UK Group To Buy Into French Radio

Paris - The British communications group, Pan European Holding Company (PEHC), is negotiating for a majority stake in the French Pacific FM radio network which has 56 franchised stations in France.

Pacific FM has suffered financial losses since its launch in Paris a year ago. The station's owners, audiovisual group Lili Productions and France Media Communications, are keen to sell.

Although the law allows EEC companies to own a majority share in a French station, the CNCL (National Commission For Communications & Freedom) must also give their stamp of approval. The CNCL has imposed certain conditions on the sale: the station must remain in the French language and 48% of its capital should be opened to French shareholders within

six months.

However, Michel Garnier, Programme Director at Pacific, is confident that the CNCL will authorise the sale. "The British won't change the programme side of the station, but they will improve the commerciality by making it more efficient," says Garnier. ■

US To Move Into UK Radio?

London - A top-level American radio delegation is to visit the UK at the end of September for two days of discussions with representatives from nine commercial (ILR) stations and Virgin's Radio Radio.

Companies outside the EEC are not allowed to own UK broadcasting franchises. But evidence is growing that US media corporations see the proposed deregulation as the go-ahead for a move into British broadcasting.

For US companies to

buy existing ILR stations would be very expensive - it would be much cheaper to start new stations with the low numbers of staff typical of US radio.

Among the US delegation are Alan Box, President of EX Communications; Rick Sklar, President of Sklar Communications; and Allen Shaw, President of Beasley Broadcast Group. A government spokesman will talk about the future of British radio and the proposed expansion from 46 to over 400 stations. ■

PETAR Results Announced

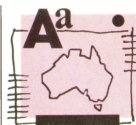
Amsterdam - The results of the long-awaited second PETAR survey (Pan European Television Audience Research) were announced at simultaneous press conferences in Amsterdam, Frankfurt, London and Stockholm on August 23. The survey is described by

one member of the PETAR committee, Mike Whittington, as "a new, improved, non-biased and better calibre survey". The survey was conducted in 11 European countries.

The survey found that a total of 85 channels are received in cable households, 13 of which are commercial satellite stations.

The number of people who watch commercial satellite stations on a daily basis is 7.3 million. Some 16.8 million watch at least once a week and 22.8 million watch at least one commercial satellite channel once a month.

Commercial satellite stations attract 16% of all TV viewers - a figure which Bruce Roberts of the PETAR Technical Committee pointed out was "remarkably constant" compared to last year. ■

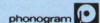

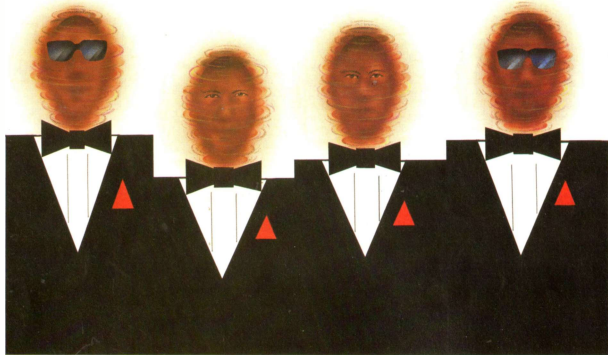

Enigma Signs With Virgin

London - Virgin Records in the UK has struck a deal with the American independent Enigma to manufacture and distribute all the company's new product in the UK and parts of Europe (see Extra! issue 34).

Enigma discovered many acts which later signed to major companies: Motley Crue (now Elektra), Berlin (Geffen) and Poison (Capitol). The first releases on Enigma/Virgin will be new albums from: Christian heavy metal band Stryper (*In God We*

Trust); trash metal band Death Angel (*Frolic Through The Park*); Devo's *Total Devo* (see Previews on page 13); and New York-based quartet The Smithereens with *Green Thoughts*.

Virgin UK will handle all of Enigma's international exploitation for Europe excluding Scandinavia (Sone), Italy (CGD) and Spain (DRO International). This means that Enigma's former European office in Amsterdam, set up in April 1986 and headed by General Manager Andre Otto,

will be disbanded. Otto's future plans are not yet known.

"Virgin is exactly the sort of company we have wanted to align ourselves with," says William Hein, Chairman Enigma Entertainment Corporation. "We expect a significant increase in European sales and exposure as a direct result of our Virgin affiliation." ■

Schulze Criticises MPA/STEMRA

Munich - The deal recently agreed between the UK Music Publishers' Association (MPA) and Dutch mechanical copyright society STEMRA (see Music & Media issue 24) has been strongly criticised by Erich Schulze, head of Germany's copyright society GEMA.

The agreement provides for royalty payment to be made in the country of sale for those sound carriers manufactured outside the country of sale and sold outside the country of manufacture.

Schulze refuses to believe that the deal could be a blueprint for licensing of mechanical royalties

in the single European market aimed for 1992.

"It is not a model for the single market," he says. "It represents instead a specifically British formula which will last only as long as the statutory licence subsists in the UK." And that licence will be abolished when the upcoming UK Copyright Bill becomes law.

He also rejects claims by MPA officials that the agreement will speed up accounting and payment of commission rates - or, indeed, that it is a central licensing system than a central accounting system. ■

Distronics Shake-Up

London - Roger Richmond-Smith, Chief Executive Officer of the world's third largest CD manufacturer Distronics, has resigned. The move coincides with the company's recent decision to move operational headquarters from Melbourne to New York.

Richmond-Smith is to take over a new project for Distronics's holding company Quatro. Details are not yet available, but the new enterprise is outside the field of Quatro's existing film, video and CD production businesses.

One of the controlling shareholders of Quatro, Peter Massey, is running Distronics until a successor is announced. Although Massey admits Richmond-Smith was "not keen" to move to New York, he says the new appointment is a happy coincidence.

Massey says it was "no longer sensible" to have the company's head office in Melbourne because the company is not expanding in Australia. Distronics's London office is also to be relocated; the 10 or so staff, headed by Director of Operations/Senior Regional Executive Europe Peter Colby, are to move to premises in Hammersmith to be closer to the music industry. ■

RADIO RAP

Both London's Capital Radio and the newly extended Capital Gold service have started to broadcast their Sunday breakfast programme one hour earlier. Neil Fox and Tony Blackburn, now begin at 06:00 hours. The reason? According to a Capital spokesman,

"people tend to get up earlier on Saturdays to get things done".

Talking of Capital Radio, the station's purse is filling up nicely. The station has just signed a lucrative deal worth over £ 750,000, thanks to a sponsorship and advertising package from the London Car Telephone Company. This is one of the big-



gest sponsorship deals in Capital's history. A disagreement is brewing at German state broadcaster Radio Bremen. The station has announced it is to cancel its youth show 'Rizz' for financial reasons. The Managing Director Karl-Heinz Klostermeier and Station Manager Karola Sommerer have been unable to reach an agreement as to when the cost cutting should begin. While Klostermeier favours immediate cuts in the youth programme, Sommerer is fighting for a later start.

Radio Gong's mega hit parade (see page 7) will overtake the previous German record set by *Ries 2* in Berlin when the station played 1001 hits in 87 hours.

StarSat, Germany's first private satellite radio station has just started broadcasting on Hamburg's cable network. The Munich-based station now serves seven metropolitan areas, beaming down from the ECS F1 satellite.

READ ALL ABOUT IT

A delegation from the environmental group Greenpeace in the UK is off to the USSR this week to finalise plans for a double LP which will feature the best tracks of U2, Dire Straits, Peter Gabriel, John Cougar Mellencamp, Bryan Adams, the Pretenders and others. The album will be manufactured in the USSR and released on both sides of the Iron Curtain early next year. State-controlled label Melodia expect to sell five million copies within days of release. Proceeds will go to Greenpeace.

Speculation that the huge Jean-Michel Jarre concert scheduled for London's Docklands on September 24 could be cancelled is just that - idle speculation. David Heartfield, Marketing Dir. of RGE who is promoting the event, admits that the local authorities have not yet granted an entertainment licence for the concert, but says this is not unusual. "We have been working through a list of conditions for 12 months and will carry on doing so - probably right up to the day before the event. Yes, there are some problems but there are always problems with every concert." It seems that it's only the press who have been getting "icky" - tickets for the 100,000 capacity event are almost sold out.

Who will take over Roger Richmond-Smith's job as head of CD manufacturer Distronics (see page 3)? According to inside sources, it will be someone from outside the industry. Could it also be someone already based in New York, where Distronics has established its new HQ in the Chrysler building? A self-confessed fan of all things Australian, Richmond-Smith's new appointment with Quatro (which means he can stay in Melbourne) is indeed a "happy coincidence".

Ever optimistic, the press department of Germany's Eureka TV says it sees "a promising future" for the project despite a number of recent setbacks - including the departure of their own press spokesman Claus Happel Heiner Weisking. MD and 25% shareholder in Eureka has left the company and sold his shares to Gerhard Ackermann, who is now sole owner. But there is still no sight of a deal with either of Media's Mighty M's - Maxwell and Murdoch - although both are said to be interested. Eureka needs to raise DM 50 million but can expect only 19 million in advertising revenue. A.D.

Euro TV Advertisers Fund Study

London - A group of influential members of the European advertising industry are to fund a £400,000 emergency study into the likely consequences of a draft Council Of Europe convention on broadcasting.

The advertisers claim that the convention would require far-reaching and highly damaging structural changes to the pattern of TV advertising in some territories, notably the UK.

The study will be carried out by London-based consultants Bob, Allen & Hamilton. The

advertisers are principally worried by proposals which effecting- ively seek to replace commercials within programmes with extended blocks of advertising between them.

It would still be possible to interrupt long-form programming such as films and mini-series with advertising, but only once every 45 minutes.

Among those likely to be hardest hit would be the UK's independent Television (ITV) companies who sell a large proportion of their advertising in the

breaks within programmes. The satellite services such as Sky and Super Channel, who are already suffering from slow advertising revenues, would also be affected.

Douglas, the British Home Secretary, recently indicated that he would refuse to sign the convention in its present form, but the only other members of the 21-nation Council Of Europe who have voiced their opposition to the proposals are Ireland and Luxembourg. ■

Amnesty Rights Announced

London - Radio Vision, the international distributor of television music programmes, has won the worldwide TV rights to the Amnesty International tour.

The 20-city tour, which features Bruce Springsteen, Tracy Chapman, Sting, Peter Gabriel and Youssou N'Dour, opened in London's Wembley Stadium on September 2. It will be filmed in Buenos Aires on October 15 for transmission on December 10 - the anniversary of the Declaration Of Human Rights.

Radio Vision's Managing Director, Simon Woodroffe, says the company has already received enquiries to carry the show from France, Spain, Italy, the UK, several African countries, Israel and the US. He would not say how much the deal was worth. ■

UK DJs To Be Paid More

In two years time, most radio stations in the UK will be paying their star DJs at least £30,000 a year, says Ralph Bernum, Managing Director of GWR, one of Britain's fastest growing radio groups.

"There is a better market for people with talent now than ever before. Presenters can more or less dictate their terms," says Bernum who is currently looking to replace over 800 applications to replace staff emptied away by big money offers. A typical salary for a senior presenter on a medium to

large station is now between £18,000 and £25,000 a year.

Many feel the problem lies with commercial radio's lack of training facilities. This will become more serious as the commercial system expands, says former National Broadcasting School expert John Russell. Bernum: "What we really need to be doing is finding more people of the class of national presenters. The trouble is they're working in such a narrow format that it restricts their talents" ■

Bigger Role For Locals

Local radio and regional television are playing an increasing role in people's lives. A new British lifestyle just published by the Mintel organisation says that people are also more interested in regional issues as a result of the growth of local broadcasting, says the study.

Evidence from European

sources suggests that the trend is not confined to the UK. Italian television has recently reduced its amount of bought-in music programming from the US and elsewhere. At the same time, some record companies have been reporting a significant growth in the demand for domestic product, especially in Germany. ■

Radio Signal Celebrates

Signal Radio in Stoke On Trent is celebrating its fifth birthday on September 5 with a week-long programme of concerts, competitions and live broadcasts. John Evington, Signal's Senior Programme Executive: "We are going to have lots of concerts covering a wide range of music. These will include a big band

concert, and an open air classical concert with the English Philharmonic Orchestra.

"We will be giving away over £1,000 on air during the week in cash competitions. We will also be running a series of live programmes from discos during September and October." ■

DSB Gets Double Boost

Direct satellite broadcasting (DSB) has received two pieces of good news. A group composed of multinational Philips, Plessey and VLSI of Norway has announced that it has successfully tested a decoding device for satellite transmissions in the D-MAC code proposed by British Satellite Broadcasting (BSB).

Meanwhile hi-fi group Alba

has taken over Satellite Technology systems. STS has already started production work on a PAL receiving dish, which it is hoped will now provide a competitor for Amstrad. Alan Sagar of Amstrad has promised his will sell for only £199 and be ready in time for the start of Rupert Murdoch's four-channel Sky Television. ■

Positive Cable News

Up to 2.5 million more households in the UK may be able to receive cable television within a couple of years. At present, the UK Cable Authority is processing applications for seven new cable areas: Birmingham; North Thames; South Thames; North West London; Avon; Thames Valley and Greater London East.

Of these, Birmingham is the biggest, with 460,000 potential households. But the Cable Authority also expects to announce soon a franchise for Greater Glasgow, which will have a capacity of 600,000 households.

The increasingly positive prospect for UK cable is also good news for pan-European channels such as MTV, Sky and Super. These should increase their UK penetration significantly if Britons now begin to take the cable. The prospects for more

subscribers are better now than at any time, according to Edward Mercer, Secretary of the Cable Authority: "All of a sudden, without anybody realising it, cable has taken off".

Although Mercer warns that cable is still a very new industry in the UK, he says that "competition is becoming the norm". Five of the seven areas on offer have more than one competing applicant. The first to be announced will be Birmingham, on October 19. Several other new areas are expected to be advertised in the near future. ■

Paris - A new rock & roll show, 'Live Music', will premiere on France's La Cinq TV on September 25. The first programme will feature the career of superstar Elton John.

The 45-minute monthly music programme is conceived and produced by two members of Paris's Avenue FM radio station: DJ Jeff Bouquet and Head Programmer Patrick Marsault. The show, to be broadcast at 12:15 hours on Sundays, will be "the first music show in Europe

to emphasise the European music scene," says Bouquet.

"Live Music" will feature new as well as established stars. This will not surprise listeners to Bouquet's radio programme which often has interviews with rising rock stars. Contrary to the show's title, however, 'Live Music' will not necessarily bring live concerts to the French rock audience.

Bouquet and Marsault will interview artists, including excerpts of their videos and footage from live performances. ■

New Shows On Radio Gong

Nuremberg - Radio Gong's Head Of Music, Arno Mueller, has announced a number of new programmes for the autumn. Radio Gong is the most popular regional private station in the Nuremberg-Elangen area.

The first of these new shows is a spectacular six-hour (September 4 - 9), 108 hour (18 hours daily from 06:00 to 24:00 hours) all-time greatest hits' special.

Over 1,500 titles chosen by Radio Gong listeners will be played during the marathon. The show will include lotteries with a trip to Miami, cash, and a car

as prizes.

On September 17, Erich Schoepe will present 'Radio Gong Unterwegs' from the ruins of Nuremberg's Katharinen cloister; guests will include the Jealous Chaps, ZARA, Franz Benton, Guillermo Marchena, Joachim Witt, Dominoe, Thommie Bayer and Heinz Rudolf Kunze.

Other programme specialities include: Lionel Richie (September 26); Huey Lewis, Frank Zapata, Ethno Pop (October); the Rolling Stones (November 14 & 21); New Age, Radio In The US (December). ■

New Call For Music TV

Paris - Communications Minister Catherine Tasca has revived the hope of a French music channel. "I am completely convinced of the necessity of music channel," said Tasca, speaking in a recent interview with French magazine *Telerama*.

Tasca also said that French TV has too many general interest

channels, citing La Cinq, M6 and TF1, but omitting their state-run counterparts A2 and FR3. The Minister suggested that converting a general interest channel into one with an all-music format would solve both problems. She declined to name, however, the one that should change format.

Europe I's Fruitful Campaign

Paris - A blue peach is the symbol chosen by Europe 1 radio to launch a major advertising campaign to coincide with the announcement of the new autumn programme schedules.

"It is tasty morning, noon and night and even between meals" and "it provides justice all day long" are just two of the slogans appearing on posters, in the daily press, magazines, on TV and on radio in a campaign rumoured to cost over FF 10 million.

The new autumn schedule continues Europe 1's policy of transmitting more music. Europe 1's Head Of Music, Yvonne Lebrun: "Our music output has tripled since last year - and not just in the evenings but throughout the whole day. My music choices can now be heard three times more often than previously, which obviously makes them more effective when it comes to pushing talent."

One new addition to the music roster is Bernard Lenoir, former presenter of the popular *Antenne 2* pop show 'Les Enfants Du 2' and protégé of Patrice Blanc-Francard, who joined the station two months ago as Director Of Programmes. A new music and sport show will be presented by Yves Bigot at weekends. ■

Pop Loses Out In SWF/SDR Merger

Stuttgart - A launch date for the merger (see Music & Media issue 31) of public broadcasters Sueddeutsche Rundfunk (SDR) and Sudwestfunk (SWF) has been set for 1992 and first details seem to indicate a drop in pop programming.

The governments of Baden-Wuerttemberg and Rheinland-Pfalz have decided to form a single TV/Radio body, Suedwestdeutscher Rundfunk (SWDR).

In place of the seven current SDR and SWF state-wide stations, only three or four are planned for the new TV and radio broadcaster. These include channels for youth and resident foreign audiences, entertainment, classical and satellite radio formats.

The public broadcasters' pop channels S3 and SWF 3 which offer the greatest competition to the privates, are not included in

the new concept. Nor will the Mainz and Stuttgart regional channels have a place for pop music.

Although the new broadcaster will be financed with a budget of about DM 1 billion in licence fees, the merger could rob the public broadcaster of its most attractive programming for advertisers. ■

BMG Austria Turnover Up

Vienna - BMG Austria has registered a 9% increase in unit turnover in the year ending July 1988, with much of the upturn due to sales of the two 'Dirty Dancing' film soundtrack albums.

According to marketing chief Erich Krappenbacher, CD sales accounted for 26% of total BMG sales in the year. As elsewhere, singles - with the exception of the multi-single - are badly down.

BMG is claiming a market lead in the music video field. Krappenbacher: "With Virgin repertoire, and our product with folk group Stoakogler Trio, we are top of the league. But it is a pity that traditional record dealers are so hesitant about getting into video in Austria. We sell our repertoire mainly through a chain of photography shops." ■

RIAS TV Goes On Air

Berlin - Despite widespread controversy, Radio In The American Sector (RIAS) began broadcasting its television channel on August 22.

Although it broadcasts in German, RIAS is part of the American Information Office. The station's General Director, Bernhard Rhoe, is German, but Chairman Robert Voht is American.

Some 84% of RIAS' operational costs (DM 50 million) is, however, provided by the German

Ministry For Internal Affairs.

Gunter Hermann, Director of Berlin-based Sender Freier Berlin (SFB) has criticised the RIAS TV launch, saying he sees "no recognizable need" for another channel in a city that already receives six German language networks.

There are fears that the new channel will cause financial hardship for the other TVs by taking away part of the available advertising revenue. ■

Fears Over Greek Media Control

by John Carr

Athens - Fears are growing about the Greek government's plan to set up an audiovisual media institute. The institute will perform theoretical and practical research into the media, train staff for the state-run broadcaster ERT and preserve audiovisual material of historical importance.

There is anxiety, however, that the move could lead to more control over the airwaves. Since

this year's explosion of professional private radio stations covering Athens and major Greek cities, the government seems worried that the traditional level of state control over broadcast control might be under threat.

Plans for the Institute come at a time when the government and private radio managements are arguing over just how much freedom broadcasters should be al-

lowed. Greece is the only EEC member still reluctant to free the airwaves, and government press/media official Dimitris Maroudas was until recently opposed to private radio and satellite television in any form. Public pressure eventually forced him to back down early in August.

The official reason for setting up the Institute is that Greece is bidding for the Olympic Games centenary in 1996 and needs a modern media setup to handle it. But to many, the idea of creating a "dynamic communications policy" is an euphemism for a new form of state control. ■

Phone A Hit

SIP, Italy's national telephone company, has ventured into the pop world. A 'disc of the week' has been launched in Rome, with the collaboration of RAI. All pop fans have to do is dial a special number to hear snippets of the nine best selling singles of the week; to hear all of their favourite single, they redial the number and add the number of their chosen disc. ■

But Aida is no overnight sensation. Born in 1949, she sang in local church choirs as a child, an experience which helped to develop her passion for gospel and black music.

In later years she began to gain a reputation as a back-up singer, both live and in the recording studio. Artists like Edoardo Bennato, Anna Oxa, Marcella and Zuccherò have all benefited from her powerful voice.

Her first solo single came as no surprise. Aida chose to offer her own soulful rendition of James Brown's *I'll Go Crazy*, backed by Otto Redding's *Be Been Loving You*. In 1987 she recorded the four track mini-album *Scosse* for Dischi Ricordi, with Alberto Salerno as producer.

That partnership seems to have been successful because Salerno is at the controls once again for her new single and upcoming album *Vinti E Vincitori* - an album which should set more than a few European soul fires burning. ■

I In 5 Privates Close

Some 70 Flemish private radio stations have had to stop broadcasting, largely due to administrative incompetence. The government asked local radio stations to apply for new authorisation in January, but several either forgot to fill in the necessary forms or declined to apply for a new permit.

As a result, these stations will be squelched out when the frequency scheme is finalised, expected within the next few weeks. The bigger privates will be grouped between 102.1 and 104.8 MHz FM under a so-called 'agglomeration-permit'. Some 46 stations have applied for a new permit which offers more antenna-power and allows more advertising. At the moment, all privates broadcast between 102 and 108 MHz FM. ■

Metronome To Lose WEA

Copenhagen - After representing WEA for over 20 years, Metronome, one of Denmark's most respected record and film companies, is to lose its contract to distribute the label by July next year.

Although details have not yet

been revealed, it is certain that WEA will open its own office in Denmark. It will then be operating 14 companies in Europe, including its central co-ordination office in London and a subsidiary in Norway which was launched last year.

The loss of WEA is a big blow for Metronome as it represented most of the label's roster. But the termination is not related to any dissatisfaction on the part of WEA; Metronome's turnover was over Dkr 41 million (with profits approaching the six million mark) and WEA's turnover has been improved by about 20% a year.

Olav Bennike, Managing Director Metronome, says he was prepared for the termination although he cannot say what impact this will have on the company. "It is a logical consequence of WEA's growth in Europe to open up new subsidiaries," say Bennike. ■

New Metal On Moshroom

Amsterdam - A new heavy metal label has been launched in the Benelux called Moshroom Records. Set up in association with Boudisque and distributed by CBS, its first release this month will be the album *Don't Cheer Me Up* by the Arizona-based Act Aftermath.

The label will be specialising in metal and trash acts and is handled by Boudisque's A&R Manager Charles Hünfeld. The next LP release will be Florida band Pariah with *Take A Walk*.

Do DJs Need Training?

Hotline this week links a radio station from Switzerland and Holland which, for political reasons, were both launched in Italy. The Swiss private, Radio 24, moved to Zurich three years ago when the country allowed commercial broadcasting. Holland's Radio 10, the first commercial cable station in the Dutch language, also transmits in Italy as a foreign broadcasting company to comply with the Dutch media laws. Support from Radio 24's audience was instrumental in changing Swiss regulations and the appearance of Radio 10 has brought the whole issue of commercial broadcasting to the forefront in Holland. Radio 10's Managing Director Jeroen Soer and Radio 24's Music Co-ordinator Clem Dalton discuss the pros and cons of training DJs and their playlist system.

Is the training of DJs a necessity or is being a presenter a natural ability for some people?

Soer: It's definitely a necessity. Because DJs have to be, from the first of all to keep their mouths shut - and then we have to convince them that if they just stick to saying what song has been played, it does not mean they are bad DJs. You also have to tell them that they don't have to be funny to be on the air.

The main thing then is to persuade them to talk less?

Soer: Yes. I often think there has to be something wrong with your ego if you want to be a DJ!

Dalton: If you don't have to be funny on the air what do you have to be?

Soer: You have to be a nice personality to listen to. The listeners must know that there is some sort of friend behind the voice. You have to have a warm feeling in your voice, a warm way of presenting.

And how do you teach them that?

Soer: Firstly, there has to be a certain amount of natural aptitude - you can't teach a dog to be a DJ.

Dalton: I agree, there must be a degree of natural talent. When I train DJs, the first thing I do is point out that the mike is the moderator's friend.

Soer: Yes, voice and personality are the key factors.

Should the DJs be moulded to a certain type - a Radio 10 or Radio 24 type?

Soer: No, we don't want personality shows as such. DJs are of course allowed to reveal their personalities, but not too much.

Dalton: Our DJs are trained to a certain extent, but they basically get on-the-job experience at Radio 24. The problem in Switzerland is that moderating is a totally new profession, so they have to receive some guidelines. It is important that the DJs learn to act as if they've been invited into the home of each listener. A smile will eventually come across over the air.

Soer: Absolutely. There is of course a big difference between Switzerland and Holland. We have had pop radio since 1965, so it's not a new profession in Hol-

land. Therefore, a lot of the new DJs have an example to follow - and that is one of the first things they try to get out of their heads. They must be themselves.

Moving on to playlists - how are these compiled at your stations?

Dalton: I get together with the Music Director on Monday mornings and we go through ideas and selections which are then put to a general meeting in the afternoon - all the DJs are present at that.

How much leeway do DJs have?

Dalton: We have 40 titles in the playlist, and I suppose that the moderators have a say amounting

to 30%.

Soer: At Radio 10 we work a little differently. If a DJ badly wants a record on the playlist, the Programme Director, Ferry Maat, and I make the ultimate decision. It's not as democratic as some stations, though we do listen to the opinions of the DJs.

So how many tracks can a DJ choose in a given hour?

Dalton: We play three playlist titles each hour, as well as one from the hit parade (based on listeners' preferences, sales and dance floor popularity). The rest can be taken from oldies or what we call instant oldies - records which are less than five years old.

Soer: We play five playlist records per hour and of course some of the DJ's own preferences are in that playlist. Apart from that, oldies and two free choices - one an LP/CD track and something entirely of the DJ's choice.

How important are the trade papers and the charts for your programming?

Dalton: Very important. Especially the US and European charts.

Why is the US chart of more use to you than, say, the UK one?

Dalton: It's very simple. The US releases coincide more with the records released in Switzerland. And the UK charts are so full of 'fad' records on small indie labels that are simply not available here. It's unfortunate, but that is how it is.

Soer: It's different with us. Of course trade papers are important in that you can see what sells well, but that doesn't help you with how it sounds. So my ears are the most valuable things I have; I listen to records. It's not important for me to see if a record is selling well in Spain, for example. If I see something on the list I try to get a copy so that I can decide for myself if it sounds good. The decision is not based on whether the record is in a particular chart.

Dalton: But don't you find that at times of heavy releases, such as now when there is so much product around, that it is impossible to listen to every single record? That is when trade papers, previews, and playlists from other stations serve as invaluable guidelines.

Soer: These things are useful in that they shorten the time that you need to listen to an album, for example. But on the other hand, the single release is not always the best track on the album.

Do you import a lot of product?

Dalton: Nothing! We are so well served by the Swiss record industry that we don't need to.

Soer: We use a lot of import record stores here in Amsterdam to supply us with British and American - and sometimes Japanese and French - product. ■



Well Fancy That...

Manich-born disco star Fancy is a singer very much aware of where he is going. Fancy's highly successful brand of lightweight disco has clocked up singles sales of more than a million in Germany alone and an unashamedly professional approach to easily accessible, dance-oriented music has brought him recognition from Spain to Asia. Fancy's third LP, 'Flames Of Love', was released recently and a new single is expected shortly.

Fancy, signed with Metronome since 1983, first entered the charts in 1984. His two singles of that year, *Slice Me Nice* and *Chinese Eyes*, both

charted high in Germany and since then the artist has worked hard to consolidate an eager home public and build up an audience abroad.

The work, however, had started much earlier than that. Fancy's preoccupation with performance first showed itself at school, where he laid the foundations of what has developed into a highly-charged stage presence: the various student theatre productions. On leaving school he formed a band, Mountain Shadows, with which he played cover versions of contemporary hits. Making ends meet with a variety of part-time jobs, Fancy also became a familiar face on record companies' doorsteps, trying to interest them in his own compositions.

The break came with the Todd Canedy written, Toni Momm produced hit *Slice Me Nice*. Further successes followed rapidly. After *Chinese Eyes* came *Get Lost Tonight* and the Spanish smash



Rolero. He was besieged by the Spanish media, and then by the Scandinavian public when *Lady Of Ice* went gold in Norway and Sweden.

Meanwhile, Fancy was concentrating on building up a live following. Tours of the US dance halls and Swedish parks were sandwiched between TV appearances in West Germany and Poland, most notably with *China Blue* and *Flames Of Love*, both tracks from the current album. Work on the LP, *Flames Of Love*, started in late 1987.

and conceived by Hal Wilner, well known for his former tribute LPs to Theloniou Monk and Kurt Weill. It will be a collection of favourite songs from Walt Disney, rendered by an impressive line-up of artists like Suzanne Vega, Stuart O'Connor, Bonnie Raitt & Was (Not Was), Tom Waits and Los Lobos.

Chrystalis will release debut albums of female duo **Dorothy** (two ex-members of The Raincoats) and **Tony Stone**. The latter, named *For A Lifetime*, follows the single *This Is Serious* that was produced by Guy Clabbers of 'World Party'. Also on Chrystalis, Scottish twin brothers **The Proclaimers**, who return with a full-powered multi-instrumental sound on their second album, *Sunshine On Leith* (Leith is the port area of Edinburgh where the two now live).

Marc Almond recently signed a new worldwide deal with EMI/Parlophone, resulting in *The Stars We Are*, a passionate LP full of sophisticated songs. **Viven's** self-titled EMI/Manhattan debut LP is expected to prove

that gritty, hard-hitting rock can be played by females too. **Jane Wiedlin**, former singer with **The Go-Go's** will release her debut LP *Fry*. Other EMI releases to watch out for include *Born To Be Blue* by Steve Miller, *Amnesia* by ex-Fairport Convention guitarist songwriter Richard Thompson, and Talk Talk's eagerly awaited fourth album, *Spirit Of Eden*, rumored to be a radical departure from the band's earlier material.

Samantha Fox's new album for Jive boasts an impressive array of producers: Stock, Aitken & Waterman, Bolland & Bolland, Full Force and Taylor Dayne's Fred Zarr. Also on Jive new product from **Sarah Jane Morris** (singer with **The Communards**), Minneapolis-based glam-rock band **Slave Raider** (*What Do Ya Know About Rock 'N' Roll*), their second LP and other exciting albums by female rap duo **Wee Papa Girl Rappers** and **Ruby Turner's** tribute to Motown.

MCA adds a third volume to the **Miami Vibe** series, featuring **Jan Hammer**, Shena Easton

and **The Hooters**. **The Mac Bae**, a US black dance act who recently had a UK top 10 hit with *Roses Are Red*, will issue their self-titled LP. Former Eagles-member **Glenn Frey** will be back on the map with *Soul Searchin'*, featuring the single *True Love*; Frey co-produced with **Elliott Schreiner**.

Glenn Medeiros' album *Not Me*, will certainly be one of PolyGram's most commercial releases to come.
