and has contributed a great deal in the upgrading of the whole industry and particularly in the contemporary scene.

"I've known him for a long time and I've wanted him to join us for a number of years. I'm just delighted that he's come."

Island scores with Britain's Rough Diamond

Island Records' Stuart Raven-Hill reports the signing of a new major British band, Rough Diamond to a world-wide contract with Island. The deal was pactured between Island president Chris Blackwell and managing director Tim Clark and the group's manager Stephen Barnett.

The group consists of singer David Byron from Uriah Heep, guitarist Clem Clempson, who replaced Peter Frampton with Humble Pie, keyboard player Damon Butcher, who comes with Clempson from Stevie Marriot's band, ex-Wings drummer Geoff Britton, and noted session bassman Willie Bath.

The band's material was first showcased

at the MIDEM conference in France, and the band appeared at an international press conference in Amsterdam February 7 and 8. Island is gearing a worldwide promotional campaign to back up the group's first album which will be released in Europe March 21 and in Britain, North America and the rest of the world April 2.

The group begins touring in Scandinavia in mid-April, and will be touring Britain through May. They plan to spend the last half of the year in Canada and the U.S. Tentative plans are already reported in the works for the band to record their second album in Toronto later this year.

The Agency signs Slam, Materick, Offenbach

Toronto booking firm The Agency has signed three major Canadian recording acts to exclusive Canada booking agreements.

Two A&M bands, Offenbach, from Montreal, and Toronto's Symphonic Slam, featuring guitarist Timo Laine, were signed the week of January 24. Asylum artist Ray Materick was signed the following week.

Tim Cottini of The Agency reports Offenbach will be performing in Ontario by the end of February, with plans being made to go west by early spring. Their A&M album, *Never Too Tender*, is reportedly receiving strong airplay in Toronto. The

title song is to be released as a single.

Symphonic Slam have been touring Ontario since February 10. Some of the larger concerts, including London's Centennial Auditorium, February 20, are being promoted by CPI.

A western tour is being planned for Materick for mid-March. A new single is reported being readied, with plans to record a fifth album (fourth on Asylum) in the near future. His last album, *Midnight Matinee*, features his new band of the same name.

CBS announces new staff appointments, promotions

In an announcement originally made at the CBS Records Marketing Convention held in Atlanta in January, CBS vice-president for marketing Bert Dunseith announced a series of appointments and promotions within the CBS Canada marketing division.

Charles Camilleri, formerly director of national promotion, has been appointed national director for artist development. A 19-year veteran with CBS, Camilleri has served in sales, as branch manager in Ontario and in Quebec, and as Ontario promo director.

Ed Colero, formerly manager of merchandising, has been appointed to the new position of national director of merchandising. Another 19-year man at CBS, Colero has been in sales and was Ontario branch manager.

Mike McCoy, formerly in charge of format programming and interview specials at CHUM-FM, has been brought to CBS as national promotion manager. A veteran of AM and FM radio with experience at various posts at CHIQ-FM, CKY, CFGO, CJCH, CKUM, CJON, CKOC and CHFJ, McCoy is expected to spur CBS's radio and promo efforts.

Bud Borkovic, former director of special products, is now director of marketing for Ontario. He has held various CBS positions in Chicago, Los Angeles and the U.S. mid-west in sales and special products.

Peter Humick, formerly a special products salesman under Borkovic, has been added to the Ontario promo department, replacing Bill Spicer, who has moved to Music World as a management trainee.

Elsie Heatherman has been appointed operations manager for the Toronto branch. She was formerly with Axe Records and previously held positions in promo, sales and marketing with Axe and London Records.

Terry McGee of CBS reports the move is an effort to consolidate the marketing division.

U.S. copyright brochure published by CAPAC

CAPAC has published a reprint of an ASCAP brochure titled Questions And Answers On The New United States Copyright Law. ASCAP originally published the brochure in respect of many inquiries from its members regarding the legislation.

The legislation, signed into existence by U.S. President Ford on October 19, 1976, is the first general revision of U.S. copyright law since 1909. The highlight of the new law is a change in copyright terms, bringing the U.S. system more into harmony with prevailing copyright regulations existing in the rest of the world.

Dates slated for Canada tour by Cockburn

Music Shoppe's Marilyn Harris reports an upcoming western mini-tour being planned for Hott Roxx, and an extensive Ontario-Quebec tour for Rose in support of the latter's new Polydor album, A Taste Of Neptune.

Massachusetts. U.A. also reports encouraging Canada sales and good advance orders on the album.

Tom Wilson of Concept Productions, exclusive booking for the Montreal group, reports the group will be busy throughout Ontario and Quebec with dates in Ottawa February 17-19, Montreal at the Edgewater Hotel March 9-13, York University (16), and Windsor (21-26).

Worldwide release on the album is slated for April 15. U.A. has launched what it describes as its biggest promo ever in support of the group and the album.

Clive Davis to speak at 3 Days in March

Clive Davis, America's most celebrated record executive and president of the New York-based Arista label, will be the keynote speaker for RPM's Three Days In March. Mr. Davis is scheduled to address the delegates on the second day of the communication meeting (Tuesday, March 15). Stan Klees, a director of RPM and in charge of special projects, reports early registration activity and is expecting delegates to com-

accommodation at the Hotel Toronto is also reported to be brisk.

Mr. Davis, author of the runaway best seller, *Clive: Inside The Record Business*, parlayed his much-publicized firing from Columbia Records (U.S.) into the present status he enjoys as being not only universally known as "the most important figure in the revolution in the record industry", but the one most responsible for giving the record industry a tinsel and glamour image equal to that of the movie industry.

When he was appointed Chief Administration Officer of Columbia in 1965, he

set out on a personal goal to streamline the industry and its thinking, particularly Columbia. Part of this streamlining was discovering and guiding the careers of fresh new talent, many of whom today remain as stars and superstars of their respective rock and adult contemporary fields. Names that came into being during the Davis/Columbia era of change included: Bob Dylan, Simon and Garfunkel, Barbra Streisand, Donovan, Janis Joplin, Chicago, Blood, Sweat & Tears, Edgar and Johnny Winter, Loggins and Messina - and the list goes on and on.

Double Taylor signing among new CBS signings

CBS Records have returned from their annual Marketing Convention, held this year in Atlanta, Georgia, January 27-30. At the meeting, a number of top name signings were announced, led by former Rolling Stones guitarist Mick Taylor and singer-songwriter James Taylor. Other signings include R&B artist Joe Tex, jazz guitarist Eric Gale, and Bobby Goldsboro.

CBS Canada was well-represented at the convention, and announced several new additions and promotions within their staff. Terry McGee of CBS Canada reported the main flavour of the convention was artist development, the signing of new artists and artists with potential for further development.

CBS artists were showcased in the evenings. Country artists Charlie McCoy and Sonny James, Joe Tex and the Sutherland Brothers & Quiver were featured along with new, less established signees. A make-shift jazz ensemble was featured the last

night, consisting of keyboard player Herbie Hancock, flautists Bobby Humphrey and Hubert Laws, saxman Benny Golson, pianist George Duke, guitarist Al Dimeola and drummer Tony Williams, accompanied by a back-up orchestra. Each records separately with CBS.

In an unusual move, CBS Canada president Terry Lynd was called upon to present CBS group Boston with a platinum album. The U.S. company made a similar presentation.

A long distance telephone call from Barbra Streisand was piped through the speakers to the 700 people at the Omni Hotel, reporting the five Golden Globe Awards received for the movie *A Star Is Born*. Awards included best album for the soundtrack, best single for Streisand's theme song on CBS, and best movie.

McGee reports CBS Canada attend this marketing convention regularly in addition to the annual international convention held each July.

CPI announces March dates for MLG, Massey Hall

CPI reports a full month of top name concerts for Ontario in March. March 8 finds CBS group Santana at the Maple Leaf Gardens Concert Bowl, with tickets on sale February 14. Polydor artist James Brown will be in the Concert Bowl on the 18th.

Donna Loucks of CPI reports the whole Gardens will be the scene of three March dates, featuring WEA artist Peter Gabriel, formerly with Genesis (22), Capitol's Jethro Tull (24) and WEA's Eagles (30). Eagles

will be opened by GRT artist Jimmy Buffett.

Gabriel is also slated for concerts in Montreal (23) at the Forum and Quebec at the Colisee (24). Tull will be at the Forum (25) and the Ottawa Civic Centre (26). Booking is split between CPI and Montreal-based Donald K. Donald.

Other approaching CPI concerts are GRT artist Al Stewart at Massey Hall in Toronto March 3 and WEA artist Dionne Warwick at Ottawa's National Arts Centre February 15 and Hamilton Place (22).

Polydor's Denise McCann breaking across Canada

Polydor's Denise McCann, a native of Vancouver, is seeing her *Tattoo Man* single break nationally with airplay from coast to coast. Polydor's Lori Bruner reports the company will be doing solid promotion in support of the single.

The single was introed as an import on the leading U.S. trade's disco chart, and has since been released in the U.S.

McCann is currently in Vancouver's Little Mountain Sound working on a debut album with husband Guy Sobell producing. Release is planned within two months,

depending on the action the single receives in the U.S.

McCann will be busy after the album is completed, with dates in Edmonton, Saskatoon, Regina and Winnipeg. Music Shoppe International is lining up a series of Ontario dates. She recently appeared on the popular Montreal TVer Disco Tourne. The single is particularly solid in Quebec, with play on every major station. A taping of the Wolfman Jack Show from Vancouver is scheduled as well as an intensive series of interviews.

Lightfoot's Massey week heads busy WEA season

Gordon Lightfoot's annual week of concerts at Toronto's Massey Hall, scheduled for March 20-27, highlights a long list of Canadian appearances by WEA artists.

Canadian group Wireless, on Atlantic Records, appear at the Colonial Tavern in Toronto February 5. Asylum artist Ray Materick is slated for the Colonial on February 4, and the Horseshoe Tavern (14-19) and the Black Hawk in Richmond Hill (21-26). Bearsville artist Jesse Winchester is touring across Canada through February.

Tours are in the making for Gensis and their former lead singer Peter Gabriel, whose recent album was produced by Bob Ezrin at Toronto's Soundstage Studio. The Eagles are slated for dates in Montreal March 29 and Toronto the 30th.

Country artist Eddie Rabbitt is taping the *Tommy Hunter Show* February 11. Jean Luc Ponty will be at Toronto's Convocation Hall (16), Steve Goodman in Ottawa (18), and comedian George Carlin at Winnipeg's Concert Bowl (21).

Attic's Wurzels to tour Newfoundland

British group The Wurzels, whose *Combine Harvester* single was a huge success in Newfoundland, are slated for a mid-February tour of the province. Attic's Tom Williams reports the February 14 concert planned for St. John's at the Arts & Culture Centre sold out so quickly a second concert was planned for the same day. It has also sold out.

Other Newfoundland dates are Gander (15), Grand Falls (16), Corner Brook (17) and Stephenville (18). Dates are also booked for Halifax (21), Hamilton Place (24) and Ottawa (25).

In conjunction with the tour Attic have released a new single, *I Am A Cider Drinker* (to the tune of *Paloma Blanca*). Williams reports the group is beginning to move west, with support throughout the Maritimes, and feels the tour and single should break them in the rest of Canada.

New single, dates for CSR's Terry Christenson

Corner Store recording artist Terry Christenson has just completed a new single, to be released within a month by Quality Records. The single, titled *Please Don't Wait Up For Me*, was recorded at the Grange Studio in Ajax, Ontario, produced by Len Simbalek. Featured in the session are local folk names Willie P. Bennett, David James Bowen, Pat Watson and Alison Reynolds, and guitarist Nigel Russell.

John Lysek of Mel Shaw's Toronto management firm reports Christenson has just completed a week at Toronto's Pizza Patio and is scheduled for Ontario dates in Tillsonburg, Ottawa, York University and Renfrew.

Christenson, a solo act for one and a half years since splitting with brother Peter, has a previous Corner Store album titled *The Ghost Of 40 Thieves*. The title song also received strong airplay as a single, particularly in Ontario. He is also featured as an actor and musician in Mel Shaw's movie *Northern Express*, which is being considered by the CBC for network release.

Emerson, Lake & Palmer rehearse for world tour

British rock band Emerson, Lake & Palmer are in Montreal preparing for an upcoming world tour, the band's first in over four years. They have rented the Veladrome, best known as the site of the Olympics bicycle races, as a rehearsal site.

The group's last album, distributed by WEA, was a live set titled *Welcome Back, My Friends, To The Show That Never Ends*. It was released in 1974.

"Good, melodic rock and roll."

Dancer is a three-piece, Los Angeles based group of experienced musicians representing the North American continent. Their first A&M album, under title of the group's name, was produced and engineered in Los Angeles between October, 1975 and February 1976 by Bill Schnee, who has worked with such names as the Four Seasons, Carly Simon, Art Garfunkel and Richie Furay.

Dancer is comprised of Jonathan Douglas, Ian Espinoza and Carl Dante. Douglas, from near Peterborough, Ontario, is the keyboard player. He has worked with the

Rowan Brothers and John Stewart. Espinoza, the guitar player, hails from Los Angeles and has worked on his own and with several groups. Dante plays bass. A former member of Gary Puckett and the Union Gap, he has also worked with Bobby Hackett. All three sing and write songs.

The group's current single, Back Into Your Arms, was written by Douglas and qualifies as Canadian content. It is the second single released from the album (the first is Magical Eyes) and is currently moving on the RPM Top Singles chart. Douglas reports the single doing quite well in areas in the U.S., notably in New England.

A&M Canada reports strong support throughout the west and in Montreal and good secondary support in Ontario.

Dancer was formed as a result of Douglas and Espinoza meeting and discovering that they had common musical tastes and goals. The members see the band as an opportunity for them to get exposure. They want to be heard and they want to entertain. Douglas describes their act as "an extroverted rock and roll show". Dante was added and the group was formed about two years ago. They also perform with a drummer.

The members ascribe to the goal of producing and performing "uplifting, good-time rock and roll music" that was more commonly heard in the sixties. They see their influences as a category including sounds such as the Beatles, Hollies, Loving Spoonful, and others which Dancer are trying to assimilate into their own sound. Douglas states, "We're trying to take certain influences of things that were really positive about a lot of things that happened in the sixties when there was sort of a higher energy level. In the seventies there's a certain staleness, I think, that a lot of people sense about contemporary music. We're just trying to somehow put a little more youthfulness into it, a little more of a spark. Not that it's a crusade, or there's anything wrong, though - - we're just trying to make good, melodic rock & roll." Dancer are not, however, a nostalgia group. The music is current and original.

Douglas, a personable young man of 24, is very conscious that he is a Canadian, and is particularly anxious to see the group succeed in Canada. He was pleased to see the single qualify as Cancon. He moved to Los Angeles seven years ago, but returns to visit friends and family as often as he can. Douglas would like to see the group perform regularly in Canada, and mentions a debut tour being planned for the spring. He also intends eventually to divide his time between Canada and California, and would like to do some production and writing in Canada.

Dancer are a group looking backward and forward at the same time. They see themselves as trying to assimilate their sixties roots and to progress and grow with them. The second album, tentatively set for recording in the summer, will be different, according to Douglas. It will be another step forward in the group's aim of bringing the sixties enthusiasm to the sophisticated music of the seventies.

Tour and album for WEA's Winchester

WEA recording artist Jesse Winchester is presently recording his fifth album on Bearsville and making preparations for a cross-Canada tour. The tour begins in Wolfville, N.S. on February 9, and moves through Halifax, Antigonish, Saint John, Toronto, Winnipeg, Regina, Edmonton, Calgary, Vancouver, and ending with a week in Victoria (27-March 3).

The album is being produced at Eastern Sound in Toronto by Brian Ahern.

Ian Hunter & Angels escape Quebec fire

CBS artist Ian Hunter, former leader of Mott The Hoople, is in Morin Heights, Quebec, recording an album at Le Studio

with Roy Thomas Baker of Queen fame producing.

Hunter, Baker and the band recently escaped serious injury when the house in which they were staying caught fire while they were asleep. Guitarist Earl Slick, formerly with David Bowie, awoke to find flames licking through the door of his room. He picked up a fire axe and began chopping at the door, waking the others and is credited with saving their lives. They escaped by jumping from windows into the snow, without time to put on clothes.

Seconds after Baker, the last one out, jumped, the house exploded in flames.

Terry McGee of CBS reports all are healthy and that work will continue shortly on the album. The band are appropriately named Overnight Angels.

Capitol to release new Gentle Giant album

Capitol Records are releasing a new two-record set by British group Gentle Giant. The live album, *Playing The Fool*, was recorded in England and includes 11 selections. It is the group's fourth release with Capitol, and eight overall.

Capitol's Kris Kerenyi reports a North America tour in conjunction with the album, with Canadian dates in Quebec City February 20 at the Convention Centre, Toronto's Maple Leaf Gardens Concert Bowl (22), and the Montreal Forum (23).

Attic's Triumph sells in U.S. as import

Attic recording group Triumph are reported receiving strong regional airplay throughout the U.S. The group's album, titled after the band's name, is not on release in the U.S. but is available as an import.

Attic vice-president Tom Williams reports one retail outlet in Chicago, Rolling Stone Records, featuring a six by six-foot handpainted picture of the album cover on display outside the store on the front wall.

Triumph have a new single release, *What's Another Day Of Rock And Roll*.

Zaza Sound opens second recording studio

Toronto's Zaza Sound Studio has opened a second recording facility. The new studio, located on the same premises, is an eight-track facility, featuring two two-track machines and the eight-track, all by Ampex, and a custom mixing board.

Zaza Sound reports the new facility will be used primarily for small sessions, dubs and demos, freeing the first studio to do more major sessions and jingles. The first bookings in the new location are imminent.

Rufus Road Machine off with Axe single

Axe Records has released a new Great Rufus Road Machine single, *Say What's On Your Mind*, the company's first single for 1977. The single is also the first new product from Axe available through London Records under the new distribution deal between the two companies.

The single is the group's first on Axe, and was produced at Toronto Sound by Axe president Greg Hambleton. Two previous singles released on the Quality-distributed Rubber Bullet label were also produced by Hambleton.

The group has been working throughout Ontario, with club dates slated in London, Kincardine and in Toronto at Adam's Rib. They are managed by Craig Nicholson of Toronto-based Pizazz Productions. A western tour is in the planning stages with an album for release in the spring.

Rose re-emerges with record deal

Polydor Records have signed Barrie-based group Rose and purchased their recently-completed album *A Taste Of Neptune*. The album was produced by the group at Listen House Audio in Montreal.

Rose have embarked on a club and one-nighter tour through Ontario. Dates included Trenton February 4, Belleville (5), The Forge in Toronto (10), Thorold (11), Newcastle (17), Prescott (18), Brockville (19), The Gasworks in Toronto (28-March 3), Niagara College March 16, The Forge (17-19), Sudbury (21-26), Oshawa (28-April 2), and the Knob Hill in Toronto (11-16). Material from the new album will be featured.

The group is booked exclusively by Music Shoppe International.

Polydor releases first Thin Lizzy product

Polydor Records has rush-released its first single by Irish group Thin Lizzy, *Don't Believe A Word*. The single is also the first Mercury-Phonogram-U.K. material to be released in Canada. Thin Lizzy is one of the groups now being distributed in Canada by Polydor as a result of the Philips deal.

Polydor's Lori Bruner reports the group's tour, as special guests on the Queen tour, going well before sell-out crowds. Guitarist Brian Robertson is not on the tour due to an injury and is being replaced by Gary Moore, formerly with Colosseum. Canadian dates remaining are Vancouver's Coliseum March 3 and Calgary's Jubilee Auditorium (16-17).

National CBC-TV creates image for Valdy & Hometown Band

If it wasn't for Canadian folksingers, the Canadian music industry would be further behind the post than it is at present. One of the country's greatest contributors to this form of music (nearly scuttled by the Juno Awards people CARAS) is A&M's Canadian superstar Valdy and the Hometown Band. You might get some argument from the latter about the folk category but, as backup to Valdy, they certainly register high on the scale for popularity in the folk and adult contemporary fields.

One observer noted that Valdy is so unique he's difficult to figure out. It's been eight years since Woodstock. Flowers and love beads have been replaced by vested suits and satin shirts. Apathy is running rampant and disco is the now thing. In spite of all this, Valdy still sings about living off the land, loving each other and ending war. Don't be too quick however, to knock success. Last year's Valdy tour grossed \$250,000 and he's sold more than 150,000 albums since 1972, ranking only second to Gordon Lightfoot in record sales for a Canadian folk singer.

Valdy was born in Ottawa, the son of a prosperous and conservative couple. He was christened Valdimar Horsdal (Valdimar is Danish for wanderer), but his father asked him never to use the family name as long as he appeared on stage.

Before settling for the back to the land image, Valdy dabbled with jazz rock and country and went one step further - he and his family tend a five acre farm on Vancouver Island.

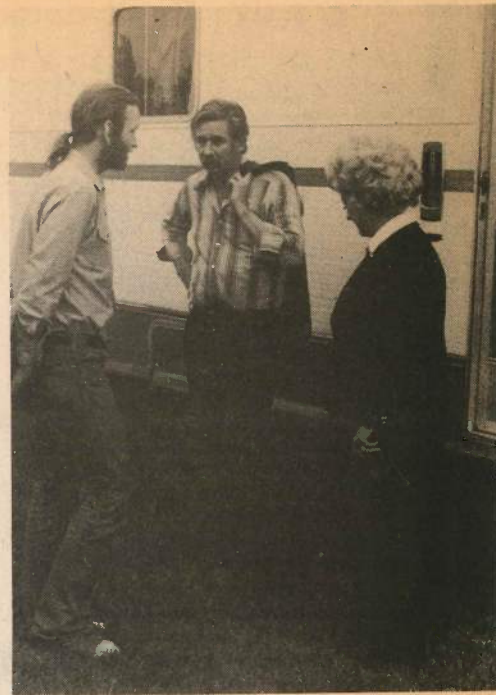
Valdy's attempts at being cute and gutsy would probably spell the end for many performers if they walked the same tight wire with their audiences. What might be construed as boorishness is, in actuality, reality. He takes on rock audiences with his Sing Me A Rock & Roll Song, he sides

with the CRTC over the Canadian content ruling. He sings about pollution, city planning and the plight of farmers and last year infuriated a Vancouver audience of anti-whaling conservationists with a poignant ditty about the problems of mass unemployment facing Newfoundland whalers in the face of ecology inspired restrictions on whaling.

Much of Valdy's recent concert success has been the super casual and highly professional backup he receives from the Hometown Band. The Vancouver-based group comprised Claire Lawrence, who is

also the producer for the group, on sax and flute: Doug Edwards, guitar; Jeff Eyre, drums; Robbie King, piano and organ; and Shari Ulrich, violin, sax, flute and vocals.

The Hometown Band are currently represented on the RPM singles chart with I'm Ready and their album, Flying, on the RPM 100 albums chart, both given a national boost with their current coast to coast major Canadian tour, sharing the bill with Valdy. On completion they will have covered sixty Canadian cities and is the most extensive ever undertaken by Valdy.

Biggest coup for the year for Valdy and the Hometown Band was their recent CBC-TV special, Folksinger Deluxe, produced and directed by David Acamba. The project which took almost a year to put together resulted in 52 minutes of film including concert shots, recorded live without overdubs and mixed (at an average of six hours per song) by producer Claire Lawrence. Because the music was on tape, none of which was recorded at less than 15 i.p.s., the sound was better than any album, or normal FM radio broadcast. To give an even greater depth to the sound of the TV special, the CBC simulcast the program over the CBC-FM network, in stereo. The show itself has been set for rebroadcast for sometime in May in view of its overwhelming success including rave reviews from critics across the country.

Valdy's first album release for A&M, Country Man, certified as gold in 1975. The remainder of his A&M catalogue which includes Landscapes, Family Gathering and Valdy and The Hometown Band are fast approaching gold status.

In spite of all his commercial and financial success, Valdy still remains, as he describes himself, "Canada's number one natural man".

Yamaha (Canada) Music Limited is celebrating the opening of its new centralized head offices in Toronto February 11. National headquarters were previously located in Winnipeg.

A very diversified company, Yamaha markets everything from guitar picks and bottlenecks to concert grand pianos to 32-channel PA systems to tennis rackets and skis, all under the Yamaha label. A sister company, the Yamaha Motor Company, markets the popular motorcycles and snowmobiles in Canada.

Yamaha (Canada) is a young company, coming into existence as recently as 1958 when it was formed by the Winnipeg-based Piano House Limited as an import and distribution concern. In May of 1973, it was purchased by the Japanese parent company Nippon Gakki to become a wholly-owned subsidiary. From that point it became the distributor of all Yamaha music and leisure products in Canada.

Yamaha product was introduced to Canada at a far earlier date. As early as 1896, a Yamaha organ was brought to Whitehorse in the Yukon, only nine years after the company came into existence. This early instrument is still an important part of a museum there.

On a worldwide basis Yamaha has been constantly growing and diversifying since 1887, when Torakusu Yamaha built his

first reed organ. There are affiliate branches throughout the world. Yamaha product is manufactured in ten factories throughout central Japan. Of these, six primarily produce musical instruments, and a seventh refines lumber for them.

The Canadian subsidiary is also continually expanding. It presently employs over 400 people and deals with over 1,000 retail outlets, nationwide. The company is headed by Mr. Hiroshi Oka, vice-president and general manager of the Canadian branch, who came to Canada from Yamaha (Europe) in Hamburg, shortly after the parent company took over in 1973.

Yamaha (Canada) is split into three basic parts, the audio, sporting goods and musical instrument divisions. The audio division, headed by national sales manager Emil Bazinet, is in charge of home entertainment equipment such as tuners, receivers and home speakers. The sporting goods division, run by national sales manager Guy Christie based in Vancouver, deals in the marketing of Yamaha's skiing, tennis and archery equipment and accessories.

The musical instrument division, headed by John Kennedy, is divided into two groups. The keyboard division, run by Dave Mitchell, deals with home keyboard instruments such as grand pianos and home organs. The small musical instrument

division, managed by Tim Craig, covers everything else, including band and orchestral instruments, synthesizers and electric keys, and sound systems and equipment for concerts.

The company's major concern is musical instruments. Tim Craig reports Yamaha is the largest wholesale supplier of instruments in Canada and the largest overall supplier in the world. Craig adds, "It is the most complete musical company in the country." Yamaha carries a full line of pianos, organs, electronic keyboard instruments, classical, acoustic and electric guitars, woodwinds, brass, drums and percussion instruments, and accessories -- most in a wide range of prices and qualities.

In sound equipment, Craig reports a full line of amplifiers of all types and for all uses, sound reinforcement systems, and a full line of mixers for studio or concert, from 16 tracks down. A new 32-track concert mixer will be introduced to the Canadian market shortly, and top line studio mixers are being developed for marketing within the next 18 months. A new monitor cabinet, the S2115H, will also be introduced, Yamaha's first step into monitors.

Perhaps the company's greatest recent strides have been in the field of electronic keyboard instruments. The top of this field is an organ-synthesizer called the GX-1.

The GX-1 has been described as the equivalent of nine 37-key polyphonic synthesizers blended into one unit. All the voices are controllable and can be preset by programming on a device which comes with the instrument. Stevie Wonder used the GX-1 extensively on his platinum Motown album, *Songs In The Key Of Life*. Craig notes, "On some of the songs the orchestra in the background is not an orchestra at all. It's the GX-1."

Two new electronic keyboard instruments will be available in Canada within a month. The company's first electronic piano, the CP-30, is a stereo instrument with three piano voices and one for harpsichord, featuring separate selection for left and right channels. The other addition is an "Electric Grand", which duplicates closely the sound of the grand piano. It was used in the award winning film *A Star Is Born* ("Barbra Streisand almost got laid on it.").

A new line of polyphonic synthesizers is scheduled for marketing in May. The top of the line, the CS-80, was used on the King Kong soundtrack. Smaller models are the CS-50 and the CS-60. The line is described as smaller, one board versions of the GX-1.

There is a growing number of Canadian artists using Yamaha instruments and equipment, among which are Eugene Ridick, first French horn in the Toronto Symphony, GRT artist Ian Thomas, who is contracted to Yamaha for sound equipment and keyboards, and CBS Portrait artist Burton Cummings, whose recent cross-Canada tour was sponsored by Yamaha's audio division.

Yamaha instruments and systems are also finding their way into places of prestige

throughout Canada. Ottawa's National Arts Centre has a resident Yamaha system. Montreal's Forum and Jarry Park and the Winnipeg Arena all use Yamaha organs. The sound systems at the Montreal Olympics were provided by Audio Analysts there, who exclusively used Yamaha mixing systems at all 26 sites. The pianos used at the Olympics for the opening and closing ceremonies and for gymnastics were also Yamaha instruments.

Yamaha also takes a keen interest in musical education, and is working through the Japan-based division, the Yamaha Music Foundation, to make musical instruction readily available in all musical fields, and at all ages and levels of talent, on a worldwide basis. The Yamaha music school program, which began in 1957, now enrolls over 300,000 students throughout Japan, North America, Europe, Asia, Australia and New Zealand. The most popular course is the organ - - 60,000 students are enrolled in electone courses in Japan alone. Guitar, piano, reeds, percussion, drums and theory are also taught.

Yamaha schools in Canada have a present enrollment of 12,000. There is an education services division and an educators' research centre, both located in Winnipeg, with full-time staff designing and developing the curriculum for the schools.

Worldwide musical development and showcasing is another function of the Foundation. Yamaha sponsors two annual competitions, the World Popular Song Festival and the International Electone Festival for organists.

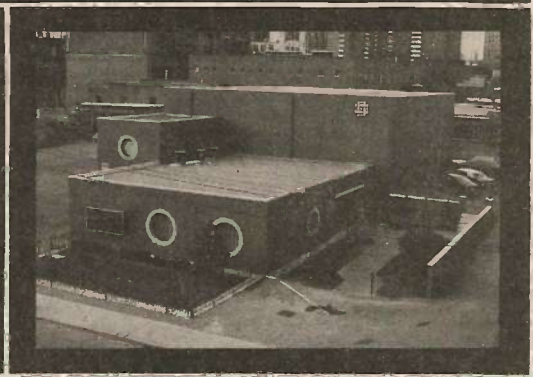
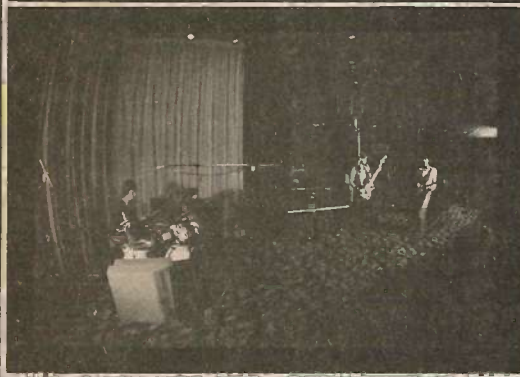
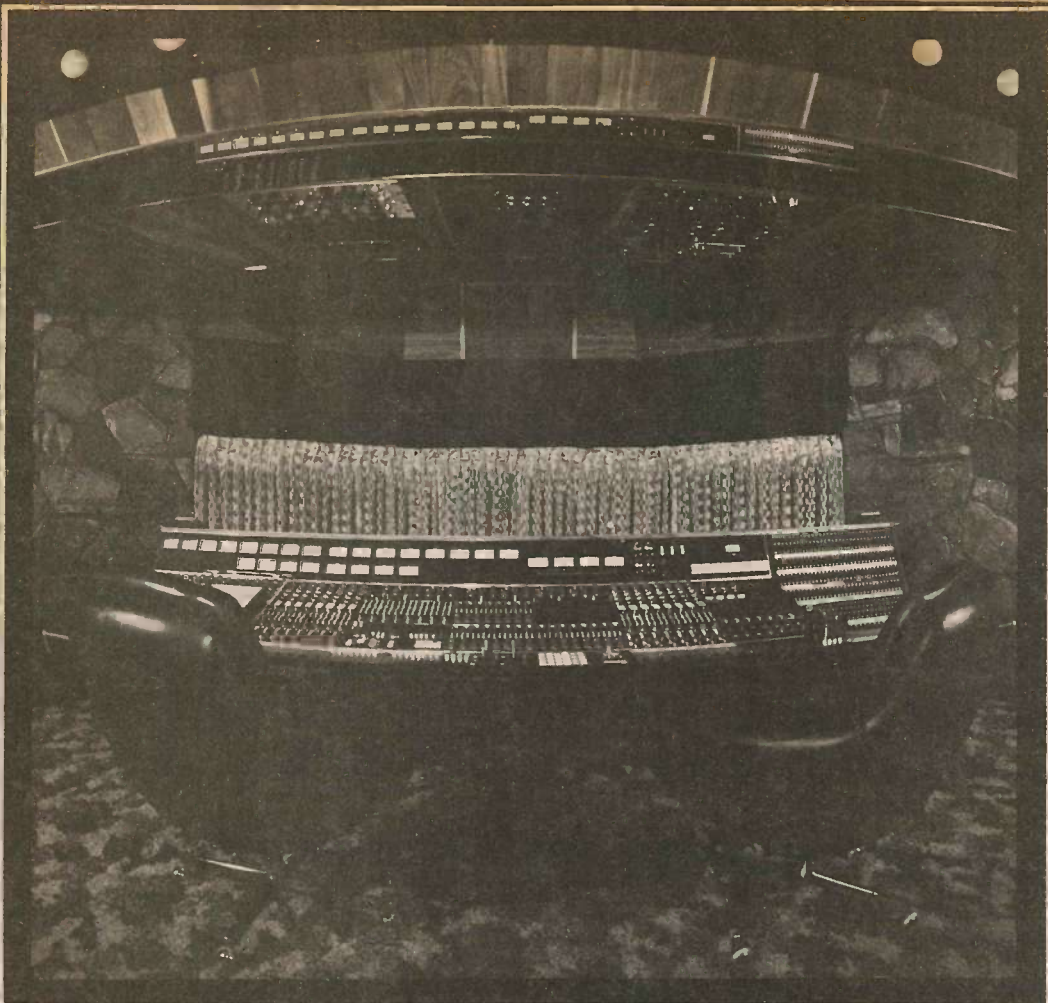
Canada's grand prize winner at the Electone Festival, in 1972, was Claude

Dupras, who is presently the house organist for the Montreal Expos baseball team. Canadians have yet to be represented at the finals of the Popular Song Festival.

The new headquarters for Yamaha Canada is housed in a 56,000 square foot facility located in Scarborough. Tim Craig described the reasons for the move: "The rate of growth that this company has experienced over the last five years is absolutely mind-boggling. We're now where we would have anticipated it would take ten years to get to. It became necessary to do something about our facilities. Up to December 31, 1976, we were operating out of four facilities in Toronto alone. We've combined all those things and moved the head offices from Winnipeg to Toronto basically because most of the business is in the eastern segment where the population is."

The new facilities include a large (810,000 cubic feet) warehouse. There are full service facilities with all equipment needed to do repairs on any product, separate repair rooms for audio, organ, piano and small instrument groups, and a testing laboratory, all run by an eastern Canada service manager. There is an equivalent facility, operated in Winnipeg by a western Canada service manager. Craig reports additional warehouse facilities to be acquired in the near future to accommodate the company's rapid growth.

It is this growth that is moving the Yamaha group ever closer to its expressed goals - - "A richer life, a time when every child can develop the music within him to the fullest and draw from every leisure hour a full sixty minutes of joy and creativity."

RCA's E.Deer Gold promos her LP in Montreal

RCA Records has begun promotion on E. Dee Gold's album, *Please Let Me Into Your Heart*. The album was first released two years ago, RCA releasing it last October. Three of the selections, the title cut, *Hustle And Bustle* and *The Answer*, were penned by Gold. *Hustle And Bustle* has been picking up good airplay, especially in Montreal, and is slated for release as a single. The album is entirely instrumental.

Gold, who is from Toronto, studied classical piano for 15 years and has her teaching certificate from the Royal Conservatory of Music. She was discovered by singer Frankie Laine who auditioned her after they met at one of his Toronto performances. The agent that booked him got

her first job, eight years ago, at Toronto's Constellation Hotel, on her 14th wedding anniversary.

She has been working at the Toronto Airport Hilton since the hotel opened five years ago. She sings primarily in French, and does her arrangements in her head: "I listen to my radio all day, and the songs just sink into my head and I can sit down at the piano and just play them. The arrangements are all mine."

On a recent promo trip to Montreal, she did an interview with Tom Scurfield of CFCF radio and delivered a tape to Paul Reid at CJAD of a song, *Paul*, that she wrote for him. She has appeared on Reid's show four times. She has also been inter-

viewed by Betty Kennedy, Juliette, Phil McKeller of CKFM, and Tom Meyer of Radio Netherlands, a world-wide shortwave station which also plays the title selection from her album.

Although she is not interested in leaving her job at the Hilton, E. Dee Gold is looking to expand her career.

Toronto writers' branch created by ACTRA

The ACTRA Board of Directors have created the eleventh Branch of ACTRA, the Toronto Writers' Branch.

ACTRA, with a total membership of over 5,000, is at the moment divided into ten Branches - British Columbia, Edmonton, Calgary, Saskatchewan, Winnipeg, Ottawa, Toronto, Montreal, the Maritimes and Newfoundland and Labrador, each of which includes performers and writers. At this time the Toronto Branch of ACTRA is the largest with about 3,000 members. Total membership in Toronto's ACTRA Branch has increased by 50% in five years and the writer membership by an even larger percentage. The Toronto Writers' Branch will represent about 600 writers, freelance writers in all areas of television and radio, feature film writers and stage playwrights. This new Branch interestingly enough will represent the same number of members as the total ACTRA membership in the Montreal Branch.

The possibility of a Toronto Writers' Branch has been discussed for some time however, ACTRA's Board of Directors was obviously influenced by a petition signed by over 100 writer members requesting the formation of such a branch.

ACTRA's assistant general secretary-writers' administrator, Margaret Collier told RPM that the Toronto Writers' Branch will come into being April 1, 1977, and that she will contact members who are registered as writers of the Toronto ACTRA Branch concerning their participation in this new branch.

Quality's Alex Harvey makes Canadian debut

Quality recording artist Alexander Harvey made his Canadian debut at Toronto's El Mocambo, January 27-29. Harvey previewed material from his forthcoming album *Preshus Child*. The album is his first with Quality and will be released in mid-February.

While in Toronto, Harvey did several radio interviews to promote the record and performance.

Harvey is noted as a songwriter for Delta Dawn, made famous by Helen Reddy, and several hits for Kenny Rogers, including *Tell It All*. The upcoming album and a single, *High Roller*, will mark his first release in Canada.

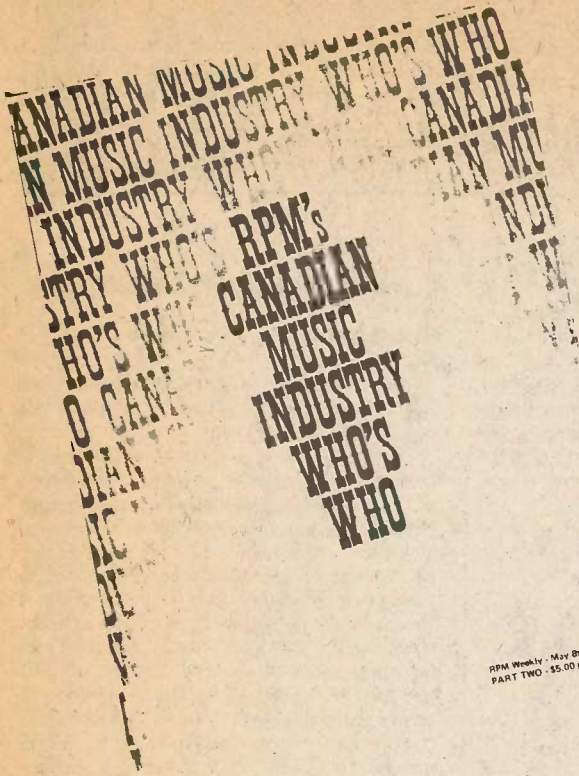

IWC finalizes plans for new Toronto FMer

While they wait for the CRTC to decide the outcome of the Global TV ownership question, IWC Communications Ltd. is busy getting its new Toronto FM station on the air, according to IWC president Allan Slaughter.

The station, licenced by the CRTC last winter, will begin broadcasting on 107.1 FM (with call letters to be announced soon) sometime in the late spring. The station's studios will be in the Hudson Bay Centre at Yonge and Bloor Streets in downtown

Toronto.

The new station will broadcast contemporary music and will play 30 per cent Canadian content, as proposed to the CRTC in their licensee application. On-air personalities and major station personalities will also be announced closer to the new station's air date, Slaughter said.

IWC is awaiting a CRTC ruling on the ownership of Global TV, of which IWC has been a major shareholder and manager of broadcast operations. If the commission rules that the Winnipeg-based Global Western Ventures Ltd. may buy out IWC, the Toronto firm will realize almost \$3.5 million profit on their Global venture-money they would likely re-invest in broadcasting operations.

IWC also owns CFGM, Richmond Hill and Toronto-area country giant, Sarnia's CHOK and Montreal's CFOX.

Next fall CFGM's frequency will be shifted from 1310 to 1320 on the AM dial, a shift which will improve its nighttime signal and expand its potential audience by 1 million.

Global TV, which had been a big money loser for the first few years of its operation, has recently turned the financial corner, according to its recently released financial statement. Losses for the 1976 fiscal year were below \$1 million, compared to almost \$5 million the previous year. In the first quarter of 1977, the network's bottom line was written in black ink, according to Slaughter.

Conestoga College broadcasters awards

The Broadcasting Radio and Television Program at Kitchener Ontario's Conestoga College honoured that program's top students January 26, by dividing \$1,350 in award money between them. The four year old awards went to students of the course who excelled in announcing, news reporting, as well as two awards presented for academic excellence, and a Broadcaster of the Year award.

CHUM Toronto's, John Gilbert was the guest speaker at the Awards Dinner, hosted by the Broadcasting Radio Television Program at Conestoga College, Central Ontario Television, CHYM Radio and Grand River Cable Television of Kitchener.

The guests at the dinner included graduates now in broadcasting operations in Kitchener, Guelph, Barrie, Hamilton, London, Toronto as well as with the CBC, CTV, and Global Television Network along with

executives of Central Ontario Television, Grand River Cable Television, CHYM Radio, CJOY Radio, CHML Radio. The sponsors and winners of this year's awards are as follows. The CHYM Radio awards for announcing, totalling \$500, were presented to Neil Trifunovich of Guelph, Terry McPhee of Sault Ste. Marie, and Mark Nelson of Simcoe. The Grand River Cable Television Award for Best News Story, valued at \$250 was presented to Kathy Herron of Toronto. The Carl A. Pollock Award for Academic Excellence, valued at \$250 was awarded to Stephen Young of Kitchener, the Faculty - Staff Award to the program graduate with the highest standing including an honorarium subscribed by the faculty and staff, was presented to George Dyke, of Toronto. and broadcasters to promote the tour. In addition, Ray Ramsay of TPC Records, Quality's western distributor, has planned the theme of the Vancouver date after a Gilley single, A Room Full Of Roses. He has arranged to give out 1,500 roses to ladies attending the concert.

Gilley has five albums released on Playboy and a number of hit singles in the country field. He has toured as opening act for Conway Twitty and Loretta Lynn.

RCA's Atkins & Lee play Canadian dates

Two RCA country artists made recent appearances on Canadian stages. Dickey Lee who recently appeared on the Grand Old Country, was at the Hook & Ladder Club at Toronto's Seaway Beverly Hills. His recent single, 9,999,999 Tears, reached number one on RPM's Country Playlist.

His current RCA album, The Best Of Chet Atkins & Friends, features Atkins playing with a wide selection of top talent, ranging from country singers Dolly Parton, Hank Snow and Jerry Reed to sax man Boots Randolph and guitarists Lenny Breau, Merle Travis and Les Paul, to the Nashville Brass and Arthur Fiedler and the Boston Pops.

The Hamilton show was part of the Du Maurier Concert Series.

Condor's Julie Lynn gets national radio spot

Condor artist Julie Lynn will be appearing on the CBC radio show Country Roads, broadcast from Halifax with host Vic Mullen. Condor's Jack Hosier reports Lynn will appear for the full 90-minute network program February 18, from 8:30 to 10 p.m.

Instead of sitting around bitching about what your record company isn't doing for you, you've got to get out there and contact disc jockeys, record stores and anyone else who can help sell your product." When Dave asked him if product wasn't an artistic creation, Smith replied, "No matter how artistic you think your music is, when it comes to getting it across to the public, it's just like selling soap or cookies, you have to get out there and promote."

Michael T. Wall, Newfoundland's greatest promoter (including Joey Smallwood) and his Mrs. are expecting the arrival of their first youngster. Michael T. is still a featured regular at Molly And Me's on Bloor West in Toronto, has been for the past twenty-one consecutive months. As a personal project Mike has been extolling the merits of numerous Newfoundland and down east records to the powers that be in the Toronto public library system, resulting in such items being added to the record divisions of several public library branches.

The Ontario gig follows several Bert Mitford promoted concerts for the red hot British group in Newfoundland and the Maritimes. They have been super sellers of records on the Attic label down east for the past several months. They have consistently rated high on the VOCM-St. John's charts, with most stations across the Big Island following suit. While they are more or less

recent arrivals on the pop/country scene in Canada the group has been in business in their native England for the past ten years. Their biggest hit to date has been Combine Harvester. That was followed by I'm A Cider Drinker, and a brand new effort gives every indication of being another chart-buster for the good British group. It's Morning Glory.

A very bright future appears to be in store for Newfoundland-native, A. Frank Willis. The artist did good business in his home place a while back with his Periwinkle debut single, Any Kinda Music,

The country policy is

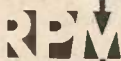
continuing in that location by the way as Dickey Lee and Billy Swan are set to appear.

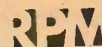

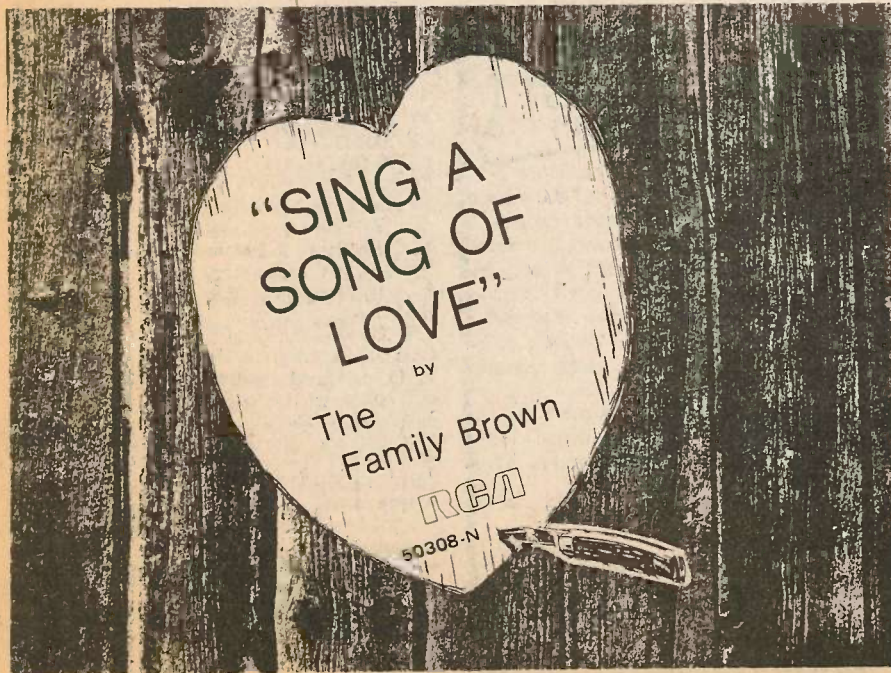

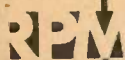
