PHILLY STATIONS HIT WITH REPORTING CONDITIONS. . . . The two words that strike fear into many a broadcaster, "reporting conditions", will become a part of life at two Philadelphia stations after the FCC renewed their licenses while denying appeals by the Philadelphia Lesbian & Gay Task Force, ASPIRA, Inc., and the National Organization for Women. Infinity's WYSP, and Malrite's WJJZ will be subject to reporting conditions through 1997. Non-commercial WHYI's license was renewed without sanction. WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

FCC Chairman Hundt turned up the heat this week on his commitment to promote equal employment opportunity, noting his goal of "having the ownership and management ranks in the telecommunications industry look more like the people they serve."

At an address to the National Urban League conference, Hundt said the recently released 1993 EEO statistics for broadcasting and cable were "not satisfactory." He also pointed out, "These results reflect insufficient movement" toward his goals, but vowed, "the Commission's renewed emphasis on EEO enforcement will spur improvement in the coming year."

In referring to the EEO stats, Hundt cited the five year period between 1989 and 1993, during which female representation in the "Officials and Managers" category increased by only 2.1% and minority representation in this category increased by only 1.2%. Likewise, there were only small gains in the "Professionals," "Technicians," and "Sales Workers" categories, as well.

In the report for radio and television, males outnumber females two-to-one in the "Officials and Managers" and "Professionals" categories, and by nearly seven-to-one in the "Technicians" category. Interestingly, there are more women than men in the "Sales Workers" category.

Hundt's commitment to EEO isn't just meant for those governed by the Commission. In his reorganization of the FCC (see related story), he has also formed an Office of Workplace Diversity, which will report directly to him and the Commissioners, and will handle the Commission's internal EEO program.

Also, the Commission has delegated authority to the General Counsel of the FCC to act as the "alternate designated agency ethics official." The Office of Government Ethics regulations require the Commission to formally designate an agency official to coordinate and manage the agency's ethics program.

The Commission has had some problems with broadcasters mailing multiple applications in the same envelope that are really supposed to go to different addresses. So, they're giving in, if you follow procedure. If you don't, your applications may be returned to you.

If you have multiple applications to file, but they're not all going to the same address, here's what you do. Sort all of the applications you're going to mail by the P.O. Box they're supposed to go to. Then enclose each set in a separate envelope with the P.O. Box for that set clearly marked on the front of the envelope. Then put all of your envelopes into a larger envelope and mail it to:

A brand new network reunites husband and wife morning team of Stevens and Grdnic. Originally on the air at Hot 97 WQHT in New York, they now tackle the world of satellite programming with their own show, which will address world and national events, entertainment news, and will have 1-800 listener interaction, parodies, human interest stories and some "good old over-the-fence gossip". The show will run 3 PM to 6PM Eastern Time, Monday through Friday. The first affiliate for the web is KUTI, Yakima, WA. For more information contact All Star Radio at (818) 766-6447.

Yet another nationally-syndicated talk show has hit the bird as WIFI in Florence, NJ (Trenton) starts a new network featuring Earl Jackson Across America. Termed the "Black Rush Limbaugh", Mr. Jackson's interactive talk show will run 3-6 PM ET. In addition to Mr. Jackson, WIFI is setting up a music service that will include an even split between Do-wop, Motown, Urban oldies and "The Philadelphia Sound". EZ Communications is getting out of Tampa before it gets in by selling off AC WTPX for \$21.25 million to New Age Broadcasting. EZ's purchase of WTPX and urban WUSL Philadelphia from Tak Communications for \$50 million was just approved by a U.S. Bankruptcy court. The sale will create a new duopoly in Tampa as New Age already owns Spanish WXDJ Homestead, FL.

Bud Paxson will be doubling up in Tampa as he has entered into an LMA with Largo Broadcasting's talker WYTA, Largo, FL. Paxson already owns news and sports outlet WHNZ, Pinellas Park, in that market. As he announced last year, Paxson still intends pick up his second FM in Tampa--easy listening WEZY, Lakeland--to go with progressive WHPT, Sarasota, as soon as a facility upgrade for WEZY is built.

Shamrock Broadcasting is on the move in Denver, picking up Premiere Radio Networks' only station, country KZDG, Greeley, CO, for \$5.5 million. Shamrock already owns oldies combo KXKL-AM & FM there.

Central States Network has announced its plans to buy an AM/FM combo in Lincoln, IL. CSN will pick up country WPRC and soft AC WESZ for \$750,000 from L & M Broadcasting. The purchase will give CSN a duopoly in the Springfield, IL market once WESZ builds its upgrade and moves from 100.1 MHz to 93.9 MHz. It already owns news/talk WTAX and hot AC WDBR, both Springfield.

Embarcadero Media will pick up a duopoly in the Riverside-San Bernardino market as it's announced it will buy country combo KHTX (AM), San Bernardino and KHTX-FM, Riverside, for \$10 million from Henry Broadcasting. Embarcadero already owns Spanish KCAL there. Plans are to flip the new combo to Spanish when the sale closes.

In Bakersfield, Mary Helen Barro flipped KXHA, Shafter, CA, from Spanish to classic rock this week and announced she's purchasing a construction permit for KZPM, a 5000 watt day/1000 watt night AM on 1100 kHz, from Jerry J. Collins for a duopoly with KXHA's sister station, Spanish KAFY.

In L.A., Willie Davis's All Pro Broadcasting is moving forward with its LMA-to-purchase of Cox Broadcasting's soft urban KACE, Inglewood, CA. All Pro owns news-talker KCKC, San Bernardino; and KAEV, Lake Arrowhead, CA, who simulcasts KACE, in the nearby Riverside/San Bernardino market. The lawsuit filed to stop the sale of the station by El Dorado Communications, licensee of KMQA-FM, West Covina, CA, is still pending.

The Radio Advertising Bureau reports the radio industry finished the first half of 1994 with combined local and national spot revenue up 11% over the same period in 1993. The highest increases in local and national revenue came from the southeast with 17% and the southwest with 12% respectively. June revenue, while slightly softer than previous months, grew at an overall rate of 9%. Network revenue was also up 2% in the first half of 1994.

Fifteen more Arbitron-measured metros will see sample increases in the Fall '94 survey. The markets are Cleveland, Columbus, Harrisburg-Lebanon-Carlisle, New Orleans, Riverside-San Bernardino, San Diego, Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater, West Palm Beach-Boca Raton, Billings, Evansville, Hagerstown, Merced, Oxnard-Ventura, Santa Barbara, and Visalia-Tulare-Hanford.

Arbitron has flagged another station for ratings bias. This time, it's CHR WFGM, Fairmont, WV in the Morgantown-Clarksburg-Fairmont market. WFGM ran a promo that stated, "And remember, when someone asks you your favorite radio station, you tell 'em WFGM, the Great 98."

A Federal Court has barred AC WRMF, Palm Beach, FL, from running a television campaign created by Custom Productions of Santa Monica. Custom alleges that WRMF produced a "virtually identical" copy of the "Honesty" campaign, and is suing for copyright infringement and damages of \$600,000.

Metro Networks, who operates Metro Traffic, has purchased Computraffic, a 25-affiliate traffic reporting service for the St. Louis area. Inside Radio reports Computraffic founder/president Brad Hildebrand will remain as general manager. Metro claims affiliates in 50 markets across the U.S.

The Seattle-based Children's Media Network, which operates the KidStar Network through KKDZ, Seattle, has announced it will begin national syndication soon, going head-to-head with Chris Dahl's Minneapolis-based Radio Aahs. CMN has promoted Jodell Seagrave to the GM slot. John Dodge is the new PD.

The Corporation for Public Broadcasting is providing \$750,000 for a new news and information network that will broadcast to Europe. The network is a joint project between NPR and Public Radio International, and will provide half-day programming in the beginning, and quickly move to 24-hours. The feed will be available for rebroadcast by both commercial and non-commercial broadcasters in Europe.

World Radio Network, a London-based group that rebroadcasts satellite feeds from international broadcasters, is offering all or any part of their 24-hour feed to any U.S. station, both commercial and non-commercial, at no charge. For more info, contact Jeff Cohen at 011-44-71-304-4343.

TAKE MY NETWORK, PLEASE. For the fourth time in five years, Business Radio Network (and American Sports Radio) has been sold. This time, it goes to an investor group of out Florida headed by Charles Arnold and talk show host Ed Taxin. The deal for the web is rumored to be worth approximately \$2 million. BRN, which was launched in 1989, merged with the American Radio Networks (now known as American Sports Radio) in 1991 and was sold to California investor Norman Tolchin in 1993. American Forum, BRN's talk network, folded earlier this year.

SMALL DEPOSIT, NO RETURN. The Commission has decided not to appeal a U.S. Appellate Court decision that effectively shut down the Commission's comparative hearing process. The move clears the way for processing of applications for new AM, FM and TV stations, applications for major upgrades or facilities modifications, and requests for rulemakings for FM and TV channel allotments. For some of you that filed apps before the freeze, the FCC will be keeping your money for a while. Details are on page 6.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

After the U.S. Court of Appeals, D.C. Circuit, decision in Bechtel vs FCC ruled the Commission's integration criteria that were applied to mutually exclusive applicants were "arbitrary and capricious", the FCC put a freeze on applications for new broadcast stations, major modifications, and rulemakings for new channel allotments. Now, the Commission will resume processing of these applications, as well as issue AM and TV cut-off lists and open FM filing windows. Even though they will suspend processing of those applications that are or become mutually exclusive, they will consider settlement proposals among the applicants and ". . . take whatever further steps may be appropriate to effectuate the settlement."

Window filing periods that were suspended by the freeze will be reopened for a full 30-day comment period in a future public notice. Applications already filed during a suspended filing window will be considered filed in the reopened window.

Even though the Commission will hold all application fees paid, all hearing fee requirements have been suspended, pending the Commission's decision on how to handle future comparative hearings. Anyone who has submitted a hearing fee after February 25 may request a refund through the Office of Managing Director.

The Commission lost another court battle this week as a U.S. Appeals Court ruled that the FCC illegally canceled a 1992 contract to move to an area of Washington, DC, known as "the Portals". The contract was dumped after the Commission told the General Services Administration, the department who procures office space for the government, that more space was needed that originally planned. It is widely known that the FCC has never been happy with the GSA choice. The appeals court said the evidence supported an FCC "campaign to scuttle" the move. This move could change the name of our publication to "The Portals Pages."

After years of legal posturing, the fight to renew the license of WAXQ, New York (formerly WNCN) is finally over. The Commission approved a settlement agreement between GAF Broadcasting and the WNCN Listeners' Guild in which GAF will pay the Guild \$110,000 for legal costs and authority to use the WNCN Listeners' Club mailing list. In return, the Listeners' Guild will withdraw all pending court and FCC actions.

After last week's announcement that the Commission will establish several new departments and reorganize some existing ones, it will now reorganize the Office of Public Affairs, the department that administers news media and public information outreach activities. It will also attempt to streamline reference functions. A Commission press release stated it, "will empower its employees in the OPA by providing more direct accountability, removing barriers to work performance, increasing the delegation of authority, and improving the information flow to and from front-line employees."

Improving information flow is nice, in theory. But you still have to be able to control the computer. For example, Irene Rodriguez Diaz de McComas, an applicant for a new FM CP in Rio Grande, PR, filed a motion asking the Commission to extend a comment period for the reexamination of the policy statement on comparative broadcast hearings. The reason: "technical difficulties with the Commission's automated docket retrieval system made it impossible for her to obtain in a timely manner copies of the comments in this proceeding." The Commission agreed, and extended the deadline for comments to August 22.

The Commission has new software that it hopes will make fee payments easier. Two products, one for DOS and Windows, and one for Macintosh computers, allows the data to be keyed directly into a spreadsheet and exported to a file format the FCC can read. The software will be made available on Internet on or about August 15. For more information, call the FCC's Customer Support Line at (202) 418-0266.

The man has a high-powered stereo system in his car that he enjoyed playing at levels that would "crack the bones" of nearby pedestrians. After the first time police charged him for disturbing the peace, he obtained an FCC license to play his stereo. The next time he was charged, the police were unimpressed with the license and wrote him up anyway.

ELSEWHERE

Have you ever thought that station trading and commodity trading have a lot in common? Here's a transaction to ponder. You may have heard that only months after they announced they were buying WOWO, Fort Wayne, Inner City Broadcasting is selling the station. They got what they wanted--the ability to re-engineer the signal of the 50,000 watt blowtorch so that their other station on 1190 kHz, WLIB, New York, can be on at night. But according to Radio Business Report, it's a sale that will take several steps. First, Inner City must complete the purchase of the combo from Price Communications. They'll then sell the AM to Jacor Communications, who will immediately trade it for Pathfinder Communications WPPT Cincinnati, which is currently in an LMA with Jacor. WOWO-FM, a class A station in Huntington, IN, will be sold to someone else. The net result will be a four-station duopoly in Fort Wayne for Pathfinder--WOWO, CHR WMEE, and country combo WQHK-AM & FM--and a full complement of four owned stations in Cincinnati for Jacor.

In other duopoly news this week, Buckley Broadcasting is doubling up in Bakersfield as it will purchase KOQQ for \$1 million from J & C Equinox, Inc. The station had been silent for a while, but is reported on the air this week doing Westwood One's Adult Rock & Roll. Buckley already owns news-talker KNZR and AC-oldies KLLY, Oildale, CA.

In Oklahoma City, Cat Communications' heritage album-rocker KATT-FM will merge with Desert Communications' adult hits KYIS. They have entered into an immediate LMA. Desert Communications is the radio station operating division of Greyhound Financial.

In Peoria, Kelly Communications announced it has entered into an LMA and will buy Headline News outlet WRED from Peoria Satellite Radio Corp for \$525,000. Kelly owns standards WOAM and country WXCL, and has flipped WRED to CHR and plans to change its call letters to WKZM.

D & F Broadcasting will pick up an instant duopoly in the Sarasota market by buying a combo and a new CP from Wilks-Schwartz Broadcasting. The purchase price of \$5.5 million includes WYNF--a new FM CP in Coral Cove, FL--as well as classical WSPB and oldies WSRZ-FM.

Brill Media is buying country KZMO-FM, Jefferson City, MO, for \$850,000 from Town & Country Communications. It will combo with country KLIK and hot AC KTXV. KZMO (AM), which is currently simulcasting its FM, will remain with Town & Country.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

The Interep Radio store released a study on how the emerging 18-29 demographic represents educated consumer power. The study projects that men and women aged 18-29 will grow from 45 to 47 million by the year 2000, noting that a sizable portion of this demographic may remain single. Other key findings of the study include: Adults 18-29 are more ethnically diverse than the total Adults 18-plus universe. More than one out of every three Adults 18-29 have annual household incomes of \$40,000 or more. Over 43% of Adults 18-29 already own a home. Adults 18-29 are sports enthusiasts. The sporting goods and equipment business must consider Adults 18-29 their most important potential customer. Radio reaches an estimated 97-98% of all Adults 18-29 during a given week with rock-oriented, new age and urban contemporary among their favorite formats. The study called "18-29 Year-Olds Redefine The American Dream" is available from Interep's Research Division at (212) 916-0539.

Capital Cities/ABC, Inc. has put its New England Newspaper Group on the block. It's been building the collection of 74 weekly newspapers in Connecticut, Massachusetts, and Rhode Island since 1979. No word on whether they will sell them as a group or individually.

Another Arbitron convict: a page 5B notice for oldies WAIR, Atlanta, MI, in the Northwest Michigan market. It put out a listener questionnaire that is similar in style and content to Arbitron's diary.

The Radio Advertising Bureau announced the promotion of two RAB department heads to the position of vice president. Andrea "Andy" Rainey to VP of Research and Services and Van Allen to VP-Comptroller.

In the event of a major league baseball strike, place your head between your knees and turn on CBS radio sports to catch Baseball Classics. The show will broadcast classic and dramatic games from the network's 18-year archive. To be hosted by Win Elliot, veteran sportscaster, the program will be available at 1:07 and 8:07 PM, ET on Saturday and 8:07 PM, ET on Sunday. The Sunday show will also feature a pre-game segment on the latest strike-related news, hosted by Jim Hunter.

CBS Americas will produce a 90-minute talk show, *Baseball de Hoy y de Siempre* (*Baseball Then and Now*), hosted by Billy Berroa and Jaime Jarrin, from 8:03- 9:30, ET Sunday. The show will analyze events during the players' strike and will include excerpts of memorable games broadcast in Spanish.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

We're only a month away from the date where station groups can increase the number of stations owned in each band from 18 to 20. On September 16, groups that are at the current limit can file to buy two more stations in each band. Applications filed before the 16th will not be accepted.

The Commission's Field Operations Bureau reports that its San Juan office responded to a complaint by the Cuban government about a pirate radio station broadcasting anti-Castro messages. FCC agents tracked the station to a farm house in rural Puerto Rico identifying itself as "Haciendas Las Carolinas." FCC investigators shut down the station, and sanctions are being considered.

Listeners of KYBG, Denver, CO had been complaining to the station that two other area radio stations were overriding its broadcasts. After station engineers couldn't solve the problem, FCC engineers identified the problem as an "inter-modulation product" created within the receivers. The Commission says many different models and makes of radio receivers were found to produce their own interfering signal from a mix of signals received from several other stations, and the complainants were encouraged to contact the manufacturers.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)

Rex Broadcasting Corp. is "covering the country" by doubling up in Tucson as they're buying their LMA partner, KCRZ, for \$3.5 million from Tucson Community Broadcasting, Inc. Rex owns country combo KCUB and KIIM-FM there. KCRZ has been simulcasting KCUB during the LMA.

In a deal valued at over \$25.5 million, Multi-Market Radio has agreed to acquire Southern Starr Broadcasting Group through a merger that will yield 15 stations in seven markets through ownership or LMA's. Both companies are publicly held on the NASDAQ. Multi-Market will pay \$13.75 cash for Southern Starr's 1.85 million common shares outstanding.

In the Elmira/Corning market, Pro Radio, Inc. will be doubling up as it will buy Panosian Enterprises' country oldies WIQT and country WQIX, both Horseheads, NY, for just over \$1 million. Pro Radio already owns news-talk WCLI and Hot AC WNKI, both Corning, NY.

To help it cover Florida's west coast, Entercom says it will purchase WISP, Holmes Beach (Sarasota) from Norm Alpert for \$3 million. Entercom owns oldies WYUU, Safety Harbor, up the road in the Tampa/St. Petersburg market.

Believe it when you hear kids can be expensive. Children's Broadcasting Corporation suffered a net loss of \$804,998 or \$0.15 per share, during the second quarter of 1994 on revenues of \$946,412. However, that's quite a revenue jump from last year's second quarter of \$185,272. Operating expenses increased from \$594,519 during Q2 '93 to \$1,376,294 in the same quarter of '94. Children's Broadcasting Corp. is traded on the NASDAQ.

If you're a subscriber to the Hartford-New Britain-Middletown or New Haven Arbitron book for Spring '94, you may want to hold up on using those numbers. 24 diaries from zip code 06451 were misassigned to the New Haven metro, instead of the Hartford metro. Arbitron isn't sure if they'll reissue the book. They're assessing the error's impact on the numbers and will announce their decision this week.

THE ROAD, Tribune Entertainment's television and radio syndication series, will be sponsoring a "superconcert" series beginning the week of September 19. WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

A Washington law firm has lost its motion requesting a stay of the effective date of the Commission's new fee schedule. Brown and Schwaninger had argued that the Commission raised the new fees higher than the rules allowed. In denying the motion, the Commission said that the firm had failed to make a sufficient showing to justify extraordinary relief it seeks.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)

Radio & Records reports the Commission is on the move to their new home in a yet-to-be-built office complex in the area known as "The Portals" in southwest Washington D.C. The FCC has been fighting the move for the past three years after the General Services Administration, the government agency responsible for office space, signed a lease for the new space without telling anyone at the Commission.

The NAB, RTNDA, The Media Institute and The Reporters Committee for Freedom of the Press have urged the FCC to reject an effort by a California anti-smoking group to reimpose the Fairness Doctrine on radio and TV broadcasters. The Fairness Doctrine, before it was repealed by the FCC in 1987, required broadcasters to air all sides of controversial public issues. At issue is whether the elimination of fairness doctrine was meant to be applied to ballot issues. The media groups contend it did, citing a decision by the FCC almost three years ago and a decision by a federal appeals court in 1993. The media groups assert the anti-smoking group simply wants the FCC to ignore the federal court decision.

Radio Marti, the U.S. Information Agency's anti-Castro AM station at 1180 kHz in Marathon Key, FL, has changed its tone. It's pleading for Cubans to stay home. In a story on the New York Times News Service, Radio Marti's staff has been scrambling to get news about Clinton's policy changes to Cubans before they decide to leave Cuba. The station has increased its power from 50 kw to 100 kw.

The Commission has adopted a new rule that explicitly states that all documents are considered officially "filed" upon receipt at the location designated by the Commission, not on the date it was postmarked.

Heftel Broadcasting, the publicly-traded Spanish broadcaster, has been really busy this week as it's disclosed it has established two credit facilities with Chase Manhattan Bank as agent worth \$100 million. No doubt this will help finance their recent spending spree, most recently including its duopoly purchase in Dallas/Ft. Worth of Spanish combo KICI (AM), Denton, and KESS, Ft. Worth from Rodriguez Broadcasting. The deal also includes an option to buy Spanish KMRT, Dallas, which Rodriguez operates under an LMA with Granum Communications. Terms of the station purchases were not disclosed. Earlier this year, Heftel also purchased the Spanish Radio Network stations--WQBA-AM & FM Miami (giving them a duopoly there with WAQI-AM & FM); WGLI, Babylon (Long Island), NY; and WADO, New York. Rodriguez will retain Christian AC, KLTU.

The Commission recently cleared the way for these transactions after rejecting a petition to deny the sale that claimed Heftel would control over 50% of the Spanish radio market in Miami. The Commission said the new ownership rules only consider the entire audience and can't consider the ethnic make-up of a market as a separate entity.

The latest duopoly to hit the Youngstown, OH, market will be Zapis Communications' purchase and immediate LMA of rocker WRKU-FM, Grove City, PA from Western Penn. Radio. The price was not disclosed. Zapis recently purchased WHTX, Sharpsville, PA, which is silent. WHTX will reopen its doors from the WRKU-FM studios.

Attention Morton Downey, Jr. affiliates. He's decided to pursue a television career (again) in Chicago this time, the market from which he originates. His syndicator, Major Networks, will discontinue the show on Wednesday, August 31. This makes the third network in recent history to lose Downey. He was on an estimated 20 stations.

The company that recently announced it was buying IDB Communications is spending another \$2.5 billion this week. The Williams Companies, Inc., has signed an agreement to sell its WilTel Network Services division to LDDS Communications. WilTel operates one of four national digital telecomm. networks in the U.S.

The Country Music Association has announced the 1994 Broadcast Awards winners in the large, medium and small market categories. Station of the Year honorees are KNIX/Phoenix, WSIX/Nashville, WQCB/Bangor, ME. Winners in the Broadcast Personality of the Year are Laurie De Young, WPOC/Baltimore; David Hughes, WUSY/Chattanooga and Bob Duchesne, WQCB. All will be recognized on the CMA awards telecast on CBS-TV October 5.

AccuRatings adds Myrtle Beach, Muskegon and Fort Walton Beach beginning with the Fall 1994 survey period. Adding the three new markets brings the service up to nearly 40 subscribing markets.

Modern Rock KDGE, Dallas drops the Stevens & Pruett show after four months. The station picked up the syndicated morning show from KLOL-FM, Houston, ran all the team's bits and schtick but dropped in its own modern rock. Local rumors in Dallas say the move is a precursor to the formation of a duopoly with Bonneville's KZPS. The station has returned to a local morning show which consequently bumped up their Summer Arbitron numbers from a 3.1 to 3.7 and 2.3 to 2.4 in morning drive.

San Francisco's KSFO gets a makeover this week as Capital Cities/ABC's KGO begins its LMA-to-purchase with the station. *Inside Radio* says the new lineup will include the Fabulous Sports Babe and Westwood One's Tom Leykis. This is ABC's second go-round with dual talkers in the San Francisco market as they used to run ABC's Talknet on KGO-FM (now Brown Broadcasting's KKSF). None of the current KSFO programming will be retained, however, they do plan to keep the call letters.

The NAB announced the participants in the "State of the Format" address to be held at the NAB Radio Show. The address will introduce the individual "format fairs" followed by a roundtable discussion on a variety of format-specific topics. Format fair addresses will be delivered by (AC) Mike McVay, McVay Media, (CHR) Alan Burns, Alan Burns & Assoc., (Country) Jay Albright, BP Consulting Group, (HISPANIC) Steve Humphries, HCI, (NEWS/TALK/SPORTS) Rob Balon, Benchmark Co., (OLDIES) Dave Allen, Dave Allen Oldies Consulting., (ROCK) Lee Abrams, ABC Radio Networks, (URBAN) Tony Gray, Gray Communications. This is not your typical radio classifieds were talking about here. Swap-Shop Yo' hails from WHAP in Hopewell, VA, a Richmond suburb, and features the supposedly-from-New Jersey host Joe Mamaglia. The probably-about 45 year-old is described as a "lovely fresh breath of greenhouse gas, mixed with a bad, hokey music bed." Joe, does what at first seems to be a normal show. Callers with something to advertise phone in and Joe repeats the number and thanks them. The show (not originally titled Swap-Shop Yo') has actually been around for about 45 years but Joe's influence since the summer of 1992 has created a cult-like following. Its not so much the advertising but rather what goes on behind and around it. Best described as a cacophony of sounds that Joe explains as..."Yo', de average caller is a dear soul, but not generally duh sort of person who spends large portions of his or her time hangin' out wid' culture vultures, y'know? So I try to expose 'em to some of the seminal notions of western art and esthetics, yo, wid stuff like found art, asymmetrical symmetry, some essential cubist and surrealist approaches to symbolic communication, (adapted to an audio medium)... dis keeps dem hipped to deh great intellectual trends of dis bad century...it also keeps me from getting bored out of my mind and getting a real job, yo!" Joe claims to be applying for an N.E.A. grant for his works of art. With no real expectations of becoming the next most-wanted Julliard music-theory professor but with the knowledge that "as obscure as dis stuff is, some bureaucrat needs to be paying me to do it, yo!". Joe hopes to "expose dese average Americans (duh type uh individual who t'inks white guys turning left at high speed for hours on end while t'ousands cheer) to some high-concept notions while performing a valuable community service. Go Go Yo Joe!

FCC puts fines on hold. The news will affect a case regarding to Jacor's KOA, Denver, which was fined \$2,500 for a contest violation. The forfeiture has been set aside and KOA's petition for reconsideration of the fine has been returned to pending status.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The Commission has remanded to the Administrative Law Judge the proceeding involving the mutually exclusive applications of Thomas W. Lawhorne and CAM Broadcasting, Inc., for a new FM station on 102.1 A at Sylvester, GA. The Commission earlier granted Lawhorne's application and denied CAM's, finding that CAM had failed to make a showing in response to a designated site availability issue. CAM ultimately filed an appeal with the U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals, D.C. Circuit. On December 28, 1993, the court, finding that CAM had adequately satisfied its required showing of site availability, returned the matter to the Commission.

Lawhorne asked the Commission to remand for further hearings on basic qualifying issues previously specified against CAM but on which no hearing was ever held - abuse of process, financial qualifications and misrepresentation.

ELSEWHERE

Duopoly of the week honors go to Bonneville Broadcasting in Dallas as they'll combo their classic rocker KZPS with Edge Broadcasting's modern rocker KDGE, Gainesville, TX. Bonneville pays \$11 million for the station, and will enter into an immediate LMA.

Keymarket's announced it will operate and manage WSPA-AM & FM Spartanburg, SC in a five year LMA agreement with Spartan Radiocasting. Keymarket recently announced an agreement to purchase WFBC-AM & FM, Greenville, SC and WORD (AM), Spartanburg from Multimedia. Keymarket will be allowed to operate the three AM's because the station's signal overlap complies with duopoly rules.

In Salt Lake City, Bountiful Broadcasting's CHR/talk combo KUTQ Bountiful/KTKK, Sandy is buying Golden Bear Broadcasting's CHR KZHT, Provo for \$1.1 million. KZHT had been in an LMA with Devine Media's KBER.

Mostly due to some crediting problems caused by a temporary simulcast and swapped calls of WHKW, Corydon, IN, and WQLL, Louisville, KY, Arbitron has had to reissue the Spring book for Louisville. The resulting changes pushes WDJX-AM out of the book, and WQLL debuts with a 12+ share of 0.6.

Arbitron is also reissuing the Norfolk-Virginia Beach book because CHR WRVQ, Richmond, VA (at 94.5 MHz) got a lot of diary credit that was really supposed to go to AC WJQI, Virginia Beach, VA (at 94.9 MHz).

Don't think for a minute that Infinity Broadcasting's legal department is sitting on its haunches just because the FCC's had a few legal setbacks. According to *Inside Radio*, they're suing Capitol Broadcasting's AC combo WWMX and WSSF Baltimore after they allege the combo faxed a flyer to advertisers and rep firms claiming Infinity's WLIF was having a "Christmas in July Fire Sale" touting \$50 rates on WLIF. The suit is being filed in U.S. District Court and asks for an injunction against using the WLIF call letters and the name of Infinity Broadcasting, as well as \$500,000 in damages.

The Radio Advertising Bureau released the July 1994 local and national spot radio revenue results. Combined local and national spot revenue grew 9% in July 1994 versus its performance in July 1993, while local revenue grew 8% in July, national spot revenue grew 12% for the same month. Year-to-date revenue gains through July remained unchanged from their June showings: Local spot up 11%, with national spot up 12% through the same time period for a combined industry wide growth rate of 11% through July 1994.

The Interep Radio Store and CouponRadio Inc. have received commitments from seven radio stations in the Miami Ft. Lauderdale market to participate in the world's first interactive radio project. WEDR, WTMI, WHYI, WPOW, WAXY, WSHE, and WKIS will be transmitting CouponRadio infomessages from late 1995. These stations will be known nationally as the first radio broadcasters to offer the consumer an innovative radio with these new services and value oriented capabilities. The infomessage scrolls the name of the group and song title while the selection is playing. The listener can then touch a "save" button and look at it later when its more convenient. This procedure will work as a "paperless electronic coupon" by the listener "saving" the coupon message and retrieving it later. For more information call David J. European Journal is a half-hour show which not only covers the day's hard news but explores the Continent's cultural diversity, its music, theater and art. The journal will begin with a five minute international headlines summary from the news desk of Monitor Radio. The feed will begin September 19 for audition and October 3rd for broadcast.
