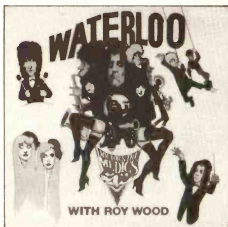

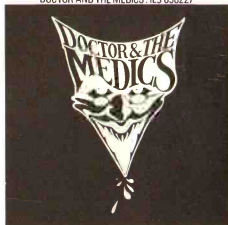

## Capital Radio To Go Public

Capital Radio, Britain's largest independent radio station, is seeking a stock market quotation early in the New Year. This makes it the fourth station (Piccadilly Radio, Radio City and Radio Clyde) are the others but it is the first to go for a full listing.

The company expects to be valued at around 12 million pounds. In the year to September 1985 it made pre-tax profits of nearly one million pounds on turnover of 17.5 million pounds, but the new figures, available in a few weeks, should show "significant" improvement.

Capital has been broadcasting since 1973 when the consortium headed by actor/director Sir Richard Attenborough won the London radio entertainment franchise. Its franchise was renewed for eight years in October, 1984.

## Channel 4 Considers Breaking With ITV

An independent report recently completed in London suggests that Channel 4 could achieve financial independence if its ties with the UK ITV network were severed. The basic idea is that it should sell its own advertising time rather than take, as happens now, a share of the ITV revenue.

At present, Channel 4 is financed by subscription from the ITV companies, set at 17% of the overall net advertising revenue. Though Mrs. Thatcher's government is seen as being

keen to see Channel 4 break with ITV, the network itself believes something important would be lost, in terms of programming freedom if it had to sell its own advertising.

The Independent Broadcasting Authority has made it clear it would be against a break, believing the present system has produced a quality channel producing innovative programmes and able to cater for minorities.

## Greece Prepares For Radio Privatization Industry Remains Sceptical

Athens: Greece could be on its way to justification so far in keeping all radio and tv under state control is that private radio could fall under the sway of "special interest" and that privatization runs counter to Article 15 of the Greek constitution.

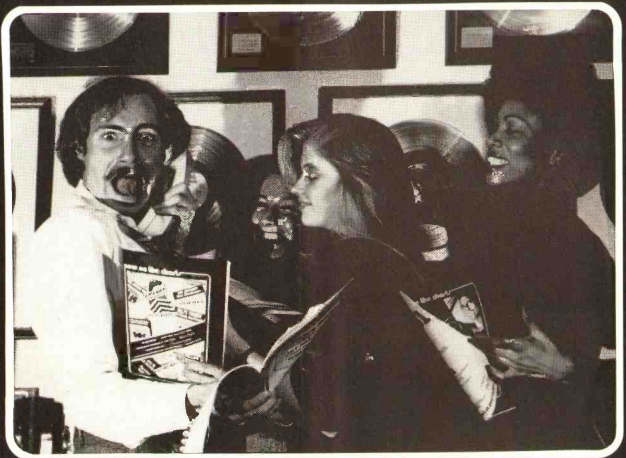

### Good X-Mas Prospects Says BPI

 Sales of singles are still dropping, year total of seven million. But singles were down 7% on 1985 to 16.2 million units, of which nearly a third were in the 12-inch format.  
 "But the general prospect for Christmas sales is very encouraging," says BPI general manager Peter Scapling.

The figures for LPs showed a surprising upturn, up to just over 12 million units (up 13% on the same period of 1985) and up 12% in monetary terms to 31.9 million pounds. But BPI warns the unit improvement shouldn't be seen as having long-term significance. It was a reflection of the strength of new release shipments and of pre-Christmas buying.

The same considerations helped cassette deliveries to the trade go up from 12.1 million in 1985 to 17.5 million, a rise of 44% — and in monetary terms up 35% to 36.4 million pounds. But BPI says: "In this sector there is a strong underlying growth rate."

CD deliveries were 1.8 million units in the quarter, on target for a full-

## French 'Muzak' Co. Expands To Us

French background music company Groupe Mood, biggest in its field in France, has opened up a US subsidiary, Tabata Music Inc., looking to expand its 5,000-title music library and setting up deals with American labels and publishers.

The group comprises six related companies and has an 80% share of the French background music market, with 22,000 subscribers and a weekly "audience" of over 30 million. Mostly its service is used in hotels, restaurants and supermarkets. Its carriers are Fideipac cartridges, 8-tracks, cassettes, FM radio, satellite and cable and new giant videowalls with up to 64 monitors.

Through its 25 years in the business, Tabata Music's emphasis has been on reaching young people. It cut out elevator music and developed "foreground" music programmes including chart hits at a time long before that format was widely adopted.

Says Tabata's Herve Louche: "We are an important element in record promotion, reaching a very wide audience all hours of the day and night and of all ages. And we reach them in the shops at the point of purchase. We generate income for publishers and songwriters in rights fees, but we also have a strong influence in breaking new artists and titles."

## Laser Back On The Air?

Ppp pirate radio station Laser is back in position in the North Sea, but its plan for long-term full-scale broadcasting is likely to be threatened or scuppered by the Department of Trade and Industry in London.

The Communicator, the stations 489-ton ship base, was forced to seek shelter in Harwich, Essex, a year ago after the DTI had blocked its supply runs from the mainland. Cost of the campaign was said to be around £20,000 a month.

Though the DTI did not force fellow pirate broadcaster Caroline off the air, the Laser boat was impounded and put up for auction by the Admiralty in London. It was bought by an Essex company, which re-sold it, and the authorities could do nothing as it finally set sail again a week or so later. The former survey ship had apparently given its destination as Gibraltar.

In fact, it dropped anchor while work on its aerial was completed, then sailed on to its old anchorage close to the Caroline ship Ross Revenge. Laser plans to use either the 576 or 531 frequency. Its old frequency 558 was snapped up by Caroline when Laser closed.

Laser has a team of US disc jockeys and the latest equipment. The station's broadcast programme plan, with "never more than a minute between records," holds good. But the DTI insists it will use all its powers to close the station down again. It is, they say, just a matter of time.

points out that the Netherlands is the sixth member state of the European Economic Community in which the government has either introduced or shown an intention to introduce a private copying royalty. One is already in force in Germany, France and Portugal, while Spain and the UK are preparing legislation to this end. However the British government has not included a planned new Copyright Act in parliamentary schedules for the year ahead.

The EEC Commission is in the final stages of preparing its own proposals on the private copying issue. Dutch action is seen as likely to influence the Commission's decision on whether to recommend a royalty throughout the 12 member states.

## Europa TV: New Hope

West Nally Bids For Satellite

Following the announcement that Europa TV ceased broadcasting November 27, West Nally, the world's largest sports sponsoring group headed by David Cicliera, has proposed a bid of 100 million Swiss francs for Europa TV. The news has given renewed hope to the remaining four consortium partners (German ARD, Portuguese RPT, Irish RTE and Italian RAI, but excluding Dutch NOS) who are at this week gathering in Paris for a secret meeting to discuss the possible continuation of the satellite. The four partners are

blaming NOS for financial mismanagement. Europa's debts have amounted to 11.3 million guilders and NOS, the Dutch general broadcasting organisation that supplied the technical facilities, refused to further wait for the debts to be paid. Insiders expect debts to be even higher, exceeding 25 million guilders. Europa TV still has to pay the rental of the ECS-satellite transponder, the contract of which only ends February next year.

## French Industry Fights For TM6

Plea For National Music Network

French record companies, EMI and Flarensax among them, have protested to the French government over its planned closure of the year-old commercial music station TM6. All sectors of the industry are united in a campaign to retain a national music-based network at all costs. They point to the already difficult position of French record production, which accounts for 3% of the country's gross national product but has been hard hit by a slump in tape/disk

sales in recent years - and by the hefty 3% tax slapped on pre-recorded music software. The record industry argues that closing down the TV6 network will deprive it of substantial revenue from the screening of video clips, and also open up great prospects for foreign-based rivals like Sky Channel and Music Box/Super Channel. At the heart of the matter is whether a music television channel is

## Superchannel Announces Programming

As of February 1 1987 the British satellite service Superchannel will start transmitting its programmes throughout Europe. The 24 hour schedule will be the emphasis on drama, amusement, comedies, and music will be watched in 12 European countries by 5.3 million people. The new channel will use the satellite transponder of Musicbox and

negotiations are currently going on with the cable operators to allow the new channel to use the Musicbox channel. Out of the 24 hours, Musicbox will supply 8 hours of (music) programmes, while the ITV companies (shareholders of the new venture) and the BBC both take 5 hours. The rest will be either own productions or third party deals.

# Richenel Moves From Indie To Major

## Dutch Artist Combines Striking Image With Pop Appeal

Richenel is a Dutch artist with a truly striking image where both male and female features are gracefully blended. Building up a certain name in the Amsterdam disco and art scene with his 'body art,' Richenel released his first single on the Dutch independent Megadisc entitled 'L'Esclave Endormi.' This exalted single with tormented, opera-like vocals was a New Talent tip in M&M issue 2 of this year. Although the single was maybe a bit too eccentric for the usuals radio formats, it picked up considerable attention by European press and was, through its release on the UK indie 4AD, quite a good seller in the English independent charts. Now, a year later, Richenel changed his sound into a more accessible one and signed with a major, CBS.

immediately, even before the release of the single, set up recordings for a promotional video. The new single, 'Dance Around The World', was released mid November and soon built up strong media reactions in Holland. Also on international level, CBS affiliates reacted likewise; definite releases are planned for France, Sweden, Germany, Belgium and Portugal and it is to be expected that other countries will follow suit. At press time, Richenel was promoting his single on Music Box and Sky Channel, where the video will also go into rotation.

Eric van Tijn and Jochem Fluitsma (of Mai Tai

fame) both produced and wrote the single and with its colourful arrangements and the catchy and danceable drive, a definite tip for cross-over. ## LOCAL TALENT TO WATCH

### Clan Of Xymox - Medusa- 4AD

Dutch fiveome exclusively signed to UK indie 4AD. The band built up a good name in the English independent charts with their first album 'Xymox', selling 80,000 copies worldwide (20,000 in the UK alone). Their new album 'Medusa' should be able to build on their previous success and will be released by Virgin on the continent, excluding Benelux (Megadisc). The band's sleeve contains a minimum of information, probably in line with the band's image and style: highly introspective and moody music with vocals embedded in layer upon layer of misty synthesizers.



### Centerfold - Man's Ruin - Red Bulllet

Dutch female trio whose sexy image has been successfully exploited in the European media. Holland seems to be fond of female girts, and Centerfold follows in the footsteps of acts like Star Sisters, Dolly Dots and Mai Tai. If they can become as successful as the latter remains doubtful, though the sophisticated mix of slick and stirring disco certainly has appeal. The album contains the hitsingles 'Dictator', 'Up And Coming' and the current single 'Radar Love', a cover of the Golden Earring hit. Also check out 'Note After Note', a teasingly and addictive dance track.



By all accounts, Elton John went down very well in Australia, not least with the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra who toured with him. He was awarded their first ever honorary life membership. Elton was equally enamoured with the orchestra and was quoted as saying that his time with them was "The only love affair I have ever had where I didn't actually go to bed with anybody!" \*

And this current tour may be the last time he goes for that much-publicised over the top image - we hear that he plans to auction off his extravagant clothing for charity early next year and then play a different type of concert in London. In fact he admitted in a recent interview that he'd love to make a solo piano album, so maybe that's his next move. But if his more subdued period back in '79 is anything to go by, it'll just be another stage in his ever-changing career. \* Paul McCartney topped the bill at the Royal Variety Show last week, no less than 23 years after he last played the event along with the rest of the Fab Four. He sang 'Only

Love Remains' which has just been rush-released from the 'Press To Play' album after the spectacular failure of 'Pretty Little Head', which didn't even trouble the Top 75. Taking a leaf out of Rock Over London's book, the British Council is taking an exhibition round the world to promote the best British music. Pop! British Music In The Eighties will go to 35 countries over a five-year period, playing music, displaying slide shows (slide shows? ah, these technical advances) of sleeve designs and featuring CD listening booths. The exhibition will be updated annually. \* Our eyewitness at El-

vis Costello's 'Spectacular Spinning Slingbook' show at London's Royalty Theatre reports that the spinning wheel didn't land on anything from any of Elvis' last three albums, with the result that it felt just like a 1982 Costello gig. Those members of the audience who were invited to spin the wheel were then asked/told to get on stage in a curious sort of cubicle affair and dance (or else). Elvis was in good form, though, and so were the Attractions at this particular date: he showed his usual penchant for oddball cover versions, like 'Ferry Cross The Mersey', 'Twist And Shout', Dusty Springfield's 'I Just Don't Know What To Do

With Myself' and Prince's 'Pop Life' and to top it off, he was joined on stage by a very casual Nick Lowe (complete with a newspaper in his back pocket) for the old Brinsley Schwarz classic 'What's So Funny 'Bout Peace, Love And Understanding' \*

Elvis' ever-changing line-up continues to baffle the fans: three of his Royal Albert Hall dates will feature The Attractions while for the other three concerts, he'll be backed by The Confederates. This is the group of musicians who appeared on 'King Of America' and they include Eric Clapton's ex-drummer Jim Keltner. After London, Elvis will take this lot on tour with him round the UK. \* The future of the Alarm looks increasingly precarious. News reaches us this week that Mike Peters and Eddie MacDonald are battling it out against the other half of the band - Dave Sharp and Nigel T维斯. It seems they can't agree on how the band should be managed. Despite a continued faithful following, their lack of major chart honours in '86 is hardly encouraging for the future. \* BBC Radio 1 has been attacked for its lack of commitment to the 'Live-In World' record which was recently played on Rock Over London. The fund-raising single and an accompanying double album were produced by the Anti-Hero Project and a host of stars including Paul McCartney, Howard Jones, Eurythmics, Holly Johnson, Nik Kershaw, John Parr and The Thompson

## UK Venue Agrees On Video Payment

by Peter Jones

Video Cafe, a 500-capacity site operating in central London's Oxford Circus with a 1.5 million pound turnover annually, is finally to pay for videotape use, following legal action by Video Performance Ltd. (VPL), the UK record industry licensing and collection agency for video broadcasts.

Says VPL consultant director Roger Drage: "This is a really big step forward in our bid to stamp out unauthorized showing of music videos. We have 127 other cases pending against premises which continue to resist attempts to license them. Many others refuse to apply for a license. We'll not hesitate to enforce

our rights."

Video Cafe, sited just along Argyl Street from the London Palladium, settled out of court, has been granted a license and is paying VPL's legal costs. This follows a High Court injunction restraining the Video Cafe from showing music videos in public without a license.

David Williams, Video Cafe managing director, now plans to raise two million pounds to launch new Video Cafes in the UK and abroad. A second London location is planned, and a Swedish company has reportedly signed to franchise more than 20.

## Jazz Federation Bemoans Czech Arrests

The International Jazz Federation is expressing "deep concern" over the arrest and imprisonment of six members of the jazz section of the Czech Musicians' Union on charges of illegal trading.

These charges relate to the continued selling of the jazz section's cultural publications to its own members during the year that followed the summary abolition of the section by the Czech authorities.

Charles Alexander, president of the IJF, says the organization is not in a position to comment on matters of law in Czechoslovakia but is concerned about extreme measures adopted against people whose activities are slanted toward a wider appreciation of culture and the arts. And he adds there is no evidence that the people arrested, already in prison for more than three months, made any financial gain from their activities.

that moved Panandrou and other officials to start considering the trend, especially since experts predict satellite television will become a reality in Greece within next year.

The man who started Channel 15 and still runs it, Roussos Koundourous, has said he does not believe the draft bill will actually change anything. He predicts that instead of the national government, it will be local governments who will control "private" radio.

Record executives say they have mixed feelings about the new signs that private radio will appear here. Most do not believe it will amount to much, but the potential for higher record sales is apparent.

Anything not directly under state control is seen as eventually benefiting the marketplace already beleaguered by a slump lasting several years - and threatened now by a whopping 36 percent value-added tax to take effect on 1 January.

commercially viable in France. Des-

pite the injection of around \$1 million worth of publicity, TV6 has not yet built a large audience. Programming changes mean that movies replace a large part of the vidclip output, now limited to between five and eight hours daily.

Programme director Patrice Blanc-Francand has said that "if TV6 is to stay a music-based service, it has to reach a much broader age group than initially thought: those between 10 and 45, not just the teenagers."

Prime minister Jacques Chirac says he notes the desire to see a musical network maintained, but adds "this concept can be applied to a regional service."

It's thought the government feels that music and French music product should be represented on general entertainment channels, not on a narrowly-based specialist station.

## Capitol/EMI Commissions Third CD Plant

Bhaskar Menon, Chairman and Chief Executive, EMI Music worldwide, has announced the commissioning of Capitol/EMI's first compact disc manufacturing plant in the US, located in Jacksonville, Illinois. The annual capacity of the plant is expected to be around 7 million CDs and 25 million cassettes.

EMI already operates two CD facilities, one commissioned in 1982 by Toshiba/EMI in Japan and the European plant in Swindon, UK. The Jacksonville plant would bring the total

three plants on three different continents.

Comments Bhaskar Menon: "We have a major commitment to the CD carrier which is gaining accelerated market acceptance throughout the world. Our substantial investment in manufacturing capacity makes it possible now to offer consumers the marvel of digital sound on a wide selection of repertoire from EMI Music's distinguished roster of current artists and from our rich catalogues."

6 months.

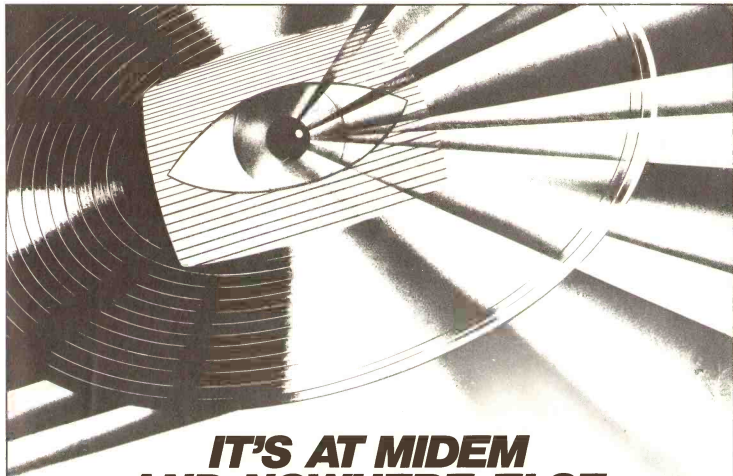
In the meantime, the decrees concerning the cable will be published and the financial dossier will be re-examined. The first cable network should have been operational September 1 of this year but the green light had been refused by the now defunct Haute Autorite.

For three months the company was therefore profligate, suffering costs of 4 million francs which were covered by a publicity campaign, with 1,800 poster spots reserved in Paris which had to be cancelled. What is worse, the publicity allocations plan-

ned a long time in advance are now unavailable.

Fifteen channels have been proposed for the 13th, 14th and 15th districts in Paris for a sum of 140 francs per month, and further districts will be connected in the near future. Thanks to the cable, the households will be able to receive as well as the six French channels, seven foreign ones, three of these in English, one local one and one for the young. Two further channels will be operational in January 1987.

It is expected that 1.3 million connections will be installed in the capital by 1992, due to an estimated 200,000 connections annually, making of Paris a truly European city.

European industry is preparing for the Christmas season which is clearly discernable by watching the European charts. Although there is no real lack of superstar product, things are slowing down and the European Airplay Top 50 only shows its first entry at 38 (Elton John & Cliff Richard's Slow Rivers). The usual flood of Christmas releases will not remain unnoticed and will have its influence on the European charts as well. Especially in the UK, December charts are completely ruled by Christmas type records. Some of them even lead a life of their own into the next year like Band Aid's *Do They Know It's Christmas*, and Wham's *Last Christmas*. This year there are some contenders as well: Epic UK re-released Wham's 1984 hit *Last Christmas* coupled with their farewell single *Where Did Your Heart Go* (a single that has so far failed to enter the Hot 100).

Elaine Page comes up with *Walking In The Air* from her 'Christmas' album, a song that was a hit last year by Aled Jones.

Just like last year (at least in the Benelux) Bruce Springsteen's *My Hometown* is out and backed with the 1975 live recording of *Santa Claus Is Comin' To Town*.

Another re-release by Epic UK for Shakin' Stevens' *Merry Christmas Everyone*, a Dave Edmunds produced 'kirkdoop' solo seasonal single.

For the 13th time Slade re-issue their 1973 hit *Merry Xmas Everybody*. Other Christmas singles by Sheena Easton (*Christmas All Over The World*), Greg Lake (re-issue of the 1975 *Father Christmas*), Splitting Image's *Santa Claus Is On The Dole* and last but not least Bruce Springsteen's b-side of the 'War'-single, *Merry Christmas Baby*.

In a related vein, the UK re-issue of *The Power Of Love* by Jennifer Rush and the Housemartins' acappella version of the Isley Jasper Isley hit *Caravan Of Love*, could be seasonal highlights as well.

The new Madonna single *Open Your Heart* is a remix version of that track from the 'True Blue' album and already the fourth single taken from that lp. The originally planned 6-track Madonna dance lp coinciding with the Christmas season has been so far so retail can purely concentrate on the seasonal sales of 'True Blue'. So far all Madonna singles of that album went to no. 1 of all Euro-

pean Hot 100 singles and with the explicit video backing up this release the same thing might happen with this one.

James Brown's latest *How Do You Stop* is quite a change compared to his earlier releases this year: Not the usual dance electricity but a heartfelt ballad that, again, nicely fits in with the Xmas season.

In the Hot 100 Singles hardly any new entries and only in the top 10 some changes. Europe again tops the Hot 100 for the second week, although the difference in sales points with Berlin is still marginal (the latter stayed four consecutive weeks at the top of the Hot 100). Coinciding with the move of Spandau Ballet's *Through The Barricades* album in the Hot 100 Albums, the

title track makes a good jump as well: 6-14. Also new in the Top 10 is FGTH's *Warriors*, in its third week zooming straight into Top 10 (9-19).

Although Bruce Springsteen's *Har* doesn't really fit in with the sounds normally delivered during the christmas season, the single does exceptionally well: in its second week moving up from 21 to 13. If the 5-LP set manages to pick up seasonal sales, the single will get a boost as well and might enter 'Top 10' next week.

A very good, somewhat unexpected, jump for Def Jam artist Oran "Juice" Jones: 14-75. Levi 501 ad star Nick Kamen crosses over to the continent with *Each Time* now also charting in Italy and Belgium (21-43).

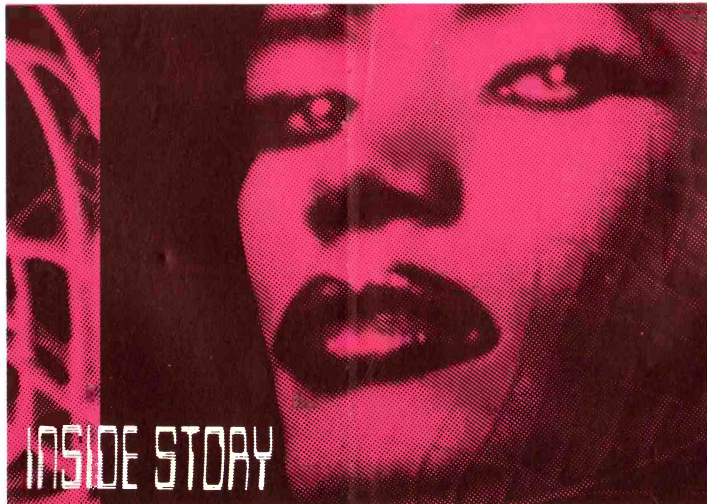

# Highlights

## UNITED KINGDOM

The "Final Countdown" has made it in the UK. Europe is the new no. 1. This makes them the third continental artists of this year to top the English charts. The first was A-Ha's "The Sun Always Shines" (although this was an English production) and the second was Falco's "Rock Me Amadeus". Europe is followed by Berlin and Erasure (coming from 7). While Bruce Springsteen's *War* rises from 27 to 18 his live album drops from 11 to 19. More good news for Roger Whittaker & Des O'Connor (*The Slow Boat Song*) (10-17). Oran "Juice" Jones (12-25), Communards (14-26) and Gregory Abbott (15-33). Highest new entry for *The Housemartins'* acappella version of the Isley Jasper Isley song, *Caravan Of Love*. Other entries are A-Ha with *Cry Wolf*, Status Quo's *Dreamin'*, Go Go Loretta with *You Can Dance*, Curtis Hairston with *Chillin' Out* and the Christmas song from Spitting Image called *Santa Claus Is On The Dole*.

## GERMANY

Stacy Young is still on top, followed by Pet Shop Boys and Cameo (coming from 5). Three excellent additions to the top 10 this week, at 4 are Bangles (coming from 14, which makes them good contenders for next week's top 3), at 9 is Trio frontman Stephan Remmler (coming from 20) and shooting up to no. 10 are Frankie Goes To Hollywood coming from 57! Other moves worth mentioning are for Kool & The Gang (17-25), Peter Gabriel & Kate Bush (27-35) (Kate Bush's album is also highest entry in the album charts) and Paul Hardcastle's tune of Top Of The Pops *The Wizard* (51-69). Highest new entry for Spandau Ballet (in at 26) (Their album entered at 47). Other entries for Oran "Juice" Jones' *The Rain*, Italian duo Al Bano & Romina Power with *Sempre Sempre*, Kate Bush and Nena's new one called *Monsieur* (they have also just released a new album called "Eisbrecher").

## FRANCE

No changes in the top 3 this week. Europe remain for the fourth week on top followed by CBS signed Julie Pietri and Jeanne Mas. Two new additions to the top 10 this week: Bibie moves with *J'Heux Pas L'Savoir* from 11 to 8 and Madonna's *True Blue*, is, after a slow start, approaching the top,

moving from 18 to 10. Two other possible contenders for next week's top 10 are A-Ha's *I've Been Losing You* (22-36) and Communards' *Don't Leave Me This Way* (20-26). Ex-Plastics/Disciples Of Soul member Jean Beauvoir is also climbing up the charts; he moves from 48 to 28 with *Peel The Heat*. New entries this week for Michel Sardou with *Musulmans*, Marc Valore with *Bascule Avec Moi* and Wham!'s *Where Did Your Heart Go?* A re-entry at no. 36 for Depeche Mode's *A Question Of Time*.

## HOLLAND

Finally a new no. 1 in Holland, the Bangles have succeeded in replacing the five-week chart topper Communards. In third position is Paul Simon. Commodores and Pet Shop Boys are both new additions to the top 10, rising respectively from 10 to 8 and from 17 to 10. Good moves for Spandau Ballet (14-21), Bruce Springsteen (17-26), Europe's newest *Rock The Night* and Peter Gabriel & Kate Bush. Another good move is for dutch popular TV presenter Henny Huisman with *Later Als Je Groot Bent*. This song is the tune to a programme in which children and adults imitate international artists. Dutch artists like Gerard Joling, George Daves and Rene Schumann were discovered after they had participated in this show. A new entry for M.C. Miker "G" & Deejay Sven at no. 34 with the rap version of Kool & The Gang's "Celebration" called *Celebration Rap*. Worth mentioning is that Kool & The Gang themselves entered at 35 with *Victory*. More entries for FTTH Stranglers and Huey Lewis' newest *Hip To Be Square*.

## BELGIUM

Already 11 weeks in the charts of which two weeks at no. 1 are Communards, followed by Berlin and Eurovision songcontest winner Sandra Kim (*Tokyo Boy*) who comes from 14. This week there is a small Dutch invasion in Belgium. Dutch duo M.C. Miker "G" & Deejay Sven have highest entry at 18 with their rap version of Kool & The Gang's Celebration (which could be the first step to conquering Europe once again), with other Dutch entries for Zanenens Zander, Naim and Andre Hazes, two singers with typical Dutch "sentimental" ballads. More entries for Niagara's newest called *Je Dais M'En Aller*, Front 242 (*Quite Un-*

usual), Eurythmics and Nick Kamen. Remarkable jump for Jean Jacques Goldman (25-30), Europe (24-37) (*Rock The Night*) and Pet Shop Boys (27-36).

## IRELAND

Europe moves from 5 to 1 in only their third week, replacing the four week chart topper Berlin who are now in second position. At three is WEA signed Nick Kamen (coming from 7). Storming up the charts is Bruce Springsteen's *War* (4-20). (Nick Kamen is the only non CBS production in this top 4). Entries for Communards' *So Cold The Night* (in at 13), Erasure, Alison Moyet, Cliff Richard & Sarah Brightman (Cliff is also in a duet single with Elton John called "Slow Rivers"), The Damned (*Anything*), A-Ha and Cutting Crew (*I've Been In Love Before*).

## ITALY

Although the no. 1 is still the same (Duran Duran), there are a lot of changes in the Italian hit parade and it will be no easy task for them to stick at the top because at no. 2 are Spandau Ballet storming up the charts, coming from 17. At 3 are M.C. Miker "G" & Deejay Sven. Straight in at no. 10 is Tina Turner's *Two People*. 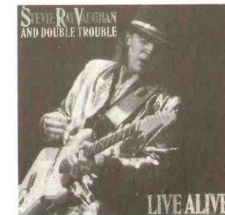

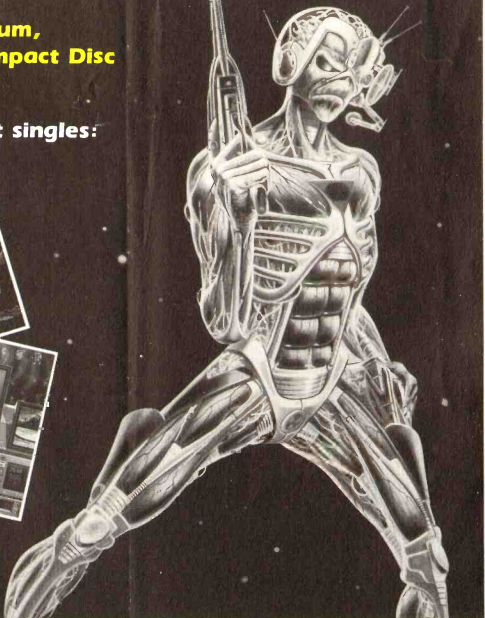
