NBC- 11:30am-12noon EST, Mon thru Fri; RETURN - Truth Or Consequences - LIVE from KRCA-TV(LA), to the net. § Sustaining. § Pkgr- Ralph Edwards Productions (LA); Exec Prod- Ralph Edwards; other production credits not available. § Bob Barker is m.c. for this new weekday version of the stunt show, still based on the old parlor game in which the player must answer questions posed by the quiz-master or pay a forfeit. For the TV version, the forfeit is usually a difficult, essentially humorous stunt, with the successful performance rewarded with cash and other prizes. The show originally debuted over NBC-TV as an evening half-hour on May 18, 1954, with its last show on Sept 28, 1956. In its new version it moves into the revised NBC-TV morning line-up, which is as follows, effective this date: Home, 10-11am EST (moved from 11am-12noon); The Price Is Right, 11-11:30am EST (moved from 10:30-11am); Truth Or Consequences, 11:30am-12noon (new).

Most of the shows on December 28, 29, 30 were listed in last week's report. Changes and additions are included here for the record. Script identifications used are: (O) Original, (A) Adaptation, (SW) Staff-written, and (SD) Staff-directed. Performers are identified as singer(S), dancer(D), comic(C), musician(M). Actors who appear regularly are listed in the premiere cast, then subsequently referred to as "regulars". Live shows are listed in caps in the left column; filmed shows are in upper and lower case letters, underlined.

Generally, only first runs of a film series are listed. Running character series (not anthology), usually staff-written shows, and other programs which use regulars, are listed only when the names of extra actors are available.
